Board Meeting - December 13 - 15, 1990

Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

An additional meeting to the regularly scheduled meetings of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Thursday, December 13, 1990, at 0845 hours with all Board members present. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Board Minutes - October Meeting: The Board reviewed the October 22 - 24, 1990 minutes. Following which, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID MINUTES AS CORRECTED.

Idaho Public Records Law: The Board reviewed the proposed policy as regards the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board complying with the provisions of the Idaho Public Records Law. Following review of the proposed policy, with the understanding that certain additional criteria may become applicable July 1, 1993, as regards the confidentiality of complaints and other such matters, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED POLICY AS GUIDELINES FOR THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD IN ITS COMPLIANCE WITH THE IDAHO PUBLIC RECORDS LAW.

Fiscal Reports: The Board reviewed the Fiscal Reports for the months of October and November, 1991. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT SAID REPORTS BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

Shannon Lindsey, dba River Mountain Wildlife Experiences: Mr. Lindsey together with Tim Craig of Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., met before the Board relative to Mr. Lindsey's outfitter license application for the conduct of deer, elk, bear, cougar, predator, forest grouse, chukar, and quail hunting together with trailrides and photography trip activities. Said conduct of outfitting business would be on Mr. Lindsey's privately owned lands known as L T & L Properties. Following the interview before the Board and discussion of this proposed action, wherein it was established that certain of L T & L Properties have been previously licensed and leased to Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., Tim Craig, Designated Agent, for the conduct of outfitted activities, that the properties involved in the current application by Mr. Lindsey are outside those leased to Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., thereby permitting Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., to continue conducting its business as is currently done. Additionally, it is the Board's understanding that Mr. Craig and Mr. Lindsey wish be licensed to guide, each for the other, for the conduct of licensed activities. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE SHANNON LINDSEY, DBA RIVER MOUNTAIN WILDLIFE EXPERIENCES OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF DEER, ELK, PREDATOR, FOREST GROUSE, CHUKAR AND QUAIL HUNTING AS WELL AS TRAILRIDES AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS; 2) DENY MR. LINDSEY'S APPLICATION

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FOR CONDUCT OF BEAR, COUGAR, AND TURKEY HUNTING. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5), IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(g), AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME LETTER DATED NOVEMBER 23, 1990; 3) DEFINE THE OPERATING AREA AS ONE AND THE SAME AS THE LT&L PRIVATELY OWNED LANDS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD IN SAID OUTFITTER APPLICATION, EXCLUSIVE OF STATE AND PUBLIC DOMAIN LANDS; 4) DEEM MR. LINDSEY QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; 5) APPROVE MESSRS LINDSEY AND CRAIG'S REQUEST TO GUIDE, EACH FOR THE OTHER; AND 6) APPROVE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK NAMELY, PAYMENT OF FEES, A MORE COMPLETE OPERATING AREA DESCRIPTION WITH MAP, AND BOND. (See Addendum #1)

Ellen Shaw, dba South Fork Lodge: Ms. Shaw met with the Board relative to her concern as regards Dusty Youren's request to amend his operating area boundary to include lands lying south of the South Fork Payette River. She indicated that she has had a long standing interest in this area for conduct of similar activities and had been repeatedly told by the Forest Service that the area, due its easy access, is receiving extensive public use, therefore was not, in their opinion, suited or available for outfitted activity. Therefore, upon reading in the local newspaper that Dusty Youren had been approved for conduct of such activities in said area, she addressed an appeal to the Forest Service protesting their action due their prior statement and position regarding outfitting in the area and, further, they did not contact her as an affected party as regards the scoping process or other action taken regarding addressing Mr. Youren's request. Her purpose for meeting with the Board was to acquaint the Board with her actions and to request their consideration of her concern.

