Board Meeting - February 25 - March 1, 1991

Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, February 25, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present, except Dale Baird who will report in at 1000 hours. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Executive Director's Report: The Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, updated the Board on ongoing activities since the last Board meeting.

Fiscal Reports: The Executive Director in the course of his presentation before the Board presented the status of the Board's budget relative to receipts and expenditures to date. Following which, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE ORAL PRESENTATION OF THESE MATTERS AS REFLECTING THE BOARD'S BUDGET STATUS AS OF THIS BOARD MEETING.

Board Minutes: The Board reviewed the Board minutes for the December 13 - 15, 1990, meeting. Following review and correction of said minutes, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT BOARD MEETING MINUTES FOR DECEMBER 13 - 15, 1990, BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

Enforcement Coordinator: The Board's Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis, met with the Board to update and bring the Board abreast of activities since the last Board meeting in December.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1205 hours and reconvened at 1320 hours.

Board Attorney's Report: The Board's Attorney, Dallas Burkhalter, met with the Board to review and update the Board relative to legislation and other legal matters pending since the last Board meeting in December.

Kenneth L. Smith, dba 62 Ridge Outfitters and Guides: The Board reviewed the proposed suspension or revocation of the 1990-91 outfitter license issued to Kenneth L. Smith, dba 62 Ridge Outfitters and Guides, Case No. 90-386-28, for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(8)(ii). Following the Board review of the motion to dismiss, discussion and consideration of Board's Attorney, W. Dallas Burkhalter, recommendation that said case be dismissed, MSC (Epley--Miller)(Crane, abstains) THAT CASE NO. 90-386-28 IN THE MATTER OF THE PROPOSED SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THE 1990-91 OUTFITTER LICENSE ISSUED TO KENNETH L. SMITH, DBA 62 RIDGE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES, BE DISMISSED.

Lyle Phelps, dba Bear Creek Outfitters: The Board reviewed the proposed stipulated settlement regarding Case No. 90-287-40, (Lyle Phelps, dba Bear Creek Outfitters) for the alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, and in consideration of the stipulated settlement proposed and payment of subsequent fine, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT SAID STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AND PAYMENT OF FINE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300.00).

Cornelius J. Hourihan, dba Taylor Ranch Outfitters: The Board reviewed the proposed stipulated settlement regarding Case No. 90-138-38, (Cornelius J. Hourihan, dba Taylor Ranch Outfitters) for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, and in consideration of the stipulated settlement proposed and payment of fine of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per guide for a total six hundred dollar (\$600.00) fine. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT SAID STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AND PAYMENT OF FINE(S) IN THE AMOUNT OF SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$600.00).

Stimmel & Diebold, Inc., Tony Diebold, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the proposed stipulated settlement regarding Case No. 90-2810-39 (Stimmel & Diebold, Inc., Tony Diebold, Designated Agent) for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which, and in consideration of the stipulated settlement proposed, and payment of subsequent fine, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT SAID STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AND PAYMENT OF FINE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300.00).

Jim Frank (Butch) Renshaw: The Board reviewed the proposed stipulated settlement regarding Case No. 90-5073-41 (Jim Frank (Butch) Renshaw)1 for alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). Following which and in consideration of the stipulation proposed and payment of subsequent fine, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT SAID STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AND PAYMENT OF FINE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300.00).

Senate Bill 1144: Messrs Brian Leavitt, Ron Sherer, Francis Mangum, and Cal Myers met with the Board regarding proposed Senate Bill 1144, and other matters relative to the licensing of bear and cougar hunters in Idaho. Discussions centered around a concern by the parties involved with the over-harvest of bear and cougar particularly in areas surrounding Boise, Idaho, in Owyhee and Boise Counties. Outgrowth of said discussion was to hopefully clarify both the Board's position, and the parties concern of procedures that could be taken to address this problem and general public perception of outfitted bear and cougar hunting in these areas.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1730 hours and reconvened on Tuesday, February 26, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present, except Dale Baird. Board's Attorney, Executive Director, and Enforcement Coordinator are also present.

Kurt W. Selisch, dba Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters: Mr. Selisch appeared before the Board relative to his alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(9). The Board reviewed this matter at its previous meeting and had instructed its attorney to contact Mr. Selisch regarding this alleged violation. Upon contact Mr. Selisch agreed to the stipulated fact that he had employed an unlicensed guide and requested an appearance before the Board to explain the circumstances surrounding the matter. Upon review of the circumstances and in consideration of Mr. Selisch's testimony before the Board, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) ACCEPT SAID STIPULATED FACT; 2) UPON CONSIDERATION OF CIRCUMSTANCES BEARING ON THIS MATTER AS PRESENTED BY MR. SELISCH IN HIS INTERVIEW BEFORE THE BOARD, THE BOARD FINDS THAT NO VIOLATION OCCURRED; AND 3) ADDRESS A LETTER OF REPRIMAND TO MR. SELISCH FOR HIS APPARENT LACK OF UNDERSTANDING OF THE BOARD'S RULES AND REGULATIONS TO SUGGEST THAT HE REVIEW SAME IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE INSTRUCTION RECEIVED FROM THE BOARD DURING THE COURSE OF THE INTERVIEW.

Robert A. Sales: The Board reviewed Mr. Sales's file and 1991-92 guide license application for conduct of boating activities while in the employment of Kurt Selisch, dba Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters, to find that Mr. Sales has been convicted for a violation of Fish and Game law during the 1990-91 license year. Following discussion and consideration of this matter and further explanation by Mr. Selisch of the circumstances surrounding this violation of Fish and Game law and his intent to hire Mr. Sales during the 1991-92 season, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE ROBERT A. SALES' 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS; TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT THERE BE NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

Eric Rector: The Board reviewed Mr. Rector's file and 1991-92 guide license application for conduct of boating activities while in the employment of Kurt Selisch, dba Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters, to find that Mr. Rector has been convicted of a violation of Fish and Game law during the 1990-91 license year. Following discussion and consideration of this matter and further explanation by Mr. Selisch of the circumstances surrounding this violation of Fish and Game law and his intent to hire Mr. Rector during the 1991-92 season, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE ERIC RECTOR'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS; TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT THERE BE NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

