APPROVED MINUTES
Board Meeting - August 26 - 30, 1991
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, August 26, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director, the Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Fiscal Report: The Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, reviewed the fiscal report with the Board, following this report and discussion, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE FISCAL REPORT BE ACCEPTED AND APPROVED.

1993 Fiscal Year Budget Proposal: The Board reviewed the proposal for the 1993 Fiscal Year Budget as submitted by Dean Sangrey. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THE PRELIMINARY FISCAL YEAR 1993 BUDGET BE APPROVED.

Retention of Old and Dated Files: Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, asked permission to destroy those old files that are no longer of value. Pursuant to this discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Miller) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE GIVEN PERMISSION TO DESTROY OLD FILES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GUIDELINES ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE FOR RETENTION OF FILES. SPECIAL ATTENTION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO MATERIALS THAT ARE OLDER THAN TEN YEARS WITH THE PROVISION THAT PERTINENT MATERIAL PERTAINING TO CURRENT LICENSED OUTFITTERS BE RETAINED EVEN THOUGH IT IS TEN YEARS OLD. WHEN POSSIBLE OUTFITTERS SHOULD BE GIVEN OLD FILES PERTAINING TO THEM IN LIEU OF DESTROYING THEM.

Idaho/Washington Concurrent Use Of Snake River: Executive Director Dean Sangrey reviewed the results of the meeting held August 12, 1991, in Lewiston, regarding the issue of outfitted activities on the concurrent waters of the Snake River. Those in attendance at the Region 2 Fish & Game Headquarters included Dan Wyckoff, Chief of Enforcement for the Washington Division of Wildlife, Washington State Representative Eugene Prince, Dwight Kilgore, Idaho Department of Fish & Game, Keith Carlson, Region 2 Fish & Game Commissioner, Licensing Board members Leo Crane, Ted Epley, and Tom Kovalicky, a representative from Idaho Senator Bruce Sweeney's office, and Executive Director Sangrey. Following a thorough review of the circumstances dealing with this issue, it was felt the best course of action to follow in resolving this matter would be to open this stretch of the river to unlimited numbers of outfitters for fishing from Lewiston upstream to the Oregon/Washington stateline. Further, Washington will develop licensing requirements and fees similar to those presently used in Idaho so that anyone fishing commercially on this section of the Snake River will be required to have an outfitter license. Additionally, anyone desiring to fish commercially from both shorelines will be

required to obtain a license from both states. During the course of these discussions, we also identified a disparity between Idaho, Oregon, and Washington within the respective fish and game departments regarding enforcement of non-residents fishing from the shore of a non-resident state. Following a brief discussion, Mr. Carlson suggested that when the respective fish and game commissions gather for a tri-state meeting later this fall, they will address this issue and try to reach a consensus. Following this review by Director Sangrey, it was the decision of the Board to concur with the findings and recommendations of the group, and to direct that this position be formalized by rules making procedures and presented for consideration at the earliest opportunity this fall.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1140 hours and reconvened at 1300 hours.

Ford and Lavelle (Partnership), dba Bogus Creek Outfitters, David P. Ford, Designated Agent: Al Lewis, Board's Enforcement Coordinator briefed the Board regarding Ford and Lavelle (Partnership), dba Bogus Creek Outfitters, David P. Ford, Designated Agent, and the citing of an unlicensed guide. Said guide was convicted in State Court for guiding without a license. Mr. Lewis recommends that Ford and Lavelle (Partnership) be brought before the Board for action for employing an unlicensed guide. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT WE BRING FORD AND LAVELLE (PARTNERSHIP), dba BOGUS CREEK OUTFITTERS, DAVID P. FORD, DESIGNATED AGENT, BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF AN UNLICENSED GUIDE. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is directed to negotiate a stipulated settlement if possible.

