APPROVED MINUTES  
Board Meeting - June 24 - 28, 1991  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, June 24, 1991, at 0825 hours with all Board members present. Tom Kovalicky was welcomed as the newest Board member. Also present were the Executive Director, the Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Executive Director's Report:** The Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, updated the Board relative to activities occurring since the last Board meeting. Included in this report were the following matters:

- 1) The financial reports and statements for the months of April and May, 1991 were presented to the Board for their review.
- 2) The Board reviewed the information regarding the possible purchase of a fax machine for the office. The Executive Director was instructed to investigate the costs for purchase and operation of a fax machine and to present that information to the Board at its August meeting with the intent of including this purchase in the upcoming budget.
- 3) The special telephone conference Board meeting draft minutes were reviewed with the Board upon recommendation of Chairman Baird, it was agreed that this type of record would be maintained for actions taken by the Board during periods of time between Board meetings and that they will be incorporated as an addendum to the regular minutes and mailed appropriately.
- 4) The Board reviewed the proposed list of areas for delegation of authority to the Executive Director. The Executive Director presented a list of ten items for consideration. The Board approved the acceptance of items #1-5, did not approve item #6, and additionally approved items #7-10 with some minor changes. Those will be incorporated into a final draft and published as part of the minutes of this Board Meeting.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1140 hours and reconvened at 1310 hours.

**Enforcement Coordinator Report:** Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis brought the Board up-to-date on all current investigative and enforcement activities. He suggested that the Board consider providing handgun weapons to all Board enforcement agents. All POST certified Board agents are required to qualify with firearms annually. Arlo Larsen, Licensing Board Firearms Instructor, will conduct qualification training in Boise on July 15, and in Orofino on July 17. Lewis also requested that the Board consider purchasing mini-cassette recorders for each of our agents. Only a couple of them have this equipment available at the present time.

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**Dan Wyckoff, Washington Department of Wildlife:** The Board met with Dan Wyckoff, Assistant Director in charge of enforcement for Washington Department of Wildlife, and Frank Nesmith, Chief Enforcement Bureau, Idaho Fish and Game Department, regarding the matter of a reciprocal agreement for outfitting and guiding activities on the Snake River where it forms the border between Idaho and Washington in the Lewiston area. Pursuant to this discussion, the Board directed that the Board's Executive Director prepare a list of alternatives in consultation with Board member Tom Kovalicky. A meeting was scheduled for August 12, 1991, at Lewiston to reach a finalized agreement on what direction the Board should take. Senator Ron Beitelspacher, House Speaker Tom Boyd, and the chairs of both the Senate Resources and Environment Committee and the House Resources and Conservation Committee, and the Governors office should be notified of our actions in this regard. Also, the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association should be kept abreast of actions in this matter.

**Howard Spaletta:** The Board reviewed the letter from Howard Spaletta addressed to Tom Kovalicky regarding the proposed pack bridge on the Main Salmon River below Horse Creek. After review of the file and discussion of the matter, the Board directed that the Chairman respond to Mr. Spaletta advising him that the Board was in error in commenting on this project originally, that the action taken on December 10, 1987, is rescinded and the US Forest Service will be so notified.

The Board recessed for the day at 1700 hours and reconvened on Tuesday, June 25, 1991, at 0822 hours with all Board members present. Also present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Charlie Loeschen, dba Action Hunts:** Mr. Loeschen met with the Board in a denial hearing regarding the denial of his outfitter license application. Following review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS PREVIOUS DENIAL OF THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FOR CHARLIE LOESCHEN, DBA ACTION HUNTS, AND ISSUE A 1991-92 OUTFITTER LICENSE TO INCLUDE LIMITED DEER HUNTING WITH A MAXIMUM OF 12 HUNTERS PER YEAR AND BEAR HUNTING WITH A MAXIMUM OF 8 TOTAL BEAR HUNTERS PER YEAR. (See Addendum #1).

The Board recessed for lunch at 1138 hours and reconvened at 1310 hours.

**Board Attorney Report:** The Board's Attorney, Dallas Burkhalter reported on the active cases and also reviewed with the Board a memorandum on ex parte contacts. As a result of his discussion, MSC (Crane--Miller) ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTION WAS GIVEN TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO INCLUDE THE EX PARTE STATEMENT AS ATTACHED

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TO MR. BURKHALTER'S MEMORANDUM IN ALL SHOW CAUSE NOTICES. ADDITIONALLY, THIS STATEMENT SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN ALL RENEWAL MAILING PACKAGES TO OUTFITTERS.

**Bruce Butler, dba Smoky Mountain Outfitters:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Mr. Butler for the addition of photography trips as a licensed activity on his outfitter license. Following review of this amendment request, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE AMENDMENT REQUEST SUBMITTED BY BRUCE BUTLER, DBA SMOKY MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, TO ADD PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS TO HIS CURRENT OUTFITTER LICENSE.

