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A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Monday, February 24, 1992, at 8:18 AM with all Board members present. Also present were Board Executive Director Dean Sangrey and Board Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis.

Executive Session: In accordance with Idaho Code 67-2345, the Board went into Executive Session at 8:18 AM to discuss personnel matters, and came out of Executive Session at 9:00 AM, with no decisions made.

Randy Evans: The Board discussed the current status of employment of Enforcement Officer Randy Evans. Pursuant to the discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT OFFICER EVANS BE PLACED ON IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION UNTIL AN INVESTIGATION IS COMPLETED.

Financial Report: The Executive Director reported to the Board regarding the current financial status of the Board. After review and discussion of the financial reports, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THE FINANCIAL REPORT BE ACCEPTED.

Wagonrides, Sleighrides, and Hayrides: The Board discussed the position they would take with regards to the operation of wagonrides, sleighrides, and hayrides within defined city limits of towns and cities around the State. Pursuant to this discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Miller)(Epley, nay) THAT THE BOARD'S POSITION BE REAFFIRMED THAT ACTIVITIES WHICH INCORPORATE WAGONRIDES, SLEIGHRIDES, AND HAYRIDES, AND TAKE PLACE TOTALLY WITHIN THE PRESCRIBED BOUNDARIES OF VARIOUS CITIES AND TOWNS AROUND THE STATE, BE DEEMED TO FALL OUTSIDE THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT.

Executive Director's Special Actions: The Board reviewed the list of special actions that have been taken by the Executive Director since the December, 1991, meeting. Pursuant to review of these items, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THOSE ACTIONS.

December Minutes: The Board reviewed the minutes for the December, 1991, Board meeting. Pursuant to said review, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE DECEMBER MINUTES.

SD Outfitters, Inc., Ed Panus, Owner: The Board discussed the violations of Fish & Game law by Ed Panus, owner of SD Outfitters, Inc. Following this discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane)(Crane, nay - Kovalicky, aye - Baird, aye - Epley, aye - Miller, nay) THAT MR. PANUS BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY HIS OUTFITTERS LICENSE SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED.

Ron Sherer, dba Steel Mountain Outfitters: The Board's Enforcement Coordinator reported to the Board regarding an alleged incident involving the taking of a cougar outside Sherer's licensed area. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT MR. SHERER BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING REGARDING ALLEGED UNETHICAL/UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT IN THE OPERATION OF HIS OUTFITTING BUSINESS.

Ron Clark / Randy Mortimer: The Board's Enforcement Coordinator reported to the Board regarding a case involving outfitter Ron Clark and guide Randy Mortimer. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Miller) THAT RON CLARK BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AS TO WHY HIS LICENSE SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED FOR UTILIZING AN UNLICENSED GUIDE.

The Board recessed for lunch at 11:30 AM and reconvened at 12:30 PM, with Board members Kovalicky and Epley temporarily absent to appear before the Senate Resources and Environment Committee for their confirmation hearings.

Guides Licenses: The Board reviewed and considered the listing of guide licenses issued during the interim since the last Board meeting. After review, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT SAID LIST BE APPROVED.

Marvin L. Todd, dba Diamond Ranch Cougars: The Board reviewed the outfitter file of Marvin L. Todd, dba Diamond Ranch Cougars. As a result it was determined that Mr. Todd has not applied for relicensing of this area since 1988. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE AREA PREVIOUSLY LICENSED TO MARVIN L. TODD BE DECLARED VACANT AND THAT THE BOARD NOT CONSIDER THE AREA FOR RELICENSING AT THIS TIME.

