Board Meeting - August 23 - 27, 1992  
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Sunday, August 23, 1992, at 9:00 AM, at the boardroom in Boise, Idaho. Board Chairman Baird, Vice-Chairman Epley, and board member Crane present, as well as Board executive director and board enforcement coordinator. Board member Tom Kovalicky is expected at 1:00 PM, and John Barker will not be in attendance until Monday, August 24.

**Hulme Dunford:** Board reviewed Mr. Dunford's outfitter license file regarding non-renewal of his license. His license was not renewed in 1991 due to his involvement in an auto accident and related hospitalization. Following review and discussion regarding his lack of effort to get the license renewed again this year, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THIS LICENSE BE DECLARED RELINQUISHED AND THAT THE BOARD CONSIDER ACTION UNDER RULE 128(c) FOR POSSIBLE RELICENSING OF THIS AREA.

**Special Board Meeting:** Based on the status of matters pending before the Board, it was determined that a special meeting should be convened for December 2 - 4, 1992. Motion carried unanimously.

**Mark Tyler:** The Board reviewed a 1992-93 guide license renewal application for Mr. Tyler. He was convicted of a Fish and Game violation in June, 1992, for spotlighting big game and was given a \$200.00 fine. After review and discussion, MSC (Baird--Epley) THAT MR. TYLER'S GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED, BUT, IN LIEU OF DENIAL, MR. TYLER BE ASSESSED AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE OF \$500.00. FURTHER, UPON PAYMENT OF SAID FINE, MR. TYLER'S GUIDE LICENSE FOR THE 1992-93 LICENSE YEAR BE ISSUED UNRESTRICTED.

**Dave Helfrich:** The Board reviewed a complaint received against Mr. Helfrich regarding a campsite violation on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River. After review and discussion, it was agreed that Mr. Helfrich be asked to appear before the Board at the December meeting, informally, to review this matter.

**Beamer's Accident Report:** The Board reviewed an accident report submitted by Myrna Beamer regarding an incident involving one of their jet boats on the Snake River. After review and discussion, the Board determined there is no further action to be taken in this regard.

**Dennis Carty:** The Board reviewed a request by Mr. Carty to recognize experience on the Selway River for training purposes. The executive director is instructed to respond to Mr. Carty asking for a certified statement regarding said experience in order to complete his file. Upon receipt of this information, the Board will consider adding the Selway River to his license.

**Gary Merritt:** In as much as the Forest Service has given Mr. Merritt a clean bill of health following recent camp inspections, and he has provided the Board with a valid bond, it is the Board's position that no further action need be taken in this matter.

**Guide License Fee Refunds:** The Board reviewed two requests for refunds of guide license application fees where the situation indicated the guides had been unable to utilize their licenses. It is the decision of the Board that there is no provision under the statute or regulation which allows refunds of this nature and, therefore, these requests are denied.

Board recessed for lunch and 11:45 AM and reconvened at 12:45 PM. The Board's attorney, Steve Scanlin, joined the meeting at 1:00 PM.

**Mainstream Outdoor Adventures:** The Board reviewed a request to add incidental grouse and chukar hunting to their outfitting license along the SN14 section of the Snake River. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THIS REQUEST BE APPROVED. FURTHER, THE BOARD APPROVED A DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION FOR GAYLE DOYLE, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE FOR MAINSTREAM OUTDOOR ADVENTURES. (See addendum #1)

**Jim Guerry, Snake River Voyages:** The Board reviewed Mr. Guerry's license file, and following a discussion, instructed the executive director to advise Mr. Guerry that he has until the end of the 1992 calendar year to perfect this license if he wants to maintain a priority interest in this outfitted activity on the Snake River.

Board member Tom Kovalicky joined the meeting at 1:10 PM.

**State of Washington First Aid Training Course:** The Board reviewed a request for verification of the content of a first aid course provided by Apprenticeship and Journeyman Training Center out of Spokane, WA. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THIS 16 HOUR BASIC COURSE AS MEETING THE FIRST AID REQUIREMENTS FOR THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT.

