APPROVED MINUTES

Board Meeting - August 27 - 31, 1990

Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, August 27, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members present together with the Board's Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Legislative Audit:** The Board reviewed the Legislative Audit status report as submitted by the Legislative Auditor concerning their audit of the Board's records for the past three years. Following review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE REPORT AS SUBMITTED AND AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ATTORNEY TO SIGN, ON THE BOARD'S BEHALF, THOSE PAPERS NECESSARY TO ACKNOWLEDGE ACCEPTANCE OF SAID REPORT.

**Fiscal Review:** The Board reviewed the year end report prepared by the Executive Director showing the detailed income and expenditures for the past fiscal year. Following review of these matters, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE REPORTS AS SUBMITTED.

**1992 Proposed Operating Budget/Legislation:** Following review of the proposed 1992 operating budget and legislation developed by the Executive Director for submission/inclusion in the Governor's 1992 Executive Budget package, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED 1992 OPERATING BUDGET AND LEGISLATION FOR SUBMISSION/INCLUSION IN THE GOVERNOR'S 1992 EXECUTIVE BUDGET PACKAGE.

**Waldo Kenneth Phillips:** The Board reviewed Mr. Phillips letter of August 16, 1990 in which he cancels his request for a hearing before the Board on its denial of his application to purchase the Lyle Phelps outfitting business. The Board further noted his request for a more complete explanation of the Board's action in denying his application to purchase the Lyle Phelps outfitting business. Following review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) (Miller, nay) THAT THE BOARD REAFFIRM ITS PRIOR DECISION AND SO NOTIFY MR. PHILLIPS OF THE BOARD'S ACTION AS TO THE AUTHORITY CITED (ACT/RULES & REGULATIONS) IN HIS ORIGINAL DENIAL NOTICE.

**Executive Directors Report:** Executive Director gave his report to the Board regarding activities and ongoing matters that have occurred since the June, 1990, Board meeting.

**Teton Valley Lodge, Inc., Randy Berry, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the enforcement file concerning the apparent hiring of unlicensed guides by Teton Valley Lodge, Inc. for conduct of guided activities on the South Fork of the Snake River (SS1). Following a discussion of this matter and finding that Teton Valley Lodge, Inc. did, in fact, have unlicensed guides conducting guided activities on SS1, and further noting that said guides were utilizing non-validated training cards as a guide license for conduct of said activities, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD BRING TETON VALLEY LODGE, INC., RANDY BERRY, DESIGNATED AGENT, BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF SAID OUTFITTER AND DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSES FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5, 9, & 14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 6(d) AND RULE 41.

**South Fork, Snake River - Unlicensed Guides:** The Board reviewed the enforcement report filed on Teton Valley Lodge, Inc. in which various guides namely, Steve Rasmussen, Mike Rasmussen, Spencer Todd VanMeter, and Cade Dillree were found to be conducting guided activities on the South Fork Snake River (SS1) without a valid guides license. Further, Chris Nelson was found to be guiding activities on the river without a properly identified boat. Following the review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MESSRS STEVE RASMUSSEN, MIKE RASMUSSEN, SPENCER TODD VANMETER, AND CADE DILLREE BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THEIR GUIDES LICENSE FOR CONDUCT OF GUIDED ACTIVITIES ON SS1 WITHOUT A VALID IDAHO GUIDES LICENSE. FURTHER, THE BOARD DIRECTS NO ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST CHRIS NELSON REGARDING THE USE OF AN UNIDENTIFIED BOAT AS THIS IS A MATTER TO BE DISCUSSED WITH HIS EMPLOYING OUTFITTER.

**Salmon River Challenge, Inc., Patrick Marek, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the enforcement report regarding Salmon River Challenge, Inc.'s operation on the Salmon River (SA7A) and the employment of unlicensed guides for the conduct of outfitting and guiding activities. Following a review of this matter and discussion thereof, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD BRING SALMON RIVER CHALLENGE, INC., PATRICK MAREK, DESIGNATED AGENT, BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF SAID OUTFITTER AND DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSES FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5,9, & 14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 41. FURTHER THAT SALMON RIVER CHALLENGE, INC. BE REQUESTED TO BRING THEIR BOOKS, RECORDS, AND OTHER MATERIALS PERTINENT TO THEIR CONDUCT OF BUSINESS FOR THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR AT THE SAME TIME OF THEIR HEARING BEFORE THE BOARD.

**Salmon River (SA7A) - Unlicensed Guides:** The Board reviewed the enforcement record regarding the conduct of unlicensed persons,

namely Mike Nelson and David Joseph Brookins for the conduct of guided activities on SA7A without a valid Idaho Guides License in possession. Following the review of this matter, MSC( Baird--Epley) THAT MIKE NELSON AND DAVID JOSEPH BROOKINS BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THEIR GUIDES LICENSE FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2104 AND 36-2113(a)(5 & 14).

**R & R Outdoors, Inc., Robert Black, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the enforcement agents report concerning R & R Outfitters, Inc.'s utilization of unmarked boats on the Salmon River (SA7A). Following review of this matter, MSC (Epley--Baird)(Miller, nay) THAT THE BOARD BRING R & R OUTDOORS, INC., ROBERT BLACK, DESIGNATED AGENT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF SAID OUTFITTER AND DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSES FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 41.

**Peter Grubb, dba River Odysseys West (ROW):** The Board reviewed the enforcement file noting that River Odysseys West, Inc. was conducting a float trip on the Snake River (SN7) without properly identified boats and utilization of an unlicensed guide. Following which, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD BRING RIVER ODYSSEYS WEST, PETER GRUBB, DESIGNATED AGENT, BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF SAID OUTFITTER AND DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSES FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5, 9 & 14), AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULES 41 AND 52(d).

**Snake River (SN7) - Unlicensed Guides:** The Board reviewed the enforcement file noting that one James Beal in the employ of River Odysseys West, Inc., Peter Grubb, Designated Agent, was conducting a float trip on the Snake River below Hells Canyon (SN7) without an Idaho Guides License for conduct of said trip on this particular reach of river. MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD BRING JAMES BEAL BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS GUIDES LICENSE FOR VIOLATIONS OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5, 8, & 14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 41.

**Bruce Oakes:** The Board reviewed Mr. Oakes 1990-91 guide license application for conduct of licensed activities while in the employ of Myrna Beamer to note that Mr. Oakes had submitted an apparent falsified Red Cross card. Upon investigation of this matter it was indeed found that Mr. Oakes had falsified said card. Following which, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. OAKES 1990-91 GUIDES LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(1).

**Enforcement Coordinator's Report:** The Enforcement Coordinator reviewed various matters that have been pending and active since the last Board meeting.

**POST Certification, Firearm Qualification:** The Board reviewed the necessity of its enforcement agents to meet POST firearms qualification requirements, following which the Board directs that the Enforcement Coordinator submit a written firearms policy for Board review and approval at the next Board meeting.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1140 hours and reconvened at 1310 hours.

**Dean Loveland:** The Board reviewed Mr. Loveland's 1990-91 guide license application for employment with R & R Outdoors, Inc., noting his felony conviction. Following review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. LOVELAND'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(3) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS RULE 8(b)(i).