**Robert Quinn/Heise Hot Springs, Inc.:** The Board reviewed the outfitter amendment request of Heise Hot Springs, Inc., wherein they request that their designated agent be changed to Robert Quinn. Additionally, the Board reviewed the designated agent license application submitted by Mr. Quinn. Following review of the files and discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST OF HEISE HOT SPRINGS, INC., FOR A CHANGE OF D.A., AND APPROVE THE DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION OF ROBERT QUINN.

**Randy Hess:** Mr. Hess has submitted a Rule 53(b) waiver request form to operate on SA1 with a ratio of 1:6 guide to clients for inflatable kayaks and a 1:4 ratio for hardshell kayaks. Following review of this request, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID RULE 53(B) WAIVER REQUEST.

**Richard Escott, dba Western Charters:** Mr. Escott met with the Board relative to his amendment request to add fishing activities on Cascade Reservoir and Little Payette Lake. Following a discussion with Mr. Escott and in consideration of the testimony given, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT MR. ESCOTT'S OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE CONDUCT OF FISHING ACTIVITIES ON THE LITTLE PAYETTE LAKE BE APPROVED LIMITED TO CATCH AND RELEASE ONLY, AND A MAXIMUM OF 20 DAYS ANNUAL USE AS RECOMMENDED BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME. ADDITIONALLY, THAT HIS REQUEST FOR FISHING ON CASCADE RESERVOIR BE HELD FOR FURTHER RESEARCH TO DETERMINE IF PRIOR APPLICANTS FOR THE RESERVOIR ARE STILL INTERESTED IN AS MUCH AS FISH AND GAME HAS CHANGED THEIR POSITION ON AN ADDITIONAL LICENSE THERE. Administrative Note: The Executive Director is directed to advertise the availability of the open slot on Cascade Reservoir.

**Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc., Terry Ring, Designated Agent:** Terry Ring met with the Board regarding the amendment request submitted by Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc. for additional fishing activities on Stocker Creek, Loving Creek, Grove Creek, Sullivan Lake, Lake Creek Lake, and various drainages in the upper South Fork area. Following the discussion with Mr. Ring and in consideration of the

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testimony given, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT SILVER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC., TERRY RING, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED WITH REGARDS TO GROVE CREEK, STOCKER CREEK AND LOVING CREEK TRIBUTARIES TO SILVER CREEK AND SULLIVAN LAKE LIMITED TO THOSE AREAS FOR WHICH HE HAS ON FILE WITH THE BOARD LAND OWNERS SIGN OFF AND APPROVAL. ADDITIONALLY THAT SILVER CREEK OUTFITTERS, INC., OUTFITTER AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR FISHING ACTIVITIES ON LAKE CREEK BE APPROVED WITH THE LIMIT AS RECOMMENDED BY THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OF 25 FISHING USER DAYS. Administrative Note: Additionally, the Board reviewed comments that had been provided by State Representative Clint Stennett regarding commercial outfitted activities in the Wood River Valley/Silver Creek area. Rep. Stennett suggested that the Board may want to consider placing a moratorium on further licensing of fishing outfitters in the area because of public concerns about overcrowding, etc. (See Addendum #2).

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, June 26, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Likewise present are the Executive Director, Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Grant Simonds, Executive Director, Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association:** Mr. Simonds met with the Board to discuss objectives of the Association.

**David Snider:** Mr. Snider and George Duncan met with the Board to discuss the 1991-92 guide license application submitted by Mr. Snider to guide for Mr. Duncan. Following the interview and consideration, MSC (Kovalicky--Miller)(Epley, aye, Kovalicky, aye - Miller, aye - Baird, aye - Epley, nay - Crane, abstains) THAT THE BOARD DENY THE 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION OF DAVID SNIDER UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HIS PROBATION WITH THE COUNTY HAS BEEN SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED AND FOR THE PERIOD OF TIME FOR WHICH HIS HUNTING LICENSE HAS BEEN REVOKED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO 36-2113 (a)(6).

**Carolyn Larson:** The Board reviewed the notification received from Carolyn Larson with regards to her application for outfitter license renewal. Following review of this information, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT CAROLYN LARSON'S NOTIFICATION THAT SHE NO LONGER INTENDS TO PURSUE THIS ACTIVITY AND THEREFORE DECLARES THIS LICENSE RELINQUISHED. Administrative Note: The Board's decision is not to pursue relicensing of this activity.

**Board Minutes - April Meeting:** The Board reviewed the April 22 - 26, 1991, Board meeting minutes, following which, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1215 and reconvened at 1327 hours.

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**Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips:** After review of the files of the current outfitters holding licenses on the SA5 section of the Salmon River, MSC (Epley--Miller)(Crane, aye - Kovalicky, aye - Baird, aye - Epley, aye - Miller, abstains) THAT THE BOARD BRING BILL BERNT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR NON-USE OF THE SA5 SECTION OF THE SALMON RIVER. ADDITIONALLY, DIRECT THAT THE BOARD'S OFFICE SHOULD RESEARCH THE OTHER OUTFITTERS LICENSED ON SA5 CHECKING FOR SPECIAL USE PERMIT AND USE DATA FOR THE PRECEDING FIVE YEARS.