Boatman Training Cards: The Board discussed the current process with regards to completion of boatman training cards. Following this discussion, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE INSTRUCTED TO NOT SEND OUT ANY BLANK TRAINING CARDS FROM THIS OFFICE, THAT ONLY VALIDATED TRAINING CARDS WILL BE SENT OUT NAMING THE PERSON TO WHOM THEY ARE ISSUED AND THE ACTIVITY REQUESTED. IN ADDITION, THE STAFF WILL PREPARE A BOATING LOG SEPARATE AND DISTINCT FROM THE TRAINING CARD FORM TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO OUTFITTERS REQUESTING SAME.

Discovery River Expeditions, Inc., Lester Lowe, Designated Agent / Dayna Hess Dueter: The Enforcement Coordinator briefed the Board regarding Discovery River Expeditions and Dayna Hess Dueter. Ms. Dueter was contacted on 08/17/91 by Enforcement Officer Anderson, at that time, she was taking a trip for Discovery River Expeditions, Inc., and had not completed all of the steps necessary to be properly licensed for that river stretch. Pursuant to the

discussion, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT MS. DUETER AND DISCOVERY RIVER EXPEDITIONS, LESTER LOWE, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE GIVEN A LETTER OF REPRIMAND FOR OPERATING WITHOUT BEING PROPERLY LICENSED AND FOR UTILIZATION OF AN UNLICENSED GUIDE ON SA7A. Administrative Note: Ms. Dueter should be notified that she still has not completed the necessary steps to become licensed for that stretch of river.

Jeff Peavey, dba Northwest Voyagers: The Board discussed the report submitted by it's enforcement staff regarding alleged unethical conduct by Northwest Voyagers, Jeff Peavey, et al. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT JEFF PEAVEY, dba NORTHWEST VOYAGERS, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR UNETHICAL CONDUCT AND FAILURE TO PRODUCE GUIDE AND OUTFITTER LICENSES ON DEMAND BY A PROPERLY CONSTITUTED AUTHORITY.

Bear Valley River Company, M. Guy Santiago, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the report regarding Bear Valley River Company, Inc., M. Guy Santiago, Designated Agent, wherein Mr. Santiago was operating in a boat which was improperly marked. Following discussion, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT NO ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST BEAR VALLEY RIVER COMPANY, INC., M. GUY SANTIAGO, DESIGNATED AGENT.

Cascade Raft Company, Steve Jones, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the inspection form which indicates the use of one unmarked boat in conjunction with a guides trip. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane)(Miller, nay) THAT CASCADE RAFT COMPANY, INC., STEVE JONES, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE USE OF AN UNMARKED BOAT. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is authorized to negotiate a stipulated settlement.

Idaho Whitewater Unlimited, Inc., David B. Fisher, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the inspection form which indicated the use of one unmarked boat. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane)(Miller, nay) THAT IDAHO WHITEWATER UNLIMITED, INC., DAVID FISHER, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE USE OF ONE UNMARKED BOAT. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is directed to negotiate a stipulated settlement if possible.

Randy Hess, dba White Otter Outdoor Adventures: The Board reviewed the Enforcement report regarding Randy Hess, and a complaint that this operation was checked with six guides who did not have their licenses in possession, one guide did not have a license at all and four inflatable rafts were improperly marked as per Board regulations. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT RANDY HESS, dba WHITE OTTER OUTDOOR ADVENTURES, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is instructed to work a stipulated settlement if possible.

Outdoor Adventures, Inc., Robert Volpert, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the report by the Enforcement Personnel of an inspection indicating that at the time of inspection, Outdoor Adventures, Inc., had in their employ two guides operating on non-validated training cards. Additionally, that the lead boatman Jennifer James, did not have her guide license in possession. Pursuant to a discussion on the matter, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT: 1)OUTDOOR ADVENTURES, INC., ROBERT VOLPERT, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR THE USE OF UNLICENSED GUIDES; 2)THAT THE GUIDE JENNIFER JAMES BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR TAKING SAID TRIP WITHOUT A VALID GUIDE LICENSE IN HER POSSESSION; AND 3) THAT THE TWO REMAINING SUBJECTS, JOSH DOSTAL AND MICHAEL KOKINIS BE ISSUED WARNING NOTICES BY ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL FOR OPERATING WITHOUT THEIR LICENSES IN THEIR POSSESSION. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is directed to negotiate a stipulated settlement if possible.

