APPROVED MINUTES

Board Meeting - October 22 - 24, 1990

Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

An additional meeting to the regularly scheduled meetings of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, October 22, 1990, at 0830 hours with all Board members present except Leo Crane (who was excused due to an early heavy snowfall which necessitated his closing camps, etc., and inability to attend Board Meeting). Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Executive Directors Report / Legislative Audit: The Board reviewed the Executive Director's draft response to the Legislative Audit Report of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board for fiscal years ended June 30, 1988, 1989, and 1990. Following review of said draft response, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD CONCUR/ APPROVE SAID RESPONSE AND DIRECT ITS SUBMISSION AS APPROPRIATE TO CONCLUDE THIS MATTER.

Bressler (Vern) Outfitters, Inc., Joe Bressler, Designated Agent: Mr. Bressler's August 13, 1990 letter requesting Board clarification and interpretation of what is power boat versus float boat activity, as defined in the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations was reviewed. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs the Executive Director respond to Mr. Bressler advising him the Board thanks him for his letter and will take this matter into consideration to better define power/float boating in the next rules making procedure. In the meantime, in order to meet the intent of the rule as it is currently written, the Board recommends that he operate under his power boat license with a motor mounted on the transom of his boats, to alleviate any concerns of the public or enforcement personnel that may be encountered.

Board Minutes - August Meeting: The Board reviewed the August 27 - 31, 1990 minutes following which, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID MINUTES AS CORRECTED.

Fiscal Reports: The Board reviewed the Fiscal Reports for the Board's operating budget as submitted by the Executive Director for the month's of July, August, and September. Following review of said reports, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID FISCAL REPORTS AS SUBMITTED.

Proposed Legislation: The Board again reviewed the proposed legislative package as submitted to the Department of Financial Management for inclusion into the Governor's Executive Budget request. A letter has been received from the Division of Financial Management acknowledging receipt of said legislative package. Accordingly, the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association, other

interested parties, and the public can be made aware of the Board's request for legislative change and proposed increase in license fees.

Executive Directors Report: The Executive Director, in addition to the foregoing matters, brought the Board abreast of other current on-going activities since the August Board meeting.

Enforcement Coordinator: The Enforcement Coordinator provided a review and update of enforcement activities since the August Board meeting.

Legal Review: The Board's Attorney reviewed and provided an update of legal matters ongoing since the August Board meeting.

Teton Expeditions, Inc., Glen Foster, Designated Agent: Mr. Foster appeared before the Board as regards his request for renewal of his 1990-91 outfitter license, in accordance with criteria/requirements of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 13. Following consideration of this matter and the interview with Mr. Foster, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT AND APPROVE TETON EXPEDITIONS, INC'S, LATE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL AND ISSUE OF THEIR 1990-91 OUTFITTER LICENSE AND GLEN R. FOSTER, DESIGNATED AGENT, LICENSE QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

Ore-Ida Council, Boy Scouts of America, dba Ore-Ida Council, Inc. #106 Boy Scouts of America, Mike Partin, Designated Agent: Messrs Kim Hansen, Mike Partin of Boy Scouts of America, and Glen Foster, Designated Agent, Teton Expeditions, Inc. met before the Board relative to the proposed purchase and transfer of Teton Expeditions, Inc., float boat business on SA7A to Ore-Ida Council, Boy Scouts of America, dba Ore-Ida Council, Inc. #106 Boy Scouts of America, Mike Partin, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board and discussion of this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN TETON EXPEDITIONS, INC., GLEN FOSTER, DESIGNATED AGENT TO ORE-IDA COUNCIL, BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA, DBA ORE-IDA COUNCIL, INC. #106 BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA, MIKE PARTIN, DESIGNATED AGENT, WITH LICENSES ISSUED PENDING COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK NAMELY: 1) COMPLETION OF MIKE PARTIN'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION; 2) MR. PARTIN'S PASSING THE OUTFITTERS EXAMINATION; 3) SUBMISSION/CONFIRMATION OF AN EXPERIENCE LOG BY MR. PARTIN AS REGARDS HIS QUALIFICATIONS TO BE LICENSED AS LEAD BOATMAN ON SA7A; 4) NECESSARY PERFORMANCE BOND; AND 5) PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #1)

The Board recessed for lunch as 1200 hours and reconvened at 1325 hours.

Idaho Public Records Law Model Policy: The Board reviewed the proposed model policy, as drafted by the Idaho Attorney General's Office, and provided state agencies for their consideration and adoption in meeting the requirements of Idaho's Public Records law. Following review of this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND BOARD'S ATTORNEY BE REQUESTED TO DRAFT A PUBLIC RECORDS POLICY FOR REVIEW AT THE DECEMBER MEETING. FURTHER, SAID POLICY SHOULD NOT ONLY PROVIDE GUIDANCE FOR COMPLIANCE WITH IDAHO'S PUBLIC RECORDS LAW BUT MUST ALSO PROVIDE GUIDANCE AS TO THOSE RECORDS WHICH ARE EXEMPT FROM REVIEW BY SAID LAW.