**Harvey Whitten/Billy Cox:** The Board reviewed the current overlap that exists in the operating area boundaries for Harvey Whitten and Billy Cox. Following review of the files, MSC (Kovalicky--Miller) THAT THE BOARD RESOLVE THE OVERLAP BY REMOVING THE OVERLAPPED AREA DESCRIPTION FROM WHITTEN'S LICENSE. (See Addendum #3).

**Harvey Whitten:** The Board reviewed the response from The Idaho Department of Fish and Game regarding the current deer hunting status in Units 14 & 18. Following this review, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT UPON RECEIPT OF PROPER PAPERWORK AND AMENDMENT REQUEST AND FEES FROM HARVEY WHITTEN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR IS AUTHORIZED TO ADD DEER HUNTING FOR A MAXIMUM OF 12 DEER HUNTERS IN UNIT 14 AND 12 DEER HUNTERS IN UNIT 18 TO HIS CURRENT OUTFITTER LICENSE. ADDITIONALLY, THAT THE BOARD APPROVE BEAR HUNTING TO TAKE PLACE IN UNIT 19A UPON CONCURRENCE FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME.

**Rich Cook, Cook's Idaho Outfitters:** Mr. Cook and Mr. Billy Cox met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of Mr. Cox's big game outfitting business to Mr. Cook. Following a review of the file, discussion of the proposal, and in consideration of the foregoing Board action to resolve the overlap problem between Mr. Cox and Mr. Whitten, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THIS PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK AND PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum #4 )

**Kirk Eimers, dba Gold Fork Touring:** Mr. Eimers met with the Board relative to his outfitter license application. Following the discussion before the Board and review of the file, MSC (Epley--Crane) 1) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION OF KIRK EIMERS, DBA GOLD FORK TOURING, FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ACTIVITIES AS SPECIFIED ON HIS LICENSE APPLICATION, EXCLUDING POWER BOAT ACTIVITIES; 2) THAT LICENSE TO BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY A MAP OF OPERATING AREA; AND 3) THAT MR. EIMERS BE LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, UPON RECEIPT OF HIS FIRST AID CERTIFICATION. Administrative Note: The requested power boating activities on the Payette Lake has been determined by the Board to be outside the purview of the Act. (See Addendum #5).

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**Mike Hammett:** The Board reviewed the designated agent license renewal application to become designated agent for Bighorn Outfitters, noting that he had answered yes to question #3 regarding being convicted for a Fish & Game violation. Following review of the file, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT 1) THE BOARD APPROVE MR. HAMMETT'S 1991-92 DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE QUALIFIED TO GUIDE; AND 2) THAT HIS 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW, NOR ANY AMENDMENT TO BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

**Jimmie Blair:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application of Jimmie Blair noting that he has indicated that he had a Fish & Game violation dating back to 1972. Following discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT MR. BLAIR'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED WITH NO RESTRICTIONS.

**R.C. Leonard:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application of Mr. Leonard noting that he failed to note a Fish & Game violation which occurred in October, 1980, for which he was cited for shooting at a pheasant from a public road. Following review of this file, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT MR. LEONARD'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS, WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS NOR THAT ANY AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992. Administrative Note: The Board directs that Executive Director strongly suggest that Mr. Leonard take another training trip before actively hauling paying passengers.

**Beau Wicklander:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application of Beau Wicklander for employment with Jim Steen, dba Steen's Wilderness Adventures. Mr. Wicklander answered no on his application as to whether he had had a Fish and Game violation or not. Search of the records indicated that he was cited by Fish and Game for fishing without a license in 1988. Following discussion of this matter, MSF (Miller--Baird) THAT MR. WICKLANDER'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO 36-2113(a)(1 & 6). MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. WICKLANDER'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

**Kenneth C. Masoner, dba Custom River Tours:** The Board reviewed its denial of a request from Mr. Masoner to have one of his guides credited for a training trip while accompanying a private party while floating the Selway River. Mr. Masoner's request was denied on May 24, 1991. Following discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) (Crane, aye - Miller, aye - Epley, aye - Baird, nay) THAT

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THE BOARD REVERSE ITS ORIGINAL DECISION ON THIS MATTER, AND ALLOW CREDIT FOR THIS TRAINING TRIP IF IT OCCURRED AS SCHEDULED.

**David L. Udy:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 designated agent license application submitted by Mr. Udy to be employed as a designated agent for Kenneth Wolfinbarger. During discussion of this matter, the Board notes that Mr. Udy has had two prior violations of Forest Service regulations, which he has indicated on his application. Pursuant to the discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. UDY'S 1991-92 DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE; 2) THAT MR. UDY BE QUALIFIED TO GUIDE AND THAT HIS 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992; AND 3) THAT LICENSES BE ISSUED PENDING HIS SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE OUTFITTER EXAMINATION.