Richard D. Armiger, dba Cayuse Outfitters: Mr. and Mrs. Armiger and Mr. and Mrs. Dressen appeared before the Board relative to: 1) review the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between D-Double-S Outfitters, Inc., Donald Dressen, Designated Agent, for conduct of elk, deer, bear, and moose hunting, fishing and trailriding activities within the prescribed operating area in Fish and Game Mgmt Unit 10 to Richard D. Armiger, dba Cayuse Outfitters, for conduct of said activities, within said operating area; 2) consider Mr. Armiger's outfitter license amendment request to add cougar, predator, and bird hunting, backpacking, snowmobiling, wagonrides, and photography trips as licensed activities in the Cayuse Outfitters operating area; 3) update/correct Mr. Armiger's outfitter license to reflect his purchase of Norm Riddle's float boating business on the Clearwater River (C12 & C13) with business to be known as Richard D. Armiger, dba Drift Fishers; 4) consider the Idaho Department of Fish and Game recommendation that a limit of 60 guided elk hunters be imposed overall on Mr. Armiger's operation as applicable to both Paradise Outfitters and Cayuse Outfitters dba's with no limit on drop camp hunters; and 5) review Patti Armiger's application to be licensed as designated agent, qualified to guide for those activities licensed under dba's Paradise Outfitters and Cayuse Outfitters and that she be licensed as designated agent under dba, Drift Fishers, not qualified to guide. Following the interview before the Board, regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between the parties involved, and other matters outlined above, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER WHEREIN RICHARD D. ARMIGER, DBA CAYUSE OUTFITTERS, ACQUIRES THE OUTFITTING BUSINESS OF D-DOUBLE-S OUTFITTERS, INC., DONALD DRESSEN, DESIGNATED AGENT FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELK, DEER, BEAR, AND MOOSE HUNTING, FISHING, AND TRAILRIDING ACTIVITIES WITH THE OPERATING AREA BEING ONE IN THE SAME AS FORMERLY LICENSE TO D-DOUBLE-S OUTFITTERS, INC.; 2) APPROVE MR. ARMIGER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF COUGAR, PREDATOR, AND BIRD HUNTING, AND BACKPACKING, SNOWMOBILING, WAGON RIDES, AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS AS APPLICABLE TO DBA CAYUSE OUTFITTERS; 3) APPROVE A LIMIT OF 60 ELK HUNTERS FOR THE COMBINED OPERATIONS OF PARADISE OUTFITTERS, AND CAYUSE OUTFITTERS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME. SAID LIMIT WILL BE ALLOCATED ON A 50/50 BASIS BETWEEN BOTH PARADISE OUTFITTERS AND CAYUSE OUTFITTERS FOR GUIDED ELK HUNTS WITH NO LIMITATIONS ON DROP CAMP ELK HUNTERS; 4) APPROVE PATTI ARMIGER AS: A) DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR CONDUCT OF THOSE ACTIVITIES LICENSED UNDER DBA PARADISE OUTFITTERS AND DBA CAYUSE OUTFITTERS; AND B) DESIGNATED AGENT, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, FOR DRIFT FISHERS; AND 5) DIRECT LICENSES BE ISSUED PENDING THE FOLLOWING FACTORS: A) DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME INPUT IN WHICH THEY CONCUR IN THE AMENDMENT REQUEST AND OTHER MATTERS AS WAS DISCUSSED BY TELEPHONE WITH JERRY THIESSEN THIS DATE; B) THAT PATTI ARMIGER SUCCESSFULLY PASSES THE OUTFITTERS EXAMINATION AND

SUBMISSION OF A CURRENT FIRST AID CARD; AND C) MR. ARMIGER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE BE AMENDED TO INDICATE HIS PURCHASE OF NORM RIDDLE'S FLOAT BOATING BUSINESS ON THE CLEARWATER RIVER (CL2 & CL3) AS WAS APPROVED BY PRIOR BOARD ACTION WITH THE DBA TO BECOME KNOWN AS DRIFT FISHERS. (See Addendum #1).

Wayne Fairchild, dba Lewis & Clark Expeditions: Mr. Fairchild met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for conduct of mountain bike touring and cross-country skiing on the Clearwater National Forest located out of the Lochsa Lodge. The interview with Mr. Fairchild and review of his file finds that there are some unanswered questions that require additional research before the Board can make a final decision on this application. This was explained to Mr. Fairchild with the understanding that needed research would be done to clarify this matter as soon as possible as to whether his application is approved or denied.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1220 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Hank Miller, dba Hank Miller Steelhead: The Board reviewed Mr. Miller's outfitter amendment request for clarification of activities now grouped under the general head of "fishing" which currently appears on his outfitter license. Mr. Miller requested that "fishing" be defined in accordance with the Board's Rules and Regulations to reflect what he is actually doing, that is: anadromous fishing (SAF), fly fishing (5FF), and power boat fishing (5PBF). In like manner he also requested that his bird hunting activities be defined as being chukar (4CH), and forest grouse (4FG). Following a discussion and in consideration of this amendment request, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. MILLER'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ABOVE SPECIFIED ACTIVITIES. (See Addendum #2). Administrative Note: Review of the recently passed and adopted Rules and Regulations effective October 15, 1990, wherein the general headings of fishing, and bird hunting (perhaps other activities as well) was broken down into their component parts, steps should be taken to update the reporting forms with the printing of the next forms.

David P. Markham, dba Venture Outdoors: Mr. Markham met with the Board relative to his outfitter amendment request for the purchase of Rebecca Thoreson, dba Sun Valley Summer Downhill, outfitter business for the conduct of mountain bike touring in which he would establish a separate dba known as Sun Valley Summer Downhill in addition to his dba as Venture Outdoors. Following the interview before the Board and review of his proposed purchase of this business and in consideration of his further amendment request to add or amend his operating area boundary to include additional roads and trails as designated in his operating plan, MSC (Epley

---Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE DAVID P. MARKHAM, DBA VENTURE OUTDOORS, PROPOSED PURCHASE OF THE REBECCA THORESON, DBA SUN VALLEY SUMMER DOWNHILL, OUTFITTER BUSINESS FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING, SAID NEW BUSINESS TO BE KNOWN AS DAVID P. MARKHAM, DBA SUN VALLEY SUMMER DOWNHILL, FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING WITHIN THAT OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO REBECCA THORESON; 2) APPROVE MR. MARKHAM'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO AMEND HIS OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY TO INCLUDE THOSE ROADS AND TRAILS AS DESIGNATED AND APPROVED BY THE FOREST SERVICE; AND 3) THAT MR. MARKHAM BE APPROVED, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, FOR MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING ACTIVITIES. (See Addendum #3).