Idaho Public Utilities Commission: The Board reviewed the September 27, 1990 letter from Tonya Clark, Director of the Regulated Carried Division, regarding issuing an outfitters license to Scott Unger for conduct of jeep tours. Ms. Clark expressed the need for better coordination between the agencies in the licensing and regulating of such activities. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs that future applications which may be received for the conduct of jeep tours or similar activity that appear to involve the Public Utilities Commission, that the Public Utilities Commission be solicited for comment on said application prior to Board approval/issue of license.

Mining Activity on the Salmon River (SA4A): The Board reviewed the October 10, 1990 letter from Ted Epley regarding the random discharge of firearms in the vicinity of the Lucile boat landing. Such discharge of firearms was alleged to have endangered the public and their enjoyment of the area. The Board also noted Governor Cecil Andrus', October 17, 1990, response to Mr. Epley's complaint regarding this matter. Following review and discussion of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to the State Land Board urging their attention and review of this violation of public trust to urge their earnest consideration as to whether future licensing of this activity in the Lucile area should be permitted. And further, a copy of Enforcement Agent Randy Evans' letter regarding this activity should accompany the letter to the State Land Board .

U.S. West Communications: The Board reviewed the October 9, 1990 letter from U.S. West Communications regarding the Delfi 616 Telephone System Maintenance Agreement that expires December 6, 1990. Following review of this matter, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE EXTENDED MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT WITH US WEST COMMUNICATIONS FOR MAINTENANCE OF THE DELFI 616 TELEPHONE SYSTEM AT A COST OF \$316.00 PER YEAR.

James Beal: The Board reviewed the October 5, 1990 letter from Mr. Beal regarding his show cause hearing before the Board for violation of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations while in the employ of Peter Grubb, dba River Odysseys West (ROW). Following review of the file and consideration of material contained therein, MSC (Miller--Baird - Epley, nay) THAT 1) THE BOARD RESCIND ITS DECISION TO BRING MR. BEAL BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS GUIDES LICENSE; AND 2) CHARGES BE DISMISSED. (Administrative Note: Discussion of this matter points out the need for clarification of Board procedures in interpretation of Rule 41 so that this confusion by the industry and the Board does not continue to exist.)

Peter Grubb, dba River Odysseys West (ROW): Following a review of Mr. Grubb's file and in consideration of the foregoing action taken on Mr. Beal, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT 1) THE BOARD DISMISS ITS CHARGES AGAINST MR. GRUBB WITH CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW CAUSE HEARING; AND 2) A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. GRUBB ADVISING HIM THAT ALTHOUGH THE SHOW CAUSE HEARING/CHARGES HAVE BEEN DISMISSED, HE DID NOT SUBMIT SAID TRAINING CARD AND/OR AMENDMENT REQUEST IN A TIMELY MANNER, WHICH CONTRIBUTED TO THE CONFUSION AS REGARDS MR. BEAL'S LEAD BOATMAN STATUS.

Dale Stansberry, dba Whitewater Adventures: The Board reviewed the October 11, 1990, Bureau of Land Management letter addressed to the Board regarding their (BLM) cancellation of Mr. Stansberry's Special Use Permit for non-payment of use fees for the conduct of activities on the Main Salmon River (SA4A). Following review and consideration of the BLM's letter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. STANSBERRY TO REQUEST THAT HE TAKE IMMEDIATE STEPS TO RECONCILE HIS PROBLEM WITH THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT IN PAYMENT OF APPROPRIATE USE FEES TO PRECLUDE NECESSITY OF THE BOARD TAKING ADVERSE ACTION AGAINST HIS LICENSE.

Salmon River Challenge, Inc., Patrick Marek, Designated Agent / David Joseph Brookins / Mike Nelson: Salmon River Challenge, Inc., Patrick Marek, Designated Agent, together with his wife Shari Marek as well as guides David Joseph Brookins and Mike Nelson, appeared before the Board in a combined Show Cause Hearing for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5, 9, & 14); violation of Idaho Code 36-2104 and 36-2113(a)(5 & 14); and violation of Idaho Code 36-2104 and 36-2113(a)(5 & 14) respectively. Pursuant to the conduct of the hearing, the following Findings of Fact are established applicable to these cases in total. 1) David J. Brookins and Mike Nelson did not have valid training forms or guide licenses in their possession during the period June 26 through July

