OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD

Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

June 25-29, 1990

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, June 25, 1990, at 0800 hours with all Board members present together with Board's Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters, Kurt Selisch, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed a Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters, Kurt Selisch, Designated Agent, Rule 53 waiver request to permit Tom Thompson, Roland and Karen Robertson, and Rick Justin to row their own craft on MF1 and MF2, June 30 through July 5, 1990. After review of the waiver request forms by both the outfitter and clients and noting the completion of the application waivers received, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID WAIVER OF RULE 53 FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID TRIP AS REQUESTED.

**Joyce R. Jacobson, dba Jacobson Lure & Fly Company:** The Board reviewed Ms. Jacobson's outfitter license application for the conduct of fishing activities on Cascade Reservoir and the North Fork of the Payette River. This is a follow-up review of this application from the April meeting at which time said application was approved pending receipt of recommendations from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game. Said recommendations are now in hand with the following restrictions suggested: A) Cascade Reservoir 1) the applicant be limited to one boat or three float tubes in use at any one time and 2) that an annual maximum of 45 angler days be imposed; and B) North Fork of the Payette River 1) catch and release for trout, single barbless hook and no bait and 2) an annual maximum of 30 angler days be imposed. Following review of these recommendations, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE JACOBSON'S APPLICATION WITH RESTRICTIONS AS RECOMMENDED BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME.

**Fiscal Reports:** The Executive Director submitted financial reports for the months of April and May. Following review and discussion of these matters, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE REPORTS BE ACCEPTED AS SUBMITTED.

**Randy Evans:** Mr. Evans met before the Board relative to his application to become enforcement agent for the Board. Following review of application before the Board regarding his requested position MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD EMPLOY MR. EVANS AS A PART-TIME ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.

**Ralph L. Hatter, dba South Fork Outfitters/Ron Beitelspacher, dba Idaho Outfitters:** Mr. and Mrs. Hatter together with Ron Beitelspacher met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and

transfer of business by and between Mr. Beitelspacher and Mr. Hatter. Following the interview before the Board and review of the files regarding this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN MR. BEITELSPACHER AND MR. HATTER. FURTHER THAT LICENSED ACTIVITIES AND OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES AS LICENSED TO RON BEITELSPACHER, dba IDAHO OUTFITTERS SHALL TRANSFER TO RALPH L. HATTER, dba SOUTH FORK OUTFITTERS, AS CURRENTLY LICENSED. (See Addendum 1).

**Ralph L. Hatter, dba South Fork Outfitters:** Mr. Hatter met before the Board relative to his outfitter amendment request for the conduct of whitetail deer hunting on privately owned land, namely the Cutler Brothers operation in Fish & Game Management Unit 14. Following the interview before the Board regarding this matter and discussion of proposed operation the Board finds that Mr. Hatter has obtained, and filed with the Board, a lease for conduct of said operation on Cutler Brothers private property. However, the Board has not yet received Idaho Department of Fish & Game recommendation regarding this request, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE RALPH L. HATTER, dba SOUTH FORK OUTFITTERS AMENDMENT REQUEST PENDING RECEIPT OF IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATIONS WITH LICENSE TO BE ISSUED UNLESS FURTHER BOARD ACTION IS REQUIRED REGARDING SAID RECOMMENDATIONS. OPERATING AREA SHALL BE THE 6600 ACRES OWNED BY THE CUTLER BROTHERS. (See Addendum 1).

**Internal Investigation:** The Board reviewed the internal investigation conducted by the Idaho Department of Law Enforcement, Bureau of Investigations, relative to the allegations that have been made against Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis. This pertained to alleged interference with an ongoing investigation being conducted by the Idaho Department of Fish & Game. Following review of said investigative report, and discussion of same, MSC (Miller--Epley) (Crane - aye, Baird - nay, Meiners - aye, Epley -aye, Miller - aye) THAT THE BOARD DISMISS THE CASE. (Administrative Note: Letter(s) addressed to the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and Al Lewis, outlining the Board's action should be sent, thereby closing this matter.)

**Lazy J. Outfitters, Inc., Larry Jarrett, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the June, 1990 memorandum and enclosures submitted by Larry Jarrett's attorney, John Sutton, listing alleged complaints against Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis for misconduct in carrying out his responsibilities as the Board's Enforcement Coordinator. Following a review of this matter and the report by the Board's Attorney regarding his investigation of said alleged complaints, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) ADDRESS A LETTER TO MR. SUTTON ADVISING HIM THAT THE BOARD HAS INVESTIGATED THE

ALLEGATIONS FILED WITH THE BOARD AGAINST MR. LEWIS AND FOUND THAT SAID ALLEGATIONS WERE UNSUBSTANTIATED 2) DISMISS SAID ALLEGATIONS AGAINST MR. LEWIS, AND 3) ADDRESS A LETTER TO MR. LEWIS ADVISING HIM OF THE BOARD'S ACTION AND THAT THE BOARD CONSIDERS THE MATTER CLOSED.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1150 hours and reconvened at 1310 hours.

**Rule 57(b):** The Board reviewed rule 57(b) with specific reference to Lake Pend Orielle and the allocated authorization to license eleven (11) operators on said lake. Following a review of the historic background and discussion of this matter and the ongoing concern that the Board, the Idaho Department of Fish & Game, and concerned private citizens have expressed regarding the number of licensees and the potential impact said licensees may have on the fisheries resource within Lake Pend Orielle, MSC (Miller--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD 1) DECLARE A MORATORIUM ON ANY FURTHER LICENSE ACTIVITY ON LAKE PEND ORIELLE; 2) NOTIFY RESPECTIVE LICENSEES ON LAKE PEND ORIELLE THAT THE BOARD WILL CONDUCT A HEARING PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 35-2107(f) AND SUBPOENA ALL RECORDS TO ENABLE DETERMINATION OF USE ON LAKE PEND OREILLE TOGETHER WITH SUCH USE RECORDS, BOOKINGS, ETC., AS MAY HAVE BEEN MADE ON LAKE PEND OREILLE; 3) APPOINT ITS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DEAN SANGREY, AS HEARING OFFICER FOR CONDUCT OF SAID HEARINGS AT AN APPROPRIATE TIME AND PLACE CONVENIENT FOR PARTICIPATING PARTIES; 4) AUTHORIZE BOARD MEMBER TED EPLEY TO ASSIST IN SAID HEARINGS IN DETERMINATION OF USE FOR THE PAST THREE LICENSE YEARS; 5) SCHEDULE SAID HEARINGS AT AN EARLY DATE TO ENABLE A REPORT TO THE BOARD AT ITS OCTOBER/NOVEMBER (FALL) MEETING; AND 6) INITIATE NON-USE ACTION UNDER RULE 28(c)/RULES MAKING PROCEDURES AS MAY BE APPROPRIATE/DEEMED NECESSARY TO ADDRESS THE NUMBER OF LICENSEES ON SAID LAKE IN KEEPING WITH AUDIT/RESEARCH FINDINGS. Administrative Note: The Idaho Department of Fish and Game & Forest Service should be contacted as regards this information, hearing site, etc.