Podsaid & Hart (Partnership) / Stockton & Podsaid (Partnership): The Board made a final review of the sales agreement by and between Podsaid & Hart (Partnership) and Stockton & Podsaid (Partnership). After review of the comments from the US Forest Service and Idaho Department of Fish & Game letter dated February 20, 1992, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THE BOARD GIVE FINAL APPROVAL TO THIS SALE WITH THE RESTRICTIONS THAT NO BIGHORN SHEEP OR MOUNTAIN GOAT HUNTING BE ALLOWED AND THAT THE FISHING ACTIVITY FOR CUTTHROAT AND BULL TROUT BE LIMITED TO CATCH AND RELEASE ONLY, PURSUANT TO RECOMMENDATIONS FROM IDF&G IN LETTER DATED FEBRUARY 20, 1992. (See Addendums #1 and #2)

River Skills Center: The Board reviewed the course descriptions for two first aid courses offered by The River Skills Center, Shasta, CA, in wilderness medicine and a swift water rescue first aid course. After review and discussion, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT

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BOTH COURSES BE RECOGNIZED AS MEETING THE FIRST AID QUALIFICATIONS FOR OUTFITTER AND/OR GUIDE LICENSES.

Robert L. Allen, dba Greylock Mountain Company: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request submitted by Robert L. Allen, dba Greylock Mountain Company, to amend his outfitter license to include cross country skiing incorporating the use of State land in the vicinity of Little Payette Lake. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Crane--Miller) THAT THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED, WITH MR. ALLEN QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #3)

Canyon, Inc., Les Bechdel, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request submitted by Mr. Bechdel in which he requests the addition of float boating activities on PN1, Payette Lakes outlet to Hartsell Bridge. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #4)

Carl McMillen, dba Alibi Charters / James Meneely, dba Seagull Charters: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business between Carl McMillen and James Meneely. Pursuant to the discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE SALE BE APPROVED. (See Addendum #5)

Quaker Hill Conference, dba Backcountry and Beyond: The Board reviewed the file of Quaker Hill Conference and the letter from the Payette National Forest regarding the termination of Quaker Hill Conference's Special Use Permit, and the file noting that they have not applied for relicensing since the 1990 license year. Pursuant to the discussion, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THIS AREA AND LICENSE BE DEEMED RELINQUISHED.

Michael Scott, dba White Cloud Outfitters: The Board reviewed a request from Michael Scott to clarify the activities listed on his license to include photography trips in all those areas he currently has listed on his license. Also to include anadromous fishing in conjunction with his float boat operation on SA2. Pursuant to the review of the file, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE MICHAEL SCOTT'S REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION OF HIS LICENSABLE ACTIVITIES. (See Addendum #6)

Executive Session: MSC (Epley-Miller) that the Board go into Executive Session in accordance with Idaho Code 67-2345, to consult and advise its' legal counsel in probable or pending litigation matters. Board went into Executive Session at 2:55 PM, and came out of Executive Session at 3:30 PM, with no decisions made.

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Ford & Lavelle, dba Bogus Creek Outfitters, David P. Ford, Designated Agent: The Board's Enforcement Coordinator reported to the Board with regards to alleged illegal activities involving Bogus Creek Outfitters and their operation of sleighrides and wagonrides outside the city limits of Idaho City and not being licensed to operate these activities. Pursuant to the discussion on the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT BOARD'S ATTORNEY BE INSTRUCTED TO CONTINUE WITH A PLEA BARGAIN ARRANGEMENT WHEREIN THE PRINCIPALS WILL PLEAD GUILTY TO THE VIOLATION AND AGREE TO A STIPULATED FINE TO BE PAID TO THE COURT WITH THIS ACTION STANDING IN AND OF ITSELF, ALSO INCLUDING THE RESTITUTION OF EXPENSE MONEY PAID OUT BY THE BOARD. THIS ACTION WILL NOT BE TIED TO ANY PROBATIONARY PROVISIONS, PREVIOUS VIOLATIONS, NOR THE WITHHELD JUDGEMENT NOW IN PLACE.