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16, 1990; 2) Said guides did conduct guided float trips during the period June 26 through July 16, 1990; 3) Said guides did intend to guide a commercial trip on July 18, 1990; 4) Said guides were advised by employing outfitter (Salmon River Challenge, Inc.) that they were in compliance with Idaho Outfitter and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations; 5) Said outfitter did attempt to get said guide licenses on July 2, 1990, but said applications were refused by the Board because of improper payment of fees; 6) Said guides did not operate boats on date cited of July 18, 1990; and 7) No evidence was presented to the Board to take action against Salmon River Challenge, Inc., Patrick Marek, Designated Agent for violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5 & 14). The foregoing Findings of Fact establish the following Conclusions of Law: 1) During the period June 26 through July 16, 1990, David J. Brookins and Mike Nelson did operate and guide several commercial float trips without having first obtained a valid guide license or a validated training form; 2) The employing outfitter (Salmon River Challenge, Inc.) did employ the above named guides in this activity; and 3) That on July 18, 1990, the above named outfitter did employ the named guides and intended to operate a commercial float trip on the Salmon River without having first obtained valid guide licenses or validated training forms for said guides. Following which, MSF (Baird--Miller)(Meiners, nay - Epley, abstains) THAT THE BOARD 1) AS REGARDS GUIDES, DAVID JOSEPH BROOKINS AND MIKE NELSON, CONSIDER THE MITIGATING CIRCUMSTANCES WHICH INDICATE SAID GUIDES WERE OPERATING IN GOOD FAITH AND UNDER THE ADVISE AND COUNSEL OF THEIR EMPLOYING OUTFITTER; 2) FINDS, THEREFORE, THAT NO PENALTY BE ASSESSED AGAINST THEM FOR GUIDING WITHOUT A LICENSE; 3) AS REGARDS THE EMPLOYING OUTFITTER (SALMON RIVER CHALLENGE, INC., PATRICK MAREK, DESIGNATED AGENT) CONSIDER TESTIMONY THAT SHOW THERE IS SOME CONFUSION BETWEEN THE INFORMATION CONTAINED ON IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD FORM OG-5 AND IDAHO OUTFITTER AND GUIDE LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 41; AND 4) ALSO CONSIDER THAT THE EMPLOYING OUTFITTER ATTESTS IN SUBMISSION OF HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION THAT HE IS AWARE OF THE CONTENTS OF RULE 41; THUS IT IS THE BOARD'S DECISION THAT THE EMPLOYING OUTFITTER (SALMON RIVER CHALLENGE, INC.) BE ASSESSED A FINE OF \$100.00 IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THEIR 1990-91 OUTFITTERS LICENSE FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9). FURTHER, THAT PATRICK MAREK, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AN OUTFITTER EXAMINATION PRIOR TO THE RENEWAL/ISSUANCE OF HIS 1991-92 DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION: MSC (Meiners--Baird)(Miller, nay) IN RECONSIDERATION OF THE FOREGOING MOTION; THAT ALL THE MOTION REMAIN AS STATED EXCEPT FOR THE AMOUNT OF THE FINE WHICH IS AMENDED TO READ: BE ASSESSED A FINE OF \$300.00 IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THIER 1990-91 OUTFITTERS LICENSE FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9).

The Board recessed for the evening at 1815 hours, and reconvened on Tuesday, October 23, 1990, at 0830 hours with all Board members, except Leo Crane, present together with Board's Attorney, Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

Idaho Wildlife Society: Bill Mullins, President, Idaho Chapter of the Wildlife Society, met with the Board concerning the conduct of their auctioned activities for purposes of fund raising to enhance Society activities. During the interview before the Board, Mr. Mullins was given material to explain the Board's position as regards the protection of public health, safety, and welfare in the conduct of those auctioned activities that fall within the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act. As a result of the interview, Mr. Mullins stated he had a better understanding of the Board's concerns and will go back to the Society to outline the Board's position in this regard and perhaps extend an invitation to the Board to participate in their upcoming annual meeting to attend and further explain the Board's position in this matter.

Idaho Big Game, Inc., Jon Goodman, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the four (4) applications submitted for consideration in relicensing and permitting future outfitting operations within that area formerly licensed to Idaho Big Game, Inc. The names of the four (4) applicants that submitted applications are Rick Hussey, Dick Norris, Dave Hettinger, and Cranney & Foland. Following a review of these applications and noting the recommendations made by the Forest Service and Idaho Department of Fish and Game relative to any future relicensing of this operating area, and in evaluation of the applications submitted for consideration by the Board in selection of a qualified applicant, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) SELECT RICK HUSSEY, dba QUARTER CIRCLE A OUTFITTERS, AS THE MOST QUALIFIED APPLICANT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE APPLICATION AND OPERATING PLAN SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD FOR ITS CONSIDERATION IN RELICENSING THAT OPERATING AREA FORMERLY ALLOCATED TO IDAHO BIG GAME, INC.; 2) ISSUE SAID LICENSE WITH RESTRICTIONS THAT ELK HUNTING IS LIMITED TO NO MORE THAN TEN (10) ELK HUNTERS PER YEAR AND ACTIVITY AROUND MOOSE CREEK AIR STRIP IS RESTRICTED; 3) NOTIFY MR. HUSSEY OF HIS SELECTION AS THE SUCCESSFUL APPLICANT IN THIS MATTER AND REQUEST HIM TO SUBMIT NECESSARY PAPERWORK TO PERMIT ISSUANCE OF LICENSE; AND 4) APPROVE MR. HUSSEY AS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (Administrative Note: All applicants should be notified of the Board's decision in this regard as well as the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and the U.S. Forest Service).