**Al Lewis:** Board Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis gave a report regarding several issues of concern to his bureau. Following this discussion, it was decided that no decisions would be made at this time, pending further review of budgetary and legal constraints regarding personnel, salaries, and equipment leasing.

**Steve Scanlin:** Board Attorney Steve Scanlin provided an update on various legal matters pending before the Board. They reviewed actions pending against Twin Peaks Ranch, Inc., including consideration of a petition filed with the Board to dismiss disciplinary action against the Corporation. This action was taken at the June Board meeting, and, based on the fact that the conviction of Frankie J. Valvo, Designated Agent for Twin Peaks Ranch, Inc., has been reversed and noticed up for trial, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT PREVIOUS ACTION AGAINST TWIN PEAKS RANCH, INC., BE DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE.

**Executive Director:** The Executive Director's report will be continued later.

The Board adjourned at 5:10 PM, and reconvened at 8:35 AM, Monday, August 24, 1992.

**Ric Jimison:** Board reviewed a 1992-93 guide license application from Mr. Jimison. He indicated on his application that he had been convicted of a felony in 1981. Since that time he has received an honorable discharge from the military and has no other criminal violations on his record. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. JIMISON'S LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR TWO YEARS WITH TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, NOR WILL ANY AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED FOR HIS LICENSE DURING THIS PROBATION. Administrative note: Following this action, the Board was advised by Mr. Jimison's intended employer that they did not plan to hire him. Appropriate record of this information will be made in Mr. Jimison's file.

**Bill (Lee) Rossman:** Board reviewed a 1992-93 guide license application submitted by Mr. Rossman. He indicated on his application that he had felony conviction. Mr. Rossman explained the circumstances in his case, stating that he had served a probationary period, but we were unable to determine if it stands as a conviction or if it was a withheld judgement. In addition, Mr. Rossman now has terminated his association with the employing outfitter as listed on his application. Consequently, it is the Board's position that this application is incomplete and we are

unable to consider it at this time.

**Jerry Hascall/Dean Steele, dba Golden Adventures, Inc.:** The Board reviewed designated agent license applications submitted by Mr. Hascall and Mr. Steele. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Epley) THAT THESE LICENSES BE ISSUED, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See addendum #2)

**Brent Lloyd:** The Board reviewed a designated agent application from Brent Lloyd for employment with the Mackay Bar Corporation. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED, NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See addendum #3)

Board recessed for lunch at 12:15 PM and reconvened at 1:35 PM.

**Richard R. Thomas:** Board reviewed a 1992-93 guide license application from Mr. Thomas on which he indicated he has been convicted of a Fish and Game violation for purchasing the wrong class of license in 1988. After a review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT MR. THOMAS' LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE 1992-93 LICENSE YEAR. TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, NOR ANY AMENDMENTS BE GRANTED ON THIS LICENSE FOR THE PROBATION PERIOD ENDING MARCH 31, 1993.

**Roger Brink:** The Board met with Mr. Brink, representing Randy Brink, Brink's Payette River Co., and Morris Hoffman and Robin Metz from the Lowman Ranger District, concerning the status of the special use permit for this outfitting business on the Payette River. After a review and discussion, it was determined that the Forest Service will continue to work on their master plan for the Payette River to determine whether that slot is still available. Mr. Hoffman indicated the plan should be completed by the end of 1995. At that time, Randy Brink will be considered for a special use permit. In the meantime, Mr. Brink will be required to keep his outfitter license current in order to maintain a priority interest in this area. Further, in as much as he will not be able to operate this business because of the lack of a special use permit, the Board waives the requirement for a performance bond and liability insurance.

**Dan Browning:** The Board reviewed a 1992-93 guide license application for Mr. Browning. He indicated on his application he had been convicted of a Fish and Game violation. Subsequently, a copy of the citation was received as well as a letter from the arresting officer, Mark Armbruster, recommending favorable consideration of Mr. Browning's application. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE YEAR 1992-93 WITH THE TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE AND LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS TO HIS LICENSE BE APPROVED DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH EXPIRES ON MARCH 31, 1993.