**Paul S. Meholchick:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application of Paul S. Meholchick for employment with Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stanley P. Meholchick, Designated Agent. Following review of the application and noting that the applicant had been convicted of several Fish & Game violations and noting the disposition of five citations written in June, 1990, and subsequent payment of fines totaling \$300.00 plus costs, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT PAUL S. MEHOLCHICK'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(6).

**Bruce Britton:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application submitted by Bruce Britton for employment with Two-M River Outfitters, Inc. Following review of the application, and noting the he answered NO to all questions in section C and also noting that upon investigation it was found he had been convicted of two violations of Idaho Fish & Game Law, one in 1985 and one in 1986. Further, reviewing the letter of explanation from the applicant regarding the circumstances behind these two violations, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION OF BRUCE BRITTON BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(1 & 6).

**Joe McKinnon:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application of Joe McKinnon for employment with Silver Creek Outfitters, Inc. Mr. McKinnon acknowledged his conviction for a Fish & Game violation and provided a letter of explanation. Following review of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE FOR JOE MCKINNON BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW NOR ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

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**Charles A. Brizzee:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application of Charles A. Brizzee for employment with James Champion, dba J & J Outfitters. Mr. Brizzee answered yes to question #3 in Section C regarding his conviction for Fish and Game violations. Investigation of the records shows that Mr. Brizzee has two citations, one for chloroxing a pool with a fine of \$150.00, the other for prohibited use of a rifle in a muzzleloader hunt for antelope. Following review of the file and consideration of the information, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THE 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. AUTHORITY FOR THIS DENIAL IS PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE 36-2113(a)(6).

**Eric Knight:** The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application submitted by Eric Knight for employment with Ted Epley, dba Epley's Whitewater Adventures. Upon review of the application, it was noted that Mr. Knight answered yes to question #3 in Section C of his application regarding his conviction for Fish & Game violations. He states that when he was about 15 or 16 years old he was duck hunting in an area "that I didn't know was restricted, I was cited and paid the fine." Following review of the file, MSC (Miller--Crane)(Epley, abstains) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MR. KNIGHT'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR THAT ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1710 hours and reconvened on Thursday, June 27, 1991, at 0828 hours with all Board members present, except Tom Kovalicky. Also present are the Board Executive Director, Board's Attorney and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Bill Goosman:** Mr. Goosman presented the Board with a potential plan for adjusting and relicensing the Muleshoe area which is currently unlicensed with the thought in mind being that the Richard Norris area around the Moose Creek Ranger Station would be eliminated and Mr. Norris would move into the Muleshoe area. There is nothing concrete decided, the Board had no objections to Mr. Goosman going ahead with the preliminary planning on this with instructions to keep the Board advised.

**Black Bear Ranch, Inc., dba Great Northern Outfitters, Andy Gray, Designated Agent:** Mr. Gray met with the Board regarding the proposed sale of business between Black Bear Ranch, Inc., and Jack Simons. Following a discussion of the matter and review with Mr. Gray, Designated Agent for Black Bear Ranch, Inc., MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER TO BE EFFECTIVE UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. AT THAT TIME, MR. GRAY WILL BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #6).

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**Roger Brink:** Messrs Roger and Bruce Brink & Rick Boardman, Attorney for the Brink's, met before the Board to discuss Randy Brink, dba Brink's Payette River Company, and the status of that license in as much as Randy Brink has been incapacitated by an auto accident and his prognosis is not clear at this time. These gentlemen requested an extension of time to file an application to continue Payette River Company's outfitter license. Following discussion, the Board directs that a letter be directed to Roger Brink as conservator for Randy Brink, stating that the Board will waive non-use requirements because of Randy's current condition and that they will consider an application for renewal of this license providing that the proper sign-offs are obtained from land management agencies, namely the USFS. This application should be received in time for consideration at the August meeting. The concurrence of the Board was obtained without formal motion.

**Brian Butz:** Brian Butz met with the Board regarding the relicensing of the Richard Grunch, dba The Grunch Bunch, area. Following the review of the file and discussion with Mr. Butz, the Board directs that a letter be addressed to the Forest Service regarding their proposed division of this area indicating that the Board feels that a part-time outfitter is not a viable situation in this case, and that the Board would rather see the area remain intact to make it a situation that could be licensed under the terms of the MOU. It would be desirable if the Forest Service has good and valid reasons for their recommendations that they appear before the Board.

**Ron Millick:** Mr. Millick appeared before the Board in relationship to the request for outfitters license renewal for S-Bar-S Outfitters, and his application to become designated agent for that new corporation. After the interview and review of the file, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD: 1) APPROVE MR. MILLICK'S DESIGNATED AGENT APPLICATION; 2) APPROVE S-BAR-S OUTFITTERS, INC. LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION; AND 3) THAT MR. MILLICK BE DEEMED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. Administrative Note: This action also includes a business structure change from a partnership to a corporation. (See Addendum #7).