James S. Fowler, Jr.: Mr. Fowler appeared before the Board relative to his request for renewal of his 1990-91 outfitter license in accordance with criteria outlined in the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 13. Following the interview before the Board and in consideration of the application, operating plan, and testimony provided to the Board by Mr. Fowler, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT MR. FOWLER'S LATE APPLICATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 13, CRITERIA WITH ISSUE OF SAID LICENSE FOLLOWING MR. FOWLER'S HAVING TAKEN AND PASSED THE OUTFITTER EXAMINATION.

Salmon River Challenge, Inc., Patrick Marek, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the October 23, 1990 amendment request from Salmon River Challenge, Inc. for an exception to Rule 57(a) to allow a total of five (5) boats for the period October 27, 1990, and a total of four (4) boats for the period of October 28, 1990, for the combination of a float/fishing trip on SA7C, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST AS STATED ABOVE ON A ONE (1) TIME ONLY BASIS.

Teton Valley Lodge, Inc., Randy Berry, Designated Agent: Randy Berry appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing for the proposed suspension or revocation of Teton Valley Lodge, Inc. outfitters license for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5, 9 & 14). Following the hearing before the Board and in consideration of the testimony offered by Mr. Berry relative to the allegations made, the following Findings of Fact are established: 1) That on July 10 & 11, 1990, Steve Rasmussen, Mike Rasmussen, Spence VanMeter, and Cade Dillree did conduct guided trips on SS1 without having in their possession valid guide licenses as required by the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations; 2) Said guided trips were conducted under the auspices of and with the knowledge of Teton Valley Lodge, Inc., Randy Berry, Designated Agent; 3) Mr. Berry acknowledged that said trips did, in fact, occur; 4) Mike Rasmussen, Spence VanMeter, and Cade Dillree license applications had been submitted and received by the Board on June 25, 1990, but, said license applications and training forms were returned to the outfitter for proper signatures. The foregoing Findings of Fact establish the following Conclusions of Law: 1) Teton Valley Lodge, Inc., Randy Berry, Designated Agent did, in fact, employ unlicensed guides in conduct of a guided fishing trip on the Snake River (SS1) on July 10 & 11, 1990, contrary to Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9); 2) Sufficient evidence was presented which allows the Board to take action against Teton Valley, Lodge, Inc., Randy Berry, Designated Agent for violation of 36-2113(a)(5 & 14) and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing

Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 41 & 60. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD FIND TETON VALLEY LODGE, INC., RANDY BERRY, DESIGNATED AGENT IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5) AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 61 IMPOSE A FINE OF \$500.00 IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF TETON VALLEY LODGE, INC. OUTFITTER LICENSE. FURTHER, THAT RANDY BERRY, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AND PASS AN OUTFITTERS EXAMINATION BEFORE RENEWAL/ISSUE OF HIS 1991-92 DESIGNATED AGENT LICENCE.

Steve Rasmussen / Mike Rowe Rasmussen / Spencer Todd VanMeter / Cade Dillree: The Board reviewed Messrs Steve Rasmussen, Mike Rasmussen, Spence VanMeter, and Cade Dillree's files noting prior Board action in which they were requested to come before the Board in a show cause hearing for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5, 9, & 14) and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rules 6(d) & 41. With reference to the Teton Valley Lodge, Inc., Randy Berry, Designated Agent, Show Cause Hearing in which Mr. Berry assumed full responsibility for the action of said guides as enumerated above, thereby making mute the actions of these individuals as to their responsibility for violation of Idaho Law, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD'S PRIOR ACTION AGAINST MESSRS STEVE RASMUSSEN, MIKE ROWE RASMUSSEN, SPENCER TODD VANMETER, AND CADE DILLREE BE DISMISSED AND THAT THEY BE SO NOTIFIED. (Administrative note: The Board's Attorney should be notified of the Board's action on this matter.)

