Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

February 12-16, 1990

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened Monday, February 12, 1990 at 0800 hours with all Board members, except Dale Baird, present. Board Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, Board Attorney, Dallas Burkhalter, and Board Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis, also present.

Executive Director's Report: Executive Director, Dean Sangery, reviewed and updated the Board as regards on-going activity since the last Board meeting.

Leo Dub: The Board reviewed Mr. Dub's application for employment as an enforcement agent and upon recommendation of Board's Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator that 1) the services of an additional enforcement agent would enhance the Board's enforcement program, and 2) Mr. Dub is P.O.S.T. certified and qualified to be employed as an enforcement agent, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD EMPLOY MR. DUB AS AN ENFORCEMENT AGENT.

H. Spence Warner, dba South Fork Lodge: Mr. Warner met before the Board in a show cause hearing for suspension or revocation of his outfitter license for the alleged employment of unlicensed guides.

Executive Session: Pursuant to Idaho Code Sec. 67-2345, motion by Crane (Crane - aye, Epley - aye, Miller - aye, Meiners - aye) that Board go into Executive Session to discuss potential litigative matters. Session commenced at 1045 hrs. and ended at 1100 hrs. with no decisions made.

H. Spence Warner, dba South Fork Lodge: The Board, following the show cause hearing in consideration of Mr. Warner's alleged employment of unlicensed guides, determines the following Findings of Fact: 1) On August 2, 1989, H. Spence Warner, dba South Fork Lodge, did employ Mr. Buchenroth, Mr. Thompson, and Mr. Lowe as fishing guides; 2) Mr. Buchenroth, Mr. Thompson, and Mr. Lowe were unlicensed at the time they were checked, August 2, 1989, by Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board's enforcement agent, Arlo Larsen; 3) Mr. Buchenroth, Mr. Thompson, and Mr. Lowe did forfeit bond on the citation for unlicensed guiding which is equivalent to a conviction according to Idaho Code Section 36-2113(b); and 4) Mr. Warner did admit that he employed Mr. Buchenroth, Mr. Thompson, and Mr. Lowe on August 2, 1989 as fishing guides and that they were not licensed at that time. In consideration of these findings of fact, the conclusion of law is as follows: 1) that Mr. Warner did indeed

employ Mr. Buchenroth, Mr. Thompson, and Mr. Lowe as guides, when they were not licensed, in violation of Idaho Code Section 36-2113(a)(9), following which, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD, IN VIEW OF THE FOREGOING FINDINGS OF FACT, AND CONCLUSION OF LAW, AND IN LIEU OF REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF MR. H. SPENCE WARNER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE, 1) IMPOSE A FINE PURSUANT TO RULE 64 OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$400 FOR EACH COUNT, FOR A TOTAL FINE OF \$1200; AND 2) ISSUE MR. H. SPENCE WARNER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR THE 1990-91 LICENSE YEAR AS PROBATIONARY. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT NO AMENDMENT TO MR. WARNER'S OUTFITTER OR GUIDE LICENSE WILL BE APPROVED AND THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY STATE, FEDERAL, OR LOCAL LAW DURING THE COURSE OF THE PROBATION YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991.

World Wide River Expeditions, Inc./Richard Jones, Designated Agent: Messrs Jones and Merlin F. Goode, Diamond Mountain Outfitters, met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Mr. Goode and World Wide River Expeditions, Inc./Richard Jones, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board concerning the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Goode's business which has been licensed for conduct of float boating on SA6, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS AS OUTLINED BEFORE THE BOARD, 2) APPROVE WORLD WIDE RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. REQUEST TO BECOME LICENSED AS WORLD WIDE RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. #1 AND #2, 3) DIRECT THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED PENDING COMPLETION OF PAPER WORK, NAMELY ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION FILED WITH THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND AN UPDATED OPERATING AREA DESCRIPTION, AND 4) APPROVE MR. JONES AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR WORLD WIDE RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC. #2, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1145 hours and reconvened at 1300 hours.

Ridge W. Taylor, dba Arbon Valley Hunting Company: The Board reviewed the complaint filed against Ridge W. Taylor, dba Arbon Valley Hunting Company, by Larry G. Ferguson for Mr. Taylor's allegedly having hunted on Mr. Ferguson's private property this past hunting season without Mr. Ferguson's permission to do so. Following discussion of this matter and in consideration of testimony offered by Enforcement Agent Arlo Larsen, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. TAYLOR BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS LICENSE IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(8). (Administrative Note: The Board may wish to call Mr. Ferguson, Nellie Brown, and Mat Morris as witnesses dependent upon Board's attorney's recommendation.)

Idaho Big Game, Inc./Jon C. Goodman, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Goodman's file with respect to Board's attorney's

memorandum regarding Board's efforts to service Mr. Goodman with notification of denial on his 1989-90 outfitter license application. Mr. Burkhalter advises that adequate service has been served and the period of any application for hearing regarding this license denial has passed. Therefore, the Board can move forward to consider the relicensing of this area. Following discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD, 1) DECLARE THE AREA RELINQUISHED, THEREBY INITIATING CONSIDERATION OF RELICENSING THE OPERATING AREA IN QUESTION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF RULE 28(c); 2) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE FOREST SERVICE, MOOSE CREEK RANGER DISTRICT AND THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME ADVISING THEM OF THE BOARD'S POSITION IN THIS REGARD AND ASKING THEIR RESPONSE AND RECOMMENDATION AS TO RELICENSING OF THE OPERATING AREA; 3) THAT UPON RECEIPT OF RESPONSE, THAT THE BOARD PROCEED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF RULE 28(c) IN CONSIDERING THE RELICENSING OF THIS AREA; 4) THAT IN COOPERATION WITH LEMHI COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY, JORDON SMITH, IN PROSECUTION OF THIS CASE, THE BOARD AUTHORIZES AN EXPENDITURE OF UP TO \$1000 AS WITNESS FEES TO ASSIST IN SAID PROSECUTION.

Richard E. Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch: The Board reviewed Mr. Grunch's file, noting the extensive number of complaints that have recently been filed against Mr. Grunch regarding his last year's hunting activities. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. GRUNCH BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(2, 5, 7, 9, 10, 12, and 14).

Bitterroot National Forest/West Fork McGruder Ranger District: The Board reviewed correspondence received regarding Forest Service issuance of special use permits to private parties in excess of the 14 day camping limit as associated with alleged cougar hunting activities. Such permits appear to have been issued to Larry Rose, Clint Kidd, and two other individuals. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE BITTERROOT NATIONAL FOREST, MCGRUDER RANGER DISTRICT, HERB SPRATLEN, ACTING DISTRICT RANGER, REQUESTING CLARIFICATION OF THEIR ISSUANCE OF SUCH PERMITS IN EXCESS OF THE 14 DAY LIMIT AS REGARDS THE POTENTIAL FOR ILLEGAL OUTFITTING ACTIVITY.

Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Adventures: The Board reviewed Mr. Cook's file and outfitter license application for the purchase of Hells Canyon Adventures/Gary Armacost, Designated Agent, jet boat business on the Lower Salmon River (SA7A, SA7B and SA8). Following Mr. Cook's interview before the Board, and in consideration of this application, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS WITH LICENSE ISSUED FOR THE BALANCE OF THE 1989-90 LICENSE YEAR, AND 2) HOLD RENEWAL OF SAID LICENSE FOR THE

1990-91 LICENSE YEAR UNTIL APPROPRIATE SPECIAL USE PERMITS FROM THE LAND MANAGING AGENCY (BLM) ARE RECEIVED.

Outdoor Company, Inc./Larry Hoff and Steve Ricks, Designated Agents: Messrs. Hoff and Ricks met with the Board relative to their outfitter license application for the conduct of various outfitted activities in the McCall/Donnelly area. They were informed that the Forest Service has notified the Board that they wish to initiate the Memorandum of Understanding, Amendment 1, Step 1 to ascertain the need for outfitted activities in the requested operating area. Messrs Hoff and Ricks did submit additional information for their file leaving only the land manager sign-off and completion of the outfitter exam to complete their application. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) CONCUR IN THE FOREST SERVICE REQUEST AND SO NOTIFY THE FOREST SERVICE, NEW MEADOWS RANGER DISTRICT, AL BECKER, RESOURCE ASSISTANT, THAT THE MOU, STEP 1, SHOULD BE TRIGGERED, AND REQUEST THEM TO PROCEED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MOU, AND 2) ADDRESS A LETTER TO MESSRS HOFF AND RICKS TO SO ADVISE THEM OF THE BOARD/FOREST SERVICE ACTION AND THAT NO FURTHER PROCESSING OF THEIR APPLICATION WILL BE MADE PENDING COMPLETION OF THE MOU PROCESS.

Lazy J Outfitters, Inc./Larry Jarrett, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Jarrett's file regarding the show cause hearing in which he was to appear before the Board for alleged outfitting outside of his operating area. Following review of the file and papers submitted by Mr. Jarrett's attorney, John Sutton, in which they claim that 1) this was not an outfitted activity, therefore no outfitting was involved to place Mr. Jarrett outside his operating area boundary, and 2) appropriate action was not taken in a timely manner in accordance with Idaho Code 36-2114(a) wherein the 60 day limit is cited for such action to be taken. Following consideration of this matter, and upon recommendation of Board's attorney, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE MATTER BE DISMISSED.

Teton Valley Lodge, Inc./Randy Berry, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Berry's file regarding his scheduled appearance before the Board on a show cause hearing for alleged employment of an unlicensed guide. Board's attorney and Executive Director previously met with Mr. Mike Crapo, Mr. Berry's attorney, at which time a stipulated settlement was tentatively agreed to, i.e., Teton Valley Lodge would agree to pay an appropriate fine with the understanding that no other adverse action would be taken against the license, namely the issuance of a probationary license. In consideration of this matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT BOARD'S ATTORNEY'S RECOMMENDATION THAT THE STIPULATED SETTLEMENT BE MADE WITH THE FOLLOWING STIPULATIONS: 1) THAT A \$500 FINE BE ASSESSED; 2) THAT NO FURTHER PROBATIONARY ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST TETON VALLEY LODGE, INC./RANDY BERRY, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR

THE 1989-90 LICENSE YEAR; 3) THAT THE BOARD INSTRUCT ITS ATTORNEY TO PROCEED WITH THE STIPULATED SETTLEMENT; AND 4) AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN SAID SETTLEMENT ONCE CONCLUDED.

Wild River Outfitters, Inc./Richard A. "Tony" Bradbury, Jr., Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Wild River Outfitters, Inc. file relative to their scheduled show cause hearing to appear before the Board for alleged violation of Rule 53 of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations. In discussing this matter, Board's Attorney advises that the Bradburys' had retained the services of a new attorney, Mr. Phillip Gordon. Mr. Gordon had contacted the Board's attorney requesting a continuance of the case to enable him to adequately prepare for said hearing. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Miller-Crane) THAT SAID CONTINUANCE BE GRANTED UNTIL THE APRIL BOARD MEETING.

High Country Outfitters, Inc./Quentin Selby, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed High Country Outfitters, Inc., file relative to the ongoing litigation in this matter. Board's attorney advises 1) that Mr. Selby has now exhausted all appeal rights regarding this case, and 2) the operating area assigned to High Country Outfitters, Inc./Quentin Selby, Designated Agent is thereby relinquished and can now be considered for relicensing under the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c). Following discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) DECLARE THE OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO HIGH COUNTRY OUTFITTERS, INC./QUENTIN SELBY, DESIGNATED AGENT, RELINQUISHED THEREBY TRIGGERING IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 28(c); 2) WILL CONSIDER RELICENSING OF THIS OPERATING AREA UNDER THE PURVIEW OF RULE 28(c); 3) CONTACT THE PAYETTE NATIONAL FOREST, KRASSEL DISTRICT, REGARDING RELICENSING OUTFITTED ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE OPERATING AREA TO REQUEST THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING SAME IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, AMENDMENT 1; AND 4) CONTACT THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME TO REQUEST THEIR RECOMMENDATION AS TO RELICENSING OF THIS OPERATING AREA FOR CONDUCT OF OUTFITTED ACTIVITY.

Hells Canyon Adventures, Inc./Gary Armacost, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Armacost's file regarding the Day Use Permits below Hells Canyon, SN7, to note the January 16, 1990 letter from Mr. Ed Cole regarding the issuance of special use permits for conduct of this activity. Following review of this file, and in consideration of Mr. Cole's letter to the Board, the Board concurs in the action taken by the Chairman by letter dated February 7, 1990 in which Capital City Supervisor, Dave Rittersbacher was notified of the Board's declaration of an impasse in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding, Amendment 2 as regards this situation.