**Andre Molsee:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Andre Molsee wherein he requests the addition of moose hunting to his current license as an additional activity in his currently licensed operating area as situated on the Palouse Ranger District. He also asked for the addition of turkey and water fowl hunting. After discussion, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD 1) APPROVE MR. MOLSEE'S AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADD MOOSE TO HIS OUTFITTING LICENSE; AND 2) DENY MR. MOLSEE'S REQUEST TO ADD TURKEY AND WATER FOWL HUNTING TO HIS LICENSE AS PER RECOMMENDATION OF IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME.

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**Gary Lane, dba Wapiti River Guides:** A discussion was held regarding Mr. Lane's advertisement and brochure relating to primitive survival skills and nature lore instruction on his trips. It was the Board's feeling that these activities do not come under the purview of the act and therefore do not require special addition to his outfitters license nor would it require a special guide to conduct those activities. However, Mr. Lane should be advised that when these activities are conducted, the group needs to be accompanied by one of his regularly licensed guides. The Executive Director is instructed to advise Mr. Lane of this fact by letter.

**Michael Lee and Jodee Luther, dba Adventures Afloat, Jodee Luther, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the request from Scott Fasken and Michael & Jodee Luther, a partnership known as Adventures Afloat, to dissolve said partnership. The proposal then being to relicense the business as Michael Lee Luther, dba Adventures Afloat. After discussion, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE DISSOLUTION OF THE PARTNERSHIP AND THE RELICENSING OF THE BUSINESS AS MICHAEL LEE AND JODEE LUTHER, DBA ADVENTURES AFLOAT, PENDING APPROVAL FROM HCNRA RECREATION RANGER. (See Addendum #8).

**Hells Canyon Challenge, Steve Zanelli, Designated Agent:** Mr. Steve Zanelli met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business between Hells Canyon Challenge, Inc., and Charles Keith McDaniel. After the interview before the Board, and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THIS SALE BE APPROVED WITH THE DELETION OF THE AREA SN6 FROM THE REQUESTED AREA OF OPERATION FOR HELLS CANYON CHALLENGE, INC., AND THAT LICENSE BE ISSUED FOR HELLS CANYON CHALLENGE, INC., WITH STEVE ZANELLI BEING LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. THIS LICENSE TO BE FOR THE CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AS CURRENTLY LICENSED TO CHARLES K. McDANIEL.

**Jim Daude, dba Gospel Mountain Outfitters:** Mr. Daude met with the Board regarding his amendment request to include a block of private land belonging to Mr. Jim Rupp for which he has received a signed agreement allowing him to conduct outfitting activities on this property. This amendment request is to hunt deer, elk, bear, cougar, predators, forest grouse, chukar, blue grouse, and hungarian partridge, as well as to conduct trail rides, backpacking, wagon rides, and photography trips. Mr. Daude explained to the Board his plan of operation and the reasons for it. Following a discussion of this request, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. DAUDE'S REQUEST FOR AN AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED. Administrative Note: The limits as specified in Mr. Daude's request be made a part of the license issued in this case, and that the Idaho Department of Fish and Game be notified that because of the concerns of the landowner regarding

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depredations by bear and cougar this activity was included on the license even though they recommended against it. (See Addendum #9).

**Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stanley P. Meholchick, Designated Agent:** In the matter of the show cause hearing of Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stanley P. Meholchick, Designated Agent, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) That Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., was convicted in Magistrate Division of the District Court in the County of Valley, for the following violations: a) three counts of littering, b) one count of illegal use of bear bait. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) The said convictions constitute a violation of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act, Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5 & 6). Pursuant to said Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD 1) FINE JUNIPER MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, INC., STANLEY P. MEHOLCHICK, DESIGNATED AGENT, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00 FOR EACH COUNT OF LITTERING FOR A TOTAL OF \$900.00; 2) THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSE OF JUNIPER MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, INC. BE APPROVED ON A ONE YEAR PROBATIONARY BASIS RELATIVE TO THE COUNT OF ILLEGAL USE OF BAIT; AND 3) THIS PROBATION WILL ALSO APPLY TO THE DESIGNATED AGENT AND GUIDE LICENSES OF STANLEY P. MEHOLCHICK. THE TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT NO VIOLATION OF LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAWS OCCUR NOR WILL ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO THESE LICENSES DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1700 hours and reconvened on Friday, June 28, 1991, at 0820 hours with all Board members present, except Tom Kovalicky. Also present are the Board Executive Director, Board's Attorney and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Administrative Actions:** The Board directs the Executive Director to complete the issuance of the one day float permit to Gary Armacost per the letter from HCNRA.

**Lost Lake Outfitters, Inc., Albert Latch, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the amendment request of Lost Lakes Outfitters, Inc., Albert Latch, Designated Agent, wherein he requested the addition of moose and whitetail deer hunting to his current licensed operating area with whitetail deer hunting occurring on private property owned by Bruce Scott. Mr. Scott has provided Lost Lake Outfitters, Inc., with a Land Managers Sign Off sheet and an agreement. The Idaho Department of Fish and Game has recommended approval of the moose addition. They have some concerns about the whitetail deer issue, but will agree to a limit of 6 whitetail deer hunters. Following a discussion, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT LOST LAKE OUTFITTERS, INC., ALBERT LATCH, DESIGNATED AGENT, OUTFITTING LICENSE BE AMENDED TO INCLUDE MOOSE HUNTING IN HIS CURRENT OPERATING AREA, AND TO ADD WHITETAIL DEER HUNTING ON THE PROPERTY

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OWNED BY BRUCE SCOTT, WITH A LIMIT OF 6 HUNTERS PER SEASON FOR WHITETAIL DEER HUNTING.