Dusty Youren: The Board reviewed Mr. Youren's outfitter amendment request to expand his operating area boundaries to include land lying south of the South Fork Payette River for the conduct of deer, elk, bear, cougar, predator, and forest grouse hunting, and incidental fishing, trailrides and backpacking activities. The Board noted that by decision notice dated October 3, 1990, the Forest Service indicated their intent to approve Mr. Youren's outfitter amendment request for the issue of a permit to conduct requested activities; the Department of Fish and Game, by letter dated November 21, 1990, also indicated they concurred in approving Mr. Youren for the requested activities. The Board further noted letters of protest from Dan Rotthoff, Garden Valley Outfitters, Inc., and Ellen Shaw regarding the permitting of Mr. Youren's requested activities and expanded operating area. Following discussion of this proposal and considering that, 1) it appears to be a "new opportunity", and 2) the Board was not contacted

regarding this proposal, in accordance with the MOU, Amendment #1, it is the Board's position to 1) take no action on Mr. Youren's outfitter amendment request at this time, and 2) to contact the Forest Service and request their reconsideration of Mr. Youren's amendment in accordance with criteria as outlined in the MOU, Amendment #1.

Steven M. Glynn, dba Priest Lake Adventures: Mr. Glynn met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application to purchase Randall M. Lemburg, dba Lemburg's Priest Lake Adventures, outfitting business for conduct of deer, moose, bear, and cougar hunting, power boat fishing on Priest Lake, trailrides, and snowmobiling. Following the interview before the Board regarding this matter, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. GLYNN'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR PURCHASE OF RANDALL M. LEMBURG, DBA LEMBURG'S PRIEST LAKE ADVENTURES, BUSINESS FOR CONDUCT OF DEER, MOOSE, BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING, POWER BOATING FISHING ON PRIEST LAKE TOGETHER WITH TRAILRIDES AND SNOWMOBILING. LICENSE TO BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK; NAMELY, LIST OF TANGIBLE ASSETS BEING TRANSFERRED IN SAID SALE, EXPERIENCE LOG, AND PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. FINALLY, THAT MR. GLYNN BE DEEMED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #2)

Mark B. Blackstone: The Board reviewed Mr. Blackstone's 1990-91 guide license application to be licensed as a guide for Steven M. Glynn, dba Priest Lake Adventures for conduct of deer, moose, bear and cougar hunting, boating and power boat fishing activities, together with trailrides and snowmobiling while in the employ of Mr. Glynn. Following a review of Mr. Blackstone's application, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. BLACKSTONE'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF REQUESTED ACTIVITIES WHILE IN THE EMPLOY OF STEVEN M. GLYNN, DBA PRIEST LAKE ADVENTURES.

Firearms Instructor/Arlo Larsen: The Board reviewed Mr. Larsen's request, via the Enforcement Coordinator, for the Board's consideration to name Mr. Larsen as Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Firearms Instructor. Following this request and in consideration of Mr. Larsen's qualifications for said requested title and position, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. LARSEN AS THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR.

Enforcement Coordinator: The Board's Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis met with the Board for review and up-to-date of the enforcement program since last reporting to the Board at the October meeting.

Randy Hess, dba White Otter Outdoor Adventures: Mr. Hess appeared before the Board in a denial hearing relative to the Board's denial of his outfitter amendment request for conduct of mountain bike touring in the Sun Valley/Stanley Basin area. Following the denial hearing, and in consideration of testimony offered before the Board, Findings of Fact regarding this denial hearing, are 1) Jeff Bitton, dba Mystic Saddle Ranch, as an affected outfitter, contacted the Board to withdraw his objection to Mr. Hess being licensed in the Galena Lodge area as they have resolved their differences; 2) Mr. Hess rescinded his request to be licensed in the Yankee Fork area in recognition of the Forest Service concerns therein; 3) Mr. Hess agreed to cease operations by September 30th as recommended by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game to preclude competition with hunting activity and safety concerns that may be evident; and 4) that use being shown by other affected outfitters does not indicate any conflict. Thus in consideration of these Findings of Fact, the Conclusions of Law are 1) That evident conflict that might exist between outfitters in the Galena Lodge area in violation of Idaho Code 36-2109(b)(4 & 5) and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 19(f) do not exist or have been resolved; 2) Safety conflicts between mountain bike touring and hunting activities have been resolved; 3) Deletion of the request for operation in the Yankee Fork area have been resolved; and 4) No apparent reason exist(s) to deny Mr. Hess's request to operate in the Stanley Basin, upper Sawtooth Valley area. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) RESCIND ITS PRIOR DENIAL OF MR. HESS'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING; 2) APPROVE MR. HESS FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING FOR AREAS REQUESTED WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE YANKEE FORK AREA, AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AGREEMENT ACHIEVED BETWEEN MR. HESS AND MR. BITTON, DBA MYSTIC SADDLE RANCH; AND 3) THAT ALL MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING SHALL CEASE BY SEPTEMBER 30 EACH YEAR. (See Addendum #3)