**Patrick Connolly:** The Board reviewed Mr. Connolly's 1990-91 guide license application for employment with Salmon River Lodge, Inc., noting his Fish and Game citation. Following review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. CONNOLLY'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT 1) HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR WILL ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE BE APPROVED DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991, AND 2) THAT HE BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AND PASS AN APPROPRIATE GUIDES EXAMINATION BEFORE ANY SUBSEQUENT GUIDES LICENSES BE ISSUED TO HIM.

**Board's Attorney:** The Board's Attorney, W. Dallas Burkhalter, reviewed and updated the Board regarding pending litigation and other legal matters.

**Bennion Teton Boys Ranch:** Dr. Steven D. Bennion of Bennion Teton Boys Ranch met with the Board to discuss the operation of the Bennion Teton Boys Ranch to request that said activities as was outlined/discussed be declared exempt from the purview of the Outfitter and Guides Act, Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21. Following review and discussion of the proposed operation of the ranch and in consideration that many of the proposed activities are covered activities under the Act, as "hazardous mountain excursions," MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT DR. BENNION BE ADVISED THAT 1) AFTER REVIEW AND CONSIDERATION OF HIS TESTIMONY BEFORE THE BOARD REGARDING THE PROPOSED OPERATION OF THE BENNION TETON BOYS RANCH, IT IS THE BOARD'S DECISION THAT MANY OF THE ACTIVITIES DO, IN FACT,

FALL WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT (TITLE 36, CHAPTER 21), AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED THERETO, AND 2) HE SHOULD PROCEED TO BECOME LICENSED AS AN IDAHO OUTFITTER IF INDEED HE WISHES TO OPERATE THE BENNION TETON BOYS RANCH AS WAS OUTLINED/DISCUSSED BEFORE THE BOARD. (Administrative Note: Letter to Dr. Bennion should outline the Boards reasons supporting its decision to require an outfitter license such as conduct of those activities (trailrides, rock climbing, fishing, and backpacking) that fall within the purview of the Act. Further, the Forest Service should be so notified of the Boards decision in this matter.)

**Board Minutes - June Meeting:** The Board reviewed the June 25-29, 1990, Board minutes. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE JUNE 25-29, 1990, BOARD MINUTES AS CORRECTED.

**Richard Escott, dba Idaho Charter Service:** Mr. Escott met before the Board regarding his outfitter license application for the conduct of power boat fishing activities on Payette Lake, Cascade Reservoir, and float boating activities on the Salmon River (SA7A & SA7B). During the discussion and interview before the Board, Mr. Escott was advised that there is no opening on the Salmon River (SA7A & SA7B), and that in accordance with Department of Fish and Game recommendation, the Board will not license further outfitters on Cascade Reservoir in the near future, following which MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE RICHARD ESCOTT, dba IDAHO CHARTER SERVICE, FOR CONDUCT OF POWER BOAT FISHING ON PAYETTE LAKE LIMITED TO NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS FISHING ACTIVITIES FOR THE 1990-91 LICENSE YEAR AND NOT MORE THAN 1 LAKE TROUT HARVESTED PER DAY, WITH RESTRICTION RE-EVALUATED UPON HIS RENEWAL APPLICATION FOR THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR, 2) DENY MR. ESCOTT'S APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF ACTIVITIES ON CASCADE RESERVOIR AND THE SALMON RIVER (SA7A & SA7B). AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (b) (5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULES 19(f) AND 57, 3) PLACE MR. ESCOTT'S NAME ON THE WAITING LIST FOR SA7A AND SA7B FOR SUCH TIME AS THIS MIGHT BECOME AVAILABLE, AND, 4) DEEM MR. ESCOTT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE ON PAYETTE LAKE WITH LICENSES ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY PAYMENT OF FEES AND COMPLETION OF AN OUTFITTERS EXAM.

**Chris Sequeira:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sequeira's 1990-91 guide license application to become lead boatman on SA7A, noting that Mr. Sequeira had a 1985 Fish and Game violation. The Board further noted the Chairman had previously reviewed this application and directed issuance of said license on a non-probationary basis. Following which, MSC (Baird--Miller) (Epley, nay) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD.

**David L. Snider:** The Board reviewed Mr. Snider's 1990-91 guide license application for employment by George Duncan in conduct of various big game hunting activities to note that Mr. Snider had been convicted of violation of numerous Fish and Game laws. Following review of this file and discussion of these violations and letter of explanation, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. SNIDER'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(6 & 14).

**Eric Petlock:** The Board reviewed Mr. Petlock's 1990-91 guide license application for float boating on the Middle Fork, Salmon River (MF1 & MF2), review of the file finds that Mr. Petlock does not have a complete application, namely a valid first aid card. Following a discussion and in consideration of this matter, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. PETLOCK'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 1(b). FURTHER, THE BOARD DIRECTS THE ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR TO FURTHER INVESTIGATE THIS MATTER TO SEE IF THERE IS ANY ACTION THAT MAY BE TAKEN AGAINST THOSE OUTFITTERS WHICH EMPLOYED MR. PETLOCK DURING THE 1990-91 LICENSE YEAR.

**Mark Osmer:** The Board reviewed Mr. Osmer's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of guiding activities while in the employ of Silver Creek Outfitters, noting that he had been convicted of a 1981 and 1984 Fish and Game violations and further noting that the Board Chairman had reviewed this file on July 10, 1990 to direct license be issued on a probationary basis. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD.

**Dave Moore:** The Board reviewed Mr. Moore's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of big game hunting activities while in the employ of Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stan Meholchick, Designated Agent. The Board, upon review of the file, finds that Mr. Moore had made a 1989-90 application at which time he was found to have been convicted of violation of Fish and Game law, with said license application denied. Further, that Mr. Moore had requested a hearing before the Board on this matter, but said hearing has never taken place. Following review and consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. MOORE'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(c) AND 36-2113(a)(6).

**Edward S. Gordon:** The Board reviewed Mr. Gordon's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of float boating activity on the Salmon River (SA5), noting that Mr. Gordon had been convicted

of a Fish and Game violation and that the Chairman had reviewed this file on July 27, 1990, to direct that the license be issued on a non-probationary basis. Following review and consideration of this matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD.

**Aaron Helfrich:** The Board reviewed Mr. Helfrich's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of float boating activities on the Salmon River (SA8) while in the employ of James D. Helfrich, noting that Mr. Helfrich had been convicted of a Fish and Game violation, following which, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ISSUE ERIN HELFRICH'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE NON-PROBATIONARY.

**Greg Hurless:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hurless's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of float boating activities on the Salmon River (SA3) while in the employ of S Bar S Outfitters, noting that Mr. Hurless had been convicted of a Fish and Game violation and that the Chairman had reviewed said application to direct issue of a license on a probationary basis. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM CHAIRMAN'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD.

**Kevin R. Kellogg:** The Board reviewed Mr. Kellogg's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of power and float boating guiding activities on SS1, TE1 and TE2 while in the employ of Vern Bressler Outfitters, noting that Mr. Kellogg had been convicted of a violation of a Colorado Fish and Game law in 1985 that the Chairman had reviewed this application on July 13, 1990, to direct that said license be issued non-probationary. Following which, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTIONS IN THIS REGARD.

