Board Meeting - December 4 - 7, 1991  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A special meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Wednesday, December 4, 1991, at 8:30 AM with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director, the Board's Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Financial Statement:** The Executive Director reviewed the current financial statements with the Board. Following his report, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS BE ACCEPTED.

**Executive Directors Report:** The Executive Director reviewed a number of items and actions that were taken since the August Board meeting. Included were several instances where he exercised the additional authority given to him by the Board. After review of these matters and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD SUSTAIN THE ACTIONS TAKEN BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ON THEIR BEHALF. (See Addendum #1).

**Board Attorney Report:** Boards Attorney Steve Scanlin, in conjunction with Dallas Burkhalter, discussed the current active cases. Pursuant to review and discussion, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE ACTIONS TAKEN BY ATTORNEY SCANLIN IN THE CASES AS OUTLINED IN THE ATTACHED ADDENDUM. (See Addendum #2).

The Board recessed for lunch at 11:50 AM and reconvened at 1:15 PM.

**Executive Session:** In accordance with Idaho Code 67-2345, the Board went into Executive Session at 3:55 PM and came out at 4:18 PM with no decisions made.

**Jeff Peavey, dba Northwest Voyagers:** Mr. Peavey met with the Board in a Show Cause Hearing regarding alleged unprofessional/unethical conduct. Upon completion of the hearing, the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law were reached. The Findings of Fact are: 1) Officer Lonnie Anderson, employee of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board, did attempt to make an inspection of the licenses and facilities of Northwest Voyagers on or about August 17, 1991; 2) Mr. Jeff Peavey, dba Northwest Voyagers, did approach Officer Anderson while in the conduct of his official duty, and attempted to dissuade Officer Anderson from completing his official duties, and did so in a threatening and abusive manner; 3) Officer Anderson departed from the scene without completing his official assigned duties. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are as follows: 1) Officer Anderson did ask for and was provided with one guide license, but did not ask for and, therefore was not denied the opportunity to check, other guide licenses; 2) While Mr. Peavey's actions represented a possibility for gross unethical/unprofessional conduct, it appears that his actions were in part precipitated by a concern for the welfare of

his clients; 3) An opportunity was presented to Officer Anderson to inspect the camp and in fact, a portion of his camp inspection was completed. Pursuant to said Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THE CHARGES RELATING TO CAMP INSPECTION AND PRODUCTION OF LICENSES FOR INSPECTION ARE DISMISSED. THAT THERE IS SUFFICIENT GROUNDS REGARDING THE UNETHICAL/UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT BY MR. PEAVEY THAT A LETTER BE PREPARED ADVISING HIM OF THE BOARD'S RESPONSIBILITY TO CONDUCT INSPECTIONS AND THE OUTFITTERS RESPONSIBILITY TO YIELD TO SUCH INSPECTIONS AND TO COOPERATE ACCORDINGLY. THIS LETTER SHOULD BE WRITTEN IN THE FORM OF A REPRIMAND.

**Enforcement Personnel Training:** The Board discussed the need for ongoing training of its enforcement personnel related to the contact required when dealing with the general public, and outfitters when they are acting in the capacity of providing those services. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE DIRECTED TO INVESTIGATE THE POSSIBILITY OF AVAILABLE TRAINING THAT WOULD ACCOMPLISH THESE GOALS AND BE PREPARED TO PRESENT THIS INFORMATION TO THE BOARD FOR THEIR CONSIDERATION AT THE NEXT BOARD MEETING.

**Exodus Corporation, Richard A. Bradbury, Jr., Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the request of The Exodus Corporation, Richard A. Bradbury, Jr., Designated Agent, for consideration of a variance to his outfitter license to allow them access to their lodge facilities by float & power boat. The lodge lies approximately 1/2 mile below Spring Bar, which is outside their licensed operating area on the Salmon River. Pursuant to a discussion on the matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE EXODUS CORPORATION BE GRANTED A VARIANCE TO ALLOW THEM TO ACCESS THEIR LODGE 1/2 MILE BELOW THE BOUNDARY OF SA7B, WITH THE PROVISION THAT THIS ACCESS BE FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSPORTING GUESTS AND EQUIPMENT ONLY. NO HUNTING, FISHING, OR OTHER ACTIVITY WILL BE ALLOWED. THIS VARIANCE WILL PROVIDE FOR YEAR AROUND ACCESS TO THE LODGE. FURTHER, THAT DURING ANY TRIPS THROUGH THAT STRETCH IT WILL BE NECESSARY FOR EXODUS TO EXERCISE EXTREME CAUTION TO AVOID INTERFERENCE WITH THE NON-OUTFITTED PUBLIC USE OF THAT STRETCH OF THE SALMON RIVER.