David T. Glasscock, dba Idaho Angling Service: Mr. Glasscock met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for conduct of fishing activities on various streams in the Sun Valley, Ketchum area. The purpose of Mr. Glasscock's appearance before the Board was to acquaint the Board with his proposal as he is leaving the Country and will not return until next spring. He was advised that the Board had not concluded its research on his outfitter license application but hope to have same concluded by his return to enable appropriate action to be taken at its February meeting.

Olivia Expeditions, Inc., dba The River Company #1 & #2: Ms. Olivia Falconer James and Mr. Erasmo Paolo appeared before the Board relative to their Designated Agent license applications to become designated agents for Olivia Expeditions, Inc., dba the River Company #1 and #2, qualified to guide. Following the interview before the Board regarding these applications, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE BOTH MS. OLIVIA FALCONER JAMES AND MR. ERASMO PAOLO AS DESIGNATED AGENTS FOR OLIVIA EXPEDITIONS, INC., DBA THE RIVER COMPANY #1 & #2, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. NAMELY, PAYMENT OF FEES.

Scott Minter: Mr. Minter met with the Board relative to his Designated Agent license application to become designated agent for SD Outfitters, Inc., dba Seven Devils Outfitters. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MINTER AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR SD OUTFITTERS, INC., DBA SEVEN DEVILS OUTFITTERS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES.

Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips: Mr. Bernt met with the Board regarding his special use permit or lack thereof for conduct of float boat activities on the Salmon River, SA5. The purpose of said interview was to bring the Board up-to-date on current activities ongoing by and between himself and the Forest Service relative to his on-going attempt to validate a special use permit on a "limited" basis.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1720 hours, and reconvened on Friday, December 14, 1990, at 0815 hours with all Board members present together with the Enforcement Coordinator, Board's Attorney, and Executive Director.

Legal Review: The Board's Attorney, W. Dallas Burkhalter, met with the Board for review and update of pending litigative matters before the Board.

Executive Directors Report: The Board's Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, concluded his review of matters coming before the Board since the last meeting in October.

Eclipse Expeditions, Inc., Bonnie Nobori, Designated Agent: Eclipse Expeditions, Inc. appeared before the Board relative to the proposed purchase of Jim Temple, dba Ways West, float boating and fishing business on the Salmon River (SA6). Following the interview before the Board, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN

JIM TEMPLE, DBA WAY WEST, TO ECLIPSE EXPEDITIONS, INC., BONNIE NOBORI, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING ACTIVITIES ON THE SALMON RIVER (SA6); 2) APPROVE BONNIE NOBORI AS DESIGNATED AGENT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; 3) DIRECT LICENSE(S) BE ISSUED WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT DONNA D. SMITH BE EMPLOYED AS LEAD GUIDE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS OTHERS WITHIN THE ORGANIZATION BECOME QUALIFIED AS LEAD GUIDES; AND 4) PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #4)

Steve Wieber, dba Happy Hooker Excursions: The Board reviewed Mr. Wieber's outfitter amendment request to change his business status from sole proprietor to a corporate status. Following review of the file and finding all paperwork complete, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE 1) MR. WIEBER'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST TO CHANGE HIS BUSINESS STATUS FROM STEVE WIEBER, DBA HAPPY HOOKER EXCURSIONS TO COUGAR COUNTRY LODGE, INC.; AND 2) MR. WIEBER AS DESIGNATED AGENT.