Jim Daude, dba Gospel Mountain Outfitters: The Board reviewed Mr. Daude's file and outfitter license amendment request to have sheep and goat hunting privileges placed on his license. After review and discussion of the matter, and input provided by the Idaho Department of Fish & Game by letter dated February 26, 1992, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT MR. DAUDE'S REQUEST FOR THE ADDITION OF SHEEP HUNTING BE APPROVED, AND THAT HIS REQUEST FOR MOUNTAIN GOAT HUNTS BE DENIED BECAUSE THERE ARE CURRENTLY NO GOAT HUNTS AUTHORIZED IN MR. DAUDE'S HUNTING AREA. (See Addendum #7)

The Board recessed for the evening at 5:30 PM and reconvened on Tuesday, February 25, 1992, at 8:00 AM with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

Lazy J Outfitters, Inc., Larry Jarrett, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the letter received from Larry Jarrett wherein he requests that the Board delete cougar hunting in Owyhee county from his outfitters license. Pursuant to this request, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THIS ACTIVITY BE REMOVED FROM LAZY J OUTFITTERS, INC., OUTFITTER LICENSE AND, FURTHER, THAT THE BOARD WILL NOT CONSIDER RELICENSING THIS ACTIVITY IN THIS AREA AT THIS TIME. (See Addendum #8)

Dallas Emch, District Ranger, Pierce Ranger District: The Board reviewed the proposal from Mr. Emch, regarding a backcountry ranger position incorporating cooperative funding between the Idaho Department of Fish & Game, Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board, and US Forest Service. Following review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE INSTRUCTED TO PROCEED IN COMPLETING THIS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WITH THE AUTHORIZATION OF UP TO \$4,500 OF FUNDING.

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Richard Armiger, dba Paradise Outfitters, Cayuse Outfitters, Drift Fishers, Patti Armiger, Designated Agent / John Hendrickson, dba Viking I Expeditions: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business from John Hendrickson to Richard Armiger. Pursuant to the discussion and interview, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE SALE FROM JOHN HENDRICKSON TO RICHARD ARMIGER FOR FISHING ON CL2 & CL3 BE APPROVED. THIS IS FOR FLOAT BOATING AND FISHING ONLY. (See Addendum #9)

Douglas R. Nash: The Board discussed the information received during the show cause hearing for Mr. Nash for alleged violation of Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations. As a result of the hearing, the following Findings of Facts and Conclusions of Law have been established: Findings of Fact are: 1) Mr. Nash did violate Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations as set forth in the statement of charges; 2) That Mr. Nash has been convicted of said violations in State court. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) That Mr. Nash is in violation of Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and The Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations. Following these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT MR. NASH'S GUIDE LICENSE IS HEREBY REVOKED.

Richard VanderMeyden, dba Wilderness Lodge / Wilderness Lodge, Ltd., Melvin Wojcik, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business from Richard VanderMeyden to Wilderness Lodge, Ltd. After a review and discussion and interview with the involved parties, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THIS SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS. THE ACTIVITIES INCLUDED ARE DEER, ELK, BEAR, COUGAR, AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING AND FISHING ACTIVITIES. (See Addendum #10)

The Board recessed for lunch at 1140 AM and reconvened at 1245 PM.

Philip Bub Smith: The Board reviewed the report from Steve Mealey, Supervisor, Boise National Forest, regarding an appeal by Philip Bub Smith of a decision pertaining to his cougar hunting activity in Fish & Game Management Units 32 & 32A. Supervisor Mealey upheld the decision from the Emmett Ranger District denying a Special Use Permit to Mr. Smith. The Board will withhold renewal of Mr. Smith's outfitter license pending a decision on other areas contained in his operating area description with the understanding that if those areas are approved by the Forest Service, this area in question will be deleted from the license at the time the license is issued. Mr. Smith is to be advised of this position taken by the Board, and a letter of acknowledgement will be requested from him. The Board will take no further action on his license at this time.

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Coolwater Ranch Outfitters, Inc., Donald Wilson, Designated Agent / Flying B Ranch, Inc., Michael Popp, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the letters submitted by Donald Wilson and Michael Popp regarding overlaps in Fish & Game Management Units 10A, 12 & 16 involving Lazy J Outfitters, Sherry Nygaard, Ralph Oswald, Coolwater Ranch Outfitters, Triple O Outfitters, and Flying B Ranch. After review and discussion, the Board directs that the Executive Director prepare a comprehensive review of this situation along with overlays to show existing conditions and any proposals made by participants as well as securing input from the land management agencies (i.e. Idaho Department of Fish and Game and the US Forest Service) to enable the Board to make a decision, if possible. The Executive Director will advise the affected outfitters by letter of the Board's intended action and give them an opportunity for comment.