**Board Minutes - April Meeting:** The Board reviewed the minutes for its meeting of April 23-27, 1990. Following review and discussion of these minutes, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

**North Fork Ranger District, Orofino, Idaho:** The Board reviewed the June 4, 1990 letter from Art Bourassa, North Fork Ranger District, U.S. Forest Service, regarding the meeting Duane Annis, and Bert Bowler held with Dean Sangrey regarding potential fishing activities within the Kelly Creek drainage. The Forest Service recommends, and the Idaho Department of Fish and Game concurs in drafting an environmental assessment regarding any proposed additional use within the Kelly Creek and Cayuse Creek drainages.

Following review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD ADVISE MR. BOURASSA THAT THE BOARD CONCURS IN THEIR RECOMMENDATION AND THAT THEY PROCEED UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE MOU, AMENDMENT #1, TO ASSESS NEW OPPORTUNITIES IN THE KELLY AND CAYUSE CREEK DRAINAGES IN COOPERATION WITH THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME.

**Dave Rittersbacher, Art Seamans, and Ed Cole, U.S. Forest Service, Regarding Day Use Float Permits below Hells Canyon Dam (SN7):** Messrs Rittersbacher, Seamans, and Cole met with the Board in review of the impasse regarding day use float trips below Hells Canyon Dam (SN7). Mr. Rittersbacher, acting in his capacity of Capitol City Supervisor and in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding, Amendment #2, will submit a letter of recommendation to the Board as to what he believes are possible resolutions of this impasse to enable licensing of this activity to go forward.

**Sun Valley Trekking, Inc., Robert Jonas, Designated Agent:** Mr. Jonas met with the Board relative to his suggested changes in amending or otherwise updating the Boards Rules and Regulations as regards the licensing of ski guides. Following this discussion, the Board advised Mr. Jonas that they believed what he has in mind may have merit. They asked him to further develop his ideas regarding how to license ski guides as an alternative to PSIA requirements currently required by the Board. Further, he was asked to take a look at appropriate current rules in the Board's Rules and Regulations to suggest what changes may be required to update them in accordance with his recommendations. Hopefully this will be done to enable Board review at its August meeting for consideration and further action.

The Board recessed for the day at 1720 hours, and reconvened on Tuesday, June 26, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Board Attorney and Executive Director also present.

**Selway Lodge, Inc., Patricia G. Millington and Rick Hussey, Designated Agents:** The Board met with Ms. Millington, Mr. Hussey, their Attorney, Mr. Terry Hogue, and Mr. Bob Sevy relative to the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Everett L. Peirce, seller, and Patricia G. Millington, purchaser of the Selway Lodge and the outfitting business associated therewith. Following the interview before the Board, and discussion of the proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN EVERETT L. PEIRCE, SELLER, TO PATRICIA G. MILLINGTON, PURCHASER, WITH THE OPERATING AREA BEING THE SAME AS WAS PREVIOUSLY LICENSED TO MR. PEIRCE AND ACTIVITIES THUS LICENSED BEING: DEER, ELK, SHEEP, MOOSE, BEAR, COUGAR, PREDATORS, AND BIRD HUNTING, FISHING, TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING, WAGONRIDES, AND PHOTOGRAPHY

TRIPS; 2) APPROVE PATRICIA G. MILLINGTON AS DESIGNATED AGENT NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; 3) APPROVE RICK HUSSEY AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 4) ISSUE LICENSE(S) UPON SUBMISSION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY COMPLETED FINANCIAL STATEMENT AND LEASE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN MS. MILLINGTON AND MR. HUSSEY FOR THE USE OF HIS EQUIPMENT, AND PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum 2).

The Board recessed for lunch at 1155 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

**High Country Outfitters, Inc., Quentin Selby, Designated Agent:**  
The Board reviewed High Country Outfitters, Inc., file relative to past Board action in revoking High Country Outfitters, Inc. outfitters license. The operating area associated/licensed to High Country Outfitters, Inc. therefore may become available to another qualified applicant under the purview of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c). Contact has been made with the Forest Service in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding, Amendment #1, and the Idaho Department of Fish & Game regarding relicensing of the operating area. Following review of the input received from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game regarding the various segments of the operating areas licensed to High Country Outfitters, Inc., namely: Area #1 the Department recommends elimination of Area #1 for conduct of consumptive outfitting activities, and does support nonconsumptive use. (THE BOARD CONCURS IN THIS RECOMMENDATION); Area #2, the Department recommends no outfitted hunting for cougar or spring bear, does support nonconsumptive uses such as trailrides, backpacking, and other recreational activities. (THE BOARD CONCURS IN THIS RECOMMENDATION. HOWEVER, THE BOARD DOES NOT CONCUR IN THE DEPARTMENTS FURTHER RECOMMENDATION THAT A LIMIT BE IMPOSED REGARDING NUMBERS OF HUNTERS ALLOWED WITHIN AREA #2 FOR CONDUCT OF ARCHERY GENERAL HUNT ACTIVITIES AND DIRECTS A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME REQUESTING DATA THAT WOULD SUPPORT THEIR RECOMMENDATION. FURTHER, AT SUCH TIME AS AN ADVERTISEMENT GOES OUT UNDER RULE 28(c), SAID ADVERTISEMENT SHOULD SO NOTIFY THE PROSPECTIVE APPLICANT THAT A LIMITATION IN NUMBERS OF HUNTERS MAY BE IMPOSED AT A FUTURE DATE TO ACHIEVE BETTER GAME MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES); Area #3, it is the Boards position that Area #3 be deleted from any advertisement for conduct of any outfitted activities.

With the foregoing in mind the Board directs a letter be addressed to the Forest Service advising them of the Boards position regarding relicensing of the operating area formerly licensed to High Country Outfitter, Inc. Further, and in accordance of the MOU, Amendment #2, a meeting date be arranged wherein the Board Executive Director, Board Chairman, and a Forest Service representative meet to discuss this matter with a report to the Board at its August meeting, if at all possible, to enable further action to be taken.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1705 hours, and reconvened on Wednesday, June 27, 1990 at 0800 hours with all Board members present. Executive Director is present, Board Attorney will be in a bit late and Hank Miller will be leaving about 0830.

**Dave Stucker Outfitting:** Mr. Stucker met with the Board regarding his bear and cougar hunting operation on the Payette National Forest. He expressed his problems in obtaining necessary special use permits from the Forest Service for conduct of said activities. Following a review and discussion of this matter, Mr. Stucker was advised to address a letter to the Board outlining his problems in obtaining Forest Service special use permit for conduct of bear and cougar hunting activities to have something on record relative to the requirements of rule 28.

**Milt Butler, dba Chilly Ranch Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Butlers outfitter amendment request to add fishing, trailrides, backpacking, wagonrides and photography trips as licensable activities on operating areas designated on a map submitted with his application as Areas 1 and 2. Following a discussion and review of this amendment request, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) DENY MR. BUTLERS AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF REQUESTED ACTIVITIES WITHIN AREA #1. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(f), 2) APPROVE MR. BUTLERS AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE AREA DESIGNATED AS AREA #2 FOR THE CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING, WAGONRIDES AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS, AND 3) THAT FISHING BE HELD UNTIL SUCH TIME AS A RECOMMENDATION IS RECEIVED FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME RELATIVE TO THE CONDUCT OF FISHING WITHIN THIS AREA. (See Addendum 3).

**Cheryl Moore:** The Board reviewed Ms. Moore's 1990-91 guide license application and finds that Ms. Moore has apparently submitted a falsified American Red Cross First Aid Card. A check of American Red Cross Records in Salt Lake City and elsewhere does not sustain her being qualified and holding a current American Red Cross Card. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT CHERYL MOORE'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 6-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(1) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 32(a).