R & R Outdoors, Inc., Robert Black, Designated Agent: Robert Black appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing for proposed suspension or revocation of R & R Outdoors, Inc. outfitters license for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(14). Following the hearing before the Board relative to this matter, Findings of Fact are established as follows: 1) on July 3, 1990, R & R Outdoors, Inc., Robert Black, Designated Agent, did, in fact, conduct a commercial float boat trip on the Salmon River, SA7A, wherein their boats were not properly identified to indicate ownership of said boats; and 2) testimony offered before the Board by Mr. Black did acknowledge that said violation of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations occurred. Thus Findings of Fact establish the following Conclusions of Law: 1) R & R Outdoors, Inc, Robert Black, Designated Agent, did, in fact, operate a float boat on the Salmon River SA7A without proper identification of craft as required by Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 52(d). Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley)(Miller, nay) THAT PURSUANT TO THE FINDINGS OF THE HEARING BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST R & R OUTDOORS, INC., ROBERT BLACK, DESIGNATED AGENT, THAT SAID OUTFITTER BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100.00 IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS OUTFITTERS LICENSE.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1215 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Lemhi/Custer Joint Use Area For The Conduct of Bear and Cougar Hunting: The Board reviewed the proposed abolishment of the Lemhi/Custer County Joint Use areas and the hearing record established before Hearings Officer, Jean Uranga. Review of the Hearings Officer's Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Proposed Order, finds the Hearings Officer recommends that the Board eliminate the Lemhi/Custer County Joint Use Areas. Following review of the file, discussion, and in consideration of the Hearings Officer recommendations, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) ACCEPT THE HEARINGS OFFICER RECOMMENDATION (SET FORTH IN CASE #90-13, SIGNED 24, SEPTEMBER, 1990) THAT THE BOARD ELIMINATE THE LEMHI/ CUSTER JOINT USE AREAS; 2) NOTIFY CURRENT OUTFITTERS LICENSED TO THE LEMHI/CUSTER JOINT USE AREAS OF THE BOARD'S ACTION AND FURTHER ADVISE THEM THE BOARD WILL HONOR AND VALIDATE CURRENT LICENSES THROUGH MARCH 31, 1991 AND 1991-92 LICENSES TO INCLUDE BOOKING WHICH MAY HAVE BEEN MADE FOR THE SPRING BEAR SEASON THROUGH JUNE 30, 1991, AFTER WHICH NO FURTHER LICENSE WILL BE ISSUED FOR THE LEMHI/CUSTER COUNTY JOINT USE AREAS; 3) WILL REVIEW CURRENT LICENSEES HOLDING LICENSES IN BOTH THE LEMHI COUNTY AND CUSTER COUNTY JOINT USE AREAS AND WHERE SAID LICENSEES POSSESS AN OPERATING AREA SUFFICIENT TO ACCOMMODATE A VIABLE SPRING BEAR/COUGAR HUNT SAID LICENSEES SHALL BE RESTRICTED TO SUCH CURRENT OPERATING AREA(S); 4) WILL CONSIDER (UPON REQUEST THOSE CURRENT LICENSEES WHO DO NOT HAVE AN OPERATING AREA TO ACCOMMODATE A VIABLE SPRING BEAR OR COUGAR HUNTING OPERATION) AND WOULD CONTACT BOTH THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND U.S. FOREST SERVICE TO REQUEST REVIEW AND EVALUATION OF AREAS NOT CURRENTLY LICENSED TO ASCERTAIN WHETHER SUCH AREAS MAY BE APPROPRIATE FOR CONDUCT AND ASSIGNMENT OF AN OPERATING AREA TO SUCH LICENSEES FOR CONDUCT OF SPRING BEAR AND/OR COUGAR HUNTING.

Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc., Terry Ring, Designated Agent: Terry Ring appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing for the proposed suspension or revocation of Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc. outfitters license for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following the hearing, and in consideration of the testimony offered before the Board, the following Finding of Fact are established: 1) Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc., Terry Ring, Designated Agent acknowledged employing Mike Riedel, an unlicensed guide, for conduct of a fishing trip, July 14, 1989. Pursuant to the foregoing Finding of Fact, Conclusions of Law are as follows: 1) Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc., Terry Ring, Designated Agent, did employ Mike Riedel for the conduct of a fishing trip July 14, 1989, prior to Mr. Riedel receiving his guide license, in violation of

Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) FIND SILVER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC., TERRY RING, DESIGNATED AGENT, IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9); AND 2) IN CONSIDERATION OF THIS FACT, IMPOSE A FINE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100.00 IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF SILVER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC., OUTFITTER LICENSE.

Mike Riedel: Mr. Mike Riedel appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing for the proposed suspension or revocation of his guide license for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2104(a). Following the hearing, and in consideration of the testimony offered before the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board, the following Findings of Fact are established: 1) Mike Riedel did conduct a fishing trip on July 14, 1989, while in the employ of Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc., Terry Ring, Designated Agent; 2) Mike Riedel did not have a valid guide license in possession on July 14, 1989; and 3) Mike Riedel was convicted in State Court for guiding without a license. Pursuant to the foregoing Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law are as follows: 1) Mike Riedel did conduct a fishing trip July 14, 1989 while in the employ of Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc., Terry Ring, Designated Agent, prior to the time he had received his guide license, in violation of Idaho Code 36-2104(a). Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) FINDS MIKE RIEDEL DID CONDUCT A FISHING TRIP ON JULY 14, 1989, FOR WHICH HE WAS CONVICTED IN STATE COURT, FOR GUIDING WITHOUT A LICENSE IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2104(a); AND 2) IN CONSIDERATION OF THIS CONVICTION, FINES IMPOSED BY THE COURT, AND TESTIMONY GIVEN BEFORE THE BOARD REGARDING ISSUE OF MR. RIEDEL'S GUIDE LICENSE THAT NO FURTHER BOARD ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST MR. RIEDEL'S GUIDE LICENSE EXCEPT THAT UPON HIS APPLICATION FOR A 1991-92 GUIDES LICENSE THAT SAID LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A "PROBATIONARY" BASIS, SAID TERMS OF PROBATION BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR THAT ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE BE MADE DURING THAT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

Tim Swallow: The Board reviewed Mr. Swallow's 1990-91 guide license application noting that the Chairman had reviewed this application on October 11, 1990, and in consideration of a Fish and Game violation and letter of explanation thereof, directed that said license be issued on a probationary basis. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD CONCUR IN THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD.