Steve Schaefers, dba Schaefers Guide Service: Steve Schaefers, Terry Damon, and Richard Helfrich appeared before the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Helfrich's boating and fishing activities on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River (MF1 & MF2) (Mr. Helfrich retains his activities on the Lower Salmon (SAB)) to a new partnership of Steve Schaefers and Terry Damon to be known as Schaefers Guide Service #2. Following the interview before the Board regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS FROM MR. HELFRICH FOR CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING ACTIVITIES ON THE MIDDLE FORK OF THE SALMON RIVER (MF1 & MF2) TO A NEW PARTNERSHIP TO BE FORMED BY STEVE SCHAEFERS AND TERRY DAMON TO BE KNOWN AS SCHAEFERS GUIDE SERVICE #2; 2) THAT STEVE SCHAEFERS BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR THE CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITIES UNDER THIS NEW OUTFITTER BUSINESS; 3) THAT MR. SCHAEFERS WILL AMEND HIS CURRENT LICENSE TO BECOME KNOWN AS STEVE SCHAEFERS, DBA SCHAEFERS GUIDE SERVICE #1, AS A SOLE PROPRIETOR, TO OPERATE ON THE LOWER SALMON AS IS CURRENTLY LICENSED; 4) THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON RECEIPT OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY, CLARIFICATION OF THE DISSOLUTION OF PARTNERSHIP AS TO WHO WILL BE THE SURVIVING PARTNER UPON DISAGREEMENT AND DISSOLUTION OF THE PARTNERSHIP, PROPER BOND FOR THE NEW BUSINESS, COMPLETION OF THE OUTFITTER EXAM; AND 5) LICENSE TO ISSUED EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 1991, WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. HELFRICH WILL ACT AS A BOOKING AGENT FOR THE NEW PARTNERSHIP UNTIL SUCH TIME AS LICENSE PROCEDURES ARE COMPLETED. (See Addendum #4).

Robert Burlingame, dba Flying B Ranch, Michael Popp, Designated Agent: Mr. Popp and Robert M. Smith met with the Board relative to the proposed purchase and transfer of business from Mr. Smith to Robert Burlingame, dba Flying B Ranch, Michael Popp, Designated Agent, for conduct of deer, elk, bear, cougar, and forest grouse hunting in Fish and Game Mgmt Units 10A, 12, & 16. The interview before the Board provided opportunity to explain to Messrs Popp and Smith that: 1) the operating areas involved in the proposed sale and transfer of business is one in which there is extensive overlap of outfitted activities particularly bear and cougar hunting; 2)

it is the Board's position that when opportunity to "unstack" such activities occurs, such as a sale of business, that such opportunity be examined before approval of sale is made to achieve this goal if possible; 3) the Board therefore, requests Messrs Popp and Smith to approach affected outfitters involved in this proposed sale and transfer of business to explore opportunities to resolve the problem; and 4) the Board will address a letter to the affected outfitters in which this situation is explained in its effect and application to their operation and sale of business to ask their cooperation in resolving the overlap problem within the spirit and intent of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 24.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1840 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, February 27, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present together with Board's Attorney, Executive Director, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Richard Cook: Mr. Cook appeared before the Board in a Show Cause Hearing Case No. 90-2140-33 in the matter of the proposed suspension or revocation of his 1990-91 guide license for alleged misconduct in an incident that occurred at Pittsburg Landing on October 14, 1990, in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5 & 14). During the hearing the Board took into consideration the testimony offered by witnesses of record; further action was delayed to enable evaluation of testimony given which matter is now before the Board for discussion and action in which the following Findings of Fact became apparent. 1) That the alleged incident of unethical conduct did, in fact, occur on October 14, 1990, at Pittsburg Landing; 2) That responsibility for provocation of said incident could be placed on either party; 3) that responsibility for such incident notwithstanding, the licensed guide did acknowledge that said incident occurred and that he did act in an unprofessional manner. Thus, in consideration of these Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law relative to this matter are: 1) Said licensed guide did act in an unprofessional and unethical manner and is therefore in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5); and 2) No evidence was presented to support a conclusion that said guide is in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(14). Following which, and in consideration of the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSF (Miller--Crane) THAT RICHARD COOK BE FOUND IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5) AND THAT FOR VIOLATION OF SAID ACT THAT HE BE FINED AN AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) TOTAL IN RESOLUTION OF THIS MATTER.

MSC (Crane--Epley)(Baird, abstains) THAT RICHARD COOK BE FOUND IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5) AND IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH BE FINED A TOTAL AMOUNT OF THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300.00). FURTHER, THAT SHOULD MR. COOK MAKE APPLICATION FOR THE 1991-92

LICENSE YEAR, THAT HIS GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW, NOR WILL ANY AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS GUIDE LICENSE DURING THE LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

Peter L. Jensen, dba Lucky Dog Retreat: Mr. Jensen met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for the conduct of Llama packing activities in the Eastern Idaho area in and around Island Park. Following review of this application and in consideration of the outline of planned operations given by Mr. Jensen, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. JENSEN'S APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF LLAMA PACKING AS OUTLINED IN HIS APPLICATION, TOGETHER WITH THE OTHER ACTIVITIES OF BACKPACKING AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS. FURTHER, THAT 1) MR. JENSEN BE DEEMED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 2) THE ASSIGNED OPERATING AREA SHALL BE AS OUTLINED IN HIS OPERATING PLAN AND DETAILED ON THE MAP WHICH ACCOMPANIED HIS APPLICATION. (See Addendum #5). Administrative Note: Mr. Jensen has indicated he will look into the addition of fishing as a licensable activity and submit an amendment therefore at a later date. Also, Mr. Jensen requested that we hold Janice Jensen's guide license application until such time as it can be completed for further consideration.

Larry Tripp, District Ranger, Mountain Home Ranger District: Mr. Tripp, at the Board's invitation, met with the Board to discuss the MOU that Mountain Home Ranger District has with the Mountain Home Air Force Base relative to the conduct of recreational activities on the Mountain Home Ranger District, with specific emphasis as to how these activities may impact the South Fork, Boise River. Mr. Tripp's presentation outlined the Forest Service's research and background into this matter; their conclusion was that said activities were conducted in much the same manner as does the general public operate in pursuing a recreational activity, i.e.; shared expenses, equipment, etc.; The MOU was entered into in an attempt to provide some guidance to activities as would occur on the South Fork, Boise River and elsewhere; and further, he believed additional information would be gained upon completion of the South Fork, Boise River land management plan.