**Sevy Guide Service, Inc., Bob Sevy, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sevy's request for an exception to Outfitter and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 53, for a trip on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River July 21 - 26, 1990, for clients Don and Barbara Roberts. Following review of this request, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT SAID REQUEST BE APPROVED.

**Kenneth Wolfinbarger, dba Northstar Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Wolfinbarger's application to become designated agent for E. Edward Houghton, dba Running Creek Ranch. Following a review of the file, and application, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. WOLFINBARGER AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR RUNNING CREEK RANCH, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

**George Mustard:** The Board reviewed Mr. Mustard's 1990-91 guide license application noting that he had been convicted of a Fish and Game violation, which he did not acknowledge in Section C of his guide license application. However, he did submit a letter of explanation of this violation. Following a discussion and in consideration of Mr. Mustard's explanation, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. MUSTARD 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE CONDITIONS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE VIOLATE NO LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW, AND THAT NO AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR, EXPIRING MARCH 31, 1991.

**Outdoor Adventures, Inc., Robert J. Volpert, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Volpert's Rule 53 waiver form and request for James and Elizabeth Wilkerson to conduct a float trip down the Middle Fork of the Salmon River (MF1 and MF2), July 8 - 13, 1990. All forms appearing to be in order, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT SAID WAIVER BE APPROVED.

**Silver Creek Outfitters, Terry Ring, Designated Agent:** Mr. Ring met with the Board regarding his outfitter license amendment request to add numerous additional waters to his license for the conduct of fishing activities. Mr. Ring was advised that the Board would take his amendment request under consideration and initiate further research with input to be requested from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game. Upon receipt of the Departments response and recommendations the Board would take such action as deemed appropriate.

**Wayne Hill Outfitting:** Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Hill met with the Board regarding their outfitter license application as a sole proprietor for the conduct of deer, elk, bear, cougar, predator and bird hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 4. Following the interview and discussion of the application and finding that the Forest Service and Idaho Department of Fish and Game have no objections to the license application, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE WAYNE HILL OUTFITTING AS AN OUTFITTER FOR THE CONDUCT OF DEER, ELK, BEAR, COUGAR, PREDATOR AND BIRD HUNTING IN UNIT 4 TO EXCLUDE AN AREA WITHIN THE REQUESTED OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY LABELED "KEY ELK AREA" AS IDENTIFIED ON THE MAP ATTACHED TO THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION AND AS AGREED TO BY THE PANHANDLE NATIONAL FOREST AND THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND

GAME. 2) NOTES THE OPERATING AREA REQUESTED DOES IN FACT, FALL WITHIN AN AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO S.C. BUTTRAM FOR THE CONDUCT OF BEAR HUNTING. HOWEVER, IN RECOGNITION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATION, THE BOARD RESCINDS IT'S POSITION UNDER RULE 28 TO EXCLUDE FURTHER OUTFITTED ACTIVITIES IN THIS PARTICULAR PORTION OF THE OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO S.C. BUTTRAM, 3) APPROVE MR. HILL QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, AND 4) ISSUE LICENSE UPON PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum 4).

The Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours and reconvened at 1320 hours.

**John Harrington:** The Board reviewed Mr. Harrington's 1990-91 Guide License Application to become a guide for Moser's Idaho Adventures River Trips, noting that he had indicated on his application that he had been convicted of a felony some 24 years ago. The Board finds that Mr. Harrington appears to have kept his record clean since that time, and following review of this application, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. HARRINGTON'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION.

**Tim J. Roberts:** The Board reviewed Mr. Roberts 1990-91 Guide License Application to become licensed as a guide under the employ of J & J Outfitters. The Board notes that Mr. Roberts has indicated on his application that he may have been convicted of a 1982 Fish and Game violation. Following review of this matter and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. ROBERTS 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF PROBATION BEING NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE FOR THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991.

**Lloyd Schoenauer:** The Board reviewed Mr. Schoenaur's designated agent license application for Devil's Bedstead Ranch. Following review of the file and noting that Mr. Schoenauer has provided false information in Section C of said application in which he indicates no conviction of Idaho Law, namely violation of Idaho Code Title 36 Chapter 21, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. SCHOENAUER'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(1) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 8(b)(i).

**W. Gregory Loomis:** The Board reviewed Mr. Loomis's file and guide license amendment request for addition of SA3 to his license and his further request to be licensed as lead guide on SA3. The Board further noted that on April 30, 1990, Mr. Loomis was convicted for violation of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Law, specifically Rule 52(d). Following consideration/discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT 1) MR. LOOMIS' GUIDE LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST

BE HELD PENDING POSSIBLE FURTHER BOARD ACTION AGAINST BOTH MR. LOOMIS AND HIS EMPLOYING OUTFITTER, OMNISPORTS, INC., DBA THE SNUG COMPANY, AND 2) SAID OUTFITTER BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THEIR OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(14), AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 52(d). (Administrative Note: Fish and Game officer Tony Latham should be requested to appear before the Board as a witness in this matter.)

**William W. Mason Jr.:** The Board reviewed Mr. Masons designated agent license application to become designated agent for Omnisports, dba the Snug Company. Following review of the file and discussion of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MASON AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, FOR OMNISPORTS, DBA THE SNUG COMPANY.

**Charles D. Stelzer:** Mr. Stelzer met with the Board regarding his outfitter license application to become licensed for fishing, trailrides, backpacking, sleighrides, and photography trip activities in Fish and Game Management Units 59 and 59A. Following review of the file and interview with Mr. Stelzer, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. STELZER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF FISHING, TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING, SLEIGHRIDES, AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS WITHIN THAT OPERATING AREA AS OUTLINED ON THE ATTACHED MAP TO THE APPLICATION. FURTHER THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum 5).

**Francis M. Mangum, dba Allstate Outfitters:** Mr. Mangum and his attorney David Hammerquist met with the Board relative to Mr. Mangum's outfitter license application to become licensed for the conduct of cougar hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 40. Following the interview before the Board, and in consideration of the June 14, 1990 letter from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, in which they recommended that no further cougar hunting be licensed in Unit 40, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. MANGUM'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR COUGAR HUNTING IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 40. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5), AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(f)(g).

**Ronald A. Nowell:** Mr. Nowell and Mr. Jim Sullivan met with the Board relative to Mr. Nowell's designated agent license application for Middle Fork Ranch, Inc. Following the interview before the Board and review of the file, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. NOWELL AS DESIGNATED AGENT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR MIDDLE FORK RANCH, INC., AND THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON CONFIRMATION THAT HIS NAME HAS BEEN ADDED TO MIDDLE FORK RANCH, INC.'S BOND.

**Beau Magers:** Mr. Magers appeared before the Board relative to his interest in becoming licensed as an outfitter in that area formerly licensed to Richard Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch. During the discussion, Mr. Magers was advised that a) the period of time in which Mr. Grunch could have appealed the Board's decision has expired and b) the revocation of Mr. Grunch's outfitter license is in place, thereby triggering Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c), and the Memorandum of Understanding with the U.S. Forest Service, and c) The Board has taken no position on relicensing the operating area to date. He was further advised that he should submit an application to be placed onto the waiting list for consideration at such time as the operating area may become available for relicensing to a successful applicant.