**Nick Rudzki, dba PR Bass Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Rudzki's file and letter in which he requests that the Board accept his relinquishment of power boating and fishing on Anderson Ranch, Brownlee, C.J. Strike, Dworshak, Hells Canyon, Lake Lowell, and Oxbow Reservoirs; Coeur d'Alene River; and, Anderson Lake, Black Lake, Blue Lake, Cave Lake, Killarney Lake, Medicine Lake, Swan Lake, Thompson Lake, Benewah Lake, Chatcolet Lake, Hidden Lake, and Round Lake. Following review of Mr. Rudzki's file and his request for relinquishment of his outfitter license on said waters, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) ACCEPT MR. RUDZKI'S RELINQUISHMENT OF HIS OUTFITTER'S LICENSE, 2) DIRECT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO PREPARE A LISTING OF THOSE WATERS AND ACTIVITIES NOW AVAILABLE FOR RELICENSING; AND, 3) REVIEW/CONSIDER SAID LISTING UNDER RULE 28(c) FOR FURTHER RELICENSING.

**James R. Thrash, dba Warren Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Thrash's outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of a

sheep hunt in Fish and Game Management Unit 57A noting that his file is complete in that he has approval by the U.S. Forest Service and the affected outfitter for the conduct of said hunt, as well as the successful sheep hunters name, tag numbers, etc.. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. THRASH'S OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID SHEEP HUNT IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 57A FOR THE PERIOD OF SEPTEMBER 20-29, 1990. THE CLIENT NAME IS JOSEPH P. KALT, 1 CALUMET ROAD, WINCHESTER, MA, 01890. HUNTING LICENSE #202-0-013230, PERMIT #801-0-000118, TAG #420-0-000015.

**Enforcement Training Conference:** Following review of the Executive Director's report in which he reviewed the agenda proceedings of the conference and commented on the facilities provided by Mr. Ted Epley in accommodation/success of the Enforcement Training Conference, the Board directs a letter of appreciation be addressed to Mr. Epley for his participation in, and provision of, accommodations and other facilities in making the training conference a success.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1725 hours, and reconvened on Tuesday, August 28, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members present together with Board's Attorney, Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

**S D Outfitters, Inc., dba Seven Devils Outfitters, Dave Stucker, Designated Agent:** Messrs Edward J. Panus, Dave Stucker, and A. J. Bohner met before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Seven Devils Outfitter, Inc., Dave Stucker, Designated Agent, outfitting business to S D Outfitters, Inc. dba Seven Devils Outfitters, Dave Stucker, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board concerning this proposed sale and transfer of outfitting business for conduct of deer, elk, goat, sheep, bear, predator, forest grouse, and chukar hunting as well as trailrides, backpacking, snowmobiling, and wagonride activities, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN SEVEN DEVILS OUTFITTER, INC., DAVE STUCKER, DESIGNATED AGENT TO S D OUTFITTERS, INC., dba SEVEN DEVILS OUTFITTERS, DAVE STUCKER, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR THE CONDUCT OF THOSE ACTIVITIES PREVIOUSLY LICENSED TO THE FORMER OUTFITTER WITHIN THE FORMERLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA. THE LICENSE TO BE ISSUED PENDING COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK NAMELY ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION FOR THE NEW CORPORATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES. FURTHER THAT DAVE STUCKER BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #1).

**Payette Forest, New Meadows Ranger District/Dave Stucker Bear/Cougar Area:** The Board reviewed Dave Stucker's file and draft environmental assessment (EA) received July 25, 1990, concerning

Mr. Stucker's bear and cougar hunting within the Payette National Forest. The Board also reviewed material submitted by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game to the Forest Service concerning bear statistics and harvest data for consideration in drafting said EA. Following a review of these materials, MSC (Miller--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO THE PAYETTE NATIONAL FOREST, NEW MEADOWS RANGER DISTRICT, IN RESPONSE TO THE DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT TO 1) MAKE/AFFIRM REFERENCE TO HISTORICAL OUTFITTED USE WITHIN THE NEW MEADOWS RANGER DISTRICT FOR THE CONDUCT OF BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING IN WHICH THERE HAS BEEN NO EVIDENCE PRESENTED THAT SUCH COMMERCIAL BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING HAS HAD AN ADVERSE IMPACT UPON THE BEAR AND COUGAR POPULATIONS; 2) STATE THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME DATA DOES NOT INDICATE/SUSTAIN NEED FOR DRASTIC MEASURES, SPECIFICALLY THE ELIMINATION OF COMMERCIAL HUNTING AS HAVING ADVERSE IMPACT UPON SAID BEAR AND COUGAR POPULATIONS; 3) RECOMMEND LIMITED COMMERCIAL OUTFITTING USE (BEAR/COUGAR HUNTING) BE CONTINUED IN THAT AREA ADDRESSED IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT.

**Richard D. Armiger, dba Paradise Outfitters:** Mr. and Mrs. Armiger together with Mr. and Mrs. Norm Riddle met before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Norm Riddle's floating business on the Clearwater River (CL2 and CL3) to Mr. Armiger. Following the interview before the Board considering this matter, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS FROM NORM RIDDLE, dba SNAKE RIVER OUTFITTERS, TO RICHARD ARMIGER, dba PARADISE OUTFITTERS, FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING ON CL2 AND CL3. FURTHER THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. FURTHER, THAT MR. ARMIGER BE NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HE COMPLETES NECESSARY TRAINING AND THAT IN THE MEANTIME MR. RIDDLE WILL SERVE AS A GUIDE UNDER MR. ARMIGER'S EMPLOYMENT.

**Richard D. Armiger, dba Paradise Outfitters:** Mr. and Mrs. Armiger met before the Board relative to his outfitter amendment request for an adjustment in his operating area boundary to include his privately owned land adjacent to his currently licensed operating area. Following the interview before the Board and discussion and consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. ARMIGER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST TO INCLUDE THAT PORTION OF HIS PRIVATELY OWNED LAND WHICH LIES OUTSIDE HIS CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY WITH ALL ACTIVITIES FOR WHICH HE IS CURRENTLY LICENSED BEING APPLICABLE TO THIS ADJUSTMENT IN OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY. (See Addendum #2). (Administrative Note: Mr. Armiger also made inquiry as to the qualifications of a potential guide, namely Dr. Philip Cress, a doctor of veterinary medicine, as to whether such veterinary medicine training would qualify him to meet minimum first aid card requirements. Following discussion, it is the Board's position

that if Mr. Cress will submit a copy of his doctors license the Board will accept same for first aid qualifications, and upon receipt of Mr. Cress's application, that said application be approved.)

**Ray Seal, dba High Country Outfitters, Mike Seal, Designated Agent:** Mr. Mike Seal, Designated Agent for Ray Seal, dba High Country Outfitters, met before the Board relative to the renewal of their outfitters license for conduct of big game hunting, fishing, and trailrides in Fish and Game Units 39 and 43. Following the interview before the Board regarding the re-establishment and reissue of Mr. Seal's outfitter license and in accordance with the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 13 (a)(iii), MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE RENEWAL OF MR. SEAL'S OUTFITTER LICENSE AND ISSUE SAME FOR THE 1990-91 LICENSE YEAR.