Olivia Expeditions, Inc., dba The River Company, Olivia Falconer James, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the Enforcement inspection filed on Olivia Expeditions, Inc. showing that one guide Amy Hoover, did not have a license for that particular stretch of river and that the outfitter utilized two unmarked boats in a trip on the day in question. Pursuant to a discussion of this matter, MSF (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT AMY HOOVER BE SENT A LETTER OF REPRIMAND REGARDING FAILURE TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FOR LICENSING ON THAT STRETCH OF THE RIVER. MSC (Epley--Kovalicky)(Miller, nay) THAT OLIVIA EXPEDITIONS, INC, BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING FOR OPERATING UNMARKED BOATS. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is directed to negotiate a stipulated settlement if possible. MSC (Crane--Kovalicky)(Miller, nay) THAT MS. HOOVER ALSO BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY SHE HAD NOT COMPLETED HER APPLICATION FOR LICENSING ON SA1. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is directed to negotiate a stipulated settlement if possible.

Ron Gillett, dba Triangle C Ranches: The Board's Enforcement Personnel reported that Ron Gillett, dba Triangle C Ranches, was inspected. Three of the guides did not have licenses in possession, although licenses had been issued. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THESE THREE GUIDES BE SENT LETTERS OF REPRIMAND WITH COPIES TO RON GILLETT AS THE EMPLOYING OUTFITTER.

Todd Molitor, dba Cat Track Outfitters: The Enforcement Coordinator reported to the Board concerning unethical conduct in assisting a client kill game on a guided hunt. Pursuant to a discussion of this matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT MR. MOLITOR BE WRITTEN A LETTER OF CENSOR POINTING OUT THE UNETHICAL APPEARANCE OF HIS ACTIONS AND ADVISING HIM TO BE MORE CAREFUL IN THE FUTURE.

Bressler Outfitters, Inc., Joe Bressler, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the enforcement report which indicated that Bressler Outfitters, Inc., had more than the allowed limit of boats on the section to SS1 for a one day period, and did operate a boat without motor attached. Pursuant to the discussion of the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane)(Miller, nay) THAT BRESSLER OUTFITTERS, INC., JOE BRESSLER, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING IN RELATION TO THE ADDITIONAL BOAT DURING THE ONE DAY PERIOD, AND THAT THE MOTOR VIOLATION BE DROPPED. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is directed to negotiate a stipulated settlement if possible.

Executive Session: The Board went into Executive Session at 1720 hours for discussion of litigation and personnel matters and came out of Executive Session at 1745 hours with one decision made. This decision was that the Executive Director is instructed to include in the News Release regarding this Board meeting a section indicating the Board is intending to go into rules making process and any persons having comment regarding current rules or additional rules should make those known to the Board prior to November 1, 1991.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1750 hours and reconvened on Tuesday, August 27, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director, the Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Donald Buck Wood / Cougar Creek Ranch, Inc., Brent Hill, Designated Agent: Donald Buck Wood and Brent Hill of Cougar Creek Ranch, Inc., met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Cougar Creek Ranch, Inc., Brent Hill, Designated Agent to Donald Buck Wood. After the interview, and pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT SAID SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK AND PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum #1).

Scott Fasken / Tony Popp: Mr. Fasken appeared before the Board to explain his side of a controversy wherein Mr. Popp did not refund a deposit of \$1,000.00. The record should show that Mr. Popp did not appear before the Board and in fact did not notify the Board that he was not going to be here until a late date. Pursuant to the discussion, and the indication that Mr. Fasken has received a judgement against Mr. Popp in small claims court, the Board will defer taking any action against Mr. Popp until notified by Mr. Fasken that the terms of the judgement have not been met.

Outfitter and Guide License Approvals: The Board reviewed a list submitted by the Executive Director of the Outfitter and Guides Licenses that have been approved and issued since the last Board

meeting. Pursuant to the review and discussion, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE ISSUANCE OF THE LICENSES SHOWN BY ATTACHED LIST BE APPROVED.