William O. Lintner: Mr. Lintner appeared before the Board as regards the Board's denial of his 1990-91 guide license application while in the employ of Steve Jones, dba Weitas Creek Outfitters. Following Mr. Lintner's appearance before the Board and consideration of his testimony relative to falsification of his guide license application, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) SUSTAIN ITS ORIGINAL DENIAL OF MR. LINTNER'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE; AND 2) WILL CONSIDER ISSUANCE OF A 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE TO MR. LINTNER SHOULD HE APPLY. FURTHER, SAID LICENSE TO BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS, CONTINGENT UPON HIS SUCCESSFULLY PASSING THE OUTFITTERS/GUIDES EXAMINATION.

Roy Angeny: The Board reviewed Mr. Angeny's 1990-91 guide license application to note he appears to have submitted an altered first aid card and, upon investigation, finds that indeed said card has been falsified. Following which, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. ANGENY'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(1).

Boy Scouts of America: Representatives namely, Roger Ball, C. Bradford Allen, Scott Johnson, Steve Nelson, Rod Leslie, and Paul Smith representing the Teton Peaks, Tendoy Area Council and Snake River Councils of the Boy Scouts of America met with the Board regarding conduct of their youth outdoor program in Idaho. The purpose of the interview was to establish a better understanding of Boy Scout Activities and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board responsibilities to better enable determining whether said activities fell within or outside the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21. The interview and discussion was informative and leads the Board to

conclude that each council operates its own program under the umbrella of the Boy Scouts of America to necessitate evaluation of each councils program with determination as to whether the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act would/would not be applicable. Also, the Boy Scouts of America (Idaho Councils) will evaluate their programs relative to Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and its application to their program(s) to "clean-up-their-act" to avoid, if possible, the necessity of their being licensed. Conversely, if a license is required they will work with the Board, as applicable, to achieve this objective. The Board directs a letter be addressed to the Council(s) involved to thank them for their cooperation and to express the Board's understanding of future working relationship.

Kurt Selisch, dba Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters: The Board reviewed the staff recommendation regarding Mr. Selisch's employment of an unlicensed guide in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. SELISCH BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9).

Idaho River Expeditions, dba Action Whitewater Adventures, Jay Verle Duerden, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the staff recommendation regarding Idaho River Expeditions employment of an unlicensed guide, in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT IDAHO RIVER EXPEDITIONS, DBA ACTION WHITEWATER ADVENTURES, JAY VERLE DUERDEN, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9).

Cornelius J. Hourihan, dba Taylor Ranch Outfitters: The Board reviewed the staff recommendation regarding Cornelius J. Hourihan, dba Taylor Ranch Outfitters, employment of unlicensed guides in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT CORNELIUS J. HOURIHAN, DBA TAYLOR RANCH OUTFITTERS, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9).

Jim Frank "Butch" Renshaw: The Board reviewed the staff recommendation relative to Mr. Renshaw having employed an unlicensed guide in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT JIM FRANK "BUTCH" RENSHAW BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9).

Lyle Phelps, dba Bear Creek Outfitters: The Board reviewed the staff recommendation regarding Lyle Phelps employment of an unlicensed guide in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT LYLE PHELPS, DBA BEAR CREEK OUTFITTERS, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9).

Stimmel & Diebold, Tony Diebold, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the staff recommendation regarding Stimmel & Diebold, Tony Diebold, Designated Agent, employment of an unlicensed guide in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT STIMMEL & DIEBOLD, TONY DIEBOLD, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(9).

Dale Kinsella: Mr. Kinsella met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for purchase of Lyle Piram's float boating and fishing business on the Snake River (SS1). Following the interview before the Board relative to this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF LYLE PIRAM'S OUTFITTING BUSINESS TO DALE KINSELLA, FOR CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING ACTIVITIES ON THE SNAKE RIVER (SS1); 2) DEEM MR. KINSELLA NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; 3) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. BRYAN TARANTOLA WILL BE EMPLOYED AS GUIDE FOR CONDUCT OF LICENSED ACTIVITIES WITH THE FURTHER UNDERSTANDING HE WILL BE LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENT; AND 4) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES AND COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. (See Adeendum #5)