**Exodus Corporation, Richard A. Bradbury, Jr., Designated Agent / Richard J. Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Outfitters:** The Board reviewed the proposed sale of the float boating & fishing outfitter business on SA7C currently operated by Rich Cook, dba Cook's Idaho Outfitters, to The Exodus Corporation. After a review and discussion of this proposal, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED. THE EXODUS CORPORATION IS PURCHASING THE FLOAT BOAT AND FLOAT BOAT FISHING BUSINESS FROM RICH COOK. THE LICENSED ACTIVITIES ALSO INCLUDE STEELHEAD FISHING AND

CHUKAR HUNTING. ADDITIONALLY, THE BOARD NOTES THAT MR. BRADBURY IS QUALIFIED TO GUIDE ON SA7C. Administrative Note: The paperwork is complete on this sale and The Exodus Corporation outfitter license should be amended to affect this transfer as soon as possible. (See Addendum #3 & #4).

The Board recessed for the day at 5:30 PM and reconvened on Thursday, December 5, 1991, at 8:30 AM with all Board members present. Also present were Board Executive Director, Board Attorney, and Enforcement Coordinator.

**Enforcement Coordinators Report:** The Board's Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis, reported to the Board regarding action taken on several ongoing investigations:

- A) **Bill Belknap:** Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis reported to the Board relative to Bill Belknap, dba Eagle Outings. Evidence indicates that Mr. Belknap took a party on an outfitted trip outside of his designated operating area. Pursuant to the discussion and review of this matter, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT MR. BELKNAP BE INVITED TO APPEAR AT THE NEXT BOARD MEETING FOR A DISCUSSION OF HIS AREA OF OPERATION AND THE IMPLICATIONS INVOLVED IN VIOLATING THAT AREA OF OPERATION.
- B) **Sulphur Creek Ranch, Inc., Tom T. Allegrezza, Designated Agent:** Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis reported regarding an incident involving guides employed by Sulphur Creek Ranch, Inc. The alleged incident involved guides Billy R. Nichols and Michael Majors and pertained to unethical/unprofessional conduct. Following a review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT SULPHUR CREEK RANCH, INC., TOM T. ALLEGREZZA, DESIGNATED AGENT, AND GUIDE BILLY R. NICHOLS BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD ON A SHOW CAUSE HEARING RELATING TO THEIR CONDUCT REGARDING THIS INCIDENT.
- C) **Douglas Nash:** Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis reported to the Board regarding actions taken against Douglas Nash, a licensed guide for outfitter Darell Bentz. Mr. Nash was arrested for taking an illegal trip on the Clearwater River and was convicted in state court. Pursuant to a review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT DOUGLAS NASH BE NOTICED IN FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY HIS GUIDE LICENSE SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED FOR CONVICTION OF IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LAW. Administrative Note: Because of the possible tie between Doug Nash and Darell Bentz as evidenced by lease agreements and licensing arrangements and signed statements from Nash, the Board directs that Darell Bentz be invited to appear at the February meeting to discuss this matter.

D) **Cougar Creek Ranch, Inc., dba Cougar Ranch Outfitters, Brent Hill, Designated Agent:** Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis reported to the Board regarding evidence which indicates that Cougar Ranch Outfitters, Inc., utilized an unlicensed guide to conduct at least two hunts during the 1991 big game season. Pursuant to review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley-Kovalicky) THAT COUGAR RANCH OUTFITTERS, INC., BRENT HILL, DESIGNATED AGENT, BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING.

