APPROVED MINUTES  
Board Meeting - April 22 - 26, 1991  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, April 22, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Executive Session:** Baird moves that the Board go into Executive Session, pursuant to Idaho Code 67-2345, at 0830 hours for the purpose of discussing personnel matters. The Board came out of Executive Session at 0905 hours with no decisions made.

**Executive Director's Report:** The Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, updated the Board relative to activities occurring since the last Board meeting. Following which, the Board addressed the following matters:

- A) CITATIONS, THE BOARD REQUESTED THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR PREPARE A SYNOPSIS OF COMPLAINTS TO ENABLE THE BOARD TO BE KEPT ABREAST OF COMPLAINTS PENDING BEFORE THE BOARD.
- B) THE ORAL FISCAL REPORT MADE TO THE BOARD FOR THE MONTHS OF FEBRUARY AND MARCH RELATIVE TO THE STATUS OF THE BOARD'S CURRENT BUDGETARY ALLOCATIONS WAS APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.
- C) THE BOARD WAS NOTIFIED THAT THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ASSOCIATION MEETING ORIGINALLY SCHEDULED FOR DECEMBER 9, 10, AND 11 HAS BEEN RESCHEDULED TO NOVEMBER 30, DECEMBER 1, 2 AND 3 AT THE RED LION INN IN BOISE. THE BOARD WILL SCHEDULE THE DECEMBER MEETING ACCORDINGLY.
- D) THE REPORTS AS RECEIVED BY THE FOREST SERVICE AND BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT WITH REGARDS THE NON-COMPLIANCE OF LICENSED OUTFITTERS TO THEIR SPECIAL USE PERMITS WERE REVIEWED. A LETTER OF THANKS IS TO BE SENT TO THE AGENCIES REQUESTING THAT THIS COMMUNICATION BE CONTINUED TO ENABLE BETTER COOPERATION BETWEEN AGENCIES AND FURTHER THAT THE DISPOSITIONS OF ANY CITATIONS THAT HAVE BEEN ISSUED TO LICENSED OUTFITTERS BE FORWARDED TO THE BOARD AS SOON AS POSSIBLE FOR OUR INFORMATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION.
- E) THE FEBRUARY 22, 1991, LETTER RECEIVED FROM DAN M. WILSON, DBA STANLEY SPORTS AND ADVENTURES, INDICATING THAT HE NO LONGER WISHES TO CONDUCT AN OUTFITTING BUSINESS IN THE STANLEY BASIN AREA FOR THE CONDUCT OF MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING; AND THAT, HE RELINQUISHES ALL LICENSES ISSUED TO HIM FOR CONDUCT OF THIS ACTIVITY WAS ACKNOWLEDGED. MR. WILSON IS TO BE NOTIFIED THAT THE BOARD ACCEPTS HIS RELINQUISHMENT.

- F) THE BOARD REVIEWED THE IDAHO STATE TAX COMMISSION PACKET TO BE PROVIDED OUTFITTERS ESTABLISHING A NEW OUTFITTING BUSINESS IN IDAHO. THIS PACKET WILL ENABLE "NEW" OUTFITTERS TO BETTER UNDERSTAND IDAHO TAX LAW FOR CONDUCT OF SAID BUSINESS. THE TAX COMMISSION REQUESTED THAT SAID PACKET BE INCLUDED IN THE BOARD'S INFORMATION PACKET CONCERNING "NEW OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATIONS." THE BOARD CONCURS WITH SAID REQUEST TO INCLUDE THIS INFORMATION WITH NEW OUTFITTER LICENSES.
- G) THAT THE RENEWAL OF THE USFS/IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT REGARDING ENFORCEMENT WORK FOR THE 1991 FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR BE APPROVED WITH THE CHAIRMAN AUTHORIZED TO SIGN SAID AGREEMENT.

**Board Minutes:** The Board reviewed the draft copy of the Board Minutes for the meeting held February 25 - March 1, 1991. Following which, (Epley--Crane) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

**Enforcement Coordinator:** The Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis, updated the Board on ongoing enforcement activities since the last Board Meeting.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1210 hours and reconvened at 1320 hours.

**Board's Attorney Report:** The Board's Attorney, Dallas Burkhalter, updated the Board relative to ongoing legal matters pending before the Board since the last meeting in February.

**Jane E. Mehs, dba Priest Lake Guide Service, and Lawrence Mehs, Guide in the Employ of Jane E. Mehs:** Following review of this case wherein: 1) the Mehs were to appear before the Board in a Show Cause Hearing for suspension or revocation of their licenses for alleged falsification of their American Red Cross Cards; 2) the Board's Attorney reported that the alleged falsification of the Red Cross Card resulted not from any specific action on the part of the Mehs' but rather a third party; and 3) The Board's Attorney further reports the Mehs do, in fact, now have current, valid first aid cards. MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT IN CONSIDERATION OF MATERIAL PRESENTED TO THE BOARD REGARDING THE ALLEGED FALSIFICATION OF AMERICAN RED CROSS CARDS BY BOTH JANE E. AND LAWRENCE MEHS THAT THE BOARD FIND NO CAUSE TO REVOKE, SUSPEND, OR DENY THE LICENSES AND DIRECTS BOTH JANE E. MEHS, DBA PRIEST LAKE GUIDE SERVICE, OUTFITTER AND GUIDE LICENSES, AND LAWRENCE MEHS GUIDE LICENSE FOR THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

**Robert C. Burlingame, dba Flying B Ranch, Michael Popp, Designated Agent:** The Board again reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Robert M. Smith, for conduct of elk, deer, bear, cougar, and forest grouse hunting in Fish and Game Management Units 10A, 12, and 16 to Robert C. Burlingame, dba Flying B Ranch, Michael Popp, Designated Agent. Messrs Smith and Popp met with the Board in February regarding this proposed sale and were advised the current bear and cougar hunting overlap among outfitters along the Selway and Lochsa river corridors must be addressed prior to further Board action regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business. Subsequent to the meeting in February, Board members Leo Crane and Bill Meiners as well as Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, met with affected licensees involved in the overlap to discuss possible resolutions to the problem. As a result a tentative agreement was drafted and sent by the parties involved to the Board for consideration at their April meeting. A review of the proposed resolution plus the fact it now appears all parties are not in agreement with the proposed resolution of the problem. Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley)(Crane, nay) THAT THE BOARD 1) NOT ACCEPT SAID AGREEMENT A RESOLUTION TO THE OVERLAP OF BEAR/COUGAR HUNTING ALONG THE SELWAY/LOCHSA RIVER CORRIDORS; 2) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN MESSRS SMITH AND BURLINGAME FOR CONDUCT OF ELK, DEER, BEAR, COUGAR, AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 10A, 12 & 16 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING STIPULATION/LIMITATIONS AS OUTLINED IN THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME LETTER DATED, MARCH 19, 1991; AREA 1, DEER AND ELK ARCHERY HUNTING ONLY - LIMIT OF 10 HUNTERS PER YEAR; AREA 2, BEAR/COUGAR HUNTS - A LIMIT OF 10 HUNTERS PER YEAR; AREA 3, COUGAR HUNTS ONLY - A LIMIT OF 5 HUNTERS PER YEAR; AND, AREA 4, COUGAR AND SPRING BEAR HUNTS - A LIMIT OF 5 HUNTERS FOR EACH SPECIES PER YEAR (AREA 4 LIMITATIONS PENDING APPROVAL AND CONFIRMATION FROM THE FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT.) (See Addendum #1). Administrative Note: The Board directs that the parties involved in the Selway/Lochsa River corridor be put on notice that lacking an agreement among the parties involved as to the resolution of the stacking problem, the Board hereby puts them on notice that no further sales or transfers of business will be approved until an acceptable agreement/resolution is achieved. And further, lacking such an agreement by December 31, 1991, the Board will address this matter under purview of Rule 24 to resolve the problem.