Darrell Weddle, dba Cee Bar Dee Outfitters: The Board reviewed the letter submitted by Darrell Weddle regarding the deletion by the US Forest Service of a portion of his hunting area. After review the Board directs the Executive Director to make inquiry of the North Fork Ranger District in regards to their decision to exclude this area in Elizabeth Creek from outfitting activity. The Board finds no record of having been advised of this by the Forest Service.

Mackay Bar - Mountain Air Float Trips & Mackay Bar Corporation, Garn Christensen and Brent Estep, Designated Agents / Wilderness River Trips Inc., Brent Estep, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business between Mackay Bar and Brent Estep. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED FOR THE ACTIVITIES OF FLOAT BOATING ON MF1, MF2, SA6, & SN5. INCLUDED IN THIS ARE FISHING AND CHUKAR AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING, AS WELL AS PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS. BRENT ESTEP IS APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. Administrative Note: This activity should be relicensed as two separate activities. Additionally Mr. Estep is to provide the Board with a more complete release statement from Mr. Hansburger indicating a release of both float boat activities. (See Addendums #11 and #12)

The Board recessed for the evening at 6:25 PM and reconvened on Wednesday, February 26, 1992, at 8:10 AM with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

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Grant Simonds: The Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association Executive Director Grant Simonds met with the Board to review current legislative activities.

South Fork Expeditions, John Hill, Jr., Designated Agent / Fred Ehlert: Mr. Hill met with the Board for a review of the situation regarding the bankruptcy court decision on Mr. Ehlert's outfitter license. Pursuant to this discussion, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT IN LIGHT OF THE FACT THAT MR. HILL IS SUCCESSOR IN INTEREST TO THE LICENSE OF MR. EHLERT, THAT THE EHLERT LICENSE BE DECLARED VACATED IN AS MUCH AS THERE HAS BEEN NO RENEWAL APPLICATION SUBMITTED FOR IT SINCE MARCH 1, 1991. IN AS MUCH AS MR. HILL IS THE FORMER OWNER AND HAD A MONETARY INTEREST IN THE BUSINESS, THE AREA SHOULD BE RELICENSED TO MR. HILL WITH THOSE ACTIVITIES AS CURRENTLY LISTED TRANSFERRING TO HIM. Administrative Note: The Executive Director is instructed to make sure that the US Forest Service is properly notified of this action. (See Addendum #13)

John V. Rose: The Board reviewed the information provided by the US Forest Service regarding Mr. Rose's Special Use Permit in a letter from District Ranger Dennis Dailey indicating that he intends to deny Mr. Rose a special use permit for his outfitting operation. Pursuant to a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Miller) THAT MR. ROSE'S OUTFITTER LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION, IF AND WHEN IT IS SUBMITTED, BE HELD FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE BOARD AT THEIR APRIL MEETING.

High Llama Wilderness Tours, Inc., Cutler Umbach, Owner, Greg Doner, Designated Agent: The Board discussed the information obtained during the show cause hearing for High Llama Wilderness Tours, Inc. At the conclusion of this hearing, the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law were established: Findings of Fact are: 1) That on the specified date and at the specified location, High Llama Wilderness Tours, Inc. did use a person or persons to pack clients and equipment on llama's from the trail head to the camp site; 2) Said persons were not licensed by the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) That this activity does constitute a violation of Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations as set forth in the statement of charges; 2) It is further noted that the defendant in this case, Mr. Cutler Umbach, did admit to the activities and did agree that they were illegal activities according to the regulations and the Act.