**Executive Session:** The Board at 1130 hours went into Executive Session in accordance with Idaho Code 67-2345 (Crane - aye, Baird - aye, Meiners - aye, Epley - aye, Miller - aye). The Board came out of Executive Session at 1220 hours with no decisions made.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1230 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

**Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc., Dan Rotthoff, Designated Agent:** Mr. and Mrs. Rotthoff together with Doug and Bruce Perry of Bear Valley Outfitters, Inc. met before the Board as regards Bear Valley Outfitters, Inc.'s desire to return the hunting outfitter business previously licensed to Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc., Dan Rotthoff, Designated Agent, due to their inability to satisfy the sales contract entered into by the parties concerned. Following the interview before the Board and consideration of this matter MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) ACCEPT AND APPROVE BEAR VALLEY OUTFITTERS, INC., REQUEST TO RETURN THEIR OUTFITTING BUSINESS FOR CONDUCT OF DEER, ELK, MOOSE, BEAR, COUGAR, PREDATOR AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING AND FISHING, TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING AND SNOWMOBILING ACTIVITIES TO GARDEN VALLEY OUTFITTERS, INC., DAN ROTTHOFF, DESIGNATED AGENT; 2) THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED FOR CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITIES IN DESIGNATED OPERATING AREA WITHIN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 33 AND 34 UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY RECEIPT OF APPROVAL AND CONCURRENCE BY THE FOREST SERVICE FOR ISSUE OF SPECIAL USE PERMIT AND MR. ROTTHOFF'S COMPLETION OF AN OUTFITTER'S EXAMINATION AND RECEIPT OF BOND; 3) BEAR VALLEY OUTFITTERS, INC., BE NOTIFIED OF THE BOARD'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD BUT THAT UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE OUTFITTER LICENSE IS INDEED ISSUED TO GARDEN VALLEY OUTFITTERS, INC., THAT THE BOARD WILL HOLD BEAR VALLEY OUTFITTERS, INC., RESPONSIBLE FOR ACCOMMODATION OF THEIR BOOKED CLIENTS; 4) THAT DAN ROTTHOFF BE

APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 5) PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (Administrative Note: The record will show that Messrs Earl Maggard and Ed Jenkins were present during the above proceedings as "interested parties" and will further note receipt of Earl Maggard's letter dated August 24, 1990 in which he has outlined certain concerns about relicensing of Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc., Dan Rotthoff, Designated Agent, for conduct of an outfitting business and Mr. Ed Jenkins' interest in this matter. Following discussion and consideration of Mr. Maggard's letter and Mr. Jenkins' comments made to the Board, it is the Board's position that no further action is required as regards Mr. Maggard's letter.) (See Addendum #3)

**Dan S. Jacobson, dba Whaler Charters:** Mr. Jacobson and Mr. Darrel Atkinson appeared before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Darrel Atkinson, dba Whaler Charters, to Dan S. Jacobson, dba Whaler Charters for the conduct of power boat fishing on Lake Pend Orielle, Clark Fork, and Pend Orielle Rivers. Following the hearing before the Board regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business and in review of the Board's prior action and denial of this application, MSC (Baird-Crane) THAT 1) THE BOARD'S PRIOR ACTION IN DENYING THE TRANSFER AND SALE OF BUSINESS BE RESCINDED AND SAID APPLICATION BE APPROVED; 2) MR. JACOBSON BE LICENSED NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HE HAS APPROPRIATE GUIDE AND COAST GUARD LICENSES; AND 3) LICENSES BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY COMPLETION OF OUTFITTER EXAM, TRAINING CARDS, SUBMISSION OF BOND AND PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. ATKINSON SHALL SERVE AS QUALIFIED GUIDE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS MR. JACOBSON IS QUALIFIED. (See Addendum #4)

**Gary R. Towle:** Mr. Towle met with the Board as regards his outfitter license application for the conduct of trailrides and photography trips in an area lying within Fish and Game Management Unit 39 on the Boise National Forest. Following the interview with Mr. Towle and discussion of his application, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) CLARIFY ITS FEBRUARY 15, 1990, MINUTES AND MOTION TITLED "RULE 28(c)" IN REFERENCE TO THE JOHN C. ANDERSON OPERATION AS THE ACTIVITIES REMOVED WERE COUGAR AND PREDATOR HUNTING AND DID NOT RELATE TO SUMMER AND WINTER RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES; 2) APPROVE MR. TOWLE'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS WITHIN THE OPERATING AREA REQUESTED EXCEPT THAT PORTION OF SAID REQUESTED OPERATING AREA LYING WITHIN THE SAWTOOTH WILDERNESS AREA; 3) THAT MR. TOWLE BE DEEMED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 4) THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK NAMELY PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #5)

**Ralph W. Bass, dba The Equestrian Center:** Mr. Bass met before the Board relative to his late submission for renewal for his 1990-91 outfitter license in accordance with requirements of Idaho

Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 13(a)(iii). Following the interview before the Board, MSC (Epley-Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. BASS'S OUTFITTER LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION FOR THE 1990-91 LICENSE YEAR IN CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES, WAGONRIDES, AND SLEIGHRIDES ON PROPERTIES WITHIN KIMBERLAND MEADOWS.

**Rick D. Doyle, dba Mainstream Outdoor Adventures:** Mr. and Mrs. Doyle, together with Ron Moore met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of Ron Moore, dba R & M Outfitters outfitting business for the conduct of power boating, fishing, and hunting activities on the Snake River (SN8) to Rick D. Doyle, dba Mainstream Outdoor Adventures. Following the interview before the Board regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN RON MOORE, dba R & M OUTFITTERS TO RICK D. DOYLE, dba MAINSTREAM OUTDOOR ADVENTURES FOR THE CONDUCT OF POWER BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SNAKE RIVER (SN8) TOGETHER WITH FISHING AND CHUKAR HUNTING; 2) THAT MR. RICK D. DOYLE BE QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) THAT HIS LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK NAMELY PAYMENT OF FEES.

**Gayle L. Doyle:** The Board reviewed Mrs. Doyle's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of power boating activities, fishing, and chukar hunting on the Snake River (SN8) while in the employment of Rick D. Doyle, dba Mainstream Outdoor Adventures. Following review of the file and finding that Mrs. Doyle is qualified, has completed necessary training and has secured the appropriate coast guard license, MSC (Miller--Meiners) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MRS. DOYLE 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITIES.

**Michael W. Riedel:** The Board reviewed Mr. Riedel's file noting that he has been convicted of guiding without a license, per Court Order of the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Idaho, Case #6810. In consideration of this conviction of violation of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. RIEDEL BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS GUIDE LICENSE FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(14).

**Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc., Terry Ring, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc. file finding that in accordance with the sentence of the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Idaho in and for the county of Blaine, that Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc. did in deed employ Michael W. Riedel as an unlicensed guide for the conduct of outfitted activities. Following review and consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT SILVER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC., TERRY RING, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE

HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF SAID OUTFITTER AND DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSES FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113 (a) (9).

**Appointment of Chairman:** Following discussion by the Board, it is resolved that the Board 1) reaffirm their action in electing Bill Meiners as its Chairman; and 2) request that Mr. Meiners remain Chairman as long as he feels capable. (Crane, aye - Baird, aye - Epley, aye - Miller, aye)(Meiners abstains)

**Bressler Outfitters:** The Board reviewed a letter received from Bressler Outfitters concerning his question as to whether the Jack Dennis Sports advertisement in which he proclaims the virtues of the South Fork Snake River and the availability of fishing trips under the conduct of South Fork Expeditions, is a legal or illegal advertisement. Following a review of this matter, it is the Boards position that a letter be addressed to Mr. Bressler advising him that the Board considers this a legal advertisement as it appears Mr. Dennis is serving only as a booking agent since he has identified the outfitter under which such activities would become available.