Mitchell Yerdon: The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application submitted by Mitchell Yerdon noting that Mr. Yerdon had been convicted for two fish and game violations during August, 1991. Pursuant to a review of the matter, and Mr. Yerdon's note of explanation, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. YERDON'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR THAT ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992.

Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., Tim Craig, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Boulder Creek Outfitters, Inc., requesting the addition of a parcel of private property owned by them to their current licensed operating area. Pursuant to a review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT SAID AMENDMENT BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #2).

Carl McMillen, dba Alibi Charters: Mr. McMillen requested a consideration for issuance of his 1991-92 outfitters license pending obtaining a coast guard worthy boat to accommodate his liability insurance. Pursuant to review and discussion of this matter, Board Executive Director was instructed to advise Mr. McMillen that he has until the end of the 1991-92 license year to come into compliance with regard to liability insurance and other licensing requirements, or his outfitter license will be terminated at that time.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1140 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Ron Sherer / Del Allmon: Messrs Sherer and Allmon and their Attorneys met with the Board regarding a resolution of the area dispute between same in Fish and Game Management Units 39 and 43. Pursuant to the testimony presented before the Board and a agreement reached between the disputing parties, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE TERRITORIAL BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENTS AS PRESENTED BY MR. SHERER AND AGREED TO BY MR. ALLMON. ADDITIONALLY, THE BOARD DIRECTS THAT THE LICENSE DESCRIPTIONS BE ADJUSTED ACCORDINGLY. (See Addendum's #3 & #4).

Charles A. Brizzee: Mr. Brizzee met before the Board in a denial hearing for the denial of his 1991-92 guide license application. Pursuant to this hearing and after listening to the testimony presented, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE BOARD REVERSE IT'S DECISION TO DENY MR. BRIZZEE'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION

AND ISSUE SAME ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW NOR THAT ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE CURRENT LICENSE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1992. Administrative Note: The Board requests that Mr. Brizzee notify the Board if he completes any significant contribution to the wildlife or outdoor resource in the State of Idaho during his probationary time. Further, the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law should be drafted for this motion. Findings of Fact in this matter are: 1) That Mr. Brizzee was convicted of Fish and Game violations in 1983 and 1985; 2) A significant amount of time has lapsed since these violations and Mr. Brizzee has not been convicted or accused of additional violations. Pursuant to the Findings of Fact, the Conclusions of Law are as follows: 1) Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(6) was violated; 2) That sufficient remorse has been shown by Mr. Brizzee to allow the Board to adjust its findings. Pursuant to these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the foregoing motion was made.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1750 hours and reconvened on Wednesday, August 28, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director, the Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Shannon Lindsey, dba River Mountain Wildlife Experiences: Shannon Lindsey and his wife Kim, met with the Board regarding a Show Cause Hearing for the conduct of a guided turkey hunt for which Mr. Lindsey is not licensed. Pursuant to the show cause hearing regarding this matter, the Findings of Fact are: 1) That the Lindsey's did provide a guided turkey hunt to a Board undercover agent; 2) Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and the Regulations promulgated thereto requires this activity be licensed under the Outfitters and Guides Act; 3) That the Lindsey's outfitters license did not have this activity assigned to it. The Conclusions of Law, therefore, are as follows: 1) That the Lindsey's did violate Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(5, 8ii), and the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 5. Pursuant to these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSF (Epley--Crane)(Crane, nay - Kovalicky, nay - Baird, nay - Epley, aye - Miller, aye) THAT IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THE OUTFITTER LICENSE ISSUED TO SHANNON LINDSEY, DBA RIVER MOUNTAIN WILDLIFE EXPERIENCES, THAT HE BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$600.00, AND THAT ADDITIONALLY, HE BE ADVISED TO APPLY FOR AN AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE TO INCLUDE ALL UPLAND GAME BIRDS INCLUDING QUAIL AND TURKEY. MSC, (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT IN LIEU OF SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THE OUTFITTER LICENSE ISSUED TO SHANNON LINDSEY, DBA RIVER MOUNTAIN WILDLIFE EXPERIENCES, THAT MR. LINDSEY BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,000.00 WITH THE SAME PROVISIO THAT HE BE ADVISED TO SEEK AN AMENDMENT TO HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE TO INCLUDE ALL UPLAND GAME BIRDS.