**Lemhi Bear/Cougar Joint Use Area:** The Board reviewed the Lemhi Bear/Cougar Joint Use Area relative to its next step to identify what areas, if any, are available to reassign/accommodate displaced or additional bear/cougar hunting activities in Lemhi/Custer counties. Following review of the file regarding this matter, the Board directs that a map be prepared and sent to BLM, USFS and Idaho Department of Fish and Game stating that in so far as the

Board can determine, the "mapped" areas outlined are currently unlicensed and to request their review/input and recommendation relative to any future licensing of these areas for conduct of bear and cougar hunting. Further, the Board would appreciate receiving this information as soon as convenient to enable consideration of appropriate action at its June meeting if at all possible.

**Ray Torrey:** The Board reviewed Mr. Torrey's file, noting that he has failed to make application for renewal of his outfitter license for license years 1990 and 1991. Following discussion of this matter and in consideration of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(13), and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28. MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD, PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(A)(13) AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 28: 1) DECLARE RAY TORREY'S OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR CONDUCT OF ANTELOPE, DEER, ELK, BEAR, GOAT, MOOSE, SHEEP, COUGAR, PREDATOR, CHUKAR, AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING, AS WELL AS FISHING, TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING AND SNOWMOBILING ACTIVITIES AS RELINQUISHED; 2) NOTIFY MR. TORREY OF THE BOARD'S ACTION IN THIS REGARD; 3) DECLARE THE OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO RAY TORREY FOR CONDUCT OF THE AFOREMENTIONED ACTIVITIES A VIABLE AREA FOR RELICENSING CONSIDERATION; AND 4) DIRECTS A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO THE LAND MANAGING AGENCIES NAMELY THE FOREST SERVICE AND BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT AS WELL AS IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, REQUESTING THEIR INPUT AND RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING RELICENSING OF THE OPERATING AREA IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 28C.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1650 hours and reconvened on Tuesday, April 23, 1991, at 0815 hours with all Board members, except Hank Miller, present. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Jarius H. Hansen, Jr.:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hansen's resume and application for the Board's consideration to employ him as an enforcement officer. Following the review of the application and discussion of same, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD EMPLOY MR. HANSEN AS AN ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.

**Moose Creek Ranch, Inc., Kelly Van Orden, Designated Agent:** Mr. Van Orden met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for Moose Creek Ranch, Inc., for conduct of incidental fishing, trailrides, backpacking, wagon rides, and photography trips in Fish and Game Management Unit 65. Mr. Van Orden is proposing to conduct his business primarily in the State of Wyoming, however, his residence is in the State of Idaho with incidental use of Idaho lands. Following the interview before the Board, relative to the outfitter license application and Mr. Van Orden's application to become designated agent for same, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD: 1) APPROVE THE MOOSE CREEK RANCH,

INC., OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF INCIDENTAL FISHING, TRAILRIDES, BACKPACKING, WAGON RIDES, AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS AS REQUESTED, AND THAT HIS REQUEST FOR SLEIGH RIDES BE HELD TILL A LATER DATE; 2) THAT MR. VAN ORDEN BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #2) Administrative Note: During the course of the interview, the matter of the name of the operation, namely Moose Creek Ranch, Inc., was discussed regarding a possible conflict with a previously licensed outfitting operation in Idaho. In discussion of this matter, Mr. Van Orden agreed to consider and explore possible other names for his outfit and if this does become necessary that the change in name would be done with an administrative amendment with no cost to Mr. Van Orden.

**Rich Cook:** The Board reviewed Mr. Cook's file relative to the pending action before the Board as regards Mr. Cook's unprofessional conduct while acting in the capacity of a guide in an incident which occurred on the Snake River last fall. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board instructs its attorney to explore and take appropriate action to resolve this matter short of further formal hearing procedures.

**Joe Bressler:** The Board reviewed Mr. Bressler's outfitter license renewal application, particularly his application for designated agent, to find that he had been convicted for violation of Wyoming Fish and Game Law. Following discussion and in consideration of the explanation offered by Mr. Bressler relative to this violation, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. BRESSLER'S LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION FOR THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR.

**George E. Duncan:** The Board reviewed Mr. Duncan's 1991-92 outfitter license renewal application finding that he had been convicted for violation of Idaho Fish and Game Law. Following review of the file and in consideration of the explanations surrounding this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. DUNCAN'S 1991-92 OUTFITTER LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION BUT THAT HIS 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

**Ron Hess:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hess's 1991-92 guide license application noting that he had been convicted for violation of Idaho Fish and Game Law. Following review of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. HESS'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE COURSE OF THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR, ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

**Sevy Guide Service, Inc., Bob Sevy, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sevy's request for waiver to Rule 53 for the conduct of a trip on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River (MF1 & MF2) for Levi J. Smith and his wife for the period June 27 - July 2, 1991. Following review of this matter, and finding that all paperwork has been completed, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. SEVY'S REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF RULE 53 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MATERIALS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

**Michael J. Rock:** The Board reviewed Mr. Rock's 1991-92 guide license application to note that he had what appears to be a falsified first aid card. Upon investigation of this matter and confirmation from the Red Cross that Mr. Rock does not appear on any of their records as having completed a red cross class on either 4/27/88 or 4/27/90. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. ROCK'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(A)(1).

**Anthony (Tony) Popp:** The Board reviewed Mr. Popp's 1991-92 designated agent license application for employment with Diana Swift Haynes, dba Wapiti Meadow Ranch and Outfitters. Following review of the file, and finding that said file is complete, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. POPP AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, FOR DIANA SWIFT HAYNES, DBA WAPITI MEADOW RANCH AND OUTFITTERS.

**Michael J. Richie:** The Board reviewed Mr. Richie's 1991-92 guide license application to note that he had been convicted for violation of Idaho Fish and Game Law. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT MR. RICHIE'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION SHALL BE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

**Eakin Ridge Outfitters, Inc, LaMont Anderson, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Anderson's 1991-92 designated agent license renewal application to find that he had received a citation for violation of Forest Service regulations, and paid required stipulated settlement. Following which, and in consideration of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. ANDERSON'S 1991-92 DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION WITHOUT RESTRICTION. FURTHER, INSTRUCT THAT A LETTER BE ADDRESSED TO MR. ANDERSON THANKING HIM FOR HIS ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE RECEIPT OF THE FOREST SERVICE VIOLATION OF HIS SPECIAL USE PERMIT.

**W. Gregory Loomis:** The Board reviewed Mr. Loomis' 1991-92 guide license application to note that he had been convicted for violation of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 52(d) for utilization of unmarked boats in the

conduct of an outfitted activity while in the employ of licensed outfitters. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Crane-Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) ISSUE MR. LOOMIS' 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992; AND 2) THAT PRIOR TO ISSUANCE OF SAID LICENSE THAT MR. LOOMIS BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AND SATISFACTORILY COMPLETE THE OUTFITTERS EXAMINATION.

**Jim Sullivan:** Mr. Sullivan met with the Board relative to his designated agent license application for employment with Middle Fork Ranch, Inc. Following the interview before the Board concerning this application and in consideration of said application, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. SULLIVAN AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR THE MIDDLE FORK RANCH, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

**Alan L. Davis:** The Board reviewed Mr. Davis' 1991-92 guide license application to find that he has admitted to being convicted for an out of state fish and game violation. Following which, MSC (Baird-Epley) THAT MR. DAVIS' 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

**J. Bret Pond:** The Board reviewed Mr. Pond's designated agent license application to become designated agent for Terry Throckmorton, dba Bar Six Outfitters. Following review of the application and finding all matters are complete, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. POND AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR TERRY THROCKMORTON, DBA BAR SIX OUTFITTERS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE.