Scott Fasken, dba Idaho Afloat #1: Mr. Fasken together with Russell R. Gore met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Gore's outfitting business for conduct of float boating, fishing, and chukar hunting on the Lower Salmon River (SAB), to Scott Fasken, dba Idaho Afloat #1. Following the interview before the Board regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF RUSSELL R. Following the interview and discussion of this matter before the Board, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN RUSSELL R. GORE, DBA GORE'S SALMON RIVER JET FLOAT TRIPS FOR THE TRANSFER OF MR. GORE'S FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING ACTIVITIES ON SA4A & SA4B TO FELKER'S GUIDE SERVICE, DBA COWBOY RIVER GUIDES AND OUTFITTERS, HENRY WILLIAM (BILL) FELKER, DESIGNATED AGENT; 2) THAT MR. FELKER BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. GORE WILL BE RETAINED AS A LEAD GUIDE, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS MR. He requested an appearance before the Board to explain the circumstances surrounding this situation and to ascertain, if possible, what the Board's reaction might be to considering relicensing him for the 1991-92 guide license season. Following consideration of the interview before the Board and the facts presented to the Board, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT SHOULD MR. Sleeping Deer Outfitters, Inc., Scott Berry, Designated Agent: Mr. Berry together with his attorney, David Leroy, and other people within the Sleeping Deer Ranch consortium met with the Board relative to his application for renewal of his 1990-91 outfitter license. Mr. Leroy outlined and reviewed various circumstances which precluded Mr. Berry operating this past year and reasons for why he did not submit a renewal application in a timely manner. Financial circumstances was a primary factor but Mr. Berry did conduct a limited business in 1989, but no business in 1990. Sleeping Deer Outfitters, Inc., Ronald J. Clark, Designated Agent: Mr. Clark together with David Leroy, attorney for Sleeping Deer Outfitters, Inc., Scott Berry, Designated Agent, met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of the Sleeping Deer Outfitters, Inc., Scott Berry, Designated Agent, outfitting business for conduct of deer, elk, goat, sheep, bear, cougar, predator, and forest grouse hunting, fishing, trailriding, and backpacking activities to Sleeping Deer Outfitters, Inc., Ronald J. Clark, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board regarding this matter, and in consideration of the application made, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE 1) THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN SLEEPING DEER OUTFITTERS, INC., SCOTT BERRY, DESIGNATED AGENT, AND ITS ASSOCIATED LICENSED ACTIVITIES WITHIN ITS ASSIGNED OPERATING AREA TO SLEEPING DEER OUTFITTERS, INC., RONALD J. CLARK, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITIES WITHIN SAID OPERATING AREA; 2) MR. CLARK

AS DESIGNATED AGENT, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. BERRY SHALL SERVE AS HIS QUALIFIED GUIDE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS MR. CLARK BECOMES QUALIFIED IN THIS RESPECT; AND 3) LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK INCLUSIVE OF PAYMENT OF FEES FOR THE 1990-91 LICENSE YEAR, THEREBY REQUIRING RENEWAL OF SAID LICENSE FOR THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR. Bear Valley River Company, Inc., M. Guy Santiago, Designated Agent: Mr. Santiago and his wife Debbie, together with Doug Perry, met with the Board relative to the proposed designation of Mr. Santiago as the new designated agent for Bear Valley River Company, Inc. Following the interview and in consideration of the information presented to the Board, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. SANTIAGO AS THE NEW DESIGNATED AGENT FOR BEAR VALLEY RIVER COMPANY, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 2) REQUEST (IN ORDER TO COMPLETE/UPDATE THE BOARD'S FILE) BEAR VALLEY RIVER COMPANY, INC. PROVIDE COPIES OF THE CORPORATE MEETING MINUTES IN WHICH THEY RESTRUCTURED THE CORPORATE OFFICE STAFF AND DETERMINED THAT MR. SANTIAGO SHOULD SEEK BECOMING CORPORATE DESIGNATED AGENT. (See Addendum #10).

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours and reconvened on Thursday, February 28, 1991, at 0815 hours with all Board members present, except Dale Baird. Board's Attorney, Executive Director, and Enforcement Coordinator are also present.

Thomas R. Sorenson: Mr. Sorenson met with the Board regarding his outfitter license application for conduct of power boat fishing on SA6 from the Walter's Ferry Bridge downstream to include Brownlee Reservoir. The Board reviewed this application and approved same at its June, 1990 Meeting absent the authorization for him to fish on Brownlee Reservoir due the Department of Fish and Game recommendation that they felt the reservoir could not sustain further use. However, said license was not issued upon Mr. Sorenson's request that it not become effective until April 1, 1991. In the interim, the Idaho Department of Fish and Game has reconsidered its position and has notified the Board that they have no objection to Mr. Sorenson now being licensed on Brownlee Reservoir. Following which and in reconsideration of the Board's prior action and Mr. Sorenson's appearance before the Board, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD AMEND ITS PRIOR APPROVAL OF MR. SORENSON'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF POWER BOAT FISHING ON SA6 FROM WALTER'S FERRY BRIDGE DOWNSTREAM INCLUSIVE OF BROWNLEE RESERVOIR. Administrative Note: The record should be noted that this now fills the two slots available on Brownlee Reservoir. (See Addendum #11).

Idaho Department of Fish & Game/1991 Idaho Non-Resident License Application: The Board reviewed the Idaho Department of Fish and Game's 1990-91 Idaho Non-Resident License Application to find that item 5 under sub-paragraph 3 is confusing - even misleading. While some outfitters may be designated as vendors, the Board is not aware that most outfitters are vendors. Therefore, Board directs that a letter be addressed to the Idaho Department of Fish and Game to ask their review and clarification of just what the intent or purpose is relative to item 5 on said 1990-91 Idaho Non-Resident License Application.