Elwyn Tupper: Mr. Elwyn Tupper met before the Board with regards to his outfitter license application to conduct guided snowmobile tours in the Stanley Basin Area. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT MR. TUPPER'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING AFFIRMATIVE COMMENTS FROM THE LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCIES AND OTHER NECESSARY PAPERWORK.

Exum Mountain Guides, Inc./Ron Matous, D.A.: Messrs Rod Newcomb and Ron Matous met with the Board to discuss their proposal for licensing to conduct technical mountaineering/rock climbing activities in the City of Rocks area. During this review, Chairman Baird expressed a concern about possible conflicts arising when big game hunting occurs in the area. No input had been received from Region 4, and it was recommended that this be accomplished before any final decision is made regarding this application.

Grant Simonds, IOGA Executive Director: Mr. Simonds shared some ideas with the Board regarding possible agenda topics dealing with Board participation at the IOGA fall meeting in Boise. He also discussed several issues pertaining to rules changes for the Board's consideration.

Paul S. Meholchick: Mr. Meholchick met with the Board in a Show Cause Hearing with regards to the denial of his 1991-92 guide license application. Pursuant to the testimony presented in said hearing, the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law have been established: 1) That Paul S. Meholchick did violate and was convicted of two counts of Fish and Game Law; 2) Said convictions are grounds for denial of guide license. In view of the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) That said Fish and Game violations and convictions are reason for a denial of this guide license application based on Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(6) and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 66. 2) Mr. Meholchick declined to present any additional evidence in his behalf to sway the Board, pursuant to these findings, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD'S ORIGINAL DECISION TO DENY THE 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION OF PAUL S. MEHOLCHICK BE AFFIRMED.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1205 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1720 hours and reconvened on Thursday, August 29, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director, the Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Tom K. Loder / Marriner Jensen: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer between Tom K. Loder and Marriner Jensen for the float boating operation on CL3 section of the Clearwater River. Pursuant to this review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER FROM MARRINER JENSEN TO TOM K. LODER BE APPROVED AND THAT MR. LODER BE LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE PENDING THE COMPLETION OF ALL NECESSARY PAPERWORK. (See Addendum #5).

Professional Guide Institute: The Board reviewed the proposal submitted to the Board on behalf of the Professional Guide Institute by Grant Simmonds. The Board directs that a letter be sent to the IOGA encouraging their continued efforts to promote professional guides through training and accreditation. Administrative Note: The Executive Director will respond to this matter.

Lemhi / Custer County Joint Use Areas: The Board reviewed the relicensing possibilities in the Lemhi / Custer County Joint Use Areas. After review of the correspondence received and a discussion on the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THE PROPOSAL BE SENT TO THE AFFECTED OUTFITTERS ADVISING THEM THAT THE OPEN AREAS IN UNIT 28 AND 21A ARE AVAILABLE FOR LICENSING AS A BLOCK FOR BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING. THE UNLICENSED AREAS IN UNITS 37, 37A AND 36A ARE NOT AVAILABLE FOR RELICENSING. Administrative Note: Affected outfitters should be advised immediately and requested to respond with an operating plan and an amendment request form. Requests will be considered only if they are received prior to November 1, 1991. Provided further that the Board will accept applications from currently licensed outfitters in that area only.

Hanowell & Lane (Partnership), dba Red River Outfitters, Steven Hanowell, Designated Agent / Archie George: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer between Hanowell and Lane (Partnership) and Archie George. Pursuant to review of the files and interview before the Board, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER FROM ARCHIE GEORGE, TO HANOWELL & LANE (PARTNERSHIP) TO BECOME EFFECTIVE AFTER THE CURRENT HUNTING SEASON, PENDING THE COMPLETION OF ALL NECESSARY PAPERWORK. (See Addendum #6).