**Robert L. Allen, dba Greylock Mountain Company:** Mr. Allen met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for the conduct of incidental fishing, backpacking, technical mountaineering/rockclimbing, cross-country skiing, mountain bike touring, and survival course at a variety of locations throughout Southern Idaho. During the course of the interview with Mr. Allen, it was found that apparently he has been working with the Forest Service and the National Park Service relative to his proposed application and had received permission for the conduct of technical mountaineering, mountain bike touring, outdoor orientation (survival course) activities within the National Park Reserve Area at the City Of Rocks, inclusive of State owned lands in section 36. Following consideration of the application, and discussion of same with Mr. Allen, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THAT PORTION OF MR. ALLEN'S APPLICATION THAT INVOLVES THE NATIONAL PARK RESERVE AT THE CITY OF ROCKS FOR THE CONDUCT OF TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING, MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING, AND OUTDOOR ORIENTATION (SURVIVAL COURSE/MAP READING, COMPASS READING, ETC.) TO INCLUDE THAT PORTION OF THE CITY OF ROCKS AREA THAT IS

MANAGED BY THE STATE OF IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF LANDS, NAMELY SECTION 36; 2) THAT MR. ALLEN BE REQUESTED TO REEVALUATE THE REMAINDER OF HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION TO FOCUS ON THOSE AREAS UNDER DISCUSSION WITH THE FOREST SERVICE ELSEWHERE IN SOUTHERN IDAHO TO PRESENT TO THE BOARD AT A LATER DATE FOR THEIR CONSIDERATION; 3) THAT THOSE AREAS IN WHICH HE IS PROPOSING INCIDENTAL FISHING BE PRECISELY IDENTIFIED TO ENABLE FURTHER RESEARCH/COMMENT FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME; AND 4) THAT MR. ALLEN BE DEEMED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #3).

The Board recessed for lunch at 1150 hours and reconvened at 1320 hours with all Board Members present.

**Executive Session:** Epley moves that the board go into executive session, pursuant to Idaho Code 67-2345, at 1605 hours, for the purpose of discussing potential litigative matters. The Board came out of Executive Session at 1610 hours with no decisions made.

**Heinz A. Sippel:** Mr. Sippel appeared before the Board relative to a Notice of Show Cause Hearing for his alleged violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(A)(6). Review of the file, and stipulated settlement made in the District Court of the 2nd Judicial District for the State of Idaho, in and for the County of Idaho, as regards this alleged violation of Fish and Game Law, the Board finds where bond was posted and forfeited relative to charges against Mr. Sippel but does not require his appearance before the court at a later date. Further, all charges have been dismissed. Thus, the Board finds it has no case against Mr. Sippel, and therefore dismisses charges against him and considers the hearing record closed.

**David M. Friedman, dba Lake Charter Service:** The Board reviewed Mr. Friedman's outfitter license amendment request to change the status of his outfitting business from a sole proprietor known as David M. Friedman, dba Lake Charter Service, to become known as Lake Charters, Inc., David M. Friedman, Designated Agent. Following review of the file and consideration of the amendment request, and finding all paperwork complete, inclusive of payment of fees, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED CHANGE IN BUSINESS STATUS AS REQUESTED FROM DAVID M. FRIEDMAN, DBA LAKE CHARTER SERVICE, TO BECOME KNOWN AS LAKE CHARTERS, INC., DAVID M. FRIEDMAN, DESIGNATED AGENT; 2) APPROVE MR. FRIEDMAN AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR LAKE CHARTERS, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) DIRECT ISSUANCE OF LICENSE TO PROCEED FOR CONDUCT OF POWER BOAT FISHING ON LAKE COEUR D'ALENE. (See Addendum #4).

**Lake Charters, Inc., Robert A. Carbone, Designated Agent:** Mr. Carbone and Mr. David Friedman met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Lake Charters, Inc., David M. Friedman, Designated Agent, power boat fishing outfitter business

on Lake Coeur d'Alene to Lake Charters, Inc., Robert A. Carbone, Designated Agent, for conduct of same activity on Lake Coeur d'Alene. Following the interview before the Board, and discussion of the proposed operation, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS FROM LAKE CHARTERS, INC., DAVID M. FRIEDMAN, DESIGNATED AGENT, TO LAKE CHARTERS, INC., ROBERT A. CARBONE, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR THE CONDUCT OF POWER BOAT FISHING ON LAKE COEUR D'ALENE; 2) APPROVE MR. CARBONE AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; 3) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, INCLUDING: A) PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES; B) SUBMISSION OF CORPORATE PAPERS; AND C) MR. CARBONE PROVIDE THE BOARD A COPY OF HIS COAST GUARD LICENSE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. IN THE INTERIM, IT IS THE BOARD'S UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. FRIEDMAN WILL BE EMPLOYED BY MR. **David Glasscock, dba Idaho Angling Service:** Mr. Glasscock together with his attorney, Bob Harwood, met with the Board relative to Mr. Glasscock's outfitter license application for conduct of fishing activities on various waters in the Picabo, Idaho, area with said operations primarily associated with and limited to privately owned, State, and public domain lands. Following the interview before the Board relative to this application, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE DAVID GLASSCOCK, DBA IDAHO ANGLING SERVICE, OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF FLY FISHING ON THE WATERS OUTLINED IN HIS APPLICATION EXCLUSIVE OF THOSE OCCURRING ON NATIONAL FOREST LANDS; 2) LIMIT SAID APPLICATION/OPERATING AREA TO PRIVATELY OWNED LANDS, STATE LANDS, AND PUBLIC DOMAIN LANDS ADMINISTERED BY THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT; 3) IMPOSE A LIMIT OF 125 USER DAYS TOTAL FOR ALL WATERS WITH A REQUEST THAT THIS USE BE DISTRIBUTED AS WIDELY AS POSSIBLE TO LESSEN THE IMPACT ON ANY SPECIFIC REACH OF WATER; 4) RESTRICT ACTIVITIES TO THOSE PRIVATELY OWNED LANDS UPON WHICH MR. GLASSCOCK HAS OBTAINED AND SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AN APPROPRIATELY SIGNED SIGN-OFF SHEET GRANTING SAID PERMISSION FOR CONDUCT OF SAID ACTIVITIES; 5) LIMIT THE BIG LOST FISHERY ACTIVITIES TO THAT REACH OF RIVER DOWNSTREAM FROM MACKAY DAM; 6) DEEM MR. GLASSCOCK QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 7) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK (AS NOTED - LAND MANGER SIGN OFF) AND PAYMENT OF APPROPRIATE FEES. (See Addendum #6).

**Deer Park Outfitters, Inc., Brent Galbraith, Designated Agent:** Mr. and Mrs. Brent Galbraith together with Grady Smith met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Smith's

outfitting business for conduct of deer, elk, goat, moose, bear, cougar, antelope, predator, and forest grouse hunting, as well as fishing, trailrides, and snowmobiling activities in Fish and Game Management Unit 29. Following the interview before the Board and finding that all paperwork is complete, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF MR. SMITH'S OUTFITTING BUSINESS TO DEER PARK OUTFITTERS, INC., BRENT GALBRAITH, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR CONDUCT OF THE FOREGOING IDENTIFIED ACTIVITIES; 2) APPROVE MR. GALBRAITH AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK INCLUSIVE OF INDICATION OF BONDING AND PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #7).

**Michael James Markovich:** The Board reviewed Mr. Markovich's 1991-92 guide license application noting he had been convicted of a felony. Mr. Markovich had requested an appearance before the Board relative to this conviction to explain the circumstances surrounding same. Following which, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. MARKOVICH'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION WITHOUT RESTRICTION; AND 2) APPROVE MR. MARKOVICH AS LEAD BOATMAN BASED ON HIS PAST EXPERIENCE AND AS HAVING COMPLETED THE NECESSARY ONE TRIP REFRESHER COURSE IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 39.