**James Dowd:** Mr. and Mrs. Dowd met with the Board in a denial hearing of Mr. Dowd's 1990-91 Guide License Application for violation of Fish and Game law. In consideration of the testimony offered before the Board regarding the violations in question, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS DENIAL OF MR. DOWD'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION, AND ISSUE SAID LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE 1) NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW, NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR, ENDING MARCH 31, 1991. AND 2) THAT PRIOR TO ISSUANCE OF ANY FUTURE GUIDES LICENSE TO MR. DOWD THAT HE BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AND PASS AN APPROPRIATE GUIDES LICENSE EXAMINATION.

**Waldo Kenneth Phillips, dba Bear Creek Outfitters:** Mr. Phillips, and Mr. and Mrs. Lyle E. Phelps, dba Bear Creek Outfitters, met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Mr. Phelps and Mr. Phillips. Following the interview before the Board, and review of the file regarding this matter, MSC (Crane--Miller) (Crane - aye, Baird -aye, Meiners - nay, Epley - nay, Miller - aye) THAT THE BOARD DENY THE PURPOSED PURCHASE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN MR. PHELPS, SELLER, TO MR. PHILLIPS, PURCHASER. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c).

**Billy W. Hampton:** Mr. Hampton together with his attorney, Steven W. French, his employing outfitter, Ellen Shaw, witness Rex Betts, and Idaho Department Fish and Game Conservation Officer, E. Blake Phillips, met with the Board in a denial hearing regarding the Board's denial of Mr. Hampton's 1990-91 guide license. Following the hearing and in consideration of testimony offered before the

Board in the course of this hearing, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS DENIAL OF MR. HAMPTON'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION AND ISSUE SAID GUIDE LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. PROVISIONS OF SUCH PROBATION SHALL BE 1) NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE DURING THE COURSE OF THE LICENSE YEAR, ENDING MARCH 31, 1991, 2) MR. HAMPTON BE REQUIRED TO PASS AN APPROPRIATE GUIDE LICENSE EXAMINATION BEFORE ISSUANCE OF ANY SUBSEQUENT GUIDE LICENSE TO HIM, AND 3) THAT MR. HAMPTON'S LICENSED ACTIVITIES ARE LIMITED TO THOSE ACTIVITIES FOR WHICH HIS EMPLOYING OUTFITTER, ELLEN SHAW, IS LICENSED, WITH LICENSE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION/SUBMISSION OF NECESSARY TRAINING FORMS TO THE BOARD.

**Stewart Fitzgerald:** Mr. Fitzgerald appeared before the Board in a denial hearing of his 1990-91 Guide License Application for the conduct of deer, elk, bear, cougar, and predator hunting under the employ of Salmon River Lodge. Following the hearing before the Board, and in consideration of the explanation and testimony given by Mr. Fitzgerald, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS DENIAL OF MR. FITZGERALD'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION AND ISSUE SAME ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. PROVISIONS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT 1) HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW AND NO AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE WILL BE MADE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR, ENDING MARCH 31, 1991, AND 2) THAT HE BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AND PASS AN APPROPRIATE GUIDES EXAMINATION BEFORE ANY SUBSEQUENT GUIDES LICENSES ARE ISSUED TO HIM.

**Richard VanderMeyden, dba Wilderness Lodge/Brian E. Butz, dba B & K Outfitters:** Messers Butz and VanderMeyden met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of a portion of Mr. Butz's outfitters business conducted in that portion of his operating area located within Richard VanderMeyden's licensed operating area. Following the interview before the Board, and in discussion and review of this proposed sale and transfer of business to note both Forest Service and Idaho Department of Fish and Game concurrence, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF A PORTION OF BRIAN E. BUTZ, DBA B & K OUTFITTERS, BUSINESS, IN SAID OPERATING AREA AS SHOWN ON BOARD MAP AS AREA #1, TO RICHARD VANDERMEYDEN, DBA WILDERNESS LODGE. (See Addendum 6 and 7).

The Board recessed for lunch at 1125 hours and reconvened at 1225 hours.

**Proposed Rules:** Following the review of the proposed rules package and comments received pursuant thereto, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ADOPT THE PROPOSED RULES PACKAGE AS AMENDED, AND THAT SAID RULES PACKAGE BE MADE EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 1990. FURTHER, THAT APPROPRIATE DISTRIBUTION OF SAID RULES BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT.

**West Fork Ranger District/14 Day Stay Limit:** - The Board reviewed a series of complaints which have been received regarding potential illegal outfitting activities allegedly taking place within the West Fork Ranger District, Bitterroot National Forest. The Board also considered Board Member Ted Epley's report as to his investigation of this matter, following which MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE BITTERROOT NATIONAL FOREST SUPERVISOR, WITH A COPY TO THE REGION I REGIONAL FORESTER, TO BRING THIS MATTER TO THEIR ATTENTION AND ASK THAT THEY LOOK INTO THE SITUATION AND RESPOND TO THE BOARD AS TO THE NATURE AND CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE ISSUANCE OF THESE SPECIAL USE PERMITS. (Administrative Note: Copies of this letter should be sent to the District Ranger of the West Fork Ranger District).

**G & L York Outfitters, Inc., Gladys York, Designated Agent:** Mrs. York, attorney Bob Brower, Leon York and Dave McMullin, appeared before the Board in a re-hearing of the show cause hearing before the board for suspension or revocation of the G & L York Outfitters, Inc., outfitters license. Following the re-hearing and in consideration of the material presented during that hearing, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) SET ASIDE ITS ORIGINAL JUDGEMENT OF REVOCATION OF THE G & L YORK, INC. OUTFITTERS LICENSE, AND IN LIEU THEREOF IMPOSE A SUSPENSION OF SAID OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE 1990 LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991; 2) DEFINE SAID SUSPENSION OF OUTFITTER LICENSE AS TOTAL, IN THAT NO OUTFITTING ACTIVITIES OR BOOKING OF CLIENTS WILL BE CONDUCTED DURING THE REMAINDER OF THE 1990 LICENSE YEAR; 3) REAFFIRM THE PREVIOUS FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AS STILL APPLICABLE TO THIS MATTER, ONLY THE ORDER WILL CHANGE FROM A REVOCATION TO SUSPENSION OF SAID OUTFITTERS LICENSE; AND 4) DIRECTS THE BOARD'S EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DEAN SANGREY, TO DRAFT AND SIGN SUCH DOCUMENTS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE BOARD'S ACTION AND DECISION IN THIS MATTER AND TO SO NOTIFY G & L YORK OUTFITTERS, INC.

**Phillip "Bub" Smith:** Mr. Smith appeared before the Board in a denial hearing regarding the denial of his outfitter amendment request for the conduct of bear hunting within his currently licensed operating area. Following the hearing, and in consideration of the testimony offered before the Board, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT UPON HEARING NO EVIDENCE TO COUNTER THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATION, THE BOARD'S DENIAL IS HEREBY SUSTAINED.

**Consideration of Applicants for Various Vacancies Created by the Application of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28:**

**Selway River - SE2:** After due advertisement of this vacancy available to be licensed again to a qualified applicant, two applications were received, one from Glacier Raft Co. -Idaho, and another from Peter H. Grubb, dba River Odysseys West (ROW). A check of board records finds that two vacancies are available and in as much as only two applications were received, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT GLACIER RAFT CO. - IDAHO, AND PETER H. GRUBB, DBA RIVER ODYSSEYS WEST (ROW) BE SELECTED TO FILL THE AVAILABLE SLOTS.