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Pursuant to these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSF (Miller-Epley) THAT HIGH LLAMA WILDERNESS TOURS, INC., BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100 AND THEIR 1992-93 OUTFITTER LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS. MSC (Crane--Epley)(Crane, aye - Kovalicky, aye - Baird, aye - Epley, aye - Miller, aye) THAT HIGH LLAMA WILDERNESS TOURS, INC. BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$250 WITH SAID FINE CONSTITUTING THE COMPLETE SENTENCE UNDER THIS ACTION WITH NO PROBATION OR OTHER PROVISIONS TO BE APPLIED. Administrative Note: The Board will consider looking into the apprentice guide provisions with the idea of adopting it across the industry.

The Board recessed for lunch at 1150 AM and reconvened at 1255 PM.

Basso, Andrade, & Maisel (Partnership), dba High Desert Enterprises: The Board reviewed the outfitter license application submitted by Basso, Andrade, & Maisel (Partnership), dba High Desert Enterprises, to do business on their privately owned property in Franklin County for the activities of deer, elk, predators, forest grouse, chukar and hun hunting, fly fishing, walk and wade fishing, and trailrides, backpacking, snowmobiling, cross country skiing, wagon rides, sleigh rides, photography trips and dog sled rides. Their request for pheasant hunting is denied at this time pending their perfecting a hunting preserve license with the Idaho Department of Fish & Game. In addition, cross country skiing activities shall be limited to day trips only. Pursuant to the discussion on this matter, MSC (Epley--Miller) THAT SAID LICENSE BE APPROVED FOR THE AFOREMENTIONED ACTIVITIES WITH THE OUTFITTERS LICENSE ISSUED IN THE NAME OF BASSO, ANDRADE, & MAISEL (PARTNERSHIP), DBA HIGH DESERT ENTERPRISES, EARL BASSO, DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT EARL BASSO'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS BASED ON A FALSE STATEMENT ON THE APPLICATION AS REGARDS AN OUT-OF-STATE FISH & GAME VIOLATION. TERMS OF SAID PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL STATE OR FEDERAL LAW, NOR THAT ANY AMENDMENT BE MADE TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE 1992-93 AND 1993-94 LICENSE YEARS WHICH WILL END MARCH 31, 1994. (See Addendum #14)

Thomas P. Taylor, dba Indian Prairie Llamas: The Board reviewed the outfitter license application of Thomas P. Taylor, dba Indian Prairie Llamas, for llama packing and back packing activities in Fish & Game Management Unit #1 in north Idaho. Specifically, the four areas outlined in the Decision Notice issued by the Sandpoint Ranger District, namely trails #52 and #67 in the Lunch Peak area, and trail #120 in the Lighting Creek/Lake Pend Oreille Ridge Area.

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This application includes llama assisted backpacking trips and incidental fishing as well as photography trips. Pursuant to the discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED WITH THOMAS P. TAYLOR LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #15)

The Board recessed for the evening at 5:30 PM and reconvened on Thursday, February 27, 1992, at 8:00 AM with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

Bill Belknap, dba Eagle Outings: Mr. Belknap met with the Board regarding a possible violation of his outfitter license. After review and discussion with Mr. Belknap, the Board determined that there was not sufficient evidence of a violation to warrant action against Mr. Belknap's license. Mr. Belknap was advised to present the Board with an amendment request and operating plan to cover some additional activities he was interested in conducting.

Jane Mehs, dba Priest Lake Guide Service / Gary Brookshire, dba Priest Lake Guide Service: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business from Jane Mehs to Gary Brookshire. After review and discussion of the matter and in consideration of the recommendations from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game on the matter, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE SALE AND TRANSFER OF THE EXISTING ACTIVITIES LICENSED UNDER JANE MEHS BE APPROVED, AND THAT THE ADDITIONAL AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR FISHING ON THE PRIEST RIVER AND THE OTHER RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES BE HELD UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE BOARD HAS RECEIVED FULL INPUT FROM THE LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCIES. Administrative Note: This transfer is to take place with the 1992-93 license year. Mr. Brookshire to be licensed qualified to guide. (See Addendum #16)