**Marlene A. West, dba Ridgerunner Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Marlene West's outfitter amendment request to modify her operating area boundaries to include that area formerly licensed to David Powers. Following a review of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Ms. West advising her that 1) the David Powers matter is still under litigation and not available to be licensed to another individual, 2) her name will be placed on a waiting list for consideration for licensing at such time as the operating area becomes available, and 3) should the area become available, it will be considered under the purview of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c).

**Milt Butler, dba Chilly Ranch Outfitters:** The Board again reviewed Mr. Butler's file and his outfitter license amendment request for an adjustment in his operating area boundaries to include additional areas defined as Area 1 and 2 on his amendment request. The Board, by prior action, denied Area 1 and approved Area 2 as requested except for fishing pending receipt of Idaho Department of Fish and Game recommendation concerning this activity. This recommendation has now been received and in consideration thereof, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. BUTLER'S REQUEST FOR FISHING WITHIN THAT AREA DESIGNATED AS AREA 2 ON HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATIONS BY LETTER DATED JULY 12, 1990.

**Boise State University, Glen R. Potter, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Boise State University's file and their outfitter license amendment request for the addition of trailrides, technical mountaineering, photography trips, and survival courses as licensable activities under said license. Following review of the file, the Board finds that the materials submitted do not provide sufficient information to make a judgement as to whether these activities should/should not be licensed, therefore, directs that a letter be addressed to Boise State University, attention Dr. Potter, to request additional information be provided as regards their proposed conduct of requested activities and that they should plan to appear before the Board at the next meeting to explain same.

**Triple O Outfitters, Inc., Harlan Opdahl, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Triple O Outfitters, Inc.'s, outfitter amendment request for the addition of mountain bike touring to be conducted within their presently licensed operating area and in addition on the Lolo Motor Way. Review of the file finds that the Forest Service has signed off and will issue the necessary special use permit for the conduct of this activity. Following which, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE TRIPLE O OUTFITTERS, INC., HARLAN OPDAHL, DESIGNATED AGENT, AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING WITHIN THEIR CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA AND IN ADDITION, ALONG THE LOLO MOTOR WAY. (See Addendum #6).

**Gary Sylte, dba Coeur d'Alene River Big Game Outfitters:** The Board again reviewed the Sylte file as regards their outfitter amendment request for additional trailrides noting that at the June, 1990, Board meeting this amendment request had been approved pending receipt of comments from affected outfitters. Comments have now been received, not only from the outfitters but from the U.S. Forest Service. Following which, (Baird--Epley) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AGREEMENT AMONG THE PARTIES INVOLVED. (See Addendum #7).

The Board recessed for the evening at 1730 hours, and reconvened on Wednesday, August 29, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members present together with Board's Attorney, Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Board Meeting:** The Board discussed the need for additional Board meetings for the remainder of the year, or until December 31, 1990. Following consideration of this matter, the Board establishes the following meeting dates: October 22-24 and December 13-15, 1990.

**Non-profit Organization/Air Force Activities:** The Board reviewed the apparent ongoing activities of various Boy Scout Councils and the Mountain Home Air Force Base recreation program in conduct of

recreational opportunities which would appear to fall within the purview of the Outfitters and Guides Act (Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21). Following review and discussion of this matter, the Board directs that letters be addressed to representatives of Boy Scout Councils in Southeast, Southcentral, and Southwest Idaho, and the Mountain Home Air Force Base commander requesting that they appear before the Board to review the nature, scope and conduct of their respective activities in an attempt to determine whether such activities fall within or outside the purview of Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21.

**Harry W. Knox:** The Board reviewed Mr. Knox's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of big game hunting, bird hunting and fishing activities while in the employ of Stanley Potts. Review of Mr. Knox's file finds that he has been convicted of a felony, following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. KNOX'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(3).

**Idaho Touring Company:** The scheduled appointment before the Board for Idaho Touring Company in which they had been requested to come and explain the circumstances surrounding the background to their advertisement for mountain bike touring in Idaho has come and passed at 0830 hours, August 29, 1990. In as much as Idaho Touring Company has not appeared for their scheduled meeting nor contacted the Board regarding same, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Idaho Touring Company advising them that since they are not a licensed Idaho outfitter, their advertisement is in violation of Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and, therefore, the Board directs they cease and desist such advertising to preclude adverse action being taken against them for violation of Idaho law.

**Philip A. Johnson:** Mr. Johnson met before the Board in a show cause hearing for suspension or revocation of his outfitter license for non-use of his float boating license activity on the Salmon River (SA1) in accordance with the criteria outlined in Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 22. The hearing established the following Findings of Fact: 1) The Board records indicate that Mr. Johnson has not reported float boat use on the Salmon River (SA1) for the license years 1987, 1988, and 1989. 2) Mr. Johnson offered no acceptable rebuttal or circumstance which would have precluded him from conducting licensed activity. 3) Mr. Johnson does not have a valid Forest Service special use permit for conduct of float boat activity on SA1. Thus, Conclusions of Law are: 1) Mr. Johnson has made no use of his licensed activity for conduct of float boating activities on the Salmon River (SA1). 2) Mr. Johnson is in violation of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 22, for non-use of said activity. In consideration of the

foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD REVOKE MR. PHILIP A. JOHNSON'S OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER (SA1). FURTHER THAT THE BOARD'S EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DEAN SANGREY, BE DIRECTED TO PREPARE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS AND SIGN SAME ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD IN CARRYING FORTH THE BOARD'S ACTION AND DECISION IN THIS MATTER.

**Jim Guerry, dba Snake River Voyages:** The Board reviewed its file regarding the float boat vacancy on the Snake River (SN2) which was advertised in accordance with Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c). Following the advertisement and receipt of interested parties applications for Board consideration in selecting an applicant to fill this slot and finding that only one applicant made said application, namely, Mr. Jim Guerry, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) AWARD THE VACANCY FOR FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITY ON THE SNAKE RIVER (SN2), MURTAUGH SECTION, TO MR. JIM GUERRY FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING, AND 2) DEEM MR. GUERRY QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

**Randy Hess, dba White Otter Outdoor Adventures:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hess's amendment request for the addition of mountain bike touring as a licensable activity under his outfitter license. Following a review of the file and noting letters received from affected outfitters and response received from the Challis National Forest, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. HESS'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING AS A LICENSABLE ACTIVITY ON HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4 & 5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(f).