**Snake River - SN5:** SN5, according to Board records, one slot is available and only one letter of interest was submitted by R & R Outdoors, Inc., expressing their desire to be licensed for this river reach. However, they did not complete the necessary paperwork to enable the Board to make a proper selection in accordance with Idaho Outfitter and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 11. Following which, MSC (Miller--Meiners) THAT THIS SN5 SLOT REMAIN OPEN FOR FURTHER CONSIDERATION.

**Clearwater River - CL3:** In considering the one available slot on CL3, seven applications were received. After due consideration of these applications and operating plans, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT GEORGE E. DUNCAN, OUTFITTER AND GUIDE, BE THE SELECTEE TO FILL THE SPACE ON CL3.

Administrative Note: Notification to all applicants should be made to advise them of the Board's actions/selections.

**Lemhi/Custer County Joint Use Areas:** Nine individuals met with the Board in an informational meeting concerning the possible elimination of both the Custer County cougar hunting and Lemhi County bear and cougar hunting joint use areas. Following this meeting and in consideration/discussion of the testimony provided the Board, MSC (Crane--Meiners)(Crane - aye, Baird - aye, Epley - aye, Miller - aye, Meiners - aye) THAT THE BOARD TAKE APPROPRIATE STEPS TO ABOLISH THE CUSTER COUNTY JOINT USE COUGAR HUNTING AREA AND THE LEMHI COUNTY BEAR-COUGAR JOINT USE AREA, PURSUANT TO AUTHORITY UNDER IDAHO CODE 36-2110(b) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 24(a)(b)(c). FURTHER, THAT EACH INDIVIDUAL CURRENTLY LICENSED IN ONE OF THESE TWO AREAS BE ADVISED THAT A SHOW CAUSE HEARING WILL BE SCHEDULED FOR THEM TO PROVIDE TESTIMONY AS TO WHY THIS BOARD ACTION SHOULD, OR SHOULD NOT, BE IMPOSED EFFECTIVE FOR THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR.

**Michael Scott, dba White Cloud Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Scott's outfitter amendment request for the conduct of a sheep hunt to be conducted outside of his currently licensed operating area. In reviewing his request, the Board finds that Mr. Scott has

obtained the written approval of Frank Valvo, the licensed outfitter in the area where the hunt will occur and the approval of the Challis Ranger District. The individual booked for this hunt is Mr. Dan Bonnell, sheep hunt 536B-2, hunting license number 202-0-013531, permit number 801-0-000162, and tag number 420-0-000022. Following review of these matters, and in consideration thereof, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. SCOTT'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID SHEEP HUNT ON A ONE-TIME-ONLY BASIS FOR THE 1990 BIG HORN SHEEP HUNTING SEASON.

**Jon Barker:** The Board reviewed Mr. Barker's designated agent license application to become designated agent for Wally and Myrna Beamer, dba Beamers Float Trips. Following review of the file and discussion of this application, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. JON BARKER AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR WALLY AND MYRNA BEAMER, DBA BEAMERS FLOAT TRIPS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

**William R. Millick:** The Board reviewed Mr. Millick's designated agent license application for S-Bar-S Outfitters. Following review of the file and in consideration of this application, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MILLICK AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR S BAR S OUTFITTERS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

**Earl R. Keating, Jr. dba Keating Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Keating's outfitter amendment request for the addition of moose hunting as a licensable activity within his currently licensed operating area. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. KEATING'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF MOOSE HUNTING WITHIN HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA.

**James R. Thrash, dba Wagon Wheel Corrals:** The Board reviewed Mr. Thrash's outfitter amendment request for a clarification in the operating area boundaries relative to his trailriding activities. Following a review of this request, and in recognition of the input received from the Forest Service dated May 15, 1990, MSC (Crane--Baird)(Epley abstains) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. THRASH'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST PENDING RECEIPT OF A PROPERLY WORDED AREA DESCRIPTION AS REQUIRED ON THE AMENDMENT REQUEST (SECTION E). (See Addendum 8).

**Paul Resnick, dba The Shepp Ranch:** The Board reviewed the June 14, 1990 letter received from Mr. Resnick regarding his proposed arrangement with Jim Temple to provide accommodations for float boating as associated with The Shepp Ranch. Following which, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO MR. RESNICK ADVISING HIM OF WHAT HE MUST DO TO ACCOMMODATE HIS FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER SA6, AND ENABLE HIM TO UTILIZE MR. TEMPLES SERVICES FOR CONDUCT OF THESE TRIPS, 1) THAT HE, MR. RESNICK, CAN ONLY SERVE AS A BOOKING AGENT AND ALL MONIES AND

CLIENTS MUST BE BOOKED THROUGH MR. TEMPLE; 2) ALL EQUIPMENT MUST BE UNDER MR. TEMPLES OWNERSHIP OR LEASE; AND 3) ALL GUIDES MUST BE QUALIFIED AND UNDER MR. TEMPLES EMPLOY. FURTHER, COPIES OF THIS LETTER SHOULD BE PROVIDED TO MR. TEMPLE AND ROGERS THOMAS, WITH CONFIRMATION REQUESTED FROM MR. TEMPLE AS TO WHATEVER ARRANGEMENT MAY ULTIMATELY BE MADE, IF ANY.

**Rich Cook, dba Cooks Idaho Adventures:** The Board reviewed Mr. Cook's various outfitter amendment requests for the conduct of various activities which he has requested to conduct within Fish and Game Management Units 14, and 18, and the Gospel Hump Wilderness. Following consideration of Mr. Cook's amendment requests and noting the various areas and activities he has requested thereby making it difficult to request input from the Forest Service and Idaho Department of Fish and Game, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. COOK REQUESTING CLARIFICATION AND MORE DEFINITIVE DESCRIPTIONS AS TO JUST WHAT OPERATING AREA(S) AND ACTIVITIES WITHIN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 14 AND 18 AND THE GOSPEL HUMP WILDERNESS HE WOULD WISH TO OPERATE AND WHAT WATERS DOES HE PROPOSE TO FISH. ADDITIONALLY, THE BOARD WOULD REQUEST THAT HE PROVIDE A PROPERLY WORDED AREA DESCRIPTION FOR THE OPERATING AREAS REQUESTED.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1705 hours, and reconvened on Friday, June 29, 1990, at 0810 hours with all Board members present except Ted Epley, who has been excused to participate in the Centennial Float. Board Attorney and Executive Director also present.

**Nightingale Nordic, Inc., Richard M. Rossignol, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Rossignol's preliminary outfitter license application as to whether he would be required to be licensed as an outfitter for the conduct of cross country skiing in the vicinity of Lolo Pass. In review of this matter, the board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Rossignol to inform him that indeed he would need to be licensed as an outfitter and that to complete his application we would also need a log of his experience to determine his qualifications for conducting such activity.