Juniper Mountain Outfitters, Inc., Stanley P. Meholchick, Designated Agent / Ronn Julian, USFS, Cascade Ranger District: Mr. Meholchick met with the Board in an interview and was subsequently followed by an interview with Ronn Julian, District Ranger from the Cascade Ranger District. The interviews dealt with: 1) Mr. Meholchick has submitted an application for a ruling on certain activities he wishes to conduct on his private land namely riding lessons, limited trail rides, and fishing activities. In this matter, the Board concurred that these activities fell outside of the jurisdiction or purview of the Idaho Code, Title 36, Chapter 21, and the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations; 2) Mr. Meholchick reviewed his feelings about the proposed unsatisfactory rating on his outfitting business on the Boise National Forest, Cascade Ranger District. Mr. Meholchick was advised that the Board could not consider action against his outfitter license until such time as action is finalized regarding possible convictions for violations of fish and game law or Special

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Use Permit regulations; 3) Ranger Julian also appeared in relationship to the proposed unsatisfactory rating on Juniper Mountain Outfitters Special Use Permit on the Cascade Ranger District. Ranger Julian was advised that if the Forest Service takes action against Juniper Mountain Outfitters Special Use Permit that results in suspension or cancellation of that permit, the Board would support such Forest Service action in that regard. Ranger Julian was also advised the Board hopes that he will pursue all possible options open to him when considering this matter.

Tuttle & Thompson (Partnership), dba Snake River Adventure Outfitters, Barbara Thompson and Kathy Tuttle, Designated Agents: The Board reviewed the outfitter license application of Tuttle & Thompson (partnership) to conduct a trailriding outfitting business in the areas described in their application along the Snake River in Canyon and Owyhee counties. Pursuant to a review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED TO INCLUDE THE ACTIVITIES OF TRAILRIDES, DAYHIKES, AND PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS, AS SPECIFIED ABOVE WITH BOTH KATHY TUTTLE AND BARBARA THOMPSON LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENTS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #17)

Michael J. Stockton, dba B-Bar-C Outfitters / Leo Crane, dba Clearwater Outfitters: The Board discussed the proposal made by Michael J. Stockton to realign the operating area boundaries between Michael Stockton, dba B-Bar-C Outfitters and Leo Crane, dba Clearwater Outfitters along a portion of Dworshak Reservoir. Pursuant to a review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Miller--Epley) THAT THE AREA BOUNDARIES REMAIN AS PRESENTLY DESCRIBED.

Salmon River Challenge, Inc., Patrick L. Marek, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request submitted by Mr. Marek for conduct of rock climbing/rappelling activities in areas adjacent to his float boat operation as well as some non-specified rock areas on the Nez Perce National Forest and the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area in the Seven Devils area. In addition, he has requested day hike and photography trip activities in the same general areas. Pursuant to the review and discussion on this matter, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE AFFORMENTIONED ACTIVITIES ALONG WITH INCIDENTAL FISHING CONTINGENT UPON REVIEW OF COMMENTS FROM THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH & GAME AND THE GUIDES BEING CERTIFIED BY THE TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT THE RAPPELLING ACTIVITIES. Administrative Note: The Executive Director will contact affected outfitters for their input prior to finalizing this license. (See Addendum #18)