**James King, dba Timber Ridge Ranch/Iris Behr and John Muir:** Mr. King is proposing to sell his trailriding business to Ms. Behr and Mr. Muir. Ms. Behr and Mr. Muir have also applied to be licensed as designated agents for the new business. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT THESE APPLICATIONS BE APPROVED FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ACTIVITIES AS SPECIFIED IN THEIR OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION AND THAT THEY BE LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENTS, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. LICENSE TO BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, NAMELY BONDING AND ADEQUATE LIABILITY INSURANCE. (See addendum #4)

**Ben Hammond, National Outdoor Leadership School:** Mr. Hammond reviewed with the Board the scope of the operation of this school and requested a determination as to whether it falls under the purview of the outfitters and guides act. Following a discussion with Mr. Hammond and review of a letter from Board legal counsel, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT IN AS MUCH AS THIS OPERATION MEETS ALL THE CRITERIA AS OUTLINED IN SEC. 36-2103, IDAHO CODE, THAT IT DOES, IN FACT, FALL OUTSIDE THE PURVIEW OF THE LICENSING ACT.

Board recessed at 5:20 PM and reconvened at 8:00 AM, Tuesday, August 25, 1992 with all members present. Also present were the executive director and the enforcement coordinator.

**Jason Roth:** The Board reviewed Mr. Roth's Fish and Game violations in regards to his guide license application. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED FOR HIS LICENSE DURING THE 1992-93 LICENSE YEAR.

**Kurt Fellom:** The Board reviewed the 1992-93 guide license application for Mr. Fellom for employment with Mackay Bar Corporation. After a review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) (Crane-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Epley-aye, Barker-nay, Baird-aye) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED AS AN APPRENTICE GUIDE WITH A PROBATIONARY PROVISION THAT MR. FELLOW VIOLATE NO LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE ALLOWED DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH EXPIRES ON MARCH 31, 1993. THIS NO AMENDMENT PROVISION APPLIES TO UPGRADING THE LICENSE TO FULL GUIDE STATUS.

**Personal Equipment Use Reimbursement:** The Board reviewed a proposal from Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis for reimbursement for the use of personal equipment by Board enforcement agents. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THESE REIMBURSEMENTS BE APPROVED AT THE LEVEL INDICATED. (See addendum #5)

**Board Policy:** The Board reviewed a proposed policy dealing with harvest of fish and wildlife by Board enforcement personnel while conducting official Board business. Pursuant to this review, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THIS POLICY BE ADOPTED. (See addendum #6)

**Liesel Ernst/Steve Lentz Show Cause Hearing:** A show cause hearing was held in the matters of Liesel Ernst, for guiding without a license, and Steve Lentz, for employing an unlicensed guide. During the course of the hearing the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) Ms. Ernst had applied for a guide license and the license was in process; and, 2) Ms. Ernst, in fact, did not actively guide clients on a commercial trip. Therefore, Conclusions of Law are: 1) the intent and spirit of the Outfitters and Guides Act and the Board Rules and Regulations have not been violated, and, therefore, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT ALL CHARGES IN THIS ACTION BE DISMISSED.

**Ron Sherer/Susan Sherer Show Cause Hearing:** A show cause hearing was held regarding Ron Sherer for allegedly outfitting outside of his assigned area, and for Susan Sherer for allegedly guiding in an area for which she was not licensed. During the course of the hearing the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) that Ron and Susan Sherer did take John Brockfield on a lion hunt. Said hunt occurring outside the assigned operating area boundaries of Mr. Sherer's outfitter license; 2) that this hunt was part of a commercial hunt booked by Ron Sherer involving John Brockfield and Russell Brockfield; 3) the Sherers held themselves out to witnesses as looking for lost dogs and did not indicate they were on a

private hunt: and, 4) the Sherers provided services to John Brockfield normally associated with those provided in the outfitting and guiding business. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are that this hunt, in fact, was a guided and outfitted hunt for which compensation was received and did occur outside the area for which Ron Sherer is licensed. Pursuant to the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT IN LIEU OF LICENSE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION THAT RON SHERER BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500.00 FOR EACH COUNT FOR A TOTAL OF \$1500.00 AND THAT SUSAN SHERER BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500.00. SAID FINES ARE TO BE PAID WITHIN 60 DAYS OF RECEIPT OF THIS HEARING NOTIFICATION.