Western Spirit Cycling, Inc., Lu Warner, Designated Agent: Mr. Warner met with the Board relative to their outfitter license application to become licensed for the conduct of mountain bike touring beginning at Ketchum, ID and proceeding along designated routes to end at Idaho City, ID. Following the interview before the Board and in consideration of this application, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE WESTERN SPIRIT CYCLING, INC., LU WARNER, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING ALONG DESIGNATED ROUTES AS SPECIFIED IN HIS APPLICATION AND OPERATING PLAN FROM KETCHUM TO IDAHO CITY, IDAHO; 2) APPROVE MR. WARNER AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK AND PAYMENT OF FEES WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT THIS WILL BE FOR THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR. The Board recessed for lunch at 1235 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch: The Board 1) reviewed the Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch, file as well as the Tony Popp, dba Trapper Creek Ranch, file; 2) reviewed the February 26, 1991, letter received from William J. McKlveen on behalf of Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch, to note that Mr. Thomas had taken action to foreclose upon the sales contract by and between himself and Mr. Popp; and 3) finds that Mr. Thomas in exercise of his power of attorney under said sales contract is now the owner of that outfitter business formerly known as Tony Popp, dba Trapper Creek Ranch. Further, the Board has been informed that Tony Popp, the current holder of the special use permit on National Forest lands for conduct of his outfitting business, has agreed to relinquish said special use permit effective March 31, 1991. The Board's records should therefore reflect this matter to indicate that the outfitting business formerly known and licensed as Tony Popp, dba Trapper Creek Ranch, no longer exists and that said outfitting business is now held by Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch. Further, that Mr. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch, does not possess a current special use permit but upon relinquishment by Mr. Popp of his special use permit, the Forest Service has indicated they will

reissue said permit to Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch, for conduct of outfitting business on National Forest Lands effective April 1, 1991. Thus, upon Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch, request for renewal of his outfitter license for the 1991-92 license year, Mr. Thomas will be approved by the Board, and will have a properly licensed and permitted outfitting business in accordance with state and federal requirements.

Indian Meadows Outpost and Pack Station, Inc., Robert McFadden & Ron Vaughn, Designated Agents: Mr. McFadden together with Mr. David Ash met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of the Harold E. Thomas, Triple T Ranch, outfitting business for conduct of deer, elk, goat, moose, sheep, bear, cougar, and predator hunting, fishing, trailrides, and backpacking activities, to Indian Meadows Outpost and Pack Station, Inc., Robert McFadden & Ron Vaughn, Designated Agents. During the interview before the Board regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business, Messrs McFadden and Ash were advised that the Board needed to conduct further research relative to the proposed sale and transfer of business, namely: 1) contact the Nez Perce National Forest regarding their plans for future timber sales that might occur within the operating area formerly licensed to Tony Popp, dba Trapper Creek Ranch, and what impact, if any, this would have on the current licensee; and 2) that an overlap between outfitters for conduct of bear and cougar hunting is evident along the Salmon River corridor which would need to be addressed before final action could be taken on their application. Thus the Board will contact the Forest Service and Mr. Thomas concerning these matters, and initiate appropriate action to resolve the problem in as timely a manner as possible.

West, Designated Agent: Mr. Christopherson, Mr. Lester West, Mr. James West and Mrs. Lester West met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Lester West, dba Whitewater Outfitters, float boating, fishing, and chukar hunting business on the Lower Salmon (SAB) to Ray A. Christopherson, dba R & C Whitewater Floats, James S. West, Designated Agent. Following the interview before the Board relative to this proposed sale and transfer of business, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN LESTER (ZEKE) WEST, DBA WHITEWATER OUTFITTERS, FOR THE CONDUCT OF HIS FLOAT BOATING, FISHING, AND CHUKAR HUNTING ACTIVITIES ON THE LOWER SALMON RIVER (SAB) TO RAY A. CHRISTOPHERSON, DBA R & C WHITEWATER FLOATS, JAMES S. WEST, DESIGNATED AGENT; 2) APPROVE JAMES S. WEST AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED AS LEAD BOATMAN; AND 3) DIRECT ALL LICENSES BE ISSUED EFFECTIVE FOR THE 1991-92 SEASON UPON SUBSEQUENT PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. Administrative Note: Lester (Zeke) West, dba Whitewater Outfitters, retains his float boating and fishing activities on SA7. (See Addendum #13).

Last Chance Lodge and Outfitters, Lynn Sessions, Designated Agent: Mr. & Mrs. Sessions, Mr. Land, and Mrs. Keckeissen met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of North Fork Outfitters, Inc., Roger Keckeissen, Designated Agent, outfitting business for conduct of float boating, power boating, and fishing on Henry's Lake, Island Park Reservoir, and the Henry's Fork of the Snake River, (SH1 & SH2), to Last Chance Lodge and Outfitters, Lynn Sessions, Designated Agent. BAIER'S OPERATING PLAN ON ROADS AND TRAILS DESIGNATED IN SAID PLAN WITH FISHING TO OCCUR ALONG THE ST. JOE AND PRIEST RIVERS APPROVED FOR BOATING ACTIVITIES; 3) DEEM MR. BAIER QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR 4 X 4 TOURS, TRAILRIDES, AND FISHING ACTIVITIES, BUT NOT QUALIFIED FOR CONDUCT OF BOATING ACTIVITIES ON THE PRIEST AND ST. Charles Loeschen: Mr. Loeschen met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for conduct of hunting all big game species and various other licensable activities in Fish and Game Mgmt Units 1 & 2. Following the interview before the Board, and in consideration of the discussion held during the interview wherein it was found that much of the area requested may be involved in critical grizzly bear and caribou habitat, while other areas requested appear to fall within areas not previously licensed for conduct of outfitted activities, the Board advised Mr. Loeschen he might wish to restructure his outfitter license application to exclude such areas and to include only those areas outside of such boundaries as defined as area #1 on his application. The Board could then contact the Forest Service (in accordance with the MOU) and Idaho Department of Fish and Game for further processing of his license application with hopefully said research being completed to enable taking final action on his application by the April meeting.

Darl Allred, dba Sawtooth Wilderness Outfitters and Guides & Dusty Youren: Messrs Allred and Youren met with the Board regarding an overlap in their licensed operating area boundaries for conduct of bear and cougar hunting. During the course of the interview an agreement was reached between the parties involved and the Board that Mr. Youren and Mr. Allred would accept a decision by the Board as to resolution of this overlap. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD RESOLVE THE OVERLAP BY MOVING MR. DUSTY YOUREN'S CURRENT OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY FOR CONDUCT OF BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING NORTH TO COINCIDE WITH THE LICENSED OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY FOR DARL ALLRED, DBA SAWTOOTH WILDERNESS OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES WITH SAID ADJUSTMENT IN OPERATING BOUNDARY TO BECOME EFFECTIVE WITH THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR. FURTHER THAT A LETTER OF APPRECIATION BE ADDRESSED TO MESSRS ALLRED AND YOUREN TO EXPRESS THE BOARD'S APPRECIATION FOR THEIR COOPERATION IN RESOLVING THIS MATTER. (See Addendum #16).

Anthony Bryan Tarantola: The Board reviewed Mr. Tarantola's designated agent license application to become designated agent for Dale Kinsella, for conduct of float boating, and float boat fishing on the South Fork Snake River (SS1). Following review of the file and in consideration of this application, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. TARANTOLA'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION AS SUBMITTED. (See Addendum #18).