**Bill Grasser:** The Board reviewed Mr. Grasser's 1990-91 Guide License Application noting his Fish and Game violations and acknowledgement of same on the application. Following review of this information, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. GRASSER BE ISSUED HIS 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

**Gary Busby:** The Board reviewed Mr. Busby's 1990-91 Guide License Application, noting that he had been convicted of a felony. Following review of the file and letters of recommendation from his probation officer and employing outfitter, Gary Moser, MSC (Crane

--Miller) THAT MR. BUSBY'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT 1) HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991, AND 2) HE TAKE AN APPROPRIATE GUIDES EXAMINATION BEFORE ANY SUBSEQUENT GUIDE LICENSE IS ISSUED TO HIM.

**Leo Crane, dba Clearwater Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Crane's outfitter amendment request for the addition of trailriding activities in Fish and Game Management Units 9 and 9A, which are outside his currently licensed operating area boundary. Following review of the file, input from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, and information from the Clearwater National Forest, MSC (Baird--Meiners)(Crane abstains) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. CRANE'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF TRAILRIDES IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 9 AND 9A, WITH THE STIPULATION THAT IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 9 THAT NO CAMPS WILL BE PLACED IN THE VICINITY OF THE LAKE AND THAT THIS APPROVAL IS SUBJECT TO FOREST SERVICE CONCURRENCE WITH REGARD TO CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITY IN UNIT 9. OPERATING AREA SHALL BE AS DEFINED ON MR. CRANE'S APPLICATION IN WHICH HE HAS NOTED THE VARIOUS TRAILS HE WILL BE UTILIZING. (See Addendum 9).

**Ralph Oswald, dba Oswald Pack Camp:** The Board reviewed Mr. Oswald's outfitter amendment request for the conduct of deer, bear, cougar, predator and bird hunting on his own private property. Following a review of this application, and in consideration of Idaho Department of Fish and Game concerns, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. OSWOLD'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF DEER HUNTING LIMITED TO TEN CLIENTS, PREDATOR AND BIRD HUNTING, (SPECIFICALLY FOREST GROUSE AND CHUKAR), AND 2) DENY MR. OSWOLD'S REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME CONCERNS RELATIVE TO BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING EXPRESSED IN THEIR RESPONSE TO PREVIOUS APPLICANTS IN THIS AREA. (See Addendum 10).

**Randy Phillips:** Mr. Phillips and Kathy Sanders requested an interview before the Board to discuss the situation that currently exists on Lake Pend Orielle as regards to their operation thereon.

**Fred Ehlert, dba Alpenhaus Motel and Fly Shop:** Mr. Ehlert had a scheduled hearing before the Board relative to the denial of his outfitter renewal application. However, Mr. Ehlert's letter of June 21, 1990, requested a continuation until a later date. The Board directs that he be advised his continuation is approved and he is scheduled to appear at the August Board meeting.

**Cougar Creek Ranch, Inc., dba Cougar Ranch Outfitter, Brent Hill, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Cougar Creek Ranch, Inc.'s request for name change from Cougar Ranch Outfitters, Ltd., to become known as Cougar Creek Ranch, Inc., dba Cougar Ranch Outfitters. All officers, operating area, and license activities remain the same as was previously licensed to Cougar Ranch Outfitters, Ltd., MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE COUGAR CREEK RANCH, INC., dba COUGAR RANCH OUTFITTERS AMENDMENT AS REQUESTED AND APPROVE BRENT HILL AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE WITH OPERATING AREA AND ACTIVITIES THE SAME AS FORMERLY LICENSED TO COUGAR RANCH OUTFITTERS, LTD. (See Addendum 11).

**Robert R. Anderson, dba Anderson Outfitting:** The Board reviewed Mr. Anderson's outfitter license amendment request for adjustment in his operating area boundary to include his base camp which presently is located outside the boundary of his current operating area. Review of the file finds that the Forest Service and the Idaho Department of Fish and Game have no objections to this adjustment of the operating area boundary. Inasmuch as said area does not fall within another outfitters operating area, and in consideration of the other information, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. ANDERSON'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR AN ADJUSTMENT IN HIS OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY. (See Addendum 12).

**Steve Wieber, dba Happy Hooker Excursions:** The Board reviewed Mr. Wieber's file noting that he apparently has made a change in his business name and has not properly notified the Board nor the Forest Service regarding this change. Further, the Executive Director has contacted Mr. Wieber at which time Mr. Wieber indicated he would submit the necessary paperwork to make the change but the Board has had no further communication from Mr. Wieber regarding this matter. And, finally, the Board took note of a certified letter dated June 4, 1990 received by the Board June 11, 1990, in which Mr. Wieber has been issued a citation for violation of his U.S. Forest Service permit, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. WIEBER IN WHICH HE 1) BE REQUESTED TO COMPLETE THE NECESSARY AMENDMENT APPLICATION FORMS TO THE BOARD TO CHANGE HIS BUSINESS NAME, AND 2) BE URGED TO COME INTO IMMEDIATE COMPLIANCE WITH HIS U.S. FOREST SERVICE PERMIT TO PRECLUDE ADVERSE ACTION BEING TAKEN AGAINST HIS OUTFITTERS LICENSE BY THE BOARD.

**Northwest Dorries, Inc., Curtis Chang, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Northwest Dorries, Inc.'s outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of mountain bike touring on the McGruder Corridor. This is an amendment request which was originally filed March 22, 1989, that triggered the Memorandum of Understanding and Forest Service participation in determining whether this new opportunity would/could be accommodated. The Forest Service has

now completed their environmental assessment and by letter dated May 2, 1990, concurs in the fact that they would issue a special use permit for the conduct of mountain bike touring utilizing the Elk City to Darby road, Road #468, from Nez Pierce Pass to Red River Hot Springs. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE NORTHWEST DORIES, INC. OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING AS AGREED TO BY THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE, NAMELY TO OCCUR ON THE ELK CITY TO DARBY ROAD, ROAD #468, FROM NEZ PIERCE PASS TO THE RED RIVER HOT SPRINGS. (See Addendum 13).

**Richard Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch:** The Board reviewed Mr. Grunch's file noting that following the Board decision and order revoking his outfitters license, that Mr. Grunch has not appealed this decision and order. Therefore, his outfitter license is hereby relinquished, triggering Rule 28(c) and the relicensing of the operating area formerly licensed to Mr. Grunch, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) DETERMINE IT IS THE BOARDS POSITION THAT THE ENTIRE AREA SHOULD BE SUBJECT TO RELICENSING UNDER THE PURVIEW OF RULE 28(c) 2) THAT THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE AND IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME BE CONTACTED RELATIVE TO THEIR POSITION IN THIS REGARD, AND ASKING THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS ON SAME, AND 3) UPON COMPLETION OF THE NECESSARY COORDINATION REGARDING THE RELICENSING OF THE OPERATING AREA, THE BOARD MOVE FORWARD TO ACCOMPLISHING SAME.

**Mike R. Mulligan, dba Mulligan's Snowmobile Tours:** The Board reviewed Mr. Mulligan's outfitter amendment request for the conduct of four wheel ATV tours within his currently licensed operating area, with the exception of operating area #3, and including an extension along Road #158. Further, the file shows that neither the Forest Service nor the Idaho Department of Fish and Game have any problem with Mr. Mulligan's amendment request. MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MULLIGAN'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF FOUR WHEEL ATV TOURS, INCLUDING HIS REQUEST TO EXTEND HIS TOURS OUTSIDE HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA #3 TO WINDOW LAKE ALONG ROAD #158. (See Addendum 14).