Quaker Hill Conference, dba Backcountry and Beyond/Scott Childs, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Quaker Hill Conference's letter and petition requesting a declaratory judgement to exclude them from the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, Title 36, Chapter 21. Review of this request and consideration/discussion of Board attorney's recommendations (letter dated February 9, 1990) in which he enumerates A) the following findings of fact: 1) Quaker Hill Conference, dba Backcountry and Beyond, holds itself out to the public by being available for usage by church groups affiliated with Quaker Hill Conference, youth groups, troubled youth homes, rehabilitation centers, and State agencies; 2) Quaker Hill Conference provides facilities for consideration; 3) Quaker Hill Conference is a non-profit organization; and 4) Quaker Hill Conference maintains, or otherwise uses equipment for compensation for the conduct of recreational outdoor activities, including hazardous excursions (backpacking, rock climbing, cross-country skiing, and wilderness activities); and B) the following conclusions of law: 1) Quaker Hill Conference, dba Backcountry and Beyond, is an outfitter within the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Act; and 2) the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act does not exempt non-profit organizations, therefore Quaker Hill Conference's petition for exemption from the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act is recommended for denial, following which MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ADOPT SAID RECOMMENDATION BY BOARD'S ATTORNEY AND SO NOTIFY QUAKER HILL CONFERENCE, DBA BACKCOUNTRY AND BEYOND, THAT THEIR PETITION IS DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DECISION IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2102(b), WITH FURTHER REFERENCE TO IDAHO ATTORNEY GENERAL INFORMAL GUIDELINE DATED SEPTEMBER 19, 1983.

Paul Resnick, dba Shepp Ranch: The Board reviewed Paul Resnick's file, noting allegations of unlicensed float trips being conducted during the summer of 1989. Following review of this matter and testimony offered by certain Forest Service employees who reportedly observed this alleged illegal activity, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT PAUL RESNICK, DBA SHEPP RANCH, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE ALLEGED CONDUCT OF AN UNLICENSED ACTIVITY, NAMELY FLOAT BOATING ON SA6. AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACTION IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(8ii).

Parley R. Perks: The Board reviewed a letter received from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, in which they have addressed a letter to Mr. Perks, dated January 30, 1990 in response to his inquiry as to the status of "swap hunting" arrangements within the State of Idaho. Following a discussion of this inquiry and its implication in so far as its falling within the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, Title 36, Chapter 21, the Board directs that its Executive Director address a letter to Mr. Perks outlining that said activity would indeed fall within the purview

of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act and would require being licensed by the Board for conduct of said proposed activities.

Board Attorney Update: Board Attorney, Dallas Burkhalter, updated the Board regarding various legal matters currently pending before the Board.

Enforcement Coordinator: Board Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis, updated the Board regarding various pending and ongoing enforcement matters.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1725 hours. The Board reconvened on Tuesday, February 13, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members, except Dale Baird, present. Board Attorney and Executive Director also present.

Patrick Prentice and Bruce Duncan, dba Selkirk Guiding and Outfitting: The Board reviewed Messrs Prentice and Duncan's file and outfitter license application for the conduct of deer, elk, goat, moose, bear, cougar, predator and bird hunting; trailrides; backpacking; snowmobiling; and photography trip activities in Fish and Game Management Unit 1 and 4A. They are proposing to purchase that portion of Grizzly Outfitters/Rick Lindsay, Designated Agent, outfitting business in these respective Fish and Game units. Following a review of the file, together with Mr. Duncan's enforcement file and in consultation with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game regarding this application, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD DENY THE APPLICATION OF PATRICK PRENTICE AND BRUCE DUNCAN, DBA SELKIRK GUIDING AND OUTFITTERS, TO BECOME LICENSED IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 1 AND 4A. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND (c), AND 36-2113(a)(6, 14).

Mike Crevelt, dba Team Adventures Serving the Community-TASC: Messrs Crevelt and Stan Siewart met with the Board regarding their outfitter license application for the conduct of activities serving disadvantaged youth. Following the interview with Mr. Crevelt, wherein he expressed a desire to obtain an outfitter's license in providing necessary services to disadvantaged youth, it was the Board's position that such a license would be considered upon his providing completed paperwork necessary for the Board to take final action on his application. Said paperwork should be available to the Board for final decision at its April meeting.

Board Minutes - December Meeting: The Board reviewed the December 4-8, 1989 Board meeting minutes, following which MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

Board Minutes - January Special Meeting: The Board reviewed the January 10, 1990 Special Board meeting minutes, following which MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.

Mike Johnson/McCall Area Sleigh Rides: The Board reviewed the Mike Johnson/McCall area sleigh ride situation regarding whether Mr. Johnson would be required to have an outfitter license for conduct of sleigh rides within the McCall, Idaho, city limits. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DEEM SAID SLEIGH RIDES CONDUCTED WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF MCCALL, IDAHO, AS NOT FALLING WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE ACT AND THAT THE BOARD FURTHER DIRECT THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. JOHNSON TO ADVISE HIM OF THE BOARD'S POSITION IN THIS REGARD.

Fiscal Report: The Board reviewed the fiscal status of the Board's operating budget for the months of December and January, following which MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE FISCAL REPORTS BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

Bruce T. Butler, dba Smokey Mountain Outfitters: Mr. Butler and Mr. Hugh Johannson met with the Board regarding Mr. Butler's outfitter license amendment requests for: 1) the addition of bear and cougar hunting within that area to which he is currently licensed, and 2) consideration of expanding his operating area boundaries. Following a discussion of this proposed amendment request, Mr. Butler has elected to drop his request for operating area boundary expansion due the fact that the requested operating area extension(s) are currently licensed to other outfitters, and therefore not available to be licensed to him. In consideration of his amendment request for bear and cougar hunting within his currently licensed operating area boundary, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. BUTLER'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING WITHIN HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY; 2) THAT SAID APPROVAL IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LIMITATIONS RECOMMENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME LETTER TO THE BOARD RECEIVED JANUARY 8, 1990, NAMELY LION HUNTING ACCESS IN UNIT 43 BE BY SNOWSHOES OR SKIS ONLY, NO MOTORIZED VEHICLES ARE AUTHORIZED DURING THE FEEDING SEASON 3) THAT HARVEST FOR UNIT 43 BE LIMITED TO TWO (2) LIONS PER WINTER; 4) THAT HARVEST OF LION IN UNIT 44 BE LIMITED TO ONE (1) LION PER WINTER; AND 5) THAT NO LION HUNTING IS AUTHORIZED IN UNIT 48. FURTHER IT IS THE APPLICANT'S DESIRE THAT THIS LICENSE BE AMENDED FOR THE 1989-90 LICENSE SEASON TO PERMIT ADVERTISING TO MOVE FORWARD.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1140 hours and reconvened at 1300 hours.