Kevin Ward, dba Gold Fork Touring: Mr. Ward met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application to be licensed for conduct of cross-country skiing on the Boise National Forest, Cascade Ranger District. Following the interview before the Board relative to his outfitter license application and in consideration of the proposal presented to the Board, MSF (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. KEVIN WARD OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b & c) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION: MSC (Baird--Crane)(Miller, nay - Epley, nay) THAT THE KEVIN WARD, DBA GOLD FORK TOURING, APPLICATION BE REMANDED TO THE FOREST SERVICE IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MOU, AMENDMENT #1, FOR EVALUATION AS TO CONDUCT OF THIS "NEW OPPORTUNITY" IN THIS AREA WITH FURTHER ACTION ON THIS APPLICATION DELAYED UNTIL INPUT FROM THE FOREST SERVICE HAS BEEN RECEIVED TO, HOPEFULLY, ENABLE BOARD ACTION AT ITS FEBRUARY 1991 MEETING.

Stuart D. Davis: The Board reviewed Mr. Davis 1990-91 guide license application to be licensed while in the employ of Myrna Beamer, noting that Mr. Davis had been convicted for violation of Idaho Department of Fish and Game law in 1990. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. DAVIS' 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH PROVISIONS OF HIS PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE IN THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1991.

Stanley Siewert: The Board reviewed Mr. Siewert's 1990-91 guide license application to be employed by Mike Crevelt for the conduct of incidental fishing, backpacking, and technical mountaineering. Following review of said file, and finding that Mr. Siewert has been recommended for approval by the Board's advisory committee as to his technical mountaineering qualifications, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT MR. SIEWERT'S 1990-91 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED.

Boise State University, Glen R. Potter, Designated Agent: The Board again reviewed Boise State University's outfitter amendment request in consideration of their requested addition of trailrides as a licensable activity under their current outfitters license. In consideration of their December 4, 1990, letter in explanation of their trailriding activity under the Alternate Mobility Adventure Seekers (AMAS) recreation program, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ADVISE BOISE STATE UNIVERSITY THAT 1) IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ATTACHED AMAS HORSEBACK RIDING PROGRAM TO THE DECEMBER 4, 1990, LETTER DEEM PHASE 1 AND PHASE 2 OUTSIDE THE PURVIEW OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT THUS DOES NOT REQUIRE AN AMENDMENT TO THEIR OUTFITTER LICENSE; AND 2) IF OR WHEN PHASE 3 IS CONDUCTED, SUCH ACTIVITY WOULD FALL WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE ACT AND WOULD REQUIRE AN AMENDMENT TO THEIR CURRENT OUTFITTER LICENSE.

Francis M. Mangum, dba Allstate Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Mangum's outfitter license application to become licensed for conduct of bear, cougar and predator hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 45, in total. Following review of the file and consideration of Idaho Department of Fish and Game recommendation, US Forest Service reservations, and impact upon the wildlife resources in the area, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. MANGUM'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(4 & 5), IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(g), AND RECOMMENDATIONS BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME BY LETTER DATED SEPTEMBER 4, 1990.

Jeff Peavey, dba Northwest Voyagers: The Board reviewed Mr. Peavey's request for a waiver of Rule 57 for the conduct of a trip on SA7C, noting that the Chairman had approved this request on a one time only basis. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD CONCUR IN THE CHAIRMAN'S ACTION.

Sam Whitten, dba River Adventures: The Board reviewed Mr. Whitten's outfitter amendment request for the conduct of power boat tours on Payette Lake and Cascade Reservoir. Following review of this amendment request, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. WHITTEN'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(f & g).

Silver Creek Outfitters, Terry Ring, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Ring's outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of fishing on various waters in Magic Valley. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. RING'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF FISHING ON BILLINGSLY CREEK IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RESTRICTIONS RECOMMENDED BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME; AND 2) HOLD FURTHER ACTION ON OTHER WATERS REQUESTED UNTIL RESEARCH HAS BEEN COMPLETED. See Addendum #6)