James M. King, dba Timber Ridge Ranch, A Christian Adventure: Mr. King met with the Board regarding the outfitter license application of James M. King, dba Timber Ridge Ranch, A Christian Adventure, and his application for trailrides and incidental fishing. The trailrides would occur on lands as marked in the exhibit map attached to the application. Fishing would occur in a private pond located on Timber Ridge Ranch. Pursuant to a discussion and review of this matter, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT MR. KING'S APPLICATION

BE APPROVED PENDING RECEIPT OF BONDING INFORMATION, LIABILITY INSURANCE INFORMATION, PAYMENT OF FEES, AND THE APPROPRIATE LAND MANAGER'S SIGN-OFFS FOR OTHER PRIVATE LANDS INVOLVED, NAMELY BLUE LAKES CORPORATION AND IFI LANDS. (See Addendum #7).

The Board recessed for lunch at 1210 hours and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips: Mr. Bernt came before the Board in a Show Cause Hearing relating to a portion of the outfitting license issued to Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips. This show cause hearing was specifically called to consider removal of section SA5 from Mr. Bernt's licensed activities. Pursuant to the hearing, the following Findings of Fact are established: 1) For the years 1988, 1989, and 1990, Bill Bernt, dba Aggipah River Trips shows no commercial use activity on this river stretch; 2) The US Forest Service indicates that they have no current plans or future plans to issue a special use permit for this stretch of river; 3) The reasons given by Bill Bernt for non-use are that he has been unable to obtain a special use permit from the US Forest Service. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) That Bill Bernt is in violation of Idaho Code 36-2113(a)(14), and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 22, in that he has not made commercial use of this stretch of river at least two out of the last three years. Pursuant to these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley)(Crane, aye - Kovalicky, aye - Baird, aye -Epley, aye - Miller, abstains) THAT SECTION SA5 BE REMOVED FROM BILL BERNT, DBA AGGIPAH RIVER TRIPS, OUTFITTER LICENSE. Administrative Note: Executive Director to research other outfitters in the same situation, ie: Rusty Gore, etc. (See Addendum #8).

Doug Tims, President, IOGA: Mr. Tims appeared before the Board to discuss topics of general interest to the industry, and to commend Chairman Baird on the timely comments expressed in his Guest Opinion which appeared recently in the Idaho Statesman.

Solitude River Trips, Al Bukowsky, Designated Agent / R.O.W., Inc, Peter Grubb, Designated Agent / Dave Helfrich, dba Helfrich River Outfitters / Orange Torpedo River Trips, Don Stevens Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the files regarding a proposed sale and transfer of business by and between Orange Torpedo River Trips, Inc. to Solitude River Trips, R.O.W., Inc., and Dave Helfrich. After review of the file and discussion of the matter, MSC (Miller-Epley) THAT THIS PROPOSED SALE NOT BE CONSIDERED ON THE BASIS THAT IT DOES NOT COME UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE BOARD, THAT THE INTERESTED PARTIES BE NOTIFIED OF THIS ACTION, AND THE SUGGESTION MADE THAT IF THEY WANT TO COMPLETE THIS TRANSACTION THAT ORANGE TORPEDO NEEDS TO ADVISE THE BOARD THAT THEY ARE RELINQUISHING THEIR

INTEREST IN THE MIDDLE FORK OF THE SALMON RIVER PORTION OF THEIR OUTFITTERS LICENSE. ADDITIONALLY, THE FOREST SERVICE SHOULD BE ADVISED OF SAME.

The Board recessed for the evening at 1723 hours and reconvened on Friday, August 30, 1991, at 0830 hours with all Board members present except Miller. Also present were the Executive Director, the Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

Donald M. Roman: The Board reviewed the 1991-92 guide license application of Donald M. Roman noting that Mr. Roman has numerous Fish and Game convictions ranging from 1980 to 1985. After review and discussion of these items, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. ROMAN'S 1991-92 GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED.

Board Minutes, June Meeting: The Board reviewed the June 1991 Board minutes. Following review of the minutes, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE JUNE, 1991, MINUTES AS CORRECTED.