**Podsaid & Hart Partnership, dba Wilderness Outfitters, A.T. (Sandy) Podsaid, Designated Agent / Stockton & Podsaid Partnership, dba Wilderness Outfitters, A.T. (Sandy) Podsaid, Designated Agent:** Mr. Podsaid met with the Board regarding the proposed purchase of a portion of the operating area he now has in a joint partnership venture with Mike Stockton. Following review and discussion by the Board, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE BOARD TENTATIVELY APPROVE THIS BUSINESS TRANSACTION WITH FINAL APPROVAL POSSIBLE UPON RECEIPT OF APPROPRIATE LAND MANAGER SIGN-OFFS FROM US FOREST SERVICE AND IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME. FAILURE TO RECEIVE THESE NECESSARY SIGN-OFFS WILL CONSTITUTE A DENIAL OF THIS BUSINESS TRANSACTION BY THE LICENSING BOARD. THE PARTNERSHIP AND CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENTS PRESENTED IN THE FILES WILL BE CONSIDERED APPROVED UPON RECEIPT OF THE SIGN-OFFS. DENIAL BY LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCIES WILL NEGATE THE ENTIRE CONTRACT. THE OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY WILL BE AS DESCRIBED IN THE APPLICATION AND THE CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AS ALSO LISTED IN THE APPLICATION. (See Addendum #5).

**Steve Zettel/Con Hourihan:** Steve Zettel and Con Hourihan met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business from Con Hourihan, dba Taylor Ranch Outfitters, to Steve Zettel, dba Taylor Ranch Outfitters. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED AS OUTLINED IN THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION OF STEVE ZETTEL. THIS APPROVAL GIVEN PENDING COMPLETION OF SOME MINOR AMENDMENTS TO THE CONTRACT AND PAYMENT OF NECESSARY FEES. MR. ZETTEL WILL BE LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. ADDITIONALLY, THE BOARD WILL CONTINUE TO PURSUE THE RESOLUTION OF THE OVERLAP BETWEEN TAYLOR RANCH OUTFITTERS AND FLYING RESORT RANCHES THAT EXISTS WITHIN THE OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY IN QUESTION. (See Addendum #6).

**J. Brett Pond/Terry Throckmorton:** Mr. Pond met with the Board regarding his proposal to purchase Terry Throckmorton's outfitting business. Pursuant to review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED AND THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSE BE ISSUED TO J. BRETT POND FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ACTIVITIES AS SPECIFIED ON HIS LICENSE APPLICATION. FURTHER, THAT MR. POND BE LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. LICENSE

WILL BE ISSUED UPON RECEIPT OF APPROPRIATE FEES, A CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE, AND BONDING BY THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ASSOCIATION. (See Addendum #7).

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:45 AM and reconvened at 1:10 PM.

**Donald Roman:** Mr. Roman met with the Board in a hearing regarding denial of his 1991-92 guide license application. The denial was based on evidence indicating Mr. Roman had been convicted of several Idaho Fish and Game violations. After review and discussion of Mr. Roman's explanation and concerns, MSC (Miller-Epley) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS ORIGINAL DENIAL OF MR. ROMAN'S GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION AND ISSUE SAID LICENSE ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE 1991-92 LICENSE YEAR, AND FURTHER, IF MR. ROMAN APPLIES FOR A 1992-93 GUIDE LICENSE THAT THE LICENSE ALSO BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY THROUGH MARCH 31, 1993. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAWS, NOR THAT ANY AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE TERMS OF THIS PROBATION.

**Jimmie Dwayne Blair, dba The Last Resort/C. David Freel, dba Double "D" Outfitters:** Mr. Blair met with the Board regarding the proposed sale and transfer of business from C. David Freel, dba Double "D" Outfitters to Jimmie Dwayne Blair, dba The Last Resort. Following review of the file and discussion with Mr. Blair on this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED, LIMITED TO THOSE ACTIVITIES FOR WHICH MR. FREEL IS CURRENTLY LICENSED ON SA4A & SA4B. FURTHER, THAT MR. BLAIR BE LICENSED AS AN OUTFITTER NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, AND, FURTHER, THAT MR. After a discussion with Mr. Carson and review of the file, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED WITH THE PROVISION THAT MR. CARSON BE LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR JACKSON HOLE MOUNTAIN GUIDES, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. ADDITIONALLY, THE GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION FOR EMPLOYEE SCOTT COLE IS ALSO APPROVED. Mr. Anderson indicated on his application that he had been convicted of a felony in 1989 that the case had been resolved and his probationary period has ended. Following review and discussion, MSF (Crane--Epley) (Crane, aye - Kovalicky, nay - Baird, nay - Epley, aye - Miller, nay) THAT MR. ANDERSON BE ISSUED A GUIDE LICENSE WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