Twin Peaks Ranch, Inc., Frank Valvo, Designated Agent: Mr. Valvo and Mr. Dale Stansbury, dba Whitewater Adventures, met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Dale Stansbury, dba Whitewater Adventures, float boating and fishing business on SA4A and SA5 to Twin Peaks Ranch, Inc., Frank Valvo, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board relative to this matter, and review of this file, MSC (Miller--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN DALE STANSBURY, DBA WHITEWATER ADVENTURES, TO TWIN PEAKS RANCH, FOR THE CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING AND INCIDENTAL FISHING ON SA4A AND FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING ACTIVITY ON SA5; 2) DEEM MR. VALVO QUALIFIED AS FLOAT BOATMAN ON SA4A AND SA5; AND 3) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #7)

Selkirk Snowmobile Tours, Inc., Chris Flanigan, Designated Agent: Mr. Flanigan met with the Board regarding his outfitter license application to become a licensed outfitter for conduct of snowmobile tours in the vicinity of Sandpoint, Idaho. Following the interview before the Board and review of his proposal, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE SELKIRK SNOWMOBILE TOURS, INC., CHRIS FLANIGAN, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF SNOWMOBILE TOURS IN THE VICINITY OF SANDPOINT, IDAHO, WITH SAID OPERATING AREA BEING THOSE GROOMED

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TRAILS AS INDICATED ON SAID APPLICATION; 2) DEEM MR. FLANIGAN QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #8)

Darl Allred, dba Sawtooth Wilderness Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Allred's request for consideration and examination of the overlap which appears to exist between himself and Mr. Dusty Youren for conduct of bear and cougar hunting in Fish and Game Management Unit 35. Following review of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Allred advising him that the Board will need to do further research to establish the license sequence as to when and who was licensed for what in the area in question before making a decision in this matter.

Rich Cook, dba Cook Idaho Outfitters: The Board again reviewed Mr. Cook's outfitter amendment request for conduct of trailrides. Following consideration of the input from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, and adjoining outfitters, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. COOK'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF TRAILRIDES. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(b)(5) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(g).

Steve Wieber, dba Happy Hooker Excursions: The Board reviewed the letter, proposed performance rating, and documents submitted by the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area December 13, 1990, concerning Mr. Wieber's conduct of his outfitting business on the Snake River (SN7 & SN8). Said proposed performance rating and accompanying documents addressed Mr. Wieber's apparent disregard of both his Forest Service special use permit stipulations and, more importantly, public safety, health and welfare. Following review of Mr. Wieber's file and material presented and proposed unsatisfactory performance rating, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO HELLS CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA IN WHICH 1) APPRECIATION IS GIVEN FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO REVIEW THE PROPOSED PERFORMANCE RATING IN ACCORDANCE WITH MOU, AMENDMENT #1 PROCEDURES; 2) LIKE CONCERN IS EXPRESSED FOR MR. WIEBER'S APPARENT AND CONTINUED DISREGARD FOR PUBLIC SAFETY, HEALTH AND WELFARE AS EVIDENCED BY HIS ACCIDENT RECORD; AND 3) THE BOARD HAS NO DATA TO PROMPT OBJECTION TO THE PROPOSED UNSATISFACTORY RATING; INDEED, IN VIEW OF MR. WIEBER'S ACCIDENT RECORD, THE BOARD WOULD CONCUR IN SAID RATING.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1715 hours, and reconvened on Saturday, December 15, 1990, at 0900 hours with all Board members present together with the Board's Executive Director and Attorney.

Scott Schnebly, dba Lost River Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Schnebly's November 1, 1990, letter concerning his request for the Board to consider his being licensed for the conduct of upland game bird hunting on the Rusty Tews Preserve in North Shoshone County. Following discussion of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Schnebly requesting his submission of the necessary amendment request inclusive of Land Manager's Sign-Off to indicate Rusty Tews Preserve concurrence in his utilization of their preserve in the conduct of upland game bird hunting activities for further Board consideration.

Mountain Home Air Force Base: The Board reviewed the December 5, 1990, response from the Mountain Home Air Force Base, Department of the Air Force, concerning their outdoor adventure program, in which they express their belief they are exempt from purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act. The Board also noted the enclosed copy of the Memorandum of Understanding by and between the Mountain Home Air Force Base and Mountain Home Ranger District, Boise National Forest. In consideration of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Larry Tripp, District Ranger, Mountain Home Ranger District, requesting his meeting with the Board at their February meeting to discuss the Memorandum of Understanding and special use permit and its ramifications as regards use and impact on the South Fork, Boise River. Further, the Governor's office should be advised of this matter and asked if they wish to make comment or participate in the meeting.