Flying Resort Ranches, Bill Guth, Designated Agent: Mr. Guth made a proposal to the Board to enter into an agreement with Dave Peterson, dba Birch Creek Outfitters, for an area boundary adjustment where their operating areas overlap in Fish & Game Management Unit 27. Mr. Peterson will give part of his operating area, namely that portion lying downstream from the Cub Creek drainage on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River on the west side to the current boundary between the two operating areas, to Flying Resort Ranches. In addition, Flying Resort Ranches proposes to give up any interest they have in the portion of their operating area that is overlapped on Steve Zettel's operating area in the vicinity of Cow Basin. Pursuant to discussion and review of the matter, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD AGREE TO CONSIDER THIS PROPOSAL IF IT IS BROUGHT BEFORE THEM WITH THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS: 1) THAT FLYING B RANCH GIVES UP THEIR CLAIM TO ANY AREA LYING WITHIN THE STEVE ZETTEL OUTFITTING AREA SPECIFICALLY THE AREA KNOWN AS COW BASIN; 2) THAT DAVE PETERSON WILL UTILIZE THE AREA BEING RELINQUISHED FROM SEPTEMBER 15 THRU OCTOBER 5 OF EACH HUNTING SEASON FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS STARTING WITH THE 1992 HUNTING SEASON; 3) THAT AT THE END OF THIS PERIOD OF TIME, ALL RIGHTS AND INTEREST IN THIS AREA WILL REVERT TO THE FLYING RESORT RANCH; 4) FLYING RESORT RANCH WILL NOT UTILIZE THIS PORTION OF THE AREA IN QUESTION DURING THAT TIME PERIOD (SEPTEMBER 15 THRU OCTOBER 5); AND 5) THAT SHOULD DAVID PETERSON SELL ANY PORTION OF HIS REMAINING OUTFITTER BUSINESS, THIS PARTICULAR AREA WILL REVERT ENTIRELY TO FLYING RESORT RANCH. THIS AGREEMENT WILL BE CONTINGENT UPON FOREST SERVICE APPROVAL AND ISSUANCE OF AN APPROPRIATE SPECIAL USE PERMIT.

The Board recessed for the evening at 5:10 PM and reconvened on Friday, February 28, 1992, at 8:00 AM with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director and Enforcement Coordinator.

Sulphur Creek Ranch, Inc., Tom T. Allegrezza, Designated Agent: The Board met with Mr. Tom T. Allegrezza and guide Billy R. Nichols in a show cause hearing. As a result of the hearing, the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law were established: Findings of Fact are: 1) That guide Billy R. Nichols was employed by Sulphur Creek Ranch, Inc. and was involved in an altercation with a hunter over the ownership of a bull elk; 2) That this altercation was due primarily to the conduct of the hunter who acted in a belligerent and threatening manner. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) The Board finds that there is no substantial indication of unethical or unprofessional conduct on the part of Billy R. Nichols or Sulphur Creek Ranch, Inc. As a result of these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT NO ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST THE OUTFITTER LICENSE OF SULPHUR CREEK RANCH, INC., TOM T. ALLEGREZZA, DESIGNATED AGENT, NOR SHOULD ANY ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST THE GUIDE LICENSE ISSUED TO BILLY R. NICHOLS.

River Canyon Outfitters, Inc., Ira J. Wilson, Designated Agent: The Board met with Mr. Earl Jordan and Mr. Ira J. Wilson with regards to the new outfitter application submitted by them. After a review and discussion of the proposed outfitting operation, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED FOR THE CONDUCT OF DEER, ELK, PREDATOR, CHUKAR AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING ON THOSE PRIVATE LANDS FOR WHICH RIVER CANYON OUTFITTERS, INC. HAS A SIGNED LEASE AGREEMENT. FURTHER, THAT BEAR, COUGAR, AND QUAIL HUNTING BE DENIED. IRA J. WILSON IS APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE, PENDING HIS SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE OUTFITTER EXAMINATION. (See Addendum #19)

Renshaw Outfitters, Inc., Jim Renshaw, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request from Mr. Renshaw to add turkey hunting to their outfitter license. After a review of the record and specifically the response from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game, it is the Board's consensus that this application be placed on hold until we get a more definitive response from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game.

Ford & Lavelle, dba Bogus Creek Outfitters, David P. Ford, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the outfitter license amendment request for the conduct of trailrides, sleighrides, wagonrides, and photography trips in the Idaho City area. After review and discussion, MSC (Miller--Kovalicky) THAT IN AS MUCH AS THIS LICENSE IS CURRENTLY IN A PROBATIONARY STATUS AND THE BOARD HAS NOT RECEIVED APPROVAL FOR THIS OPERATION ON BLM PROPERTY AS HAS BEEN REQUESTED, THAT THE AMENDMENT REQUEST BE DENIED. NOTING, HOWEVER, THAT IF THEY CONDUCT THESE OPERATIONS INSIDE THE CITY LIMITS OF IDAHO CITY THAT THIS ACTIVITY FALLS OUTSIDE THE PURVIEW OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT.