The Lodge at Palisades Creek, Inc., A. Bryan Tarantola, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request submitted by Dale Kinsella, to change his business name and structure from a sole proprietorship under the name Dale Kinsella, to a corporate structure under the name The Lodge at Palisades Creek, Inc., A. Bryan Tarantola, Designated Agent. Following review of the file, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST TO CHANGE BUSINESS NAME AND STRUCTURE FROM A SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP UNDER THE NAME DALE KINSELLA, TO A CORPORATION UNDER THE NAME THE LODGE AT PALISADES CREEK, INC., A. BRYAN TARANTOLA, DESIGNATED AGENT. (SEE ADDENDUM #19)

Jane E. Mehs, dba Priest Lake Guide Service: The Board reviewed Jane E. Mehs, dba Priest Lake Guide Service outfitter license renewal application for the 1991-92 license year to note that she has submitted an apparent falsified red cross card. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD DENY RENEWAL OF THE JANE E. MEHS, DBA PRIEST LAKE GUIDE SERVICE, 1991-92 OUTFITTER LICENSE. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO 36-2113(a)(1 & 5).

Lawrence E. Mehs: The Board reviewed Mr. Mehs 1991-92 guide license application to note that he has submitted an apparent falsified red cross card. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD DENY RENEWAL OF THE LAWRENCE E. MEHS 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO 36-2113(a)(1 & 5).

Richard Winkler: The Board reviewed the file and information resulting from an investigation of the operation and letter submitted by Mr. Winkler known as the "St. Peter and Hubert Piscatorial and Hunting Society of Idaho". Said research and investigation of Mr. Winkler's operation finds that such operations are outside the scope of Title 36, Chapter 21 as is prescribed in the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 9.

Philip Bub Smith: The Board reviewed the letter from the Emmett Ranger District regarding Mr. Smith's having not secured a special use permit for conduct of cougar hunting on the National Forest Lands within the Emmett Ranger District. Review of Mr. Smith's operating area boundaries finds that it is entirely possible that he may not have conducted an extensive amount of cougar hunting on National Forest Land and, in fact, may conduct a majority of said activity on privately owned land. Following consideration of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Smith asking clarification as to whether he is operating on National Forest Lands or privately owned lands. And, if the latter, the Board would request that he submit necessary private land owner approval for his conduct of business on their privately owned lands.

Michael Scott, dba White Cloud Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Scott's file and letter of concerns submitted to the Board by the Cypress Mining Company, Challis, ID, regarding Mr. Scott's alleged activities in areas adjacent to the mine. Mr. Scott was contacted, and his response indicates that he was acting in a completely legal manner in conduct of a personal hunt which has been confirmed by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game. Therefore, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to the Cypress Mining Company thanking them for their letter, stating that the Board has investigated this matter and finds that Mr. Scott was operating in a legal manner in conduct of a personal hunt. Therefore, no further action will be taken and the Board deems this matter closed.

Peter Grubb, dba Rivers Odysseys West: The Board reviewed Mr. Grubb's outfitter license amendment request for conduct of "walking tours" within the river corridor for which he is licensed for boating activities namely the Snake River (SN7). Following review of Mr. Grubb's proposed activity, the Board deems that "walking

tours" is little different from the currently licensable activity of backpacking, and therefore declines to establish a new separate category. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT PETER GRUBB, DBA RIVER ODYSSEYS WEST (ROW), OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF BACKPACKING AS A LICENSED ACTIVITY BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #20).

R.O.W., Inc., dba River Odysseys West, Peter Grubb, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Grubb's outfitter license amendment request to change his outfitter business name from Peter Grubb, dba Rivers Odysseys West, to R.O.W., Inc., dba Rivers Odysseys West, Peter Grubb, Designated Agent. Following the review of this amendment request, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE REQUESTED NAME CHANGE OF PETER GRUBB'S OUTFITTING BUSINESS FROM PETER GRUBB, DBA RIVER ODYSSEYS WEST, TO R.O.W., INC., DBA RIVER ODYSSEYS WEST; AND 2) APPROVE PETER GRUBB AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, FOR SAID CORPORATE STRUCTURE. (See Addendum #21).

Randy Hess, dba White Otter Outdoor Adventures: The Board reviewed the January 31, 1991, letter from Mr. Hess in which he outlines his proposal to provide a full service rental program for private boaters on the Middle Fork Salmon River. It will be limited to the provision of food and rental of equipment to groups who have private permits on the river. Following consideration of Mr. Hess's letter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Hess to advise him that his proposed activity as outlined in his January 31, 1991, letter does indeed fall outside the purview of Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21.

Keith Rush, dba Lake View Guest Ranch: The Board reviewed Mr. Rush's outfitter license amendment request of August, 1990, in which he requested the addition of snowmobiling and skiing activities within Fish and Game Mgmt Unit 61. Contact with the Forest Service at the Island Park and Dubois Ranger Districts indicated the necessity to prepare necessary environmental documents which, in so far as the Island Park Ranger District is concerned, has now been completed with their concurrence that Mr. Rush be licensed for snowmobiling on groomed trails within Fish and Game Mgmt Unit 61. The Dubois Ranger District has as yet not responded to the Board's request for input to Mr. Rush's amendment request. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE KEITH RUSH, DBA LAKE VIEW GUEST RANCH, OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF SNOWMOBILING IN ISLAND PARK RANGER DISTRICT ON GROOMED TRAILS WITHIN FISH AND GAME MGMT UNIT 61. (See Addendum #22).

Middle Fork Lodge, Inc.: The Board reviewed the Middle Fork Lodge, Inc., outfitter license amendment request to change their business name from what is currently known as MFL, Inc., to again become Middle Fork Lodge, Inc. Review of the file finds all paperwork is complete, following which, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE REQUESTED AMENDMENT FOR THE CHANGE OF BUSINESS NAME AS REQUESTED. (See Addendum #23).

Sam Davis: The Board reviewed Mr. Davis's designated agent license application to become the designated agent for Middle Fork Lodge, Inc. Following review of the file and finding all paperwork complete, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. DAVIS'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION TO BECOME DESIGNATED AGENT FOR MIDDLE FORK LODGE, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #23).

Olivia Expeditions, Inc., Olivia James, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the December 21, 1990, letter from Olivia Expeditions, Inc., in which they request a renewal of their exception to the guest/guide ratio for float boaters on SA1. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT SAID REQUEST BE APPROVED.