Rolland Dean Adams, Jr.: The Board reviewed Mr. Adams 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of big game hunting activities while in the employ of Eakin Ridge Outfitters, noting that he answered affirmatively to having been charged with a

felony. Following discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT MR. ADAMS' 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR, ENDING MARCH 31, 1991.

Greg Burke: The Board reviewed Mr. Burke's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of big game hunting, trailrides, backpacking and incidental fishing activities while in the employ of Eakin Ridge Outfitters. In the review of the file the Board notes that he had made an application in 1988 for which he was denied the guide license for a conviction of violation of Idaho Fish and Game law, following which, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT GREG BURKE'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991.

Boise State University Recreational Program, Randy Miller, Designated Agent: Messrs Randy Miller and Robert Allen appeared in response to the Board's request that a BSU representative appear before the Board to clarify BSU's amendment request for the addition of trailrides, technical mountaineering, photography trips, and survival course as licensable activities under BSU's outfitter license. Following the interview and in consideration of information provided to the Board regarding this amendment request, Mr. Berry offered to submit a letter outlining BSU's purpose and intent in conduct of requested activities as regularly scheduled curricula in fulfilling their AMAS Program: Alternate Mobility Adventures Seekers program. Following which, the Board stated it would consider this information at its December meeting for further appropriate action regarding BSU's amendment request.

William O. Lintner: The Board reviewed Mr. Lintner's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of big game hunting, fly fishing, walk and wade fishing, and trailrides while in the employ of Steve Jones, dba Weitas Creek Outfitters. The Board further noted Mr. Lintner's response in section C that he had not received any convictions for violation of Fish and Game law. However, Idaho Department of Fish and Game records indicate that Mr. Lintner was, in fact, convicted of two (2) violations of Fish and Game law in 1987. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. LINTNER'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(1).

Guy A. Smith: The Board reviewed Mr. Smith's 1990-91 guide license application noting Mr. Smith indicated that he was convicted in 1970 for violation of Fish and Game law. The Board also noted the Chairman had reviewed this matter and authorized issue of license on a non-probationary basis. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD AFFIRM THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD.

Robert W. Rosenberg: The Board reviewed Mr. Rosenberg's amendment request to become lead boatman on Snake River (SN7) to note that 1) Mr. Rosenberg completed three trips in 1990 on the subject river (SN7); 2) He was licensed in 1988 with no indication of experience at that point and time; and 3) Prior to 1988 he was licensed in 1978 on the same river reach(SN7). Following consideration of this experience record, MSC (Miller--Baird)(Meiners, nay) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. ROSENBERG'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO BECOME LEAD BOATMAN ON SNAKE RIVER (SN7).

Harvey Leroy Suryan: The Board reviewed Mr. Suryan's 1990-91 guide license application noting that he had indicated on his application he had been convicted of a felony in 1976. Following which, MILLER MOVES THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. SURYAN'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION WITH LICENSE ISSUED WITH NO RESTRICTIONS. MOTION FAILS FOR LACK OF SECOND, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT MR. SURYAN'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH SAID TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991.

Dale A. Gardner: The Board reviewed Mr. Gardner's 1990-91 guide license application, noting that he has submitted what appears to be a falsified first aid card. Investigation of this matter by the Enforcement Coordinator finds the first aid card has, indeed, been falsified. Following which, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT MR. GARDNER'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO 36-2113(a)(1).

David Harbison: The Board reviewed Mr. Harbison's 1990-91 guide license application for the conduct of big game hunting, fly fishing, and trailriding activities while in the employ of Triple O Outfitters, noting that Mr. Harbison has submitted what appears to be a falsified Red Cross card. Investigation of this matter by the Enforcement Coordinator finds the first aid card has been falsified. Following which, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT MR. HARBISON'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO 36-2113(a)(1).

Gary Peters: The Board reviewed Mr. Peters designated agent license application to become designated agent for Clearwater Crossings Lodge, Inc., dba Hole-In-The-Wall Lodge. Following review and consideration of his application, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. PETERS AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR CLEARWATER CROSSINGS LODGE, INC., dba HOLE-IN-THE-WALL LODGE, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., Tim Craig, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., Tim Craig, Designated Agent, outfitter amendment request for the addition of cougar hunting within his currently licensed operating area (designated as area #1) occurring in Fish and Game management units 12 & 17. Following consideration of this amendment request and recommendation by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game wherein they find they have no objection to amending the license, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE BOULDER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC., TIM CRAIG, DESIGNATED AGENT, AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF COUGAR HUNTING WITHIN THAT OPERATING AREA DESIGNATED AS AREA #1. FURTHER, BEFORE SAID AMENDED LICENSE BE ISSUED THAT MR. CRAIG BE CONTACTED TO SUBMIT AN ADDITIONAL FEE OF \$65.00 FOR THE MAJOR AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE. (See Addendum #2)

Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Outfitters: The Board reviewed Rich Cook's outfitter amendment request for a change in his corporate outfitters name from Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Adventures, to Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Outfitters. Following consideration of this amendment request, MSC (Baird--Epley)(Miller, abstains) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID REQUEST. (See Addendum #3)