Western Pleasure, Inc., Roley Schoonover, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the new outfitter license application submitted by Western Pleasure, Inc., Roley Schoonover, Designated Agent, for the conduct of recreational activities on their private properties as described in their application in the Sandpoint area of northern Idaho. Pursuant to review and discussion of this matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING RECEIPT OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK INCLUDING BOND AND CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE. FURTHER THAT ROLEY SCHOONOVER BE LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENT, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See Addendum #20)

Mary Jackson Humeston, dba Owyhee Expeditions: The Board reviewed the new outfitter license application submitted by Mary Jackson Humeston, dba Owyhee Expeditions, for the conduct of backpacking and photography trip activities in specified areas in southern Ada County and Owyhee County. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED PENDING PAYMENT OF FEES. (See Addendum #21)

US Forest Service / Ford & Lavelle, dba Bogus Creek Outfitters: The Board reviewed the information submitted by the US Forest Service with regards to the request for input regarding the probationary rating proposed for Ford & Lavelle, dba Bogus Creek Outfitters. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE DIRECTED TO RESPOND TO THE DISTRICT RANGER AND ADVISE THE RANGER OF THE CURRENT STATUS OF FORD & LAVELLE'S OUTFITTER LICENSE (i.e. PROBATIONARY) AND OF THE FACT THAT THERE IS A PENDING VIOLATION IN STATE COURT THAT HAS NOT BEEN RESOLVED. ADDITIONALLY, THE BOARD HAS NO REASON TO DISPUTE THE PROPOSED RATING.

US Forest Service / Big Creek Lodge & Outfitters, Inc., Brit Manly, Designated Agent; Salmon River Lodge, Roger Ball, Designated Agent; Flying Resort Ranches, Bill Guth, Designated Agent; Mackay Bar Corporation, Brent Estep & Garn Christensen, Designated Agents: The Board reviewed the letter from Krassel District Ranger Ruth Monahan regarding her intention to issue an unacceptable rating to Big Creek Lodge and Outfitters, Inc. After review and consideration, MSC (Miller--Crane) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE DIRECTED TO RESPOND TO RANGER MONAHAN ADVISING HER THAT THE BOARD DOES NOT HAVE IN ITS FILES ANY ADDITIONAL INFORMATION TO ASSIST HER IN HER RATING EITHER PRO OR CON. Administrative Note: A similar response is appropriate relative to the preliminary ratings proposed to be issued to Salmon River Lodge, Flying Resort Ranches, and Mackay Bar Corporation.

Palisades Ranger District / Richard M. Phillips, dba The Outfitters Pack Station; Haderlie (Vaughn) & Sons, David Haderlie, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed the Palisades Ranger District proposal for additional outfitting activities based on use days as outlined in the prospectus that was sent out for applications. The Board considered the applications of Richard M. Phillips, dba Outfitters Pack Station, and Vaughn Haderlie & Sons, relative to the specified work units of Black Mountain, Pritchard Creek, Dead Horse Ridge, Van Point, and Poker Peak. THIS APPROVAL INCORPORATES SEVERAL MINOR EDITORIAL CHANGES AND ACKNOWLEDGES THAT A FINAL DECISION ON THE SN15 SEGMENT OF THE SNAKE RIVER HAS NOT YET BEEN MADE. Administrative Note: The new rules package is to become effective April 1, 1992. Further, that in the discussion portion of this action that the reference to the Snake River segments include the Board's decision that SN15 be entered as a separate section set aside for fishing activity only with regulations relating to that activity to be determined at a later date. This decision is based on a lack of action by the State of Washington and public comment received during the comment period and as a result of the public hearing held in Lewiston on January 16, 1992.



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

Float boating and fishing may be conducted on the Lochsa River (LO1), the Selway Falls to Lowell section of the Selway River (SE2), and the Lowell to Kooskia section of the Clearwater River (CL1).

CONDITION: Any private lands in the above area description are not covered by this outfitter license unless signed permission/lease is obtained and filed with the Board.