Dan S. Jacobson, dba Panhandle Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Jacobson's file noting that he had appeared before the Board in August, 1990, at which time the Board approved his purchase of the Darrell Atkinson business known as Whaler Charters. Condition(s) for issue of said license were that: 1) Mr. Jacobson be licensed not qualified to guide until such time as he had obtained appropriate guide and coast guard licenses; and 2) that Mr. Darrell Atkinson would serve as guide until Mr. Jacobson had obtained necessary licenses. Mr. Jacobson elected not to pursue issuance of this license until such time as he had, in fact, obtained his coast guard license and became qualified to guide on the waters in question. In the interim, he has also elected to make a business name change. Following review of this matter, and in consideration of Mr. Jacobson's request, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. JACOBSON'S REQUEST TO CHANGE HIS BUSINESS NAME FROM DAN S. JACOBSON, DBA WHALER CHARTERS, TO DAN S. JACOBSON, DBA PANHANDLE OUTFITTERS; AND 2) THAT HE BE DEEMED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #24).

Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips & Russell Gore, dba Gore's Salmon River Jet/Float Trips: The Board reviewed these respective outfitter files noting a letter received from the North Fork Ranger District as regards Mr. Gore's and Mr. Bernt's alleged unauthorized conduct of boating activities on the Salmon River (SA5). Following discussion of this alleged unauthorized commercial boating activity on SA5, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Rogers

Thomas, North Fork Ranger District, requesting that he research the Salmon River Management Plan and inform the Board as to: a) the original allocation of respective power and float boating activities on SAS; and b) any amendment(s) made to the original allocation, either up or down, to require an adjustment in numbers of licenses/permits currently issued to establish a basis for taking adverse action against either Mr. Bernt's or Mr. Gore's outfitter license.

Gerald Richie Outfitting: The Board reviewed Mr. Richie's file noting the complaint that was filed against him by Larry Rose of Darby, MT, for an incident that occurred in November, 1990. The complaint alleges Mrs. Richie made accusations against Mr. Rose regarding illegal outfitting, poor conditions of camps, and certain possible physical harm. The Board contacted the Richie's regarding this matter and has as yet not received a response. Following consideration of this matter and upon staff recommendation, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD BRING MR. RICHIE BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS OUTFITTING LICENSE FOR ALLEGED VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(5). FURTHER THAT NECESSARY SUBPOENA SHOULD BE ISSUED FOR WITNESSES THOUGHT NECESSARY FOR THE PROSECUTION OF THIS CASE.

Mitch Sanchotena: The Board reviewed Mr. Sanchotena's file noting that he had been convicted for violation of Idaho Fish and Game Law, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. SANCHOTENA BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS GUIDE LICENSE FOR CONVICTION OF VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(6).

Heinz Sippel: The Board reviewed Mr. Sippel's file noting that he had been convicted for violation of Idaho Fish and Game Law, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. SIPPEL BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS GUIDE LICENSE FOR CONVICTION OF VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(6).

Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stan Meholchick, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stan Meholchick, Designated Agent, file noting that they had been convicted for several violations of Idaho Fish and Game Law, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT JUNIPER MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, INC., STAN MEHOLCHICK, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF JUNIPER MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, INC. OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR CONVICTION IN VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(6).

Stan Potts, dba Stan Potts Outfitting: Based upon a recommendation by the Enforcement Coordinator in regard to information provided to him by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game in which it is alleged that Mr. Potts did employ unlicensed guide for the conduct of a 1990 fall big horn sheep hunt, MSC (Epley--Crane)(Miller, nay) THAT STANLEY POTTS BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF HIS OUTFITTERS LICENSE FOR ALLEGED VIOLATION OF IDAHO CODE 26-2113(a)(9).

Randy Brink, dba Brinks Payette River Company: The Board reviewed the Lowman District Ranger's letter in which he advised the Board that Mr. Brink does not have a current special use permit for conduct of his licensed activities on National Forest Lands. The Board further noted the Lowman District Ranger, based upon his knowledge of Mr. Brink's operations, had requested the Board to take appropriate non-use action against Mr. Brink's license. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs as an addition to its February 4, 1991, letter to the Lowman Ranger District, a further letter to advise him of the Board's record regarding Mr. Brink's use of his license privileges and that Mr. Brink is not deemed as being in non-use status at the present time. However, the Board will address a letter to Mr. Brink to advise him the Board will require a land manager sign-off sheet indicating their intent to issue a special use permit before renewal of his 1991-92 outfitter license is issued.

Cascade Raft Company, Steve Jones, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the January 30, 1991, letter from Steve Jones in which he petitions the Board to review the number of permits issued for the South Fork of the Payette River (PS1 & PS2). Following a review of this requested petition, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD REJECT SAID PETITION DUE TO THE FACT THAT; 1) ALL CURRENT LICENSABLE SLOTS ON THE RIVER ARE FILLED AND 2) THAT THE ASSUMPTION THAT A VACANT SLOT EXISTS ON THE RIVER IS INCORRECT.

Rick D. Doyle, dba Mainstream Outdoor Adventures: The Board reviewed Mr. Doyle's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of forest grouse, chukar, and partridge hunting to his power boat license on SN8. Also, the Board noted his requested review of his file regarding his efforts to be licensed on SN7. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Doyle stating 1) the Board will initiate research on his request for forest grouse, chukar, and partridge hunting with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game for their recommendation regarding the addition of these activities to his license 2) that at the present time there is no space available on SN7 to which he may be licensed; and 3) his name will be placed on the waiting list for future consideration should a space become available.

Emergency Rule - Rule 57: The Board reviewed the background to the drafting of an emergency rule to correct an omission in the current Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 57. Said emergency rule has been adopted and is now promulgated in accordance with necessary procedures under the APA and now comes before the Board for final adoption. Following which, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DOES NOW MAKE FINAL ADOPTION OF THE EMERGENCY RULE WITH SAID RULE NOW INCLUDED IN THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 57.

Technical Advisory Committee: The Board reviewed the applications made by Bonnie Nobori, Designated Agent for Eclipse Expeditions, Inc., and by Rick Barker of Sun Valley Heli Ski, wherein they expressed their interest to become members of the Board's technical advisory committee concerning skiing, mountain climbing, and back country alpine skiing activities. Following the review of their credentials in this regard, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THEIR APPOINTMENTS BE CONFIRMED TO THE BOARD'S TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE. FURTHER, THAT LETTERS BE ADDRESSED TO THESE INDIVIDUALS EXPRESSING THE BOARD'S APPRECIATION FOR THEIR INTEREST AND WILLINGNESS TO ASSIST THE BOARD IN THIS MANNER.