**June Board Minutes:** After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THESE MINUTES BE APPROVED.

**Kevin MacKaben:** The Board reviewed an application from Mr. MacKaben for a new outfitter license for the conduct of deer, elk, and moose hunting, powerboat fishing on Priest Lake, fishing, trailrides, snowmobiling, wagonrides, sleighrides, and mountain bike touring. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS OUTFITTING LICENSE BE APPROVED FOR THE AREAS SPECIFIED ON THE APPLICATION FOR TRAILRIDES, SNOWMOBILING, WAGONRIDES, SLEIGHRIDES, AND MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING. THE HUNTING AND FISHING PORTIONS ARE DENIED BASED ON THE FACT THAT THESE ACTIVITIES ARE ALREADY LICENSED IN THIS GENERAL AREA WITH OTHER OUTFITTERS. MR. MACKABEN SHOULD BE LICENSED, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See addendum #7)

**Philip Bub Smith:** The Board reviewed a pending renewal of an outfitter license for Mr. Smith with activities conducted in Unit 39 for cougar hunting. Following review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 36-2110(b) 124(b)ii, BASED ON IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME RECOMMENDATION THAT THIS AREA CANNOT STAND ADDITIONAL COUGAR HARVEST.

**Bogus Creek Outfitters, R.L. LaVelle, Designated Agent, Show Cause Hearing:** A show cause hearing was held wherein Bogus Creek Outfitters was charged with misuse/abuse of livestock based on a complaint lodged by Jerry Jeppson. During the course of the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) a number of horses leased by Mr. Jeppson to Bogus Creek Outfitters sustained injuries and showed evidence of excessive use and poor care; 2) that Bogus Creek Outfitters agreed to supply horses to Jeppson last fall to replace those that had been injured; and, 3)

that Bogus Creek Outfitters did not comply with this agreement. Therefore, Conclusions of Law establish there has been a violation Sec. 36-2113(a)(10 & 12). Based on the results of this hearing, MSC (Barker--Epley) THAT A CURRENT WITHHELD JUDGEMENT OF \$250.00 AGAINST BOGUS CREEK OUTFITTERS BE REINSTATED, AND BOGUS CREEK OUTFITTERS BE INSTRUCTED TO PAY THAT AMOUNT WITHIN 15 DAYS OF RECEIPT OF THIS NOTIFICATION. FURTHER, THAT BOGUS CREEK OUTFITTERS BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5000.00. THE EXECUTION OF THIS SENTENCE TO BE WITHHELD PROVIDING BOGUS CREEK OUTFITTERS COMES TO AN AGREEMENT WITH MR. JEPSON FOR THE PAYMENT OF REASONABLE DAMAGES PRIOR TO DECEMBER 1, 1992.

**Sun Valley Wilderness Outfitters, Inc., Glenda Lewy, DA - Show Cause Non-Use Hearing:** R.J. Lewy appeared on behalf of Sun Valley Wilderness Outfitters, Inc., in a show cause non-use hearing. They have not reported any use of the hunting activities on their license since 1989, and have failed to renew the license at all so far in 1992. Mr. Lewy explained they have actively been working to sell the hunting business for over a year and are negotiating with a prospective buyer at this time. They hope to reach agreement on this sale by 11-1-92. They also have finalized a proposal for the sale of the sleighride business and this transaction will come before the Board for approval at the December meeting. Following review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT NON-USE ACTION AGAINST THE SUN VALLEY WILDERNESS OUTFITTERS, INC., LICENSE BE DELAYED UNTIL THE DECEMBER MEETING TO ALLOW THEM TIME TO NEGOTIATE A SALE OF THE BUSINESS. ALSO, MR. LEWY WAS INSTRUCTED TO FACILITATE THE RENEWAL OF THE OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR THE 1992-93 SEASON IMMEDIATELY.