Cyprus Mines: The Board reviewed the October 26, 1990, letter and petition sent the Board concerning alleged conduct of an outfitter in the area surrounding the Cyprus Mine properties. Following which, and in consideration thereof, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Michael Scott, the outfitter in question, asking his response to this concern.

Salmon River Challenge, Patrick Marek, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the November 15, 1990, letter from Salmon River Challenge in which Shari Marek challenged Board authority to require Patrick Marek to again take the outfitters examination. Following which, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Shari Marek stating that as a part of disciplinary action taken against Salmon River Challenge, Patrick Marek, Designated Agent, as well as others, for violation of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, it was the Board's decision to require Mr. Marek to again take the examination so that he will become more familiar with the Board's Rules and Regulations to enable him to avoid further violation of said rules and regulations.

Sun Valley Trekking, Inc., Robert Jonas, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed material submitted by Mr. Jonas for their consideration in re-evaluating ski guide qualifications. Following which, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Jonas thanking him for his recommendations and further stating that said recommendations will be considered in review and update of the Board's Rules and Regulations.

US Forest Service (Camping 14 Day Stay Limit): The Board reviewed the discussion held at the recent Interagency Meeting together with the material submitted by the Forest Service regarding this matter and believe that no further action is necessary at this time.

Pending Legislation/IOGA Resolution: The Board reviewed its pending legislation as regards the resolution concerning increased license fees passed by the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association meeting December 9 - 12, 1990. Following discussion of the resolution and its impact on proposed legislation/license fees, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) ACCEPT THE SUGGESTED 10% LIMIT RECOMMENDED BY THE IOGA RESOLUTION, AND 2) AMEND PENDING LEGISLATION, IF POSSIBLE, TO PROPOSE THAT A) AN OUTFITTER LICENSE BE INCREASED TO \$250.00; B) A DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE REMAIN AT \$100.00; AND C) THAT GUIDE LICENSES BE INCREASE TO \$85.00 ALL OF WHICH WOULD BE WITHIN THE PURVIEW OF THE 10% INCREASE ACROSS THE BOARD RECOMMENDED BY IOGA.

National Park Service/Red Cross Qualifications: The Board reviewed the November 29, 1990, letter from the National Park Service in response to the Board's inquiry as to the criteria of the Park Services first aid qualification courses. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT NATIONAL PARK SERVICE STANDARDS AS MEETING THE BOARD'S FIRST AID QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS.

Emergency Rule: The Board, in conduct of business during the current meeting found it had inadvertently disenfranchised outfitters in conduct of their currently licensed fishing activities on Idaho's rivers and streams by adoption of Rule 57(a), September 1, 1990, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD FIND THAT THIS ACTION HAS CREATED AN IMMINENT PERIL TO PUBLIC WELFARE IN PUTTING SEVERAL OUTFITTERS OUT OF BUSINESS. THEREFORE AN EMERGENCY IS DECLARED TO EXIST. PURSUANT TO SAID EMERGENCY, RULE 57(a) IS AMENDED:

ALL OTHER RIVERS AND STREAMS OR SECTIONS THAT LIE TOTALLY OR PARTIALLY WITHIN THE STATE OF IDAHO SHALL BE CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL OUTFITTING BY OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES.

ALL OTHER RIVERS AND STREAMS OR SECTIONS THAT LIE TOTALLY OR PARTIALLY WITHIN THE STATE OF IDAHO SHALL BE CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL BOATING OPERATIONS BY OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES.



OPERATING AREAS FOR SNOWMOBILE TOURS

OPERATING AREA #1: Beginning at Sec. 7, T57N, R2W, BM; thence westerly up Bald Mountain Road to Happy Fork Gap and the junction with Happy Fork Creek; thence either continuing westerly down Happy Fork Creek and up the North Fork of Happy Fork Creek, or proceeding around Bald Mountain Ridge to intersect again with Happy Fork Gap.