**Richard M. Rossignol, Nightingale Nordic, Inc.:** Mr. Rossignol met before the Board relative to his outfitter license application for conduct of cross country skiing activities in the vicinity of Lolo Pass. The interview served to clarify Mr. Rossignol's intent as to conduct of his proposed business, namely that it is not a "guided" activity, and is a cross country ski school only as confined to groomed trails on the Forest Service approved area at Lolo Pass. In consideration of this fact, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE PROPOSED BUSINESS, AS EXPLAINED BY MR. ROSSIGNOL, IS DEEMED TO FALL OUTSIDE THE PURVIEW OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT, AND THEREFORE, DOES NOT REQUIRE BEING LICENSED AS AN IDAHO OUTFITTER. FURTHER, THAT THIS BOARD DECISION IS APPLICABLE ONLY SO LONG AS ACTIVITIES ARE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROCEDURES OUTLINED DURING THE INTERVIEW BEFORE THE BOARD AND DOES NOT INCLUDE CONDUCTED GUIDED TOURS OUTSIDE THE FOREST SERVICE SITE AT LOLO PASS.

**David L. Peterson, dba Birch Creek Outfitters, dba Double Fork Lodge:** Mr. Peterson met with the Board regarding clarification of his license procedures to assure continued separation of the two dba's under which he is currently licensed to operate. The Board provided guidance in this matter with the final decision being Mr. Peterson's as to just what he might wish to do.

The Board recessed for lunch and 1210 hours and reconvened at 1325 hours.

**Ellen Shaw:** The Board reviewed Ms. Shaw's outfitter license amendment request to add sleighrides, photography trips, and meatpacking to her licensed activities. Review of her application finds that said application is not complete as Ms. Shaw has not secured Forest Service approval for amendment of her special use permit. Further, her request falls within or involves operating areas licensed to other individuals. Also, her operating area is one which was assigned for the conduct of recreational activities, not hunting activities. Following a review and consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) ADDRESS A LETTER TO MS. SHAW BRINGING TO HER ATTENTION THAT HER APPLICATION IS INCOMPLETE IN THAT SHE HAS TO HAVE LAND MANAGER SIGN OFF; 2) WILL HAVE TO CONTACT AFFECTED OUTFITTERS TO ASCERTAIN THEIR RESPONSE TO HER APPLICATION AND; 3) ADVISE MS. SHAW THAT HER APPLICATION DOES IN FACT OVERLIE OTHER LICENSED OUTFITTER'S OPERATING AREAS FOR CONDUCT OF HUNTING ACTIVITIES AND THE BOARD IS NOT INCLINED TO LICENSE MEAT PACKING ACTIVITIES INTO SUCH OPERATING AREAS.

**Palisades Ranger District/Recreational Use Limits Process, Palisades Ranger District, Targhee National Forest 1990:** The Board reviewed a draft copy of Recreational Use Limits Process for the Palisades Ranger District, Targhee National Forest 1990. Following discussion of this draft, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Ron Dickemore, District Ranger, Palisades Ranger District, to express the Board's appreciation for the effort made in drafting the subject draft and believes it to reflect sound resource management planning. However, in view of Forest Service manpower, funding, and other constraints, the Board questions whether or how the Forest Service will be able to gather the necessary data, implement, and monitor the program they have outlined.

**Affidavit for non-commercial use:** The Board reviewed the Cottonwood Resource Area affidavit form used by BLM as regards non-commercial float boat activities. The form was provided the Board for their consideration/use. Following consideration/discussion of this affidavit, plus consideration of a similar Forest Service affidavit, the Board directs that its Enforcement Coordinator, Executive Director, and Attorney pool their efforts to draft an affidavit for Board consideration and use.

**Affirmative Action Program:** The Board reviewed the July 17, 1990 letter from the Governors' Executive Interagency Committee on affirmative action. Following the review and in consideration of the substance of this letter, directs the Executive Director to comply therewith and sign appropriate response on the Board's behalf.

**Executive Session:** The Board went into Executive Session in accordance with Idaho Code 67-2345 for the purpose of discussing possible litigation. The Board went into said session at 1520 hours, (Crane - aye, Baird - aye, Meiners - aye, Epley - aye, Miller - aye) and came out of the said session at 1530 hours with no decision made.

**Fred E. Ehlert, dba Alpenhaus Motel and Fly Shop:** Mr. and Mrs. Ehlert together with their attorney, Royce Lee, appeared in a hearing before the Board regarding the Board's denial of Mr. Ehlert's 1990-91 outfitter license. Testimony/evidence presented before the Board establishes the following Findings of Fact: 1) Mr. Ehlert was convicted of a felony and given a withheld judgment; 2) Mr. Ehlert by testimony before the Board stated he was advised by the District Court that he was not convicted of a felony; 3) Mr. Ehlert did answer no to the conviction of felony on the outfitter license renewal application. In consideration of the forgoing Findings of Fact, the following Conclusions of Law are made: 1) Mr. Ehlert, to the best of his knowledge, answered truthfully on the outfitters renewal application and; 2) Mr. Ehlert was given a withheld judgement and, in accordance with Idaho Code 36-2113(b), said sentence would constitute a conviction for a felony charge. Pursuant to the forgoing Finding of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) RESCIND ITS PRIOR ACTION TO DENY MR. EHLERT'S 1990-91 OUTFITTER LICENSE AND; 2) ISSUE SAID OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR THE 1990-91 SEASON ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH THE TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR, ENDING MARCH 31, 1991 AND FURTHER, THAT PRIOR TO ISSUANCE OF SAID LICENSE, MR. EHLERT BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AND PASS AN APPROPRIATE OUTFITTERS EXAMINATION.

**Omnisports, Inc., dba The Snug Company, William R. Mason, Designated Agent:** Mr. Mason came before the Board as Designated Agent for Omnisports, Inc., dba The Snug Company in a show cause hearing as to why their license should not be suspended or revoked for violation of Idaho Code 36-2113 (a)(14) and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 52(d). Following receipt of testimony in the hearing and in consideration of testimony offered, the following Findings of Fact are established: 1) W. Gregory Loomis was convicted for operation of an unmarked boat for his employing outfitter on the Salmon River

(SA2); 2) said employing outfitter was, in fact, Omnisports, Inc., dba The Snug Company; 3) no evidence was presented which would refute these facts. Thus the following Conclusions of Law are made: 1) Omnisports, Inc., dba The Snug Company, did in fact employ W. Gregory Loomis for the conduct of a fishing expedition on the Salmon River (SA2) utilizing an unmarked boat. Pursuant thereto, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF OMNISPORTS, INC., dba THE SNUG COMPANY'S, OUTFITTER LICENSE, THAT THEY BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$150.00 FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(14) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 52(d).

**Day Floats, Below Hells Canyon, SN7:** The Board reviewed the Capitol City Supervisor, Dave Rittersbacher's, proposed impasse resolution for licensing of day use float trips on the Snake River (SN7) below Hells Canyon Dam. The Board also reviewed the August 23, 1990 letter by Wallowa-Whitman Forest Supervisor, R.M. Richmond, in which he finds Mr. Rittersbacher's proposed resolution as unacceptable. Following discussion/consideration of this matter, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD DIRECT ITS ATTORNEY TO DRAFT A LETTER TO STAN TIXIER TO 1) EXPRESS THE BOARD'S POSITION THAT THEY HAVE FOLLOWED THE MOU TO THE LETTER 2) FORWARD ITS RESPONSE TO THE CAPITOL SUPERVISOR'S SUGGESTED RESOLUTION TO THE IMPASSE TOGETHER WITH CORRESPONDENCE HAVING BEARING ON THE IMPASSE, AND 3) REQUEST HIS ASSISTANCE AS DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE OF THE CHIEF ON MATTERS CONCERNING THE MOU BETWEEN THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD AND THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE, IN REVIEW AND RESOLUTION OF THIS MATTER. FURTHER, COPIES OF THIS LETTER SHOULD BE SENT TO WALLOWA-WHITMAN FOREST SUPERVISOR, R.M. RICHMOND, HELLS CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA MANAGER, ED COLE, AND BOISE CAPITOL CITY SUPERVISOR, DAVE RITTERSBACHER.