**Aaron Plain:** The Board reviewed the 1992-93 guide license application submitted by Mr. Plain for employment with Gordon Frost. Mr. Plain had pled guilty to a felony charge and is currently serving out a withheld judgement and is on probation. According to court documents, upon satisfactory completion of this probation, all charges will be dismissed and erased from his record. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky)(Crane-Aye, Kovalicky-aye, Epley-aye, Barker-aye, Baird-nay) THAT THIS GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR TWO YEARS. TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS TO THIS LICENSE BE APPROVED DURING THE TERM OF THE PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

**Harry Knox:** The Board reviewed a guide license application for Mr. Knox to guide for Stan Potts. Mr. Knox has been convicted of a felony and also a Fish and Game violation in 1991. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker)(Crane-nay, Kovalicky-aye, Epley-aye, Barker-aye, Baird-aye) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED.

The Board recessed at 6:25 PM, and reconvened at 8:30 AM, Wednesday, August 26, 1992. All Board members present.

**Ray Ralls:** The Board reviewed a designated agent license application for Mr. Ralls for employment with Whitten Guide Service. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED BASED ON PREVIOUS RECORDS CONTAINED IN BOARD FILES.

**Mike Storaasli/Brent Fitchett:** The Board reviewed a proposal from Mr. Storaasli for the sale and transfer of his outfitter business Mr. Fitchett. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED, AND THAT MR. FITCHETT BE LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE THE ACTIVITIES AS CURRENTLY AUTHORIZED ON THE ELK CREEK OUTFITTING LICENSE. (See addendum #8)

**Mike Lyons / Don Canine/Lonn Thaete:** Mr. Lyons, through his attorney Phillip Gordon, is proposing to sell that portion of his float boating outfitter business located on the SN6 and SN8 segments of the Snake River to Mr. Canine and Mr. Thaete, a partnership. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THIS SALE BE APPROVED PENDING COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK AND REVISION OF THE SALES CONTRACT PRESENTLY ON FILE WITH THE BOARD. (See addendum #9)

**Mike Lyons / Conrad Fourney:** Mr. Lyons, through his attorney Phillip Gordon, is proposing to sell that portion of his float boating outfitter business located on the PA1, PS1, PS2, and PN2 segments of the Payette River to Mr. Fourney. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS SALE BE APPROVED AND THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSE BE ISSUED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE UPON RECEIPT AND COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK. (See addendum #10)

**Executive Director:** The Executive Director presented a report on specific actions he has taken on behalf of the Board during the period of time since the June meeting. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THESE ACTIONS BE APPROVED.

**Guide Licenses to Date:** The Board reviewed a record of the guide licenses issued to date since the June meeting. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE ISSUANCE OF THESE LICENSES BE APPROVED.

Board recessed for lunch at 11:30 AM and reconvened at 12:30 PM.

**William P. Marcroft Show Cause Hearing:** A show cause hearing was held regarding Mr. Marcroft, who is charged with guiding in an area for which he is not licensed. As a result of the hearing, the following Finding of Fact was established: that Mr. Marcroft did, in fact, guide a client outside the boundary of the licensed area for which his outfitter, Milt Butler, was licensed. Conclusions of Law are that this constitutes a violation of Sec. 36-2113(a)(8), Idaho Code, and of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 105(d). Pursuant to these findings, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. MARCROFT BE FINED \$250.00 WITH NO FURTHER RESTRICTION ON HIS GUIDE LICENSE. SUCH FINE SHALL BE PAID BEFORE MR. MARCROFT ENGAGES IN ANY FURTHER GUIDING ACTIVITIES.