Dave Stucker: The Board reviewed Mr. Stucker's file regarding his

license for the conduct of bear and cougar hunting on the New Meadows Ranger District and other operating areas within both the Payette and Boise National Forests. The Board further noted that Mr. Stucker has not yet secured the necessary special land use permits from the land managing agency for the conduct of said activities. Following review and discussion of this matter, the Board directs that Mr. Stucker's application for renewal of license, if and when received, be held and he be notified that receipt of his application has been noted, however, no further action will be taken on renewal until he shows proof of having secured the necessary special use permits from the land managing agency.

Marlene West: The Board reviewed Marlene West's December 11, 1989 letter in which she expressed concern regarding the assignment of exclusive areas for outfitting activities within the State of Idaho. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Ms. West expressing the Board's appreciation for her letter and stating that under Idaho law and, additionally, the Memorandum of Understanding that the Board has with the land managing agencies (U.S. Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management), the Board believes her concern is one that should not apply to the State of Idaho.

Private Land Outfitting Permission Criteria: The Board reviewed a proposal that is suggested to be added as a condition on hunting outfitter operating area descriptions as well as those river outfitters operating area descriptions who have land based activities. It is also recommended as an inclusion in the proposed rules package. Such statement or condition reads as follows: "An outfitted operation(s) on any private land(s) within an operating area approved by the Board is not authorized unless signed permission/lease is obtained from the private land owner(s), or their agent(s), and filed with the Board." Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THIS CONDITION BE APPROVED FOR INCLUSION ON APPROPRIATE OPERATING AREA DESCRIPTIONS AND FURTHER THAT IT BE MADE A PART OF THE PROPOSED RULES PACKAGE FOR ADOPTION AS A GENERAL BOARD RULE.

Ronald L. Sherer, dba Steel Mountain Outfitters: Mr. Sherer met with the Board regarding his outfitter license amendment request for the addition of bear and cougar hunting in Units 43 and 44. During discussion of this matter with Mr. Sherer, he indicated that he had withdrawn his bear hunting request but that he was still interested in the conduct of cougar hunting. In further discussion of this matter, the Board stated it was its position that they did not license an individual into another operating area for conduct of hunting activities wherein the other licensed outfitter was interested in or was conducting the applied for activities.

Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT RONALD L. SHERER, DBA STEEL MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF COUGAR HUNTING IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 43 AND 44 BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(f).

Petition - Little North Fork Clearwater River: The Board reviewed a petition received from Leo Crane, dba Clearwater Outfitters, to go to rules making to add a section of the Little North Fork Clearwater River to Rule 57(a) for the conduct of float boating activity. Following a review and discussion of this petition, MSC (Miller--Epley, Crane abstains) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE PETITION AND GO TO RULES MAKING IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT.

Lemhi County Joint Use Bear and Cougar Area/Custer County Joint Use Cougar Area: The Board reviewed the material compiled regarding these joint use areas and current licensees who have been and continue to be licensed in conduct of hunting activities for either bear and cougar or cougar alone. Following review and consideration of this matter, the Board directs the Executive Director to again contact the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, and Salmon and Challis National Forests for a review and update of their recommendations regarding joint use of the Lemhi/Custer County areas. Assuming these materials are available for the April Board meeting, the Board will review same and initiate appropriate action to notify affected outfitters of the Board's intent to take action under the criteria of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 24, in resolution of this continuing problem of joint use for bear and cougar hunting/cougar hunting activities in Lemhi and Custer counties.

Mike J. Stockton, dba Stockton Outfitting: The Board reviewed Mr. Stockton's file and operating area description, noting that by Board action of March 14, 1989, it had inadvertently licensed Mr. Stockton for spring bear hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 10, an area which was previously licensed to Lester "Zeke" West for spring bear hunting, thereby creating a "stacked" situation. Following a review and discussion of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Stockton to advise him of the Board's oversight in this regard and stating that the Board desires to correct this problem by asking if he would be willing to relinquish his spring bear hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 10 to enable correcting a stacked bear hunting situation which is contrary to Board licensing procedure policy and Idaho Department of Fish and Game recommendation.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours. The Board

reconvened on Wednesday, February 14, 1990, at 0820 hours with all Board members, except Dale Baird, present. Board Attorney, Executive Director, and Enforcement Coordinator are also present.

Ron Beitelspacher, dba Idaho Outfitters: Mr. Beitelspacher met with the Board regarding a conviction he received for violation of Idaho Fish and Game law. Following a discussion of this matter before the Board and hearing Mr. Beitelspacher's explanation of the circumstances surrounding same, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ISSUE RON BEITELSPACHER, DBA IDAHO OUTFITTERS, OUTFITTER AND GUIDE LICENSES PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1990-91 SEASON WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THERE SHALL BE NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION EXPIRING MARCH 31, 1991.

Bill Schiess: Mr. Schiess met with the Board concerning his petition to the Board to increase the current limitation of eight (8) outfitters authorized on Henry's Lake by one to enable him to be licensed there for the conduct of power boat fishing. Mr. Schiess is a property owner and operates a motel and other recreational facilities adjacent to the lake and is very interested in becoming licensed on this body of water. During the course of the interview, the Board's position was explained relative to acceptance or denial of a petition, that this had gone to rules making in 1986 and it was the Board's position to not go back to rules making relative to his petition at this time. Mr. Schiess was advised that the Board is very interested in his allegations of non-use on Henry's Lake and that they will consider this information and initiate appropriate actions to investigate the situation at Henry's Lake. Following which, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD NOT ACCEPT MR. SCHIESS' PETITION TO GO TO RULES MAKING ON HENRY'S LAKE, AND THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. SCHIESS OUTLINING THE BOARD'S POSITION REGARDING THIS PETITION AND ALLEGED NON-USE ACTIVITIES AT HENRY'S LAKE.

Omni Sports, dba The Snug Company/Brian Brockette, Designated Agent, and Russell Gore, dba Rusty Gore's Salmon River Jet Boat and Float Trips: Messrs Brockette and Gore met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of Rusty Gore's float boating business on SA2 to Omni Sports, dba The Snug Company/Brian Brockette, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board regarding this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT 1) THE BOARD APPROVE THE SALE OF RUSSELL GORE, DBA RUSTY GORE'S SALMON RIVER JET BOARD AND FLOAT TRIPS, FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING BUSINESS ON SA2 TO OMNI SPORTS, DBA THE SNUG COMPANY/BRIAN BROCKETTE, DESIGNATED AGENT; 2) BRIAN BROCKETTE NOT BE LICENSED TO GUIDE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HE IS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FLOAT BOATING ON SA2; AND 3) THAT MR. GORE BE EMPLOYED BY OMNI SPORTS UNTIL MR. BROCKETTE IS LICENSED TO GUIDE ON SA2.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1210 hours and reconvened at 1310 hours.