**George May:** The Board reviewed Mr. May's 1990-91 Guide License application for the conduct of big game and bird hunting as well as fishing, trailrides, and snowmobiling activities while in the employ of S D Outfitters, Inc., dba Seven Devils Outfitters, Dave Stucker, Designated Agent. Following a review of this application, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MAY'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION AS SUBMITTED WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SNOWMOBILING IN AS MUCH AS THERE IS NO SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS TO ATTEST TO MR. MAY'S QUALIFICATIONS TO CONDUCT THIS ACTIVITY.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours, and reconvened on Thursday, August 30, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members present together with Board's Attorney, Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Kenneth L. Smith, dba 62 Ridge Outfitter and Guides:** The Board reviewed the ongoing matter of litigation regarding a boating

accident on the Clearwater River (CL3). Further, it has been revealed that Mr. Smith apparently employed Messrs Cook and English for the conduct of a drift boat operation when in fact Mr. Smith is not licensed for the conduct of said activity and is only licensed for power boating activities on CL3. Following a review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley)(Crane abstains) THAT THE BOARD BRING MR. SMITH BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS LICENSE FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(8)(ii).

**Olivia Expeditions, dba The River Company, Betsy Barrymore Stoll, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the July 2, 1990 letter from the Idaho Public Utilities Commission addressed to Ms. Stoll regarding the citation issued to River Rat Express as regards vehicle inspection. Following the review and consideration of the circumstances which prompted the citation and subsequent letter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER OF REPRIMAND TO MS. STOLL EXPRESSING ITS CONCERN FOR THE APPARENT DISREGARD OF THE COOPERATIVE EFFORT EXTENDED BY THE IDAHO PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION IN ATTEMPTING TO SERVICE THE INDUSTRY IN INSPECTION OF THEIR EQUIPMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH LAW. FURTHER, THE BOARD WOULD CAUTION MS. STOLL TO COMPLY WITH APPLICABLE LAW TO PRECLUDE THE BOARD HAVING TO TAKE ADVERSE ACTION AGAINST THE LICENSE OF OLIVIA EXPEDITIONS, dba THE RIVER COMPANY, FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5). (Administrative Note: Copies of this letter should be sent to the Public Utilities Commission Port of Entry and the D Bus Company.)

**Richard L. Dierks:** Mr. Dierks met before the Board regarding his proposal to conduct a kayaking school and his further interest in finding whether this activity would fall within the purview of the Act. Evaluation of the data/information presented by Mr. Dierks as to conduct of his proposed kayaking school finds that said activity would come under the purview of the Outfitters and Guides Act (Title 36, Chapter 21). Mr. Dierks was so advised. Thus, he was further advised that he would either need to 1) become a licensed Idaho outfitter or 2) become a licensed guide under a qualified outfitter for the conduct of his proposed kayaking school. Further, the Board directs a follow-up letter be addressed to Mr. Dierks to reaffirm the Board's position and advice given.

**Clearwater Forest/Muleshoe Wilderness Camp Outfitters:** Messrs Dennis Elliott, Tom Suk, and Chuck Raddon of the Clearwater National Forest met with the Board regarding the Muleshoe Wilderness Camp outfitting business and the Forests' analysis of additional recreational opportunities on the Forest as it may have impact/bearing upon relicensing of said business. Discussion of this matter finds that the current Muleshoe Wilderness Camp outfitter license appears to have expired March 31, 1990. Further,

the Forest Service special use permit for said business expired December 31, 1989. If, indeed, these documents have expired then Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c) for consideration in relicensing of this area would be triggered. Various aspects of this situation were discussed with Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, and Board member Leo Crane appointed to work with Forest Service representatives in review and determination of license/special use permit status and evaluation of the operating area for licensable activities and/or steps necessary to relicensing of this area under the purview of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28(c) and the Memorandum of Understanding.

**Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Adventures:** Messrs Ron Howell, Whitewater Express, Inc., and Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Adventures, met before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Ron Howell, Whitewater Express, Inc., for the transfer of his float boating activities on SA7A, SA7B, and SA7C as well as Salmon River SA8 to Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Adventures. Also, Mr. Cook has two outfitter amendment requests before the Board for addition of snowmobiling as a licensable activity under his license in Fish and Game Management Units 14 & 18 and for conduct of trailrides, photography trips, and fishing in the Gospel Hump Wilderness. Following review of these matters and interview before the Board, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE TRANSFER AND SALE OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN RON HOWELL, WHITEWATER EXPRESS, INC., FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER (SA7A, SA7B, SA7C & SA8) TO RICHARD COOK, dba COOK'S IDAHO ADVENTURES; 2) APPROVE MR. COOK'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR ADDITION OF SNOWMOBILING IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 14 & 18 AS OUTLINED ON HIS APPLICATION AND; 3) APPROVE MR. COOK'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR ADDITION OF TRAILRIDES AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS IN THE GOSPEL HUMP WILDERNESS AREA PENDING AFFIRMATIVE APPROVAL FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND RESPONSE FROM AFFECTED OUTFITTERS. IN THE EVENT THERE IS ADVERSE INPUT FROM THE DEPARTMENT AND/OR AFFECTED OUTFITTERS, THE BOARD WILL COMMUNICATE WITH MR. COOK RELATIVE TO HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST REGARDING SAME.

The Board recessed for lunch and 1205 hours and reconvened at 1325 hours.

**Jim Infanger, dba High Country River Trips:** Mr. and Mrs. Infanger together with Larry Moats met before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Larry Moats for conduct of power boating and fishing on the Salmon River (SA4A & SA4B) to Jim Infanger, dba High Country River Trips. Following the interview and discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF

BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN LARRY MOATS AND JIM INFANGER FOR CONDUCT OF POWER BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER (SA4A & SA4B); 2) ISSUE SAID LICENSE UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES, REGISTRATION AND SUBMISSION TO THE BOARD OF A DBA CERTIFICATE FROM LEMHI COUNTY AND BOND AND; 3) APPROVE MR. INFANGER QUALIFIED TO GUIDE PENDING RECEIPT OF NECESSARY TRAINING CARDS. (See Addendum #8)

**Lloyd Schoenauer:** Mr. Schoenauer appeared in a hearing before the Board regarding the denial of his designated agent license. Prior to going into said hearing, information provided by Mr. Schoenauer and, review of the Board's files finds that the prior Board action was in error. Following which, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS PRIOR ACTION IN DENIAL OF MR. SCHOENAUER'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE AND PROCEED TO ISSUE SAID LICENSE QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT A LETTER BE DIRECTED TO MR. SCHOENAUER TO AFFIRM THE CONVERSATION WITH HIM REGARDING HIS ADVERTISEMENT IN WHICH HE HAS INDICATED HE WOULD TAKE STEPS TO CLARIFY SAID ADVERTISEMENT TO INDICATE HE WOULD BE SERVING ONLY AS A BOOKING AGENT FOR LICENSE IDAHO OUTFITTERS OR TAKING CLIENTS WITHIN HIS EMPLOYING OUTFITTERS OPERATING AREA BOUNDARIES.