High Llama Wilderness Tours, Inc., Gregg Doner, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the report by Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis, regarding the investigation for unlicensed guides. Mr. Lewis recommends that Mr. Doner be brought before the Board for the employment of an unlicensed guide based on his preliminary investigation. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE HIGH LLAMA WILDERNESS TOURS, INC., GREG DONER, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING. Administrative Note: The Board's Attorney is directed to negotiate a stipulated settlement if possible.

Sleeping Deer Outfitters, Inc., Ron Clark, Designated Agent / Michael Scott, dba White Cloud Outfitters: The Board reviewed the outfitter amendment request from Sleeping Deer Outfitters, Inc., Ron Clark, Designated Agent, to add a portion of Michael Scott's hunting unit to their licensed operations. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT SAID AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED. Administrative Note: Michael Scott, dba White Cloud Outfitters, has signed a relinquishment and has agreed to this transaction. (See Addendum's #9 & #10).

Proposed Rule Changes: The Board reviewed the suggested rules for action. Pursuant to discussion and review of the suggested rules, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE RULES INDICATED IN THE ATTACHED ADDENDUM BE CONSIDERED FOR TAKING TO THE RULES MAKING PROCESS, AND THAT THE STAFF BE INSTRUCTED TO DEVELOP LANGUAGE PREPARATORY TO GOING TO THE PUBLIC REVIEW PROCESS.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1200 hours and reconvened at 1310 hours.

Salmon River Challenge, Pat Marek, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the request from Salmon River Challenge, Inc., for a waiver to Rule 57, to allow extra boats in excess of the three boat limit for a trip occurring November 15 & 16, 1991, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE AN EXEMPTION FOR THIS ONE-TIME ONLY TRIP TO ACCOMMODATE UP TO ELEVEN DORIES AND/OR RAFTS.

Don Habel, dba Selway Magruder Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Habel's amendment request to add snowmobiling, wagonrides, sleighrides, and photography trips to his licensed activities. These activities are to be conducted on the Elk City Road which bisects his operating area. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #11).

Richard E. Grunch / Operating Area: The Board reviewed the former operating area of Richard E. Grunch in relationship to Rule 28c to relicense. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD RECONSIDER ITS EARLIER POSITION ON SPLITTING THE AREA AND ADVERTISE THE TWO SEPARATE AREAS AS AVAILABLE UNDER RULE 28(c), FOLLOWING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE US FOREST SERVICE.

Ray Torrey / Operating Area: The Board reviewed the former operating area of Ray Torrey in the Lemhi Valley in relationship to Rule 28c. Pursuant to review of the file and a discussion of the management agency input wherein Fish and Game and the US Forest Service recommend this area not be relicensed at this time, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THE AREA NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR RELICENSING AT THIS TIME, BUT THAT IT BE BROUGHT UP FOR REVIEW IN THREE YEARS.

David Whitworth / Operating Area: The Board reviewed the former operating area of David Whitworth in relationship to Rule 28c. Pursuant to a review and discussion of the file, and recommendations from Fish and Game and the US Forest Service, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT WE PROCEED WITH RULE 28C REQUIREMENTS, AND ADVERTISE THIS AREA FOR RELICENSING.

David Powers / Operating Area: The Board reviewed the former operating area of David Powers which has been relinquished and is up for Rule 28c. The Idaho Fish and Game Department and the Department of Lands both recommend against relicensing this area for commercial activities. Pursuant to review of the file and discussion on the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley)(Crane, abstains) THAT THE BOARD NOT CONSIDER THIS AREA FOR RELICENSING UNDER RULE 28C AT THIS TIME.

Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stanley P. Meholchick, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the Fish and Game citations issued to Paul S. Meholchick. After review of the matter by the Board's Attorney, and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD CONSIDER THE PENALTIES THAT HAVE BEEN ASSESSED AGAINST JUNIPER MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, INC., AND AGAINST GUIDE PAUL S. MEHOLCHICK, AND THE SANCTIONS THAT ARE CURRENTLY IN PLACE, AND AS SUCH, CONSIDER THIS MATTER AS TO THE VIOLATION OF IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS, RULE 10D TO BE CLOSED WITH NO FURTHER ACTION REQUIRED.

With no further business coming before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 1532 hours.