**Dave Williams:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Dave Williams to add predator and forest grouse hunting to his outfitter license. Following a discussion of this matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE ADDITION OF PREDATORS AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING TO MR. WILLIAMS LICENSE AS STATED IN HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST.

**Approval of Guide License Applications as presented by Executive Director, Sangrey:** Pursuant to discussion and review, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE LICENSES PRESENTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE APPROVED.

**South Fork Expeditions, Ltd, John Hill, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by South Fork Expeditions, Ltd, John Hill, Designated Agent, wherein Mr. Hill requests the addition of trailrides to his existing operating area. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THIS REQUEST BE APPROVED.

**High Llama Wilderness Tours, Greg Doner, Designated Agent:** Mr. Doner submitted an amendment request to add photography trips to his currently licensed operating area. Following discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED.

**Salmon River Challenge, Pat Marek, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the amendment request to add float boating and fishing on river section SA8, power boat fishing on Payette Lakes, and Cascade Reservoir and forest grouse hunting along SA6 and SA7 where they are currently license for float boating. After review of the file and discussion, it was determined that there are no slots available for the requests on SA8, Payette Lake, or Cascade Reservoir, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST TO ADD FOREST GROUSE HUNTING ON THEIR CURRENTLY LICENSED FLOAT AREA OF SA6 & SA7 BE APPROVED, AND THAT THE REMAINDER OF THE REQUEST BE DENIED. Administrative Note: Salmon River Challenge, Inc., should be put on the waiting list for SA8, Payette Lake, and Cascade Reservoir.

**Robert C. Burlingame, dba Flying B Ranches, Michael Popp, Designated Agent:** With the clarification of their outfitting license limitations as the result of a sale approved at the April meeting. Administrative direction to the Executive Director to insert in Unit 4 the limitation of 3 lions not exceed one female on that license as per recommendation from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game. (See Addendum #10).

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**Robert Allen, dba Greylock Mountain Company:** The Board reviewed the amendment request to add rock climbing in the Black Cliffs area near Boise as well as final approval of the Slick Rock area having received Forest Service sign off and approval for this area. Pursuant to the review of the file and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED.

**Kirk Bachman:** The Board reviewed the resume submitted by Mr. Kirk Bachman regarding mountaineering/rock climbing. After review and his resume and discussion, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT MR. BACHMAN BE INCLUDED AS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD'S TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

**David P. Markham:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by David Markham to add mountain bike touring and llama packing trips on the Fairfield Ranger District to his currently licensed operation. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST.

**Bruce T. Butler, dba Smoky Mountain Outfitters:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Bruce T. Butler to add photography trips to his currently licensed operations, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THIS REQUEST BE APPROVED.

**Snug Outfitters, Inc, Bill Mason, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Snug Outfitters, Inc., William Mason, Designated Agent. Mr. Mason has several requests: 1) technical mountaineering/rock climbing be removed from their license; 2) that backpacking trips be limited to the National Recreation Area; 3) clarification of mountain bike tours that they be limited to Forest Service roads only; 4) request to switch their area of operation for upland game bird hunting from the Cedar Draw Preserve to the Tews Ranch Shooting Preserve; and 5) clarification of the fishing section on Big Lost River to include the area below Mackay Reservoir. Pursuant to review of the file and discussion of the matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THESE AMENDMENT REQUESTS BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #11).

**Wilderness River Outfitters, Inc., Joe Tonsmeire, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Mr. Tonsmeire to update his outfitter license operating area to properly identify those areas in which he conducts cross-country skiing and backpacking activities. These areas were approved by the various ranger districts involved but were not coordinated and the Board was not made aware of these. Pursuant to discussion and review of the file, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THESE AREAS AS IDENTIFIED IN HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE ADDED TO HIS CURRENT OPERATING AREA DESCRIPTION, AS WELL AS THE USE OF PACK STOCK, HORSES AND LLAMA'S IN CONJUNCTION WITH HIS BACKPACKING TRIPS. (See Addendum #12).