**June Financial Report:** After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THIS REPORT BE APPROVED.

**Dr. Richard Gardner, DFM:** Dr. Gardner, representing the Governor's office, reviewed with the Board some concerns and information regarding farm and ranch operations that may expand recreational activities into the outfitting business. Dr. Gardner requested that the Board look at some of these situations with the idea of trying to make it easier for these small farm operations to comply with the regulations and, in turn, he agreed to identify specific areas of concern for the Board.

**Idaho Whitewater Unlimited, David Fisher, DA/Show Cause Hearing:** A show cause hearing was held into the matter of Idaho Whitewater Unlimited, Inc., allegedly employing guides who operated without their licenses in possession. The following Finding of Fact was established: that three guides for Idaho Whitewater Unlimited were contacted by an enforcement agent and did not have their licenses in their immediate possession. Accordingly, the Conclusion of Law is that this is a violation of the statutes and regulations as set forth in the complaint. As a result of the hearing, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT ALL CHARGES AGAINST IDAHO WHITEWATER UNLIMITED, INC., BE DISMISSED, AND A LETTER SENT EXPLAINING WHAT IS ACCEPTABLE AS FAR AS GUIDE LICENSES BEING IN POSSESSION, AND FURTHER, THAT THIS INFORMATION BE SHARED WITH THE REST OF THE

BOATING INDUSTRY AND ALSO CLARIFIED FOR BOARD ENFORCEMENT STAFF.

**Snake River Adventures/Pinehurst School:** Board Attorney Steve Scanlin gave a report regarding a dispute between Snake River Adventures and Pinehurst School over a deposit paid for a trip. Following this discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT SNAKE RIVER ADVENTURES BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING.

**Don Allen, dba: Three Rivers Ranch:** The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Allen requesting emergency consideration for redefining some additional segments on the lower section of the South Fork of the Snake River. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE BOARD NOT CONSIDER THIS AN EMERGENCY, BUT TO PROCEED WITH NORMAL RULES MAKING PROCEDURES TO ADDRESS THIS ISSUE. Administrative note: Mr. Allen needs to be notified that the Board has concerns about the public involvement process to ensure all segments of the public are made aware of these proposed modifications to the rules.

**Youth Cavalry School:** The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Terry Bonner which outlines his development of a youth cavalry school. Mr. Bonner inquired as to whether their activities would fall under the purview of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act. After review and discussion, it was determined that this activity appeared to fall within the exceptions granted in the act and, consequently, it is not necessary for them to obtain an outfitter license. The executive director will notify Mr. Bonner accordingly.

**Steven Dalgliesh:** The Board reviewed the 1992-93 guide license application submitted by Mr. Dalgliesh. A review of the file shows that Mr. Dalgliesh had a Fish and Game violation in 1983, and that he answered "no" on his application. After review and discussion, Motion by Kovalicky THAT THIS GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. Motion died for lack of a second. Upon further review, MSC (Crane--Baird)(Crane-aye, Kovalicky-nay, Epley-aye, Barker-nay) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1992-93 LICENSE YEAR.

Board recessed at 6:05 PM, and reconvened at 8:30 AM, Thursday, August 27, 1992 with all members present as well as the enforcement coordinator and executive director.

**Budget Review:** The executive director presented the proposed FY94 proposed budget. Following review and discussion, MSF (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE PROPOSED BUDGET AS PRESENTED. After further review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED BUDGET, AS PRESENTED, BE ACCEPTED, WITH THE EXCEPTION THAT THE CAPITAL OUTLAY EXPENDITURE FUNDS FOR A PICKUP TRUCK BE MOVED BACK INTO OPERATING AND SALARY EXPENSES, AND FURTHER THAT THE RECOMMENDATIONS AS OUTLINED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REGARDING THE FUNCTION AND STATUS OF THE BOARD ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR POSITION RELATIVE TO STATE RETIREMENT, CLASSIFICATION, MODIFICATION OF WORK ASSIGNMENTS, ETC., BE APPROVED.