**Michel S. Sanchotena:** Mr. Sanchotena appeared before the Board in a Show Cause Hearing regarding his conviction for violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(A)(6). Testimony offered before the Board relative to this matter establishes the following Findings of Facts: 1) On October 21, 1990, Michel S. Sanchotena was a dully licensed fishing guide and was employed by the Mackay Bar Corporation to take steelhead fishermen who were clients of Mackay Bar fishing on the Salmon River near the Mackay Bar Ranch; 2) Michel S. Sanchotena on this date did have in his possession a valid hunting license and bighorn sheep tag and permit issued by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game authorizing him to kill and possess one Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep; 3) While engaged in the act of guiding steelhead fishermen who were guests of Mackay Bar Corporation, Mr. Sanchotena observed a number of bighorn sheep and did attempt to kill one of said sheep by firing at it with a big game rifle. A number of witnesses stated that one of the sheep appeared to have been wounded by the gunfire. Mr. Sanchotena declined to follow the sheep to determine if in fact he had wounded it. He did, however, ask a friend who was present to check the area. The friend reported back that he had found a small amount of what appeared to be blood. Mr. Sanchotena did not follow up because of the necessity of leaving the fishermen unguided for a period of time; 4) Later this same day, Mr. Sanchotena was transporting a group of Mackay Bar Corporation clients by jet boat to the end of the road at Vinegar Creek on the Salmon River. He again observed a group of bighorn sheep and attempted to kill one

by rifle fire. When it appeared that he was successful he instructed his wife and a friend to climb to where the sheep had been killed and place his tag on said sheep, dress the sheep and bring the animal off the mountain. Mr. Sanchotena continued down river to take the guests (clients) to the end of the road. When the two arrived at the kill site they discovered that two (2) sheep had been killed. The larger of the two rams was dressed, tagged and an attempt was made to bring the carcass to the river. They were unsuccessful in doing this until Mr. Sanchotena returned to the site in late afternoon. The second sheep was not dressed nor taken care of in any manner until the following morning when it was field dressed and brought off the mountain and taken to the Mackay Bar Ranch on the Salmon River; 5) Fish and Game Department personnel were notified and they investigated the incident. The final results of the investigation were that Mr. Sanchotena pleaded guilty to fish and game violations of failing to pursue a wounded animal and waste of big game meat. Thus the Conclusions of Law are as follows: 1) Mr. Sanchotena was convicted of two counts of violating Idaho Fish and Game Law; 2) Said convictions are grounds for revocation, suspension or denial of a license to guide or outfit in the State of Idaho as provided by Idaho Code 36-2113(A)(6). Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT PURSUANT TO SAID FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, THE BOARD FIND THAT: 1) MR. SANCHOTENA DID VIOLATE TWO COUNTS OF IDAHO FISH AND GAME LAW. IT IS NOT SWAYED BY THE ARGUMENT THAT IN THE FIRST COUNT MR. SANCHOTENA DID NOT FEEL HE HAD WOUNDED THE ANIMAL THEREFORE DID NOT NEED TO FOLLOW UP TO VERIFY THIS. IT IS MORE CONCERNED WITH THE FACT THAT MR. SANCHOTENA PLACED HIMSELF IN A POSITION OF HAVING TO MAKE A CHOICE BETWEEN HIS RESPONSIBILITY TO FOLLOW UP THE SHEEP AND HIS RESPONSIBILITY TO ATTEND TO THE CLIENTS OF MACKAY BAR CORPORATION. MOREOVER, MR. SANCHOTENA FAILED TO SEE THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST HERE AND AGAIN PLACED HIMSELF IN A COMPROMISING POSITION A SECOND TIME IN THE SAME DAY BY KILLING SHEEP WHILE HAVING A RESPONSIBILITY TO ATTEND TO CLIENTS. THIS RESPONSIBILITY PREVENTED HIM FROM PROPERLY CARING FOR GAME ANIMAL(S) KILLED BY HIM; 2) MR. SANCHOTENA WAS PERSONALLY AND SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS ACTIONS ON THIS DAY; 3) ANY RIGHTS OR PRIVILEGES ASSOCIATED WITH MR. SANCHOTENA'S 1990/91 GUIDE LICENSE ARE HEREBY REVOKED; AND 4) ANY APPLICATION FOR A 1991/92 GUIDE OR OUTFITTER LICENSE BY MR. SANCHOTENA IS HEREBY DENIED.

**Bob Rosso:** The Board reviewed the Elephant's Perch, Ketchum, Idaho, letter of March 14, 1991, wherein Bob Rosso submits a letter/resume offering his services to provide input to the Board's Technical Advisory Committee relative to mountaineering, rockclimbing, back country and cross country skiing, mountain rescue and safety procedures. Following review of this letter/resume and in consideration of Mr. Rosso's offer to become a member of the Board's technical advisory committee, MSC (Miller

--Baird) THAT THE BOARD ADDRESS A LETTER TO MR. ROSSO THANKING HIM FOR HIS INTEREST IN ASSISTING THE BOARD IN THIS MATTER AND ACCEPTING HIS OFFER TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE BOARD'S TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1205 hours and reconvened at 1315 hours with all Board members present, except Bill Meiners who arrived at 1500 hours. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Del Allmon/Ron Sherer:** Messrs Allmon and Sherer met with the Board regarding an ongoing dispute relative to their operating area for bear hunting. Following discussion and testimony regarding this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD WILL ALLOW THE TWO PARTIES INVOLVED UNTIL MAY 28, 1991, TO RESOLVE THEIR DIFFERENCES AND SUBMIT TO THE BOARD AN AGREEMENT THAT WILL 1) RESOLVE THE OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY DISPUTE, AND 2) DOES NOT OVERLAP. IF AT THAT TIME, AN AGREEMENT HAS NOT BEEN REACHED, THE BOARD WILL SET A HEARING FOR THE JUNE MEETING WITH BOTH MESSRS ALLMON AND SHERER IN ATTENDANCE ALONG WITH IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME PERSONNEL TO RESOLVE THIS DISPUTE.

**Garn Christensen, Mackay Bar Corporation:** Mr. Christensen met with the Board regarding the October, 1990, bighorn sheep incident with Michel S. Sanchotena and Heinz Sippel. Mr. Christensen explained Mackay Bar Corporation's actions regarding this incident. Following the interview before the Board, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT NO ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AGAINST MACKAY BAR CORPORATION, GARN CHRISTENSEN, DESIGNATED AGENT, AS REGARDS THIS INCIDENT.

**Robert R. Anderson, dba Anderson Outfitting:** The Board reviewed Mr. Anderson's outfitter license amendment request for the addition of float boating activity on SN1 and SN6 with incidental fishing. Following review of the file and in consideration of this request, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. ANDERSON'S AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF FLOAT BOATING ON SN1 AND SN6 WITH INCIDENTAL FISHING. (See Addendum #8).

**Darrell L. Weddle, dba Cee-Bar-Dee Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Weddle's outfitter amendment request wherein Darrell Weddle and his brother, Charles Weddle, propose to purchase the assets of Cee-Bar-Dee Outfitters, Inc., following which this outfitting business would be converted to a sole proprietorship to be known as Darrell L. Weddle, dba Cee Bar Dee Outfitters, for conduct of deer, elk, bear, cougar, predator, and forest grouse hunting, fly fishing, walk and wade fishing, incidental fishing, trailrides, and photography trips in Fish and Game Management Unit 10. Following review of the file and in consideration of this matter, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. WEDDLE'S AMENDMENT REQUEST AS ABOVE STATED. (See Addendum #9).

**Executive Session:** Baird moves that the Board go into Executive Session, pursuant to Idaho Code 67-2345, at 1555 hours. The Board came out of Executive Session at 1635 hours with no decisions made.

**Hells Canyon Adventures, Inc., Gary Armacost, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the matter of Mr. Armacost's utilization of his licensable activity on SN6 to find that such activity has been confined to that area now occupied by Hells Canyon Reservoir. Following a review and in consideration of this matter and his apparent non-use of SN6 above Hells Canyon Reservoir, MSC (Miller-Epley) THAT MR. ARMACOST'S LICENSE BE AMENDED TO 1) REDEFINE HIS USE ON SN6 AS BEING HELLS CANYON RESERVOIR; AND 2) TO REMOVE THE REMAINING PORTION OF SN6 FROM HIS LICENSE. (See Addendum #10).