Executive Session: Pursuant to Idaho Code Sec. 67-2345, motion by Epley (Crane - aye, Epley - aye, Miller - aye, Meiners - aye) that Board go into Executive Session to discuss potential litigative matters. Session commenced at 1410 hrs. and ended at 1415 hrs.

K. Thomas Mehler, dba Mehler Charter Service: Mr. Mehler met with the Board in a show cause hearing for conviction of violating Idaho Fish and Game law. During the course of the hearing, the following findings of fact were established: 1) Mr. Mehler was found guilty of violating Fish and Game law for having multiple gear on three occasions; 2) Mr. Mehler was found guilty of hunting in a closed area on one occasion; 3) Mr. Mehler admits to these violations of Fish and Game law; 4) Mr. Mehler has paid fines assessed for violation of these laws; 5) Mr. Mehler, in the course of the hearing, explained that the violations for having multiple gear in the water were due to his professional occupation of developing fishing gear and that in the conduct of such experiments no passengers or outfitted clientele were a party to these operations. In consideration of these findings of fact, the conclusions of law are as follows: 1) Mr. Mehler is indeed in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5); and 2) due to the repeated violation of Fish and Game law, that such activity does indeed constitute unethical and unprofessional conduct in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(6). Following consideration of these findings of fact and conclusions of law, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) IMPOSE A \$200 FINE RELATIVE TO VIOLATION OF 36-2113(a)(5), AND 2) PLACE MR. MEHLER ON PROBATION FOR ONE YEAR WITH THE CUSTOMARY TERMS OF PROBATION BEING NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW, NOR ANY AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE DURING THE COURSE OF THE PROBATION, WHICH WILL END MARCH 31, 1991.

Murray "Bat" Masterson and Mel Masterson, dba Coeur d'Alene Outfitters/David Bobbitt, dba Coeur d'Alene Outfitters: Messrs. Murray and Mel Masterson, a partnership, appeared before the Board together with David Bobbitt, regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Mr. Bobbitt and the Mastersons. Following the interview and discussion of the proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID TRANSFER OF BUSINESS PENDING THE COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY AN AMENDMENT TO THE PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT SHOWING THE ACTION TO BE TAKEN UPON DISOLUTIONMENT OF SAID PARTNERSHIP; SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF THE OUTFITTERS EXAM; AND PAYMENT OF FEES. FURTHER, THAT THE OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES AND LICENSED ACTIVITIES AND LICENSE RESTRICTIONS ARE ONE AND THE SAME AS FORMERLY LICENSED TO DAVID BOBBITT, dba COEUR D'ALENE OUTFITTERS (See addendum #1).

Sean Christopher Peterson: The Board reviewed Mr. Peterson's file and 1989-90 Guide license application to become licensed as a lead backcountry alpine ski guide. Following review of the file and the technical advisory committee recommendation as to Mr. Peterson's qualifications, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT MR. PETERSON'S 1989-90 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION FOR LEAD BACKCOUNTRY ALPINE SKI GUIDE BE APPROVED.

Sevy Guide Service, Inc./Robert J. Sevy, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Sevy's outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of forest grouse hunting. Upon review of the file and finding that he is licensed for float boating activities on MF1, MF2, SA8, OW1 and JB1, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SEVY GUIDE SERVICE, INC.'S, OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF FOREST GROUSE HUNTING ON MF1 AND MF2 ONLY.

Kenneth Jafek, dba War Eagle Outfitter and Guides: The Board reviewed Mr. Jafek's outfitter file, finding that in the course of review and approval of his outfitter amendment request for the addition of trailriding and fishing in Unit 55, dated March, 1989, and subsequent Board approval of said amendment request, that they erroneously included Fish and Game Management Units 52, 52A, 56 and 57 in said approval. Following consideration of this oversight by the Board, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD, BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT, CORRECTLY ISSUE THE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR FISHING AND TRAILRIDE ACTIVITIES IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 55 ONLY.

L. Quention Cook: The Board reviewed Mr. Cook's request regarding the status of his guide license. Following a review and discussion of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Cook stating that in clarification of his request as regards the status of his guide license, that the Board has been informed by his employing outfitter, Leo Crane, dba Clearwater Outfitters, that Mr. Cook is no longer in his employ. Mr. Cook's guide license is therefore invalid until such time as he is again employed by another outfitter and so notifies the Board of his re-employment for the balance of this license year ending March 31, 1990.

Steven English: The Board reviewed Mr. English's file to note that a letter had been received from Mr. English's employing outfitter, Roger Monger, stating that Mr. English was no longer in his employ. Following which, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. English stating that the Board received said letter from his employing outfitter stating that he was no longer in his employ, and that his guide license is therefore invalid until such time as he is again employed by a licensed outfitter and so notifies the Board of his re-employment for the balance of this license year ending March 31, 1990.

Charles C. Boyd, dba Salmon River Experience: The Board reviewed Mr. Boyd's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of mountain bike touring in conjunction with and concurrent to his currently licensed activity of float boating on various river reaches, namely SA7A, SA7B, and SA8. Following review of this file and operating plan, and in consideration of the hazards involved as regards public health, safety, and welfare, MSC (Meiners--Miller) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. BOYD'S OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING ALONG SA7A, SA7B, AND SA8. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 36-2101, 36-2109(b)(4); AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19.

Lost Lakes Outfitters, Inc./Albert Latch, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Lost Lakes Outfitters, Inc./Albert Latch, Designated Agent, outfitter amendment request for the addition of trailrides in Fish and Game Management Unit 12, in the vicinity of Lolo Pass along the Montana/Idaho stateline. Review of the application finds that it is incomplete in that no worded operating area description was provided. Following which, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT LOST LAKES OUTFITTERS, INC./ALBERT LATCH, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 12, IN THE VICINITY OF LOLO PASS ALONG THE MONTANA/IDAHO STATELINE, BE APPROVED, BUT THAT AMENDED LICENSE NOT BE ISSUED UNTIL SUCH TIME AS AN APPROPRIATE WORDED AREA DESCRIPTION IS RECEIVED OUTLINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE OUTFITTING AREA REQUESTED AND APPROVED BY THE CHAIRMAN. (See addendum #2)

Boulder Outdoor Survival School, Inc./David L. Wescott, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Boulder Outdoor Survival School, Inc.'s file noting the December 18, 1989 letter from the Department of Fish and Game outlining their concerns regarding the outfitter amendment request for the conduct of activities in Fish and Game Management Units 60 and 60A. The Board further noted that this amendment request had been approved previously for conduct of requested activities. However, in view of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game's more recent recommendations, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD, BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT, AMEND BOULDER OUTDOOR SURVIVAL SCHOOL, INC.'S OUTFITTER LICENSE TO COMPLY WITH THE RESTRICTIONS AS SET FORTH IN THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME'S LETTER DATED DECEMBER 18, 1989 AS REGARDS REQUESTED ACTIVITIES IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 60 AND 60A. (See addendum #3)

The Board recessed for the evening at 1650 hours. The Board reconvened on Thursday, February 15, 1990, at 0830 hours. All Board members, except Dale Baird, are present. Board Executive Director, Board Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator are also present.

Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association/Amy L. Hoover: The Board reviewed Ms. Hoover's February 13, 1990 letter to the Board concerning the proposed Centennial Float Trip being sponsored and booked by the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association. Ms. Hoover requests guidance as to how to proceed in putting this trip together relative to involved outfitters or other individuals who may be participating in the Centennial Float Trip scheduled for late June - early July, 1990. Following review and discussion of this proposal, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD FINDS THE PROPOSED CENTENNIAL FLOAT TRIP AS BEING OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF THE ACT AS A DONATED TRIP AS A PARTICIPATORY ACTIVITY WITHIN THE IDAHO CENTENNIAL YEAR CELEBRATION WHEREIN THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ASSOCIATION SERVES AS A SPONSORING ORGANIZATION AROUND WHICH THE TRIP WILL BE BOOKED WITH AND CONDUCTED BY LICENSED IDAHO OUTFITTERS. FURTHER, THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MS. HOOVER ADVISING HER OF THE BOARD'S POSITION IN THIS REGARD.

David P. Markham, dba Adventure Outdoors: The Board reviewed Mr. Markham's outfitter license application in which he had requested licensing as an outfitter for the conduct of llama tours in the Sun Valley area and which, by prior Board action, said request had been denied. Mr. Markham requested a hearing before the Board regarding this denial. This is the time and place for the hearing, however, Mr. Markham called the Board to request a continuance of said hearing to allow him more time to gather additional information before appearing before the Board. The continuance was granted with the hearing to be held at the next Board meeting in April.

Kurt W. Selisch, dba Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Selisch's file and his letter of December 31, 1989 in which he requests a Board exemption to Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 53, as was granted to him during the 1988 float season. However, since granting this exemption to Rule 53 in 1988, the Board has developed waiver forms to be used in this instance. Both the participants in the float trip and the outfitter involved must sign waivers assuming full responsibility for their actions. These are not on file. MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. SELISCH'S REQUEST BE APPROVED SUBJECT TO RECEIPT OF SIGNED WAIVER FORMS FROM BOTH THE OUTFITTER AND PARTICIPANTS REGARDING THIS REQUESTED WAIVER TO RULE 53.

**Hughes River Expeditions, Inc./Jerry Hughes, Designated Agent/
Kurt W. Selisch, dba Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters/Omer H. Drury:** The Board reviewed the files of the respective licensees in consideration of the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between the parties involved, namely, that Hughes River Expeditions, Inc./Jerry Hughes, Designated Agent and Kurt W. Selisch, dba Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters, would purchase Omer

H. Drury's float boating business on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River, MF1 and MF2. Following a review of the contract of sale and schedule 1 attached thereto, and in consideration of the proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT 1) THE PROPOSED SALE OF THE OMER H. DRURY FLOAT BOATING BUSINESS ON MF1 AND MF2 BE APPROVED AND TRANSFERRED AS PROPOSED TO HUGHES RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC., AND KURT W. SELISCH, DBA MIDDLE FORK WILDERNESS OUTFITTERS; 2) THAT AS A NET RESULT OF THIS PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS, THE CURRENT OUTFITTER LICENSE ISSUED TO OMER H. DRURY WILL CEASE TO EXIST, THEREBY REQUIRING A REDUCTION IN THE NUMBER OF LICENSED OUTFITTERS ON MF1 AND MF2, REDUCING THE CURRENT NUMBER FROM 29 TO 28, WITH THIS PROPOSED REDUCTION ADDRESSED IN THE PROPOSED RULES CHANGE PACKAGE SCHEDULED FOR 1990.

McDevitt and Meyers/Jerry R. Meyers: In view of the letter of complaint received from Jerry R. Meyers, February 9, 1990, the Board excused Hank Miller from proceedings in review and consideration of the complaint letter received from Mr. Meyers. In considering this complaint received from Mr. Meyers, Board finds that allegations made in said letter are false and have no merit. Following which, MSC (Meiners--Crane) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. MEYERS OUTLINING THE BOARD'S POSITION REGARDING THIS COMPLAINT LETTER AND IN WHICH IS INDICATED THE BOARD WILL TAKE NO FURTHER ACTION ON SAID COMPLAINT.

Rule 28(c): The Board reviewed its records as regards licensed privileges removed under authority of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c) as applicable to both land-based and water-based activities. Following a review of the record regarding this matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT 1) LAND-BASED ACTIVITIES REMOVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH CRITERIA ESTABLISHED BY RULE 28(c) IN THOSE PORTIONS OF THE S. C. BUTTRAM, JOHN E. The Board recessed for lunch at 1135 hours and reconvened at 1300 hours.

Magnum Outfitters, Inc./Stephen I. McLemore, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Magnum Outfitters, Inc.'s file noting their outfitter license amendment request for the addition of various recreational activities, namely trailrides, backpacking, snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, wagonrides, sleighrides, and photography trips, within their current operating area boundaries. Review of the file finds that their current operating area boundaries include both land administered by the Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management and that land manager approval is not included in the file nor is a qualified individual indentified for the cross-country skiing. Following consideration of the foregoing review of Magnum Outfitters, Inc.'s file, the Board directs that this outfitter license amendment request be held and that a letter be addressed to Magnum Outfitters, Inc. to advise them of the matters which need to be completed before final board action can be taken on their request.

Outfitters Plus, Inc., dba Class V Whitewater/David B. Fisher, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Outfitters Plus, Inc., dba Class V Whitewater's file and outfitter license amendment request to change their corporate name to read "Idaho Whitewater Unlimited". All necessary paperwork and fees appear to have been completed and paid, following which, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CORPORATE NAME CHANGE.

Tour West, Inc./Howard Lewis, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Tour West, Inc.'s file, noting their outfitter license amendment request for the addition of photography trips as a licensable activity under their current license as well as their further request to change their designated agent from Mr. Howard Lewis to Mr. Frank Stratton. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS AS A LICENSABLE ACTIVITY TO BE

CONDUCTED ALONG THE SA6 RIVER CORRIDOR; AND 2) APPROVE MR. FRANK STRATTON AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE ALL ACTIVITIES.