**Jim Bass, dba Whiskey Mountain Outfitters:** The Board reviewed a new outfitter license application submitted by Mr. Bass for the conduct of antelope, deer, elk, sheep, predator, forest grouse and chukar hunting, as well as fishing, trailrides, wagonrides, sleighrides, and photography trips. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED, INCLUDING THE ADDITION OF BIGHORN SHEEP, BUT WITH THE EXCEPTION OF COUGAR, QUAIL, PHEASANT, TURKEY, AND SAGE HENS. IN ADDITION, MR. BASS BE AUTHORIZED TO CONDUCT OUTFITTED SERVICES IN CONJUNCTION WITH HIS CATTLE DRIVES. After additional discussion regarding this application, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. BASS BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR WHISKEY MOUNTAIN OUTFITTERS, INC., QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (See addendum #11)

**Steven Kaschmitter:** The Board reviewed a request from Mr. Kaschmitter to conduct hunting activities on his private land. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT MR. KASCHMITTER'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED WITH A LIMIT OF NOT MORE THAN 10 HUNTERS PER YEAR FOR THE CONDUCT OF DEER HUNTING. (See addendum #12)

**Guy M. Carlson, dba: GMC Outfitting:** Mr. Carlson met with the Board to discuss his proposal for a big game hunting outfitter operation on private and public lands with portions of Fish & Game Unit #19A. Based on the responses received from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game and the New Meadows Ranger District, it is difficult to ascertain what type of activities should be considered and what would be compatible in the area identified. Following a review of his application and discussion with Mr. Carlson, the Board recommended that he contact the fish & game department and the Forest Service to discuss other possible alternatives to his proposal, and come back before the Board at the December meeting.

Board recessed for lunch at 12:30 PM and reconvened at 1:30 PM.

**Gary Sylte:** The Board reviewed an amendment request by Mr. Sylte regarding emergency action on adding some additional operating area to his current outfitter license. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT IN AS MUCH AS THERE DOES NOT APPEAR TO BE AN EMERGENCY RELATIVE TO THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC IN THIS MATTER, THAT THIS AMENDMENT FOLLOW IT'S NORMAL COURSE AND BE REVIEWED AT THE DECEMBER MEETING.

**Kevin Burlingame:** The Board reviewed a guide license application for Mr. Burlingame, on which the applicant indicated he had been convicted of a Fish and Game violation for purchase of a wrong class license. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE CONSIDERED FOR THE DURATION OF THE PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1993.

**Jerry Black:** The Board reviewed a guide license application for Mr. Black. Mr. Black was convicted for failing to have his unused bighorn sheep tag canceled. After review and discussion, MSF (Crane--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY. After further discussion, motion made by Kovalicky THAT MR. BLACK BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00, WITH FINE TO BE PAID PRIOR TO THE ISSUANCE OF HIS GUIDE LICENSE. Motion failed for lack of a second. After further discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT MR. BLACK BE ISSUED A TWO YEAR PROBATIONARY LICENSE WITH THE TERMS OF PROBATION BEING HE NOT VIOLATE AN LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS TO HIS LICENSE BE APPROVED DURING THE PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

**John Collins:** The Board reviewed a guide license application from Mr. John Collins to guide for Last Chance Lodge and Outfitters. Mr. Collins indicated on his application that he had never been convicted of a Fish and Game violation. However, a check of the records indicated that he did have a Fish and Game violation for fishing without a valid license. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED.

**Tony Glass:** The Board reviewed an application from Tony Glass to guide for Kurt Thompson. Mr. Glass indicated on his application that he'd been convicted of a Fish and Game violation for transporting a bull elk without the antlers present. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT MR. GLASS' LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1992-93 SEASON. TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE CONSIDERED FOR HIS LICENSE DURING THE PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1993.

**Leonard Moffo:** Mr. Moffo indicated on his guide license application that he had been convicted of a felony in 1980. A review and discussion of the file shows that he has completed all probationary requirements relative to this felony conviction and has submitted several letters of recommendation from various individuals. After further review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1992-93 SEASON WITH TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE AN LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS TO HIS LICENSE BE CONSIDERED.