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**Lazy J. Outfitters, Inc.:** The Board reviewed the petitions submitted by Lazy J Outfitters, Inc., Larry Jarrett, Designated Agent, this petition is for an amendment to the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations with regards to Mr. Jarrett's request for a rule change on the guide application to clarify the responsibility of the outfitter for his guides to read "An outfitter shall be responsible for the actions of all guides and other persons while under the direct employ of the licensed outfitter." Regarding amendment request #1, after discussion, the Board felt that current language in the Rules give a better coverage as to what was expected of a guide than does the language as suggested by Mr. Jarrett. With regards to request #2, to allow a standardized guide/employee contract, the Board felt that this was more a prerogative of the outfitter and should be left at his discretion rather than to enact a rule requiring such a contract. With regards to Mr. Jarrett's letter of May 7, 1991, and petition requesting a change in the Rules and Regulations specifically requesting a rule making the decision by the Outfitters and Guides Board restricting outfitters and guides from hunting personally outside their licensed areas for any species listed on the outfitters license, and a rule requiring that all licensed outfitters and guides employed by said outfitter hunt in only designated areas either with or without friends or acquaintances and that all animals harvested be counted as part of the licensed outfitters total take for that license year. After review and discussion on these two letter requesting amendments to the Rules and Regulations, the Board feels that the foregoing statements regarding letter number one apply regarding letter number two and the Board feels that these incidents can more readily be addressed through the complaint process and with regards to violations of unprofessional and unethical conduct by licensees. Pursuant to this discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THESE PETITIONS BE DENIED. Administrative Note: Please make sure that Mr. Jarrett is notified of this action as soon as possible and the reasons for this action.

**Attorney General Memorandum:** The Board reviewed the Attorney General Memorandum regarding the Administrative Procedures Act, the Board instructed the Executive Director to forward a copy of this review to Region 6 of the USFS.

**Gordon White, dba Flying W Horse Services:** The Board reviewed the letter received from Mr. White requesting a ruling on his business of rental horses on the Targhee National Forest. The Board directs that the Executive Director respond to him advising him that if he provides any services, equipment, or supplies for compensation for conduct of recreational activities in Idaho that he must have an outfitters license.

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**Ralph Hatter:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Ralph Hatter regarding wording of his white tail deer hunting on private land. Pursuant to review of the file, and discussion, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE WORD "LATE" BE DELETED FROM THIS AREA DESCRIPTION.

**Ray Baier:** The Board received a letter from Ray Baier regarding review of his request for fishing privileges on Spokane River. After reviewing the request and the response from Fish and Game, it is the Board's position that the denial of his request remain intact. Also, in consideration of his additional letter, a reminder to Dean to advise him of our position as outlined in discussion on the Richard Grunch operating area.

**Dr. Dennis Harper:** The Board reviewed the petition from Dr. Harper to allow commercial outfitting activities on the North Fork of the Clearwater River. Pursuant to a review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Epley--Baird) THAT THIS PETITION BE ACCEPTED AND TAKEN TO RULE MAKING PROCEDURES.

**Del Allmon/Ron Sherer:** The Board reviewed the Del Allmon/Ron Sherer overlap for bear hunting in Unit 39. Pursuant to the review of the file and discussion of the matter, and in consideration of the fact that the two parties have not been able to come to an agreement, it is the decision of the Board that a hearing for proper disillusionment of the overlap be scheduled for the August meeting.

**Scott Fasken:** The Board reviewed a letter from Scott Fasken regarding his inability to reach a compromise with Tony Popp about the refund of a deposit. Following consideration of this matter, the Board directs that a letter be written to both Fasken and Popp suggesting that they plan to attend the August Board meeting. This meeting will provide them with an opportunity to explain the circumstances surrounding the payment of the deposit, and why there has not been more of an effort made to satisfactorily resolve this issue.

**Hells Canyon Adventures, Inc.:** The Board's Enforcement Coordinator reported to the Board relative to the operation of Hells Canyon Adventures, Gary Armacost, Designated Agent, and the employment of unlicensed guides. Pursuant to review of the case and discussion of the matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE OUTFITTER AND THE GUIDES INVOLVED BE NOTICED BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY THEIR PRIVILEGES SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is instructed to attempt to secure a negotiated settlement in this matter.

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**Cascade Raft Company, Steve Jones, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the letter from Cascade Raft Company regarding a complaint about being investigated and checked by our enforcement agent, Randy Evans. Pursuant to the review and discussion of the matter, the Board directs that the Chairman respond to Mr. Jones of Cascade Raft Company advising him that the Board expects the Enforcement Officers to check licensed guides and the Board expects outfitters to be cooperative in this matter.

**Michael Lyons/Enforcement Report:** The Board reviewed the enforcement report regarding Michael Lyons, dba Lyons Adventures. The report shows that they were contacted launching a raft on a commercial trip. Said raft was unmarked. Also, a guide, Stuart Chapin, did not have his license in possession. Pursuant to review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Crane)(Miller, nay) THAT OUTFITTER MICHAEL LYONS BE NOTICED BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY HIS OUTFITTERS LICENSE SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is instructed to negotiate a settlement, if possible, in this matter.

**Office Space/Lease Agreement:** The Board directs that Executive Director to investigate the possibility of securing space in a State office building provided this can be done at a lesser cost. If this is not available, the Executive Director and Chairman are authorized to negotiate and finalize a lease agreement with the current lessor.

**Resolution of Complaints filed with the Board:** The Executive Director reviewed the complaints filed with the Board. A satisfactory resolution was obtained, and no further action will be taken.

With no further business coming before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 1541 hours.