MSC (Miller--Epley) (Crane, nay - Kovalicky, nay - Baird, aye - Epley, aye - Miller, aye) THAT MR. **Northwest Mountain Adventures, Inc., Scott Unger, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the situation regarding the outfitter license issued to Northwest Mountain Adventures, Inc. The Board was advised that Mr. Unger intends to relinquish his license because of lack of business. Business has not been successful and he has embarked on another business venture. Following this discussion, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE RELINQUISHMENT OF THE LICENSE FOR NORTHWEST MOUNTAIN ADVENTURES, INC., SCOTT UNGER, DESIGNATED AGENT, AND NOT CONSIDER THE RELICENSING OF THIS ACTIVITY UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF RULE 28C.

**Selway Lodge, Inc., Patricia Millington & Rick Hussey, Designated Agents:** The Board reviewed the outfitter amendment request submitted by Selway Lodge, Inc., proposing to including inflatable kayaking on their license outside the controlled season on the SE1 section of the Selway River. Following review of the application and discussion by the Board, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE BOARD DENY THE APPLICATION. Administrative Note: A letter should go out

**Ralph Hatter, dba South Fork Outfitters:** The Board reviewed the amendment request submitted by Ralph Hatter requesting an amendment to his outfitter license to add additional private property within his current operating area boundary. Following review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST. (See Addendum #10).

**Selkirk Snowmobile Tours, Inc., Chris Flanigan, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the outfitter amendment request submitted by Selkirk Snowmobile Tours, Inc. to add additional private property to his operating area for the conduct of snowmobile tours. The proposal involves Schweitzer Mountain Ski Resort. Mr. Flanigan has provided all necessary paperwork, including a concession agreement from the ski resort. Following discussion of the matter and review of the file, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #11).

**Triple O Outfitters, Inc., Harlan Opdahl, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the outfitter amendment request submitted by Triple O Outfitters, Inc. to add snowmobile touring to their licensed activities. The Forest Service has tentatively agreed to lease the Mex Mountain Work Center facility as headquarters for these tours, and will issue a special use permit accordingly. No objections have been voiced by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game. Following a review and discussion of the file, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED CONTINGENT UPON THE FOREST SERVICE FINAL APPROVAL AND ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL USE PERMIT. **Last Chance Lodge and Outfitters, Inc., Lynn Sessions, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request submitted by Last Chance Lodge and Outfitters, Inc. to amend their outfitter license to include snowmobiling activities on the Targhee National Forest. The Forest Service has concurred with this request. Pursuant to review and discussion of the file, MSC (Kovalicky--Miller) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED TO THE EXTENT THAT SNOWMOBILING IS PERMITTED IN THOSE AREAS DECLARED OPEN TO THIS ACTIVITY BY THE TARGHEE NATIONAL FOREST, ISLAND PARK RANGER DISTRICT. **Ed Hunt, dba Sundog Outfitters:** The Board reviewed Mr. Hunt's request to delay the renewal of his 1991-92 outfitter license.

However, additional correspondence indicates that he is currently conducting outfitting activities, i.e. booking clients for next season. Following a review of the file and discussion of the matter, the Board directs that Executive Director Sangrey notify Mr. Hunt that under the circumstances we will waive his renewal of his 1991-92 license pending his acquiring the necessary liability insurance required to operate. Furthermore, Mr. Hunt needs to be advised that he is not to conduct any type of outfitting activity or book any clients until such time as his license has been issued. This includes advertising or any other activities directed towards securing clients.

Reagan McLemore III, Designated Agent:** The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business by Magnum Outfitters, Inc. to Gary Moser. After review of the file and discussion of the matter, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE SAID SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS FROM MAGNUM OUTFITTERS, INC., B. 