Middle Fork River Co./Steve Lentz, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the Middle Fork River Co./Steve Lentz, Designated Agent, file in review of the ongoing appeal by Mr. Lentz of the Forest Service denial of his special use permit for conduct of boating and fishing activities on the Boise River - Danskin Bridge to Neal Bridge (B01). Additionally, the Board reviewed Mr. Lentz's petition before the Board to amend Rule 57(a) regarding licensed activity on this river reach and his letter dated February 2, 1990 in which Mr. Lentz has withdrawn his petition for consideration on B01 at this time pending outcome of his negotiations with the Forest Service regarding this matter. Following this review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. LENTZ'S WITHDRAWAL OF HIS PETITION.

Salmon River Tours Company, Inc./Mike McLain, Designated Agent and Salmon River Boat Tours, Inc./Bob Smith, Designated Agent: Messrs McLain and Smith met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Salmon River Boat Tours, Inc./Bob Smith, Designated Agent, outfitting business on the Salmon River (SA4A, SA5, and SA6), to Salmon River Tours Co., Inc./Mike McLain, Designated Agent, following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE TRANSFER AND SALE OF BUSINESS FROM SALMON RIVER BOAT TOURS, INC./BOB SMITH, DESIGNATED AGENT, TO SALMON RIVER TOURS COMPANY, INC./MIKE MCLAIN, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR CONDUCT OF POWER BOATING ON SA4A, SA5, AND SA6 AND RECREATIONAL FISHING; 2) THAT MR. MCLAIN BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, UNTIL SUCH TIME AS MR. SMITH, WHO WILL BE SERVING AS A LICENSED GUIDE UNDER THIS LICENSE, HAS ADEQUATELY TRAINED MR. MCLAIN TO BECOME SO LICENSED; 3) THAT THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS LICENSE SHALL BE BEGINNING APRIL 1, 1990 THROUGH MARCH 31, 1991 WITH LICENSE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES.

Steelhead Inc., dba Kingfisher Expeditions/Steve Settles, Designated Agent and Miller & Moser, dba Idaho Adventures/Hank Miller, Designated Agent: Messrs Settles and Miller met with the Board as regards a proposed sale and transfer of Miller & Moser, dba Idaho Adventures' float boating, fishing and chukar outfitting business on the Middle Fork Salmon River, MF1 and MF2. Following the interview and in consideration of documentation submitted with this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Epley--Crane, Miller abstains) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS FROM MILLER & MOSER, DBA IDAHO ADVENTURES/HANK MILLER, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING, FISHING AND CHUKAR HUNTING ON MF1 AND MF2 TO STEELHEAD INC., DBA KINGFISHER EXPEDITIONS/STEVE SETTLES, DESIGNATED AGENT; 2) THAT SAID TRANSFER OF BUSINESS SHALL BE CONSIDERED AN AMENDMENT TO STEELHEAD INC., DBA

KINGFISHER EXPEDITIONS CURRENT OUTFITTER LICENSE EFFECTIVE WITH LICENSE ISSUED AS SOON AS NECESSARY PAPERWORK AND PAYMENT OF FEES ARE RECEIVED; 3) THAT STEVE SETTLES BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR STEELHEAD INC., DBA KINGFISHER EXPEDITIONS, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE ON MF1 AND MF2 UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HIS TRAINING IS COMPLETED. IN THE MEANTIME, MR. MILLER SHALL SERVE AS THE QUALIFIED BOATMAN ON THESE RIVER REACHES; 4) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BY MR. SETTLES TO REDESIGNATE HIS CORPORATE NAME FROM SALMON RIVER WHITEWATER, INC., DBA KINGFISHER EXPEDITIONS, TO STEELHEAD INC., DBA KINGFISHER EXPEDITIONS, BE APPROVED UPON SUBMISSION OF PROPER PAPERWORK AND BONDING.

Tom Taylor, dba Indian Prairie Llama Tours: The Board reviewed Mr. Taylor's file and outfitter license application for the conduct of fishing and llama tours in Fish and Game Management Unit 10. This is an operating area that, at least in part, had formerly been requested by Quention Cook for similar activity other than for llama tours and for which the Forest Service had conducted a study. However, since that time, various communications have been received from the Forest Service and effected outfitters concerning Mr. Taylor's proposed outfitted activity to result in the Forest Service now requesting that the Board consider this application under the purview of the MOU, Amendment 1. Following which, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD CONCUR IN THE FOREST SERVICE REQUEST TO INITIATE NECESSARY PROCEDURES UNDER THE MOU, AMENDMENT 1, IN EVALUATION OF THIS PROPOSED ACTIVITY AND DIRECT THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. TAYLOR TO SO ADVISE HIM OF THE BOARD'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD.

Sevy Guide Service, Inc./Robert Sevy, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the February 8, 1990 letter received from Mr. Sevy in which he alludes to an error in the SA1 designation for walk and wade steelhead fishing along the upper Salmon River. Said letter states that the SA1 designation is not in concurrence with the regulations as developed by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game for conduct of this activity. Following a review of Mr. Sevy's letter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Sevy to advise him that 1) river reaches designated in the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 57(a), are those river reaches deemed by the Board as open to commercial outfitting, and 2) SA1, from Red Fish Lake Creek to Torrey's Bar, is that river reach established by the Board for conduct of walk and wade steelhead fishing and for which he has received a license for the conduct of said activity. Further, that approval of walk and wade steelhead fishing on SA1 resulted from a joint effort/participation by the Sawtooth National Recreation Area and the Idaho Department of Fish and Game.

L. P. Enright, dba Busterback Ranch/Jim Root, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Enright's file and outfitter license amendment request for an expanded operating area in which to conduct wagonrides. Said review of the file finds that the Sawtooth National Recreation Area and effected outfitters have no problem with this request for an expanded operating area within which to conduct wagonrides. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT SAID LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST BY L. P. ENRIGHT, DBA BUSTERBACK RANCH/JIM ROOT, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #4)

James R. Thrash, dba Salmon Meadows Lodge Outfitters/Wagon Wheel Corrals/Warren Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Thrash's outfitter license amendment request for an updated/corrected operating area boundary description to "correct discrepancies" as defined by Mr. Thrash. Following a review of the file, the Board finds that the amendment request is not complete, in that it does not have a Land Manager's signature on the sign off for approval of requested amendment. Following which, MSC (Meiners--Miller) THAT THE BOARD HOLD MR. THRASH'S OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST PENDING RECEIPT OF THE FOREST SERVICE EVALUATION AS INDICATED BY MR. VANCE IN HIS COMMENTS ON THE OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT FORM. FURTHER, THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. THRASH, ADVISING HIM OF THE BOARD'S ACTION IN THIS MATTER.