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SPECIAL BOARD MEETINGS - TELEPHONE CONFERENCES

The following issues were reviewed and discussed between Chairman Dale Baird and various Board members on the dates specified:

5-13-91 - Chairman Baird was contacted by Dave Mills, Rocky Mountain River Tours, regarding a guide license for Michael Rock. Mr. Rock's guide application was denied by the Board in April because of a falsified first aid card. Mills explained that he needed Rock licensed for an upcoming trip which had been booked for some time. Chairman Baird contacted Leo Crane and Ted Epley and they agreed that if a stipulated settlement could be reached calling for payment of a \$300.00 fine and issuing the 1991-92 guide license probationary, they would accept that compromise. Board Attorney Dallas Burkhalter prepared stipulation and Mr. Rock signed same on 5-17-91. Payment of \$300.00 fine was received on 5-16-91. License was issued and mailed to RMRT on 5-20-91.

5-16-91 - Gary Armacost, Hells Canyon Adventures, phoned inquiring about the status of a guide license application for Brian Lindsay. He was advised that the application had been delayed because of a Fish & Game violation, a training card for SN7 was incomplete when submitted, that we received the completed training card on 5-13-91, and the file would require additional review by the Board because of the violation. Mr. Lindsay called the office on 5-20-91, asking for special consideration if possible, because HCA needs his services for a trip scheduled on 5-22-91. Lindsay explained that he caught a 12" Dolly Varden during a steelhead only season, and the trout was hurt too bad to release. F&G cited him for illegal possession and he paid an \$18.00 fine. Chairman Baird contacted Leo Crane and Ted Epley and it was agreed to approve issuance of license, without restriction, as soon as possible. License issued 5-20-91.

5-20-91 - Don Wilson, Coolwater Ranch Outfitters, called stating that he needs to have Joseph Peterson licensed as his designated agent prior to 6-10-91, if possible. Wilson is leaving for Alaska for three months and wants Peterson to be able to act on his behalf for Coolwater Ranch during this time. Chairman Baird contacted Board members Epley and Crane by telephone and it was agreed that license should be issued as soon as possible, following completion of proper bonding, and payment of fees.

5-22-91 - Jim Spickelmire submitted DA license application on 4-26-91 for Hells Canyon Fishing Charters. Richard Cook is already licensed as DA for HCFC. Spickelmire explained that he would like to be licensed as a designated agent as soon as possible. Application and files were reviewed by Chairman Baird on 5-22-91. Telephone conference with Board members Crane and Epley confirmed that they recommend approval and issuance of license following completion of proper bonding.

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6-17-91 - Jerry Meyers, attorney for Stan Potts and Gerald Richie, contacted the Board office regarding a possible settlement of the Potts issue, and recommending dismissal of the charges against Richie. Following a discussion between Chairman Dale Baird and Board attorney Dallas Burkhalter, Baird contacted Board members Epley and with recommendation that the Stan Potts matter be settled for payment of \$600.00 fine, with the understanding that no charges would be filed against Potts' guide Jim Martiny, and that the Gerald Richie matter be dismissed.

## DELEGATION OF DUTIES TO EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

June 24, 1991

The Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board delegates the following administrative duties to its executive director. The executive director is expressly vested with the power and authority to perform these delegated duties in the name of the Board. The Board reserves the right to review the actions of the executive director and may refuse, sustain or reverse, by majority vote, any action or decision of executive director.

1. The executive director shall serve as the Board's fiscal officer and be responsible for the preparation, accounting, collection, and payment of the Board's budget, payroll, accounts receivable, accounts payable and receipt of license fees and administrative fines.

2. The executive director shall prepare, issue, and execute in the Board's name, such documents as are directed by Board action; including outfitter and guide licenses, findings of fact, conclusions of law and orders, notices of hearings, subpoenas, orders and correspondence.

3. The executive director shall review outfitter license amendment requests, and may approve the following routine amendment requests: business - name change, business - structure change and special one-time hunts.

4. The executive director may approve Rule 53 waiver of requests for the use of private boats by clients on a commercial trip, one-time exceptions to the number of boats authorized on a section of river, and exceptions to the established client/guide ratios.

5. The executive director shall deny outfitter and guide license applications which indicate significant fish and game convictions, felony convictions, fraudulent first aid cards, and other significant disqualifying factors for the issuance of a license. The applicant may request a denial hearing before the Board on any application denied by the executive director. The executive director shall conditionally approve outfitter and guide license applications which indicate insignificant fish and game convictions, and other insignificant disqualifying factors for the issuance of a license.

6. The executive director shall act for the Board on all personnel related matters, except those directly affecting the executive director position, including the hiring, termination, and discipline of the Board's employees.

7. The executive director shall coordinate and approve all work assignments of the enforcement coordinator and enforcement staff, including covert operations, and will advise chairman.

8. The executive director shall represent the Board in all inter-agency matters, in public meetings, hearings, court appearances, and responses to the governor's office.

9. The executive director shall make preliminary investigation of all complaints against licensed outfitters and guides and Board employees, and take necessary action.