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours and reconvened on Thursday, April 25, 1991, at 0815 hours with all Board members present. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Selway Lodge, Inc., Rick Hussey, Designated Agent:** The Board Executive Director Dean Sangrey, informed the Board that due to an administrative oversight when Patricia Millington was purchasing the outfitting business from Everett Peirce, predator and forest grouse hunting, as well as wagonrides and photography trip activities, were omitted from consideration at the time of this sale and transfer of business. Following review of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SELWAY LODGE, INC., RICK HUSSEY, DESIGNATED AGENT, AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADD PREDATOR AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING AS WELL AS WAGON RIDES AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS AS LICENSABLE ACTIVITIES UNDER THE SELWAY LODGE, INC. OUTFITTER LICENSE. FURTHER, THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST SHOULD BE DONE BY ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT WITH NO CHARGE TO SELWAY LODGE, INC., AS IT WAS AN OVERSIGHT IN THE BOARD'S PAST ACTION. (See Addendum #11).

**G & L York, Inc., Gladys York, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the G & L York, Inc. outfitter license matter finding that litigation has apparently run its course and, the Board can now make a determination under Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 28, to consider whether this operating area should again be relicensed. Following which, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) DECLARE THE OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO G & L YORK, INC. AS RELINQUISHED; 2) DECLARE THAT THE OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO G & L YORK, INC. BE DEEMED AVAILABLE FOR CONDUCT OF FUTURE OUTFITTING BUSINESS; 3) CONTACT THE USFS REGARDING THIS OPERATING AREA AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THEIR LETTER OF JANUARY 9, 1991, NOTIFY THE FOREST SERVICE THAT THE BOARD IS NOW IN A POSITION TO PROCEED UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE MOU AND RULE 28 FOR CONSIDERATION FOR LICENSING OF THIS AREA

IN AS TIMELY A MANNER AS POSSIBLE; AND 4) CONTACT THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME TO REQUEST THEIR INPUT/RECOMMENDATION REGARDING RELICENSING OF THIS OPERATING AREA.

**Richard Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch:** The Board reviewed the Grunch Bunch file noting that we have received input from the Forest Service regarding relicensing of this operating area under the purview of Rule 28c. Following a review of the Forest Service proposal, the Board directs that the Avery Ranger District be contacted to consider an alternate proposal of splitting the operating area boundary starting at Storm Mountain and proceeding west along the established trail on Storm Mountain and continuing westerly down Cedar Creek to the Slate Creek Road, thence southerly along Slate Creek Road to the trail leading to Mastodon Mountain, thereby tying Brian Butz's two operating areas together. The Board feels that this would create a more viable operating area in the portion identified as the Shefoot Area. If this adjustment in their proposal is acceptable to the Forest Service, the Board would then proceed with Rule 28 to advertise and select a successful applicant for the conduct of business in the two designated areas. And, if not, to please advise.

**Chuck Wells and Lew Munson, Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation:** Messrs Wells and Munson met with the Board regarding the matter of snowmobile registration funds and their inadequacy to provide necessary funds for proper grooming of trails used by licensed Idaho Outfitters and Guides. Messrs Wells and Munson were advised that the Board has no authority to be able to assist them in this matter but suggest that they contact the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association to seek industry input and support.

**John Valvo, dba Twin Peaks Outfitters:** Messrs John and Frank Valvo met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Ed Peterson's outfitting business for the conduct of elk, deer, goat, antelope, bear, cougar, predator, and forest grouse hunting, as well as fishing and trailride activities to John Valvo, dba Twin Peaks Outfitters. Following the interview before the Board concerning this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN ED PETERSON FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE AFOREMENTIONED ACTIVITIES TO JOHN VALVO, DBA TWIN PEAKS OUTFITTERS; 2) APPROVE JOHN VALVO, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) DIRECT LICENSE NOT BE ISSUED UNTIL SUCH TIME AS MR. VALVO HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED HIS OUTFITTER EXAMINATION AND HAS PROVIDED THE BOARD A SIGN-OFF SHEET FROM ED PETERSON RELEASING ANY FURTHER INTEREST IN THE BUSINESS AND PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #12).

**Salmon River Properties, Inc., dba Twin Peaks Ranch, Frank Valvo, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Valvo's outfitter amendment request for the addition of bighorn sheep and moose hunting as a licensable activity under his outfitter license. Following review of this matter, and finding there is a hunting season for both sheep and moose within the Fish and Game Units to which Salmon River Properties, Inc. is licensed, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SALMON RIVER PROPERTIES, INC., DBA TWIN PEAKS RANCH, FRANK VALVO, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF SHEEP AND MOOSE HUNTING AS REQUESTED. (See Addendum #13).

**Wayne F. Fairchild, dba Lewis and Clark Expeditions:** The Board reviewed Mr. Fairchild's outfitter license application to become licensed as an outfitter for conduct of backpacking, back country alpine skiing, cross country skiing, mountain bike touring, photography trips, and survival course training. However, during the course of the interview, Mr. Fairchild indicated his intent to drop his request for conduct of back country alpine skiing and cross country skiing since all he will be doing is providing an equipment rental service for customers to ski on their own and, further, he had no real interest in conduct of a survival course. Review of the file finds the Forest Service has signed off in approval of Mr. Fairchild for conduct of backpacking, mountain bike touring, and photography trips. However, affected outfitters did object to said approval but Forest Service comments have indicated they believe the area will accommodate three outfitters and they will monitor these activities to determine any impact, adverse or otherwise, on the resources involved. Following review of the file and in consideration of these matters, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE WAYNE F. FAIRCHILD, DBA LEWIS AND CLARK EXPEDITIONS, FOR CONDUCT OF BACKPACKING, MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING, AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS; 2) APPROVE MR. FAIRCHILD AS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; 3) DEFINE THE OPERATING AREA BE ASSIGNED AS THAT WHICH HAS BEEN OUTLINED IN MR. FAIRCHILD'S OPERATING PLAN; AND 4) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES AND COMPLETION OF OTHER NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY BOND, AND LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE. (See Addendum #14). Administrative Note: A flag should be raised relative to any further licensing of mountain bike activities on the Lolo Trail pending outcome of Forest Service evaluation of current use and objections by currently licensed outfitters. And, if it becomes necessary to place limits, that appropriate rules making procedure be utilized to put such limits in place.

**Indian Meadows Outpost and Pack Station, Inc., Robert L. McFadden, and Ronald K. Vaughn, Designated Agents:** The Board reviewed the Indian Meadows Outpost and Pack Station, Inc. file noting that this involves the proposed sale and transfer of Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch outfitting business for conduct of deer, elk, goat,

moose, sheep, bear, cougar, and predator hunting, as well as fishing, trailrides, and backpacking activities to Indian Meadows Outpost and Pack Station, Inc., Robert McFadden and Ron Vaughn, Designated Agents. The Board further notes that at the time this matter came before the Board at its last meeting in February, that the parties involved were instructed that the Board would take no further action on this application until such time as resolution of the overlap for bear and cougar hunting with Zeke West and Mackay Bar was resolved. Since that time, resolution of this overlap situation appears to have been reached and recorded with the Board by letters dated April 9, 1991, from Harold E. Thomas, dba Triple T Ranch, and April 23, 1991, from Mackay Bar Corporation, Garn Christensen, Designated Agent. Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF HAROLD E. THOMAS, DBA TRIPLE T RANCH, OUTFITTING BUSINESS FOR CONDUCT OF THE AFOREMENTIONED ACTIVITIES TO INDIAN MEADOW OUTPOST AND PACK STATION, INC., ROBERT L. MCFADDEN AND RONALD K. VAUGHN, DESIGNATED AGENTS, PENDING RECEIPT OF CONFIRMATION FROM THE FOREST SERVICE AND ZEKE WEST THAT THE PROPOSED RESOLUTION OF THE OVERLAP SITUATION IS INDEED ACCEPTABLE TO THEM; 2) APPROVE MESSRS MCFADDEN AND VAUGHN, DESIGNATED AGENTS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) UPON CONCURRENCE BY THE FOREST SERVICE AND ZEKE WEST, ASSIGN THE OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED AS MODIFIED BY AGREEMENT TO UNSTACK OVERLAP AREA. (See Addendum #15).