**Steve Schaffers:** The Board reviewed Mr. Schaffers outfitter amendment request for the addition of chukar hunting as a licensable activity along his currently licensed operating area, namely SA8. The Board further noted the June 17, 1990, letter from the Department of Fish and Game in which they recommend denial of this application. Following which, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE CHUKAR HUNTING AS A LICENSABLE ACTIVITY IN CONJUNCTION WITH MR. SCHAFFERS FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITY ON SA8. (Administrative Note: Mr. Schaffers outfitter license renewal form does not indicate a dba, however his outfitter amendment request

indicates that he has a dba of Schaffers Guide Service. This should be checked out as to whether this is in fact true.)

**Phillip A. Johnson:** The board reviewed Mr. Johnson's file noting that he apparently is in non-use status and that his use records do not show any use on SA1 for the past three years, his statement on his outfitter renewal request referencing his health notwithstanding, following which MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT MR. JOHNSON BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY THIS LICENSE PRIVILEGE SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED UNDER PURVIEW OF OUTFITTER AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 22. FURTHER, A LETTER SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO THE SAWTOOTH NRA REQUESTING VERIFICATION OF MR. JOHNSON'S SPECIAL USE PERMIT STATUS.

**Thomas R. Sorenson:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sorenson's outfitter license application for the conduct of powerboat fishing and photography trips on SN6 and Brownlee, Oxbow, and Hells Canyon Reservoirs. Following review of the file, and in consideration of his application, MSC (Crane--Miller)(Crane - aye, Baird - nay, Meiners - aye, Miller - aye) THAT MR. SORENSON'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED FOR THE CONDUCT OF POWER BOAT FISHING AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS ON THAT PORTION OF SN6 FROM WALTERS FERRY BRIDGE DOWNSTREAM TO THE BACKWATERS OF BROWNLEE RESERVOIR, AND FOR OXBOW AND HELLS CANYON RESERVOIRS. FURTHER, THAT HIS APPLICATION FOR THE BROWNLEE RESERVOIR BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 57(b) IN WHICH THERE ARE TWO SPOTS AVAILABLE AND THEY ARE CURRENTLY FILLED.

**Lynn E. Miller, dba Lower Salmon Express:** Lynn E. Miller, dba Lower Salmon Express Inc., purchaser and Ken E. Jacks, dba Lower Salmon Express Inc., seller, appeared before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Jacks float boating business on the Salmon River (SA8), to Mr. Miller with Mr. Miller keeping the corporate name and entity as currently licensed to Mr. Jacks. Following the interview before the Board and review of the file, and receipt of Mr. Millers request to become designated agent under the corporate structure, qualified to guide, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN MR. JACKS, SELLER, TO MR. MILLER, PURCHASER, FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING BUSINESS ON THE LOWER SALMON RIVER, SA8 PLUS THE ACTIVITIES OF FISHING AND CHUKAR HUNTING. FURTHER, THAT MR. MILLER BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE AT THE PRESENT TIME, BUT THAT MR. JACKS WILL SERVE AS A GUIDE FOR MR. MILLER UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HE IS QUALIFIED TO DO SO HIMSELF.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1135 hours and reconvened at 1305 hours.

**H. William (Bill) Belknap, dba Eagle Outings:** The Board reviewed Mr. Belknap's outfitter license application for the conduct of float boating, incidental fishing, backpacking, and photography trips and auto tours essentially throughout the State of Idaho. Following the interview before the Board regarding his request to be licensed for the conduct of the foregoing activities, and in consideration of the land managers sign off sheets Mr. Belknap has obtained, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE H. WILLIAM BELKNAP, DBA EAGLE OUTINGS', OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF BACKPACKING, PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS, AND AUTO TOURS AND THAT SUCH ACTIVITIES BE RESTRICTED TO THOSE AREAS KNOWN AS THE BOISE DISTRICT, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, AND THE BOISE, IDAHO CITY AND MOUNTAIN HOME RANGER DISTRICTS OF THE BOISE NATIONAL FOREST. FURTHER, THAT HIS REQUEST FOR FLOAT BOATING ON ANDERSON RANCH, ARROWROCK, C.J. STRIKE AND SALMON FALLS RESERVOIR AND INCIDENTAL FISHING BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4)(5). (See Addendum 15).

**The Wildlife Society:** The Board reviewed a June 9, 1990, letter from William H. Mullins, Vice President, Idaho Chapter, The Wildlife Society, in which Mr. Mullins requests verification of the Boards position as regards to an organization such as The Wildlife Society offering, on an auction basis, such activities as bird hunting, fishing trips, backpacking trips, game counts, and float trips for fund raising purposes. Following a discussion of this letter and in consideration of what is being asked, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Mullins inviting him to the August meeting to enable clarification of their proposed activities as it relates to the necessity or exclusion of such activity falling within the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act.

**Barker River Trips, Inc., John A.K. Barker, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the June 23, 1990, letter from Mr. Barker, in which he requests Board consideration or waiver of Rule 57 on the Clearwater River, Orofino to Lewiston (CL3), to enable the conduct of a half day float trip August 1, 1990 for the purpose of accommodating a Lewis and Clark Trail Heritage Foundation outing of up to 120 people. His request is to allow him to have more than the five boats per float boating activity as specified in the rule. Following a review and discussion of this request, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. BARKER'S REQUEST FOR A WAIVER OF RULE 57, CLEARWATER RIVER, OROFINO TO LEWISTON (CL3), ON A ONE TIME BASIS ONLY TO ACCOMMODATE THE ABOVE REFERENCED LEWIS AND CLARK TRAIL HERITAGE FOUNDATION OUTING. FURTHER, THAT THIS PERMISSION AND WAIVER IS MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE OTHER CONDITIONS AS OUTLINED IN MR. BARKER'S LETTER, MAINLY THAT HE WILL BE APPROACHING OTHER LICENSED OUTFITTERS ON CL3 TO ACCOMMODATE THE NEEDED BOAT REQUIREMENTS. (Administrative Note: A copy of a letter to Mr. Barker advising him of the Boards action should be sent to Harlan and Barbara Opdahl).

**Gary and Paula Moser, dba Moser's Idaho Adventures River Trips, and The River Company, dba Middle Fork River Company, Steve Lentz, Designated Agent:** Mr. and Mrs. Moser together with Steve Lentz met with the Board regarding the matter of protecting dba's in the State of Idaho and requesting the Board's action in this regard in helping to secure such company names for the original licensee. In order to do this they have requested the Board to go to rules making to obtain this protection. After discussion with Mr. and Mrs. Moser and Mr. Lentz, it was the Board's position that the Board does not have this authority, as it lies outside the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, Idaho Code Title 36, Chapter 21.

**Gary and Paula Moser, dba Moser's Idaho Adventures River Trips:** Mr. and Mrs. Moser registered a complaint before the Board regarding the licensing of outfitters on SA4A and SA4B as it relates to their being licensed on these river reaches. The Board advised Mr. and Mrs. Moser that they would research their files, to clarify the current status of licensing outfitters on these river reaches. Further, Mr. Moser was advised to submit his application to be placed on the waiting list for future consideration for any of these river reaches.

**David E. Williams:** The Board reviewed Mr. Williams designated agent license application for the Flying Resort Ranches, Inc. Following review of the file and noting Mr. Guth's letter of June 11, 1990, as regards the lease or purchase of equipment and other matters relating to the employment of Mr. Williams as designated agent qualified to guide, cougar hunting. MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE DAVE WILLIAMS AS DESIGNATED AGENT, FLYING RESORT RANCHES, INC. QUALIFIED TO GUIDE COUGAR HUNTING.