Robert C. Burlingame, dba Flying B Ranch/Michael R. Popp, Designated Agent: The Board met with Messrs Burlingame and Popp regarding Mr. Burlingame's outfitter license application for conduct of deer, elk, predator and bird hunting and fishing and trailride activities on privately owned land along Lawyers Canyon, near Kamiah, Idaho, in Fish & Game Management Unit 11A. Discussion of the proposed operation finds that Mr. Burlingame holds an Idaho Game Preserve License, #64-000005, which would pertain to his requested bird hunting, and that Mr. Popp would become designated agent if license application is approved. Following this discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE ROBERT C. BURLINGAME, dba FLYING B RANCH, OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF DEER, ELK, PREDATOR AND BIRD HUNTING AND FISHING AND TRAILRIDE ACTIVITIES; 2) ISSUE LICENSE SUBJECT TO INPUT/RECOMMENDATION OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME; AND 3) APPROVE MICHAEL R. POPP AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE ALL ACTIVITIES WHICH HIS EMPLOYING OUTFITTER IS AUTHORIZED TO OFFER. (See Addendum #5)

Hells Canyon Excursions, Inc./Floyd W. Harvey, Designated Agent: Mr. Harvey met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for the conduct of boating, fishing and other hunting activities on various river segments along the Clearwater, Snake, and Salmon rivers. During the course of the interview, Mr. Harvey

was advised that all available licenses have been awarded to current licensees with the exception of one slot on the Clearwater River (CL3), from Orofino to Lewiston, which may become available for relicensing due to non-use action. Beyond that potential available slot, no other license opportunities are currently available along the rivers requested. Additionally, Mr. Harvey was advised that he could make application to be placed on the waiting list for consideration for CL3, and that he could likewise file a petition with the Board under the State Administrative Procedures Act to go to rules making to increase the number of license slots on the various rivers in which he is interested. The Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Harvey to confirm these matters discussed with him during this meeting.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours. The Board reconvened on Friday, February 16, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Board Executive Director and Board Attorney are also present.

Board Attorney, Dallas Burkhalter: The Board, in consideration of the fact that Mr. Burkhalter has been in its employ for six months and has provided excellent service, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD CONTACT THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE TO RECOMMEND THAT DUE TO THE EXCELLENT SERVICES PROVIDED BY MR. BURKHALTER, THAT HE BE MOVED FROM PROBATIONARY TO PERMANENT STATUS AND GIVEN A 5 PERCENT PAY INCREASE EFFECTIVE AT THE BEGINNING OF THE NEXT PAY PERIOD.

Henry's Fork, Snake River: The Board reviewed the various use records of licensed outfitters who have been historically licensed on the Henry's Fork, Snake River, and the further fact that many have likewise been licensed to Henry's Lake and Island Park Reservoir. However, there is no real means by which to separate the respective uses on either the river itself or Henry's Lake or Island Park Reservoir. Consequently, for the 1989-90 license year, licensees will be requested to submit separate use records for Henry's Lake and Island Park Reservoir. Further, due alleged non-use of these waters and interest in people becoming licensed on just the lake and reservoir and not the stream, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) NOTIFY RESPECTIVE LICENSEES ON SH1, SH2, AND SH3 THAT THE BOARD WILL CONDUCT A HEARING PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2107(f) AND SUBPOENA ALL RECORDS TO ENABLE DETERMINATION OF USE ON THE HENRY'S FORK (SH1, SH2, AND SH3), TOGETHER WITH SUCH USE RECORDS, BOOKINGS, ETC., AS MAY HAVE BEEN MADE OF HENRY'S LAKE AND ISLAND PARK RESERVOIR; 2) APPOINT ITS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DEAN SANGREY, AS HEARING OFFICER FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID HEARINGS AT AN APPROPRIATE TIME AND PLACE APPROPRIATE TO PARTICIPATING PARTIES; 3) AUTHORIZE BOARD MEMBER TED EPLEY TO ASSIST IN SAID HEARINGS IN DETERMINATION OF USE FOR THE PAST FIVE LICENSE YEARS; AND 4) SCHEDULE SAID HEARINGS AT AN EARLY DATE TO ENABLE A REPORT TO THE BOARD AT ITS JUNE MEETING.

Brian Simi, dba Sheep Mountain Outfitting: The Board reviewed Mr. Simi's file and outfitter license application for the conduct of deer, elk, goat, sheep, bear, and cougar hunting, as well as fishing, trailriding, and photography activities in Fish and Game Management Units 27 and 36. The Board further noted the Forest Service February 7, 1990 letter in which they indicate they have been in contact with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game regarding Mr. Simi's proposed outfitting operation with their recommendation that the operating area requested not be licensed. Following consideration of Mr. Simi's application and recommendation by both the Forest Service and Department of Fish and Game, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. SIMI'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4, 5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(b, f, g) AS WELL AS RECOMMENDATIONS BY THE U. S. FOREST SERVICE AND IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1230 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours with all Board members present except Dale Baird and Hank Miller, who were excused to attend their Senate Confirmation Hearings at 1330 hours and returned at 1430 hours.

Proposed Rule Package: The Board completed its review of the proposed rules package, following which MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED RULES PACKAGE; 2) PROVIDE COPIES OF SAID RULES PACKAGE TO THE FOREST SERVICE AND BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RESPECTIVE MEMORANDUMS OF UNDERSTANDING, FOR THEIR REVIEW/RECOMMENDATION PRIOR TO PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION, WITH SUCH REVIEW AND WRITTEN COMMENT REQUESTED BY MARCH 23, 1990; 3) DIRECT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, UNLESS AGENCY RESPONSE REQUIRES FURTHER BOARD ACTION AT THE APRIL BOARD MEETING, TO PROCEED TO INITIATE THOSE PROCEDURES UNDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT FOR ADOPTION OF SAID RULES PACKAGE; AND 4) CONDUCT THREE HEARINGS, AT IDAHO FALLS, BOISE, AND LEWISTON, FOR THE PURPOSE OF TAKING/HEARING PUBLIC INPUT AS REGARDS SAID RULES PACKAGE, THAT SAID HEARING DATES SHALL BE MAY 15, 16, AND 17, RESPECTIVELY, WITH TIME AND LOCATION ANNOUNCED IN PUBLIC NOTICE.

Complaint Letters: The Board reviewed the complaints on file and instructed the Chairman/Executive Director to take necessary action/steps to resolve/answer same.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 1635 hours.