The Board recessed for lunch and 1200 hours and reconvened at 1300 hours.

**Richard E. Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch/Richard W. English:** The Board reviewed Richard E. Grunch and Richard W. English's files finding that they have relinquished their outfitter license for the conduct of outfitting business in the State of Idaho. Following consideration of this matter, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) DETERMINE SAID OPERATING AREA, NOTED AS AREA 1, THAT WAS FORMERLY ASSIGNED TO RICHARD E. GRUNCH, DBA THE GRUNCH BUNCH, LYING NORTH OF THE BOUNDARY/BONNER COUNTY LINE AND THAT PORTION OF THE RICHARD W. ENGLISH FORMER OPERATING AREA LYING NORTH OF THE BOUNDARY/BONNER COUNTY LINE (BOTH OF WHICH FALL WITHIN THE CURRENTLY LICENSED OPERATING AREA LICENSED TO STAN W. SWEET) BE DEEMED UNAVAILABLE FOR RELICENSING UNDER RULE 28, PROCEDURES AND, INSTEAD BE INCLUDED WITHIN THE STAN SWEET OPERATING AREA UNDER THE PURVIEW OF RULE 24, THEREBY ELIMINATING THE OVERLAP THAT PREVIOUSLY EXISTED; 2) DEEM THAT PORTION OF THE RICHARD E. GRUNCH, DBA THE GRUNCH BUNCH, OPERATING AREA 1 AS WELL AS THAT PORTION OF THE RICHARD W. ENGLISH OPERATING AREA LYING SOUTH OF THE SAME COUNTY LINE AS WELL AS THAT OPERATING AREA FORMERLY LICENSED TO T. KAISER LYING SOUTH OF THE BONNER COUNTY LINE AS AVAILABLE FOR CONSIDERATION TO BE RELICENSED AS AN OUTFITTING BUSINESS UNDER PURVIEW OF RULE 28; 3) CONTACT THE FOREST SERVICE AS WELL AS THE

DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RELATIVE TO THEIR INPUT AND RECOMMENDATION REGARDING THE RELICENSING OF THIS AREA FOR CONDUCT OF AN OUTFITTING BUSINESS; AND 4) ACKNOWLEDGE STAN SWEETS OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST WHEREIN HE REQUESTS BOARD CONSIDERATION TO BE LICENSED TO THIS AREA PENDING COMPLETION OF RULE 28C PROCEDURES AND THAT HE BE SO ADVISED OF THE BOARD'S DECISION IN THIS MATTER AND FURTHER ADVISED THAT HIS NAME WILL BE PLACED ON THE WAITING LIST FOR CONSIDERATION AT SUCH TIME AS THIS AREA BECOMES AVAILABLE.

**Stan Sweet, dba Sweet's Guide Service:** The Board reviewed Mr. Sweet's outfitter amendment request wherein he requests consideration to enlarge his operating area boundaries. See prior motion, Item #4.

**Nichols Expeditions, Inc., Chuck Nichols, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Nichols outfitter license amendment request to add mountain bike touring as a licensable activity under their outfitter license to be conducted in the McCall Ranger District from McCall via the Warren Wagon Road corridor down the French Creek Grade to the Salmon River. Review of the file also finds that the Forest Service concurs in this activity. Following which, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE NICHOLS EXPEDITIONS, INC., CHUCK NICHOLS, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADD MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING TO HIS LICENSABLE ACTIVITY AS OUTLINED IN THE OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST. (See Addendum #16).

**Canyon Outfitters, Inc. #2, George Hauptman, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Scott Fasken, dba Idaho Afloat #2, to Canyon Outfitters, Inc. #2, George Hauptman, Designated Agent, for conduct of float boating, chukar hunting, and fishing activities on SN7 and SN8. Review of the file finds all paperwork complete. Following which, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN SCOTT FASKEN, DBA IDAHO AFLOAT #2, TO CANYON OUTFITTERS, INC. #2, GEORGE HAUPTMAN, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR CONDUCT OF FLOAT BOATING, FISHING, AND CHUKAR HUNTING ON SN7 AND SN8. (See Addendum #17).

**Break Away Tours, Inc., Charlie Thompson, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed Mr. Thompson's outfitter license amendment request to: 1) notify the Board that Amy Hoover is no longer involved in said corporation and therefore her name should be eliminated from all paperwork associated with the corporation; and 2) the addition of mountain bike touring routes within the Stanley Basin area. The Board notes that the additional bike routes have been approved by the SNRA. Following which, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) ACKNOWLEDGE MR. THOMPSON'S REQUEST TO REMOVE AMY HOOVER'S NAME FROM

CORPORATE PAPERS ON FILE WITH THE BOARD; AND 2) APPROVE MR. THOMPSON'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADD ADDITIONAL MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING ROUTES TO HIS OPERATING AREA DESCRIPTION. (See Addendum #18).

**Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips:** The Board reviewed Mr. Bernt's file to note the ongoing discussion relative to the issuance of a viable float boat special use permit by the Forest Service on SA5. Following discussion of this matter, it appears further discussion needs to be held with the Forest Service, therefore, the Board directs Mr. Bernt be advised that this will be again considered by the Board at its June meeting at which time, hopefully, a decision can be made.

**Charles Loeschen, dba Action Hunts:** The Board reviewed Mr. Loeschen's outfitter license application for conduct of deer, elk, goat, moose, bear, cougar, predator, and forest grouse hunting, as well as walk and wade fishing, incidental fishing, backpacking, and photography trips in Fish and Game Management Unit 1. Review of the file finds that by recommendation of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game in letter dated April 16, 1991, they recommend denial of this application due to the extensive road access and the current heavy use by the general hunting and fishing public. Following which, MSC (Meiners--Baird) THAT THE BOARD DENY MR. LOESCHEN'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF REQUESTED ACTIVITIES. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(B)(4 & 5), AND IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 19(F & G), AND THE APRIL 16, 1991, LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION FROM IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME.

**Douglas T. Colwell, dba Divertirse:** Mr. Colwell met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application for conduct of technical mountaineering/rock climbing in and near the vicinity of Boise, Idaho, and the "Slick Rock" area near McCall, Idaho. Following the review of his file and interview before the Board, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. COLWELL'S OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CONDUCT OF TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING/ROCK CLIMBING AS REQUESTED; 2) APPROVE MR. COLWELL AS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 3) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY SUBMISSION OF INSURANCE COVERAGE, BOND, AND PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. Administrative Note: License is to be held until Mr. Colwell is ready to proceed. He will notify us. (See Addendum #19)

**Elmer Joe Stuemke, dba Diamond J Outfitters:** Mr. Stuemke and Tony Diebold, Designated Agent for Stimmel and Diebold, met with the Board relative to the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Diebold's outfitting business, dba Four of July Creek Outfitters, for conduct of deer, elk, goat, moose, sheep, bear, cougar, predator, and

forest grouse hunting, as well as fishing, trailrides, and backpacking activities in Fish and Game Management Unit 10 to Elmer Joe Stuemke, dba Diamond J Outfitters. Following the interview before the Board regarding this proposed sale and transfer of business, and finding there is no bighorn sheep hunt season authorized by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game in Fish and Game Management Unit 10, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BY AND BETWEEN STIMMEL AND DIEBOLD, DBA FOURTH OF JULY CREEK OUTFITTERS, TONY DIEBOLD, DESIGNATED AGENT, FOR CONDUCT OF DEER, ELK, GOAT, MOOSE, BEAR, COUGAR, PREDATOR, AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING AND FISHING, TRAILRIDES, AND BACKPACKING ACTIVITIES TO ELMER JOE STUEMKE, DBA DIAMOND J OUTFITTERS; 2) APPROVE MR. STUEMKE QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR ALL ACTIVITIES MENTIONED ABOVE; 3) DIRECT LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. (See Addendum #20). Administrative Note: Please note deletion of "sheep" as a licensed activity for Mr. Stuemke's outfitter license.