Warren River Expeditions, Inc., Dave Warren, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Warren's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of kayaking, steelhead fishing, and chukar hunting. Following review and consideration of this amendment request, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT WARREN RIVER EXPEDITIONS, INC, DAVE WARREN, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF KAYAKING (18KK) BE APPROVED, FURTHER, THE STEELHEAD FISHING (5AF) AND CHUKAR HUNTING (4CH) SHOULD HAVE BEEN INCLUDED IN THE ORIGINAL PURCHASE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS FROM BOB SEVY AND THAT SUCH WAS INADVERTENTLY OVERLOOKED AND WILL NOW BE ADDED TO HIS LICENSE. (See Addendum #25).

Scott Schnebly, dba Lost River Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Schnebly's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of bird hunting on the Rusty Tews preserve in Lincoln County. Review of the file finds that Mr. Schnebly appears to have proper paperwork and approval by individuals administering Rusty Tews preserve for the conduct of said requested activities. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. SCHNEBLY'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF BIRD HUNTING ON THE RUSTY TEWS PRESERVE. (See Addendum #26).

Renshaw Outfitting, Inc., Jim Renshaw, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed Mr. Renshaw's outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of deer, elk, bear, predator, forest grouse, and turkey hunting, and trailrides on his privately owned 460 acre ranch. Following review of this outfitter amendment request, and in consideration of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game recommendations, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE RENSHAW OUTFITTING, INC. AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF DEER AND ELK HUNTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATIONS, (NAMELY: NO MORE THAN EIGHT (8) DEER HUNTERS AND NO MORE THAN SIX (6) ELK HUNTERS PER YEAR), PREDATOR AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING AND TRAILRIDES; 2) DENY RENSHAW OUTFITTERS, INC., AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR CONDUCT OF BEAR AND TURKEY HUNTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATION AND THE FURTHER FACT THAT TURKEY HUNTING IS NOT A LICENSABLE ACTIVITY; AND 3) AS A NOTE ON THE OPERATING AREA DESCRIPTION, ENCOURAGE THE RENSHAW'S TO ALLOW PUBLIC ON THEIR PRIVATE PROPERTY FOR DOE HARVEST. (See Addendum #27).

Idaho River Expeditions, Inc., dba Action Whitewater Adventures, Jay Verle Duerden, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the stipulation which was presented to Mr. Duerden regarding his alleged employment of an unlicensed guide during the 1990 summer float boat season on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River (MF1 & MF2). Mr. Duerden conceded to the facts that he did, in fact, employ the unlicensed guide, a Mr. Eric Petlock, and attached a letter of explanation as to the circumstances surrounding his employment of Mr. Petlock. Following consideration of this stipulation and the letter of explanation of the circumstances surrounding same, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE STIPULATION MADE BY MR. DUERDEN AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE LETTER OF EXPLANATION OF THE FACTS SURROUNDING THE EMPLOYMENT OF MR. PETLOCK, THAT NO FURTHER FINE OR ADVERSE ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST HIS LICENSES BUT IN LIEU THEREOF A LETTER OF REPRIMAND BE ADDRESSED TO MR. DUERDEN FOR HIS NOT CHECKING ON MR. PETLOCK'S LICENSE PRIOR TO HIS EMPLOYMENT WHICH COULD HAVE PREVENTED THIS INCIDENT FROM OCCURRING AND, BY THESE ACTIONS THE BOARD CONSIDERS THE CASE CLOSED.

Todd Van Braemer, dba Sun Valley Outfitters: The Board reviewed the January 1, 1991, letter from Mr. Van Braemer in which he expressed his concern for outfitted activity in the Lost River drainage to request the Board to declare a moratorium on any further outfitted activity in said drainage. Following review and consideration of Mr. Van Braemer's letter, the Board directs an additional letter to the one previously sent by the Executive Director be addressed to Mr. Van Braemer in which the Board acknowledges his concern and to advise him additional information would be required before a decision relative to his concern to

exclude outfitted activity within the Lost River drainage could be made. Further, such an action would require consideration and public review under the State Administrative Procedures Act with a rule promulgated and put in place to exclude such use.

Bonnie B. Davis or Buzz Davis, dba Willey Ranch Outfitters: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request received from Bonnie B. Davis and Buzz Davis regarding their proposal to amend the former license issued to Del Davis, now deceased, to enable the orderly transfer of said business to Mrs. Davis and son. Review of the amendment request finds all paperwork has been completed inclusive of a land managers sign-off sheet and satisfactory passing of outfitter examination. Following which, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE BOTH BONNIE B. DAVIS AND BUZZ DAVIS, DBA WILLEY RANCH OUTFITTERS, AS THE SUCCESSOR IN INTEREST TO THE DEL DAVIS OUTFITTER BUSINESS; 2) DEEM BOTH BONNIE B. DAVIS AND BUZZ DAVIS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) CONSIDER THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST AS A RENEWAL APPLICATION OF DEL DAVIS'S CURRENT LICENSE TO BECOME EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 1991. (See Addendum #28). Administrative Note/Questions: Have use records been submitted, if not, they should be requested.

Ted Epley, dba Epley's Idaho Outdoor Adventures: The Board reviewed Mr. Epley's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of wagonrides and sleighrides to be conducted on leased state lands near the vicinity of McCall, ID. Review of the file finds that paperwork for said request is complete, following which, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED AS REQUESTED ON STATE LEASED LAND FOR THE ADDITION OF WAGONRIDES AND SLEIGHRIDES TO MR. EPLEY'S OUTFITTER LICENSE. (See Addendum #29).

St. Joe Hunting and Fishing Camp, Inc., Will Judge, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the St. Joe Hunting and Fishing Camp, Inc., outfitter license amendment request for the addition of photography trips as a licensable activity. Following which, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED FOR THE ADDITION OF PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS TO THEIR OUTFITTER LICENSE. (See Addendum #30).

Sally Chang: The Board reviewed Mrs. Chang's designated agent license application to become designated agent for Northwest Dories, Inc. Review of the file finds that it is complete and that she is qualified to guide. Following which, MSC (Miller--Epley) SALLY CHANG BE APPROVED AS AN ADDITIONAL DESIGNATED AGENT FOR NORTHWEST DORIES, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #31).

Marlene West, dba Ridgerunner Outfitters: The Board reviewed Marlene West's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of photography trips as a licensable activity on her outfitter license. Review of the file finds all paperwork is complete with payment of necessary fees. 