**Mike Crevelt, dba TASC:** The Board reviewed an amendment request for Mr. Crevelt's outfitting license to include mountaineering and rock climbing in the Slick Rock area in the Payette National Forest, and backpacking and mountaineering activities in the Hazard Lake Area. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THESE AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED AS SPECIFIED IN THE APPLICATION. (See addendum #13)

**Gary Brookshire:** The Board reviewed a request by Mr. Brookshire to amend his outfitter license. After a review and discussion, it is determined that the Idaho Department of Fish and Game has some concerns about this operation and Mr. Brookshire needs to address these concerns more fully with that agency prior to any final action by the Licensing Board. MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE HELD UNTIL THE DECEMBER MEETING. In the meantime, Mr. Brookshire should be advised to work with Fish & Game to clear up their concerns, if possible.

**Dave Stelzer:** The Board reviewed an amendment request from Mr. Stelzer to add llama packing to his license. Review of the file indicates that the Dubois Ranger District is still in the process of completing a EA on this proposal. It is the consensus of the Board that this application be held until the December meeting for completion of that review.

**Robert L. Stewart:** The Board reviewed an amendment request by Mr. Stewart for the addition of snowmobile activities to his license. Review of the file indicates that the Forest Service has now signed off on this application. Pursuant to review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED. (See addendum #14)

**Executive Session:** MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS COMPLAINTS PURSUANT TO SEC. 67-2345, IDAHO CODE. Board went into Executive Session at 3:00 PM and came out of Executive Session at 3:12 with no action taken.

**Leo Dollins:** Mr. Dollins had requested a hearing regarding the denial of his guide license application at the June meeting. He failed to appear at the appointed time set for the hearing. Following discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE DENIAL OF MR. DOLLINS GUIDE LICENSE BE SUSTAINED.

**Alan Dunn, dba Mountain Stream Fishing Outfitting:** In accordance with guidelines as established in the MOU, the Board reviewed two applications for proposed activities on Palisades Reservoir. One application was submitted by Mr. Dunn for the conduct of floatboating and powerboating, as well as walk and wade and incidental fishing on Palisades Reservoir. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE APPROVED. The other application was complete but did not meet the criteria as established in the announcement for this opportunity, as the activities requested did not fall under the purview of the Outfitters and Guides Act. (See addendum #15)

**Turkey Hunting:** The Board reviewed pending amendment requests for the inclusion of turkey hunting activities on several outfitter licenses. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) (Crane abstained) THAT BASED ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, THESE APPLICATIONS BE DENIED. Executive director is advised to notify the applicants regarding this decision.

With no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 4:15 PM.



BOARD POLICY

HARVESTING OF FISH & WILDLIFE WHILE CONDUCTING  
OFFICIAL BOARD BUSINESS

The following policy has been established by the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board to address procedures to be followed by employees of the Licensing Board while in the conduct of official Board business.

It shall be the policy of the Board that:

- 1) "While conducting official Board business" shall mean while traveling to or from an official Board assignment, meeting, investigation, or other function, and when utilizing a State, leased, or personal vehicle for which the expenses will be reimbursed or covered by the State of Idaho.
- 2) While conducting any official Board business, either in or out of the State of Idaho, no employee of the Board shall be permitted to harvest, and reduce to possession, any fish or game animal. (See exceptions below)

EXCEPTIONS:

- 1) If participating in a covert operation where it is necessary to operate under an assumed identity, and with fictitious licenses and tags, no fish or game animal will be harvested, and reduced to possession, unless considered absolutely essential to the success of the investigation.

In the event the harvest of wildlife under these circumstances is deemed necessary, the covert licenses and tags in the employee's possession at that time will be utilized in all instances. Wildlife harvested remains property of the State, and will be disposed of as ordered by the court having jurisdiction.

- 2) Upon completion of an authorized assignment, the employee may participate in hunting, fishing, recreational, or private activities prior to returning to their home bases. Employees are encouraged to use good judgement and not to abuse these privileges. Good judgement includes not doing these activities in an area where enforcement action has just been taken.