**Mackay Bar Corporation, Garn Christensen, Designated Agent:** Mr. Christensen met with the Board relative to Mackay Bar selling its jet back business to E & Z Corporation, Zeke West, Designated Agent. This involves the transfer of a permit from the Forest Service from Mackay Bar to E & Z Corporation for jet back purposes only. In further explanation of this action: Mackay Bar owns and operates a commercial jet back business which is also authorized for contracting activities, lodge owners access, sight seeing, and fishing on the Main Salmon River between Spring Bar and Corn Creek (SA6); seller desires to sell such business as an ongoing concern and the property and assets of such business upon the terms and conditions that have been agreed between Mackay Bar Corporation and E & Z, Inc. With the foregoing in mind, the Board concurs in said sale and transfer of boating activity. However, said sale and transfer does not require any license procedural change as both parties are currently licensed power boat outfitters; it does reflect a change in Forest Service Special Use Permit assignment with no change in total Special Use Permit allocation.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours and reconvened on Friday, April 26, 1991, at 0815 hours with all Board members present. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Shannon Lindsey, River Mountain Wildlife Experiences:** The Board received a report that Mr. Lindsey has allegedly conducted an illegal turkey hunt for which he is not licensed. Following consideration of this alleged violation of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, and upon recommendation made by staff, MSC (Crane--Baird)(Miller, abstains) THAT MR. LINDSEY BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR ALLEGED VIOLATION OF 36-2113(A)(5) & (8)(ii).

**Paul Moroz, US Forest Service, Emmett Ranger District:** Mr. Paul Moroz, Charlie Swearingen, and Joanne Halbasch, from the Forest Service, Emmett and Idaho City Ranger Districts, as well as Don Wright and Brent Hyde from Idaho Department of Fish and Game met with the Board regarding the relicensing of Philip (Bub) Smith for cougar hunting activities in Fish and Game Management Units 32, 32A, 33, and 39. The primary concern was the lack of a current special use permit issued by the Forest Service for Mr. Smith to conduct his activities in the aforementioned Fish and Game Management Units. From the time Mr. Smith was first licensed in 1975 until 1982, Board records indicate that he had obtained a sign-off from the Forest Service each year. The Emmett and Idaho City Ranger Districts are now concerned with Mr. Smith's operation due the lack of a Special Use Permit since 1982. In addition, the Idaho Department of Fish and Game has indicated a concern the impacts that such use might have on the wildlife resource. Following a discussion of these matters, it was the Board's position, and consensus of the group, that the Forest Service and Department of Fish & Game would re-evaluate their concerns under purview of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 24, in consideration of Mr. Smith's operation. At the conclusion of their reviews, possible future action will be considered, in cooperation with the Board, to resolve this matter.

**Phillip (Bub) Smith:** The Board reviewed Mr. Smith's file and outfitter license renewal application for the conduct of cougar hunting in Fish and Game Management Units 32, 32A, 33, & 39, noting that he lacks current land manager approval for conduct of said activities on Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, or private lands. Further, that he did not submit an appropriate certificate of insurance. Following a discussion of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to Mr. Smith in which he be advised that his renewal application is incomplete, namely that it lacks appropriate certificate of insurance and land manager's sign off and before Board's taking further action on his renewal application he will need to submit said certificate of insurance and land manager's sign-off inclusive of Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, and private land holdings upon which he intends to operate.

**Michael J. Stockton, dba B - Bar - B Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Stockton's request to change the structure of his currently licensed outfitting business from a corporate structure to a sole proprietor namely from B-Bar-C Outfitters, Inc., Michael J. Stockton, Designated Agent, to become known as Michael J. Stockton, dba B-Bar-C Outfitters, with no change in licensed activities or operating area boundaries. Following which, MSC (Baird--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. STOCKTON'S REQUEST TO CHANGE HIS BUSINESS ENTITY FROM A CORPORATE STRUCTURE TO A SOLE PROPRIETOR AS INDICATED. (See Addendum #21).

**Stockton and Podsaid (Partnership), dba Wilderness Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Stockton's file noting that he requested Board approval of a proposed change in his business structure from a sole proprietor known as Michael J. Stockton, dba Michael J. Stockton Outfitting, to a partnership structure to become known as Stockton and Podsaid (Partnership), dba Wilderness Outfitters. Appropriate paperwork has been completed showing the officers of said partnership, however, these papers do not provide a dissolution clause as to who will be the party in interest upon dissolution of the partnership. Following which, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. STOCKTON'S PROPOSED RESTRUCTURING OF HIS OUTFITTING BUSINESS FROM A SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP, KNOWN AS MICHAEL J. STOCKTON, DBA MICHAEL STOCKTON OUTFITTING TO BECOME KNOWN AS STOCKTON AND PODSAID (PARTNERSHIP), DBA WILDERNESS OUTFITTERS. HOWEVER, LICENSE WILL NOT BE ISSUED UNTIL SUCH TIME AS A PROPERLY EXECUTED DISSOLUTION AGREEMENT HAS BEEN SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD FOR OUR RECORDS, SHOWING WHO WILL BE SUCCESSOR IN INTEREST SHOULD THE PARTNERSHIP BE DISSOLVED. (See Addendum #22).

**Alexander (Sandy) Thomas Podsaid, Jr.:** The Board reviewed Mr. Podsaid's designated agent license application to become designated agent for Stockton and Podsaid (Partnership), dba Wilderness Outfitters, as well as being authorized to guide for Michael J. Stockton, dba B-Bar-C Outfitters, Inc. Following consideration of this application, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT MR. PODSAID BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR STOCKTON AND PODSAID (PARTNERSHIP), DBA WILDERNESS OUTFITTERS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT HE BE AUTHORIZED TO GUIDE FOR MICHAEL J. STOCKTON, DBA B-BAR-C OUTFITTERS.

**Ellen Shaw, dba South Fork Adventures:** The Board reviewed Ms. Shaw's file noting that she had made application to become licensed for conduct of deer, elk, bear, and cougar hunting in the corridor along the south side of the South Fork Payette River lying in Fish and Game Management Units 33, and 35. The proposed operating area has been addressed under the purview of the MOU with the Forest Service relative to licensing an outfitting business in the area in question. The Forest Service has conducted appropriate environmental assessment of this area with a decision that they would concur together with the Department of Fish and Game with the licensing of a limited outfitting business along the corridor in question, namely the establishment of two camps, two clients per camp for the elk and deer seasons. With the foregoing in mind, and two applicants having made application for consideration to be licensed to the area, the Board selected Ellen Shaw, dba South Fork Adventures, as the successful applicant. In consideration of this action, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT THE BOARD NOTIFY THE FOREST SERVICE THAT THEY HAVE EVALUATED THE APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED FOR

CONSIDERATION TO BE LICENSED TO THIS AREA AND HAVE SELECTED ELLEN SHAW, DBA SOUTH FORK ADVENTURES, AS THE SUCCESSFUL APPLICANT AND WOULD ASK THEIR REVIEW AND CONCURRENCE IN THIS SELECTION SO THAT LICENSE AND PERMIT MAY BE ISSUED. UPON CONCURRENCE BY THE FOREST SERVICE OF THIS SELECTION, ELLEN SHAW'S CURRENT OUTFITTER LICENSE SHOULD BE AMENDED TO AUTHORIZE THE CONDUCT OF DEER AND ELK HUNTING IN THE OPERATING AREA LOCATED ALONG THE DRAINAGE INTO THE SOUTH FORK PAYETTE RIVER IN FISH AND GAME MANAGEMENT UNITS 33 & 35 AND DEFINED IN THE FOREST SERVICE SCOPING DOCUMENT WITH RESTRICTIONS OF TWO CAMPS, TWO HUNTERS PER CAMP FOR THE ELK AND DEER SEASONS. FURTHER, THAT MS. SHAW'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST WHEREIN SHE ASKS FOR AUTHORITY FOR BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2109(B)(5), AND THE FURTHER FACT THAT THE AREA IS CURRENTLY LICENSED TO ANOTHER OUTFITTER FOR THESE ACTIVITIES. IN REGARDS TO HER REQUEST FOR FLOAT BOATING ON PS2, THE BOARD DIRECTS THAT MS. SHAW BE ADVISED THAT THERE IS NO SPACE AVAILABLE ON PS2 AND THAT HER NAME WILL BE PLACED ON THE WAITING LIST FOR FUTURE CONSIDERATION SHOULD A SLOT BECOME AVAILABLE. (See Addendum #23). Administrative Note: The other applicant, Dusty Youren, should be notified of the Board's action following Forest Service review/comments.