**Idaho Department of Fish and Game/1991-95 Mule Deer Management Plan:** The Board reviewed the Idaho Department of Fish and Game 1991-95 draft Mule Deer Management Plan and finds the statement: "deer harvest by outfitted clients tends to concentrate disproportionately on the mature bucks in areas where mature buck numbers are low and additional harvest is not desirable the department will oppose any additional outfitting activities involving deer hunting" of concern to the Board as regards validity of said statement and public perception of the outfitting industry. Following a discussion and consideration of this draft plan and above quoted statement, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME TO EXPRESS SHOCK AND OPPOSITION THAT THE DEPARTMENT WOULD INCLUDE SUCH A BIASED STATEMENT WITHIN THE PROPOSED DRAFT MULE DEER MANAGEMENT PLAN.

**Ridge Taylor, dba Ridge Taylor Outfitters:** Mr. Taylor met before the Board relative to his license amendment request for the conduct of trophy deer hunting within Fish and Game Management Unit 69 (controlled hunt 169) to accommodate four clientele: Allen Kotecki, license #202-0-011927, permit #806-0-073920; Don Gould license #202-0-011928, permit #806-0-073650; Rich Haageson license #202-0-004164, permit #806-0-07371; and James Voeller license #202-0-004164, permit #806-0-07414, for a deer hunt November 15 - 30, 1990. The first two have booked hunts, the other two are pending. Following consideration of Mr. Taylor's amendment request, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. TAYLOR'S REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF TROPHY HUNTS WITHIN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNIT 69

(CONTROLLED HUNT 169). IN ACCOMMODATION OF THE AFOREMENTIONED PERSONS NAMELY, ALAN KOTECKI, DON GOULD, RICH HAAGESON, AND JAMES VOELLER, NOVEMBER 15-30, 1990. FURTHER, THAT ANY PRIVATE LANDS THAT MAY BE INVOLVED IN THE CONDUCT OF SAID HUNT MUST HAVE WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM SAID PRIVATE LAND OWNER OR HIS AGENT WITH SUCH PERMISSION FILED WITH THE BOARD PRIOR TO THE HUNT.

**Ridge W. Taylor, dba Ridge Taylor Outfitters:** Mr. Taylor met before the Board in a show cause hearing for suspension or revocation of his outfitter license for violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(8). During the course of the hearing and testimony offered by Messrs Taylor, Morse, and Ferguson, the following Findings of Fact are established: 1) Employees of Ridge W. Taylor, dba Ridge Taylor Outfitters, were hunting with clients on private property owned by Larry Ferguson; 2) said activity occurred without written permission having been obtained from the private land owner and filed with the Board and; 3) Mr. Taylor admitted to the allegation that his employees were in fact hunting clients on property owned by Mr. Larry Ferguson. The foregoing Findings of Fact establish the following Conclusions of Law: 1) Ridge W. Taylor, dba Ridge Taylor Outfitters employees were hunting clients outside of Mr. Taylor's assigned operating area in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(8). Therefore, pursuant to the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) FIND RIDGE W. TAYLOR, dba RIDGE TAYLOR OUTFITTERS IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113 (a)(8); 2) IMPOSE, IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF MR. TAYLOR'S OUTFITTER LICENSE, A FINE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200.00, SAID FINE BEING PAYABLE WITHIN 60 DAYS OF RECEIPT OF NOTIFICATION AND; 3) REQUIRE MR. TAYLOR TO TAKE AND PASS THE OUTFITTERS EXAMINATION BEFORE THE ISSUANCE OF ANY SUBSEQUENT OUTFITTERS LICENSE.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours, and reconvened on Friday, August 31, 1990 at 0830 hours with all Board members present together with Board's Attorney, Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Forest Service/Wallowa-Whitman National Forest:** The Board reviewed the Decision Notice received from Wallowa-Whitman National Forest concerning the outfitter/guide special use authorization to conduct commercial services connected with cougar and bear hunting issued August 17, 1990. The review finds the decision officer selected Alternative C as his near term decision while the long term decision was to "complete another analysis assessing the entire outfitter/guide program" on the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest. Following review and consideration of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to R.M. Richmond, Forest Supervisor, Wallowa-Whitman National Forest to 1) commend his near term decision in selection of Alternative C and; 2) urge that in his

preparation and evaluation relative to continued outfitting and guiding activities on the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest that outfitting and guiding activities be addressed as a legitimate use of National Forest (public) land, separate and apart from dispersed recreation with analysis and evaluation on that basis. That is, use similar procedures utilized in evaluating grazing, mining, timbering, or other uses of the public land.

**Lemhi/Custer County Bear-Cougar Joint Use Area Hearing:** The Board recessed to enable the conduct of the Lemhi/Custer County Joint Use hearing as conducted by an independent hearings officer, Jean Uranga. Hearing got underway at 0900 hours and was completed at 1150 hours.

The Board recessed for lunch and 1200 hours and reconvened at 1220 hours.

**Steven J. Wieber, dba Happy Hooker Excursions:** The Board reviewed Mr. Wieber's file noting July 15, 1990 and August 23, 1990 Forest Service letters addressed to Mr. Wieber and to the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board respectively regarding Mr. Wieber's violation and conviction of stipulations of his Forest Service Special Use Permit. Further review of the file finds that in accordance with prior action taken by the Board dated February 17, 1988 wherein Mr. Wieber's outfitter license was revoked with said revocation suspended and placed on probation for a period of three years. Stipulated terms of said probation was that Mr. Wieber comply/not violate the laws of the State of Idaho governing outfitting and guiding, fish and game and the rules and regulations of the Board. In consideration of the foregoing review of Mr. Wieber's file, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT STEVEN J. WIEBER, dba HAPPY HOOKER EXCURSIONS 1) BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR REVOCATION OF HIS OUTFITTERS LICENSE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STIPULATIONS SET FORTH IN THE ORDER OF THE BOARD DATED FEBRUARY 17, 1988, AND; 2) OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CHANGE IN BUSINESS STRUCTURE (NAME) BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109 (c) AND 36-2113 (a)(4 & 14).

**Bressler Outfitters, Joe Bressler, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the August 13, 1990 letter from Mr. Bressler concerning enforcement activities on the South Fork Snake River (SS1). Following review of this letter, the Board directs that the Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator address a letter to Mr. Bressler explaining the background and circumstances which prompted this incident.

Thus, the Board directs the Executive Director contact the Clearwater National Forest as soon as possible to request they delay further action as regards Mule Shoe Outfitting business until such time as Executive Director, Dean Sangrey and Board member, Leo Crane has opportunity to meet with them and discuss same.

**John Valvo, dba Twin Peaks Outfitters:** Messrs Valvo and Peterson met before the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer by and between Ed Peterson to John Valvo for the conduct of big game hunting and recreational activities. However, during the course of the interview, it appeared that a misunderstanding by the parties as to what portion of the business was being sold and what was being retained by Mr. Peterson became evident. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board suggested they reevaluate their proposal and return at the next Board meeting if and when they have resolved their differences.

**Charles A. 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