Richard Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch: The Board reviewed the matter of relicensing the operating area formerly licensed to Richard Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch. Following review and consideration for relicensing of this operating area in accordance with the MOU and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28, the Board directs a letter be addressed to the Idaho Panhandle National Forest, Avery Ranger District, to 1) recommend relicensing and permitting of outfitting in this operating area for conduct of previously licensed/permitted activities; 2) advise the Forest Service the Board does not consider this a "new opportunity" and asks that the Forest Service consider issuing a declaratory judgement that an environmental assessment is not necessary, thereby enabling the Board and Forest Service to move immediately to Step 7, Amendment 1, of the MOU, to advertise this operating area in accordance with Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28; and 3) further advise the Forest Service the Board has contacted the Idaho

Department of Fish and Game concerning relicensing this operating area and they, by letter dated September 4, 1990, have stated they have no problem in doing so if licensed as previously authorized. Thus, if the Board/Forest Service agree with recommended procedures, this vacancy can be filled by next license year.

Henry's Lake: The Board reviewed the open licensable slots on Henry's Lake and advertisement of same. Three (3) individuals responded to said advertisement and submitted applications for consideration in filling said slots, namely: Jimmie Duane Blair, Jacklin's Fly Shop, and William Scheiss. Following review and evaluation of the applications and operating plans submitted by said applicants, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD SELECT FROM AMONG THE THREE (3) APPLICANTS WILLIAM SCHEISS AND JACKLIN'S FLY SHOP TO FILL THE TWO (2) SLOTS AVAILABLE ON HENRY'S LAKE. (See Addendum #4 & #5).

The Board recessed for the evening at 1730 hours, and reconvened on Wednesday, October 24, 1990, at 0830 hours with all Board members, except Leo Crane, present together with Board's Attorney, Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

Firearms Policy: The Board reviewed the Firearms Policy as drafted by the Enforcement Staff and find that it appears to meet the Board's requirements very well. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) ADOPT SAID POLICY EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY; AND 2) COMMEND ARLO LARSEN FOR HIS TIME AND EFFORT IN FORMULATION AND DRAFTING SAID POLICY.

Lake Pend Oreille - Audit: Executive Director Dean Sangrey presented/reviewed the Lake Pend Oreille audit as conducted by himself and Board Member Ted Epley. Following discussion of the audit, certain factors emerge: 1) no apparent non-use of licensed activities is evident as applicable to the eight (8) individuals/licenses audited; 2) two (2) individuals/licenses were out of state, therefore their records were not audited, but arrangement was made to do so at a later date; 3) the audit leads to the recommendation that activities on the lake be closely monitored in the future to determine/confirm extent of licensed power boat fishing to further evaluate such use and its impact upon the lake and its fishery with adjustments made if necessary; and 4) the Idaho Department of Fish and Game provided useful information relative to alleged illegal activities on Lake Pend Orielle. Following which, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) ACCEPT THE AUDIT REPORT; AND 2) DIRECT AUDIT FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS BE INVESTIGATED AND IMPLEMENTED WHERE APPLICABLE

Northwest Dories, Inc., Curtis Chang, Designated Agent: The Board again reviewed Northwest Dories, Inc., Curtis Chang, Designated Agent, outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of mountain bike touring. The Board had previously approved the Nez Perce National Forest portion of their request; the Clearwater National Forest has now responded and have indicated they have no objection to the activity as requested, however, this segment of the request is an area in which Triple O Outfitters, Inc., Harlan Opdahl, Designated Agent conducts trailrides. Thus, the Board directs a double check be made as to whether Triple O Outfitters, Inc., Harlan Opdahl, Designated Agent has been contacted to ascertain whether this activity would be in conflict with their activities. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE NORTHWEST DORIES, INC., CURTIS CHANG, DESIGNATED AGENT, AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING PENDING RESPONSE/COORDINATION WITH TRIPLE O OUTFITTERS, HARLAN OPDAHL, DESIGNATED AGENT'S CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES ON THE SAME SECTION OF THE LEWIS AND CLARK TRAIL. (See Addendum #6)

Snug Guiding Service, Inc., Bill Mason, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request submitted by Omnisports, Inc., dba The Snug Company, William Mason, Designated Agent, for a change in corporate name to read Snug Guiding Service, Inc., Bill Mason, Designated Agent. Following review of the file and finding said file is complete, MSC (Baird--Epley) SNUG GUIDING SERVICE, INC., BILL MASON, DESIGNATED AGENT'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED. (See Addendum #7).

Nick Rudzki, dba PR Bass Outfitters: Mr. Rudzki had submitted a request to the Board to relinquish his outfitter license for the conduct of bass fishing on various waters within Idaho. Following consideration of this relinquishment, the Board accepted said relinquishment at its August meeting and now makes a determination in accordance with Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28, that the waters involved in Mr. Rudzki's relinquishment of his outfitter license not be relicensed at the present time.