**Gary Sylte, dba Coeur d'Alene River Big Game Outfitters:** The Board again reviewed Mr. Sylte's outfitter amendment request for the addition of trailrides wherein it was found that they had previously approved a portion of this request but had not received concurrence from the Forest Service relative to the Independence Creek trail. This approval has now been received to enable further Board action. The Board also notes Mr. Sylte's request for incidental bear hunting; following consideration of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. SYLTE'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADD TRAILRIDES AS APPLICABLE TO THE INDEPENDENCE CREEK TRAIL; AND 2) APPROVE INCIDENTAL BEAR HUNTING WITH THE DESCRIPTION PLACED ON THE OPERATING AREA AS TO WHAT IS MEANT BY INCIDENTAL BEAR HUNTING. NAMELY, THAT SUCH HUNTING SHALL BE CONDUCTED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE BIG GAME SEASON FOR DEER, AND ELK WITH NO SPRING BEAR HUNTING, OR DELIBERATE ATTEMPT TO HUNT BEAR DURING THE FALL. (See Addendum #24).

The Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours and reconvened at 1300 hours.

**Forest Service/National Environmental Policy Act:**As applicable to renewal of Forest Service special use permit authorizations and grazing permits. The Board reviewed the response letter of February 28, 1991, from the Krassel Ranger District to Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, regarding the Board's inquiry as to the background leading to the Forest Service position in this matter. Following a discussion and consideration of the letter of February

28, 1991, and the attached letter of August 25, 1989, from the Deputy Assistant General Council to James C. Overbee and Jeff M. Sermon regarding this matter, the Board authorized Hank Miller, Vice Chairman, to draft a letter to the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association drawing their attention to the Board's concern regarding the potential impact that this may have upon processing of license renewals.

**Sun Valley Trekking Company, Robert F. Jonas, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the February 12, 1991, letter and material received from Mr. Jonas regarding proposed modification of current Board rules regarding ski guides. Following the review of this material, the Board directs a letter be addressed to Mr. Jonas thanking him for his input and advising him that the Board will consider his proposal/suggestions during the next rules making procedure - probably late summer or fall.

**Raymond A. Baier:** The Board reviewed the petition dated March 28, 1991, from Mr. Baier in which he has petitioned the Board to go to rules making for the purpose of authorizing commercial use of the Spokane River for float boating and fishing, from Lake Coeur d'Alene - downstream to the Washington stateline. Following a review of this petition and input from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and in consideration of the heavy public use being made of this river in its proximity to high density population centers in Eastern Washington and the Coeur d'Alene area, MSC (Meiners--Baird) THAT THE PETITION FROM MR. BAIER BE DENIED.

**Richard Escott, dba Western Charters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Escott's outfitter amendment request to add other waters upon which to conduct fishing activities and his further request to add forest grouse, and chukar hunting, and photography trips as licensed activities under his outfitter license. Following review of this amendment request, input from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, and discussion of the lack of background knowledge of just exactly what Mr. Escott has in mind in conduct of requested activities, MSC (Baird--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE RENEWAL OF MR. ESCOTT'S 1991-92 OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR CONDUCT OF FISHING ON PAYETTE LAKE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STIPULATIONS SET FORTH BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME BY LETTER DATED APRIL 9, 1991; AND 2) POSTPONE TAKING ACTION ON OTHER REQUESTED ACTIVITIES AND INVITE MR. ESCOTT TO MEET WITH THE BOARD AT ITS JUNE MEETING TO OUTLINE/EXPLAIN HIS PROPOSAL IN CONDUCT OF REQUESTED ACTIVITIES TO ENABLE FURTHER BOARD CONSIDERATION/REVIEW. Administrative Note: The Board requests Executive Director to consult with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game concerning their recommendations for Cascade Reservoir as it appears this is a contradiction of the prior recommendation.

**Hells Canyon - Day Use Float Boat Trips:** The Board reviewed the file and impasse regarding the issuance of a licence for conduct of day use float trips below Hells Canyon. Following discussion of this matter, the Board directs the Executive Director address a letter (for the Chairman's signature) to the Regional Forester, USFS, Region 4, requesting his review and decision regarding this impasse to enable appropriate Board action at its June meeting in accommodation of the licensed outfitter to be able to conduct business for the upcoming season.

**Kenneth Elwood Masoner, dba Whitewater Adventures:** The Board reviewed the letter received April 26, 1991, from Kenneth Elwood Masoner, dba Whitewater Adventures, in which he requests a private trip on SE1, June 21, 1991, from Paradise be authorized as a training trip in conjunction with the launching assigned to Curtis Stanley of Boise, ID. 

SPECIAL BOARD MEETINGS - TELEPHONE CONFERENCES

The following issues were reviewed and discussed between Chairman Dale Baird and various Board members on the dates specified:

5-13-91 - Chairman Baird was contacted by Dave Mills, Rocky Mountain River Tours, regarding a guide license for Michael Rock. Mr. Rock's guide application was denied by the Board in April because of a falsified first aid card. Mills explained that he needed Rock licensed for an upcoming trip which had been booked for some time. Chairman Baird contacted Leo Crane and Ted Epley and they agreed that if a stipulated settlement could be reached calling for payment of a \$300.00 fine and issuing the 1991-92 guide license probationary, they would accept that compromise. Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter prepared stipulation and Mr. Rock signed same on 5-17-91. Payment of \$300.00 fine was received on 5-16-91. License was issued and mailed to RMRT on 5-20-91.

5-16-91 - Gary Armacost, Hells Canyon Adventures, phoned inquiring about the status of a guide license application for Brian Lindsay. He was advised that the application had been delayed because of a Fish & Game violation, a training card for SN7 was incomplete when submitted, that we received the completed training card on 5-13-91, and the file would require additional review by the Board because of the violation. Mr. Lindsay called the office on 5-20-91, asking for special consideration if possible, because HCA needs his services for a trip scheduled on 5-22-91. Lindsay explained that he caught a 12" Dolly Varden during a steelhead only season, and the trout was hurt too bad to release. F&G cited him for illegal possession and he paid an \$18.00 fine. Chairman Baird contacted Leo Crane and Ted Epley and it was agreed to approve issuance of license, without restriction, as soon as possible. License issued 5-20-91.

5-20-91 - Don Wilson, Coolwater Ranch Outfitters, called stating that he needs to have Joseph Peterson licensed as his designated agent prior to 6-10-91, if possible. Wilson is leaving for Alaska for three months and wants Peterson to be able to act on his behalf for Coolwater Ranch during this time. Chairman Baird contacted Board members Epley and Crane by telephone and it was agreed that license should be issued as soon as possible, following completion of proper bonding, and payment of fees.

5-22-91 - Jim Spickelmire submitted DA license application on 4-26-91 for Hells Canyon Fishing Charters. Richard Cook is already licensed as DA for HCFC. Spickelmire explained that he would like to be licensed as a designated agent as soon as possible. Application and files were reviewed by Chairman Baird on 5-22-91. Telephone conference with Board members Crane and Epley confirmed that they recommend approval and issuance of license following completion of proper bonding.