**Inter-Agency agreement with USDA Forest Service, USDI, BLM:** The Board reviewed the June 8, 1990, letter from Rogers M. Thomas in which he attached a recently executed interagency agreement by and between Regions 1 and 4 of the U.S. Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management, Idaho. Review of this finds that there are some errors relative to their designation of specific river segments in accordance with Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 57. Following which the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Thomas drawing his attention to these errors.

**USDI BLM/Lower Salmon River Management Plan:** The Board reviewed the May 25, 1990, letter from LuVerne Grussing in which he has requested Board input regarding the revised Lower Salmon River Management Plan. Following review of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Grussing thanking him for the opportunity to comment, and drawing his attention to the

adopted rules changes and specifically the definition of watercraft, which excludes hovercraft, jetskis, personal floatation devices or other similar devices from being licensed activities under the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act. Accordingly, the BLM may want to reflect this change in the purposed management plan.

**Fritz Hammerlie, Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney, Blaine County:** The Board reviewed the June 12, 1990, letter from Mr. Hammerlie, in which he expressed his appreciation of the Board participation in prosecution of a recent case in Blaine County. He further made some suggestions and recommendations as to what could be done to enhance the effectiveness of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act. Following review of the letter, the board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Hammerlie thanking him for his letter and expressing our appreciation for his help in litigative matters in Blaine County and that we will take his suggestion into consideration for future legislative change.

**Idaho Fish and Game Department:** The Board reviewed the May 1990 letter from Mr. Lewis Racine, Jr., Chairman, Idaho Fish and Game Commission, in which he requests comments as regards the Idaho Department of Fish and Game policy plan. Following review of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Racine thanking him for the opportunity to comment on the proposed Idaho Fish and Game Department policy, and that we have no comment to offer.

**Decision Memo - Issuance of temporary day use outfitter/guides permits to licensed outfitters on the Salmon National Forest, Lemhi County, Idaho:** The Board reviewed the decision memo issued by John E. Burns, Forest Supervisor, Salmon National Forest, as regards their proposed consideration and issuance of special use permits for the conduct of outfitting and guides activities on the Salmon National Forest. Following a review of the Decision Notice, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Burns thanking him for the opportunity to comment and expressing our appreciation for their adjusting their decision notice to coincide with the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board licensing procedures. Also, that the Board offers its assistance in any way possible to bring this matter into full compliance with the Memorandum of Understanding.

**South Fork Boise River:** The Board reviewed the news release signed by District Ranger Larry Tripp as regards recreational activities on the South Fork Boise River in which he requests public comment regarding same. Following review of this news release, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Tripp thanking him for the opportunity to comment and expressing the Boards opinion that recreational use on the South Fork of the Boise River is very

appropriate and should include limited outfitted use to accommodate that public wishing to utilize an outfitters service.

**Henry's Lake:** The Board reviewed the June 14, 1990, letter from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game regarding their response to the Board inquiry relative to relicensing of anticipated vacancies on Henry's Lake. Following which, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD PROCEED TO RELICENSE ACTIVITIES ON HENRY'S LAKE UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 28 BY, 1) PREPARING APPROPRIATE ADVERTISEMENTS AND SUBMITTING SAME TO LOCAL NEWSPAPERS AT IDAHO FALLS, POCATELLO, ST. ANTHONY AND REXBURG AND; 2) NOTIFYING THOSE INDIVIDUALS CURRENTLY ON THE WAITING LIST OF THE BOARDS ACTION.

**Albert Tilt/Jim Beard:** The Board reviewed Mr. Beard's file to note he has submitted a certificate of backcountry first aid instruction completed June 6, 1990, as issued by the United State Department of the Interior, National Park Service. There is a question as to whether such certification meets the requirements as defined in the Idaho Outfitter and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 32. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to the National Park Service requesting a copy of the curriculum so as to assist the Board in determining whether this course meets the criteria of Rule 32.

**Gary L. Moser, dba Moser's Idaho Adventures River Trips:** The Board reviewed the May 7, 1990, letter received from Mr. Moser in which he requested clarification of the status of Rusty Gore, dba Gore's Salmon River Jet Boat and Float Trips and Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips, license status on the Salmon River, SA5. Following a review of this letter, and the matter of alleged non-use by the parties involved, the Board directs that 1) a letter be addressed to the Forest Service asking for verification of any use that may have been reported to them by Rusty Gore, dba Gore's Salmon River Jet Boat and Float Trips and Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips, for the past five years, and 2) the Board research its own files to ascertain what use may have been reported to the Board for the past five years on SA5. Further, the letter should inquire as to the use status of Norm Riddle on SA6 for the past five years. Upon receipt of this data the Board will then review same for possible action under Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 22.

**Dick L. Smith:** The Board reviewed Mr. Smith's 1990-91 Guide License Application to note that he had been cited and convicted for a violation of Idaho Fish and Game Law, said violation being acknowledged on his application. The Board further noted that the Chairman had approved this license to be issued on a probationary basis with terms of said probation being that Mr. Smith not violate

any local, state or federal law or no amendment shall be made to his license during the current license year ending March 31, 1991. MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD EXCEPT FOR THAT PORTION OF TERMS OF PROBATION WHICH DISALLOWS GUIDE LICENSE AMENDMENTS, BE RESCINDED, AND THAT HE BE APPROVED FOR FLOAT BOATING ON SA4A FOR C. DAVID FREEL, dba DOUBLE "D" OUTFITTERS.


**Donald C. Hodge:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hodge's 1990-91 Guide License Application for the conduct of fly fishing while in the employ of Silver Creek Outfitters, noting that Mr. Hodge had received a citation/conviction for violation of Idaho Fish and Game law. Further, it was noted that Mr. Hodge has acknowledged same on his application in Section C. MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. HODGE'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS, WITH THE TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT 1) HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW, THAT NO AMENDMENT SHALL BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991, AND 2) MR. HODGE BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AN APPROPRIATE GUIDES EXAMINATION BEFORE ANY SUBSEQUENT GUIDES LICENSE IS ISSUED TO HIM.

**Gary and Jan Sylte, dba Coeur D'Alene River Big Game Outfitters:** The Board reviewed the Sylte's outfitter amendment request for the addition of trailrides as a licensable activity primarily conducted within their currently licensed operating area. However, certain of his proposed trail routes would take him outside his operating area and into or along other licensed outfitters operating area boundaries, namely Mr. Richard VanderMeyden and Michael J. Storaasli, dba Autumn Birch Outfitters. The file also reveals that approval has been indicated by the U.S. Forest Service for a special use permit for the conduct of these activities. Following a discussion of this amendment request, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE TRAILRIDES AS REQUESTED BY THE SYLTE'S PENDING RECEIPT OF COMMENT FROM THE AFFECTED OUTFITTERS. FURTHER, THE LICENSE BE ISSUED IF NO REASONABLE OPPOSITION IS OFFERED BY THE AFFECTED OUTFITTERS. OTHERWISE, THE AMENDMENT REQUEST SHOULD COME BACK BEFORE THE AUGUST BOARD MEETING FOR FURTHER CONSIDERATION. (See Addendum 16).

There being no further business to come before the Board the meeting was adjourned at 1625 hours.