Frank J. Valvo: The Board reviewed Mr. Valvo's Designated Agent license application to become designated agent for Ed Peterson in conduct of antelope, deer, elk, goat, bear, predator, and bird hunting, as well as fishing, trailrides and backpacking activities in Fish and Game Management Units 30A & 58. Following review, and consideration of this application, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT AND APPROVE MR. VALVO'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION TO BECOME DESIGNATED AGENT FOR ED PETERSON. LICENSE TO BE ISSUED UPON RECEIPT OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. NAMELY CORRECTED BOND AND PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum #8).

David C. Wilson: The Board reviewed Mr. Wilson's Designated Agent license application to become designated agent for B & B Enterprises, dba The Dam Boat. Following review and in consideration of this application, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. WILSON'S APPLICATION TO BECOME DESIGNATED AGENT FOR B & B ENTERPRISES, dba THE DAM BOAT, WITH LICENSE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. NAMELY, AN AMENDED BOND SHOWING MR. WILSON AS THE DESIGNATED AGENT AND SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF OUTFITTERS EXAMINATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum #9).

High Country Outfitters, Inc., Quentin Selby, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the report submitted by Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, relative to a meeting with the Forest Service regarding the relicensing of this operating area for the conduct of outfitted activities. He reported and the Forest Service requested that final action be delayed in relicensing and permitting outfitted activities in the operating area pending the Forest Service's review/update of the EA in accommodation/evaluation of recent developments, namely: paving of the South Fork Salmon River road and possible impact of the Valbois Ski Resort development contemplated for construction at Cascade Reservoir. Following review of this matter the Board concurs with the Forest Service request, will so notify them and further requests they expedite this matter ASAP as timely action could enable the licensing/permitting of a successful applicant for the 1991-92 license year.

Salmon River Tours Co. Inc., Michael McClain, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the Salmon River Tours Co., Inc. outfitters license amendment request for the additions of bird hunting, namely forest grouse and chukar hunting in addition to their river activities along SA4A, SA5, and SA6. Following a review of this amendment request and input from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF BIRD HUNTING, CHUKAR AND FOREST GROUSE ON THE SALMON RIVER SA6; AND 2) DENY BIRD HUNTING, NAMELY FOREST GROUSE AND CHUKAR HUNTING, ON SALMON RIVER SA4A AND SA5. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME LETTER DATED OCTOBER 12, 1990. (See Addendum #10)

Don Pearsons, dba Mule Shoe Outfitters: The Board again reviewed the matter of relicensing the Don Pearsons, dba Mule Shoe Outfitters, operating area for the conduct of outfitting activities. Following discussion, and in consideration of the meeting between Board and Forest Service representatives wherein the Forest Service expressed the desire to prepare an EA in

conformance with the MOU, Amendment #1, before taking steps to relicense and permit outfitted activities in the operating area, the Board directs a letter be addressed to the Forest Service concurring in their request and urging them to conduct the EA ASAP to permit consideration and selection of an outfitter for this operating area in as timely a manner as possible.

Philip A. Johnson: The Board reviewed Mr. Johnson's file relative to his being brought before the Board in a Show Cause Hearing for non-use of his float boating activities on SA1. The time having now passed in which Mr. Johnson could have appealed the Board's decision in this regard, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT 1) THE BOARD REMOVE MR. JOHNSON AS A LICENSED OUTFITTER ON SALMON RIVER SA1; AND 2) UNDER PURVIEW OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTER AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 28, THAT THIS OPPORTUNITY NOT BE RELICENSED.

Ed Peterson: The Board reviewed Mr. Peterson's file noting that he had been cited and paid a fine for violation of his Forest Service Special Use Permit. Following a discussion of this matter and in consideration of this citation for violation of his special use permit, the Board directs Mr. Peterson's file be flagged and upon Mr. Peterson's application for renewal of his 1991-92 outfitters license, this matter be brought before the Board before issue of said license for appropriate action.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1230 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours.

Steve Wieber, dba Happy Hooker Excursions: Mr. Wieber and his attorney, Tom Clark, appeared before the Board in a Show Cause Hearing for suspension or revocation of Steve Wieber's, dba Happy Hooker Excursions, outfitter license for alleged violation of his Forest Service Special Use Permit criteria and Probationary Outfitter License Stipulations. Following a dismissal motion by the defendant's council, review of the U.S. District Court violation notice wherein the collateral paid as regards violation of the Forest Service Special Use Permit was not to secure the defendant's appearance, and, therefore, not a conviction as defined by the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, the Board directs the charge against Steve Wieber, dba Happy Hooker Excursions, be dismissed without prejudice. Further, notice of the Board's action in this regard should be made to all involved parties.

Steve Wieber, dba Happy Hooker Excursions: The Board reviewed Mr. Wieber's outfitter license amendment request to make a corporate name change in his outfitting business. Following a review of his file and in consideration of the Forest Service letter regarding their concerns in making such a corporate name change, and finding that this would trigger the MOU, Exhibit 3, the Board advised Mr. Wieber that he would need to secure the Land Manager's (Forest Service) signature and sign-off and completion/submission of other necessary paperwork; namely: bond, outfitters examination, articles of incorporation and bylaws, and payment of fees to enable the Board to take final action on his application at the December meeting.

Orion Expeditions, Inc., dba Sawtooth River Expeditions, James L. 


