MINUTES

Board Meeting - December 1 - 4, 1992
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened on Tuesday, December 1, 1992, at 8:30 AM, at the boardroom in Boise, Idaho. Board Chairman Dale Baird, Vice-Chairman Ted Epley, and Board members Tom Kovalicky and Leo Crane were in attendance with Board Member John A.K. Barker advising he would not be able to attend until Wednesday morning. Also present were Board Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, and Board Enforcement Coordinator, Al Lewis.

Financial Report: Board reviewed the financial reports compiled since the August Board meeting. Following this review, MSC (Epley-Crane) that the reports be accepted.

The Board's attorney, Steve Scanlin, joined the meeting at 9:00 AM.

Information Brochure: The Board wishes to compliment the Executive Director for his efforts in the development and distribution of the Boards' new brochure.

August Minutes: After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE AUGUST MINUTES BE APPROVED.

Executive Director - Delegation of Duties: The Executive Director presented a proposal for expansion of his duties and responsibilities to include the approval and issuance of new outfitter licenses, as well as routine amendments to current outfitter licenses, and approval of sales and transfers of businesses that are routine, with the understanding that anything out of the ordinary would be required to be brought before the Board. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THESE DUTIES BE DELEGATED TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.

Board Attorney: Steve Scanlin reviewed all legal matters currently pending before the Board.

✓ **Bogus Creek Outfitters, Bob LaVelle, DA:** The Board reviewed a request for a re-hearing from Bogus Creek Outfitters. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT BASED ON THE SHOWING OF POSSIBLE NEW EVIDENCE TO BE PRESENTED, THIS REQUEST BE GRANTED AND SCHEDULED AT THE FEBRUARY BOARD MEETING.

✓ **Ron Sherer/Susan Sherer:** The Board reviewed a request from Ron

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and Susan Sherer for a re-hearing of their cases before the Board. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THERE DOES NOT APPEAR TO BE ANY NEW EVIDENCE IN THIS MATTER, AND THEREFORE THIS REQUEST IS DENIED.

Mike and Jodee Luther, dba Snake River Adventures: The Board reviewed information relative to a show cause hearing filed against Snake River Adventures. After review and discussion, based on recommendation of the Board's attorney, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS SHOW CAUSE HEARING BE DISMISSED BASED ON A SATISFACTORY RESOLUTION BY SNAKE RIVER ADVENTURES WITH THE COMPLAINING PARTY. Administrative Note: The Luther's should be advised that the Board would like to meet with them at the February Board meeting to discuss a reoccurring pattern of failure to provide services as advertised.

Frankie Valvo: The Board reviewed the action taken during the June, 1992, Board meeting. After review and discussion and upon recommendation of Board's attorney, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THE ACTION TAKEN AGAINST FRANKIE VALVO BE DISMISSED BASED ON THE FACT THAT THE CONVICTION ON WHICH THE DECISION WAS MADE HAS BEEN OVERTURNED.

Randy Hess: The Board reviewed the matter of Mr. Hess employing an unlicensed guide (Jon Bohach). After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT BOARD'S ATTORNEY BE INSTRUCTED TO NEGOTIATE A STIPULATED SETTLEMENT WITH MR. HESS.

CHARLES
Alan Lamm: The Board reviewed the Alan Lamm show cause hearing. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THIS MATTER BE DISMISSED IN AS MUCH AS THE CIRCUMSTANCES INVOLVED IN THIS INVESTIGATION HAVE BEEN REMEDIED AND THE PROBLEM HAS BEEN RESOLVED.

MAINSTREAM OUTDOOR
✓ **Myrna Beamer:** Myrna Beamer was to appear before the Board for a show cause hearing for employing an unlicensed guide. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT IN AS MUCH AS THE CHARGES FILED AGAINST THE GUIDE HAVE BEEN DISMISSED IN DISTRICT COURT, THAT THIS ACTION BE DISMISSED.

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:45 AM and reconvened at 1:00 PM.

Enforcement Coordinator: Al Lewis reviewed all enforcement actions currently being investigated by him and his staff.

Forrest Wimer: Mr. Wimer has applied for a guide license to guide for Flying B Ranch. A review of the file shows that he has been convicted of a Fish and Game violation as evidenced by records obtained from the Department of Fish and Game. Pursuant to this review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED.

Pat Connolly: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Connolly. A review of the file indicates that Mr. Connolly has been convicted of a Fish and Game violation for fishing during a closed season. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT MR. CONNOLLY'S APPLICATION BE DENIED.

Bruce Edwards, dba Canary Creek Guest Ranch: Mr. Edwards met with the Board to discuss his application for an outfitter license for the conduct of trailrides, backpacking, snowmobiling, wagonrides, sleighrides, mountain bike touring, and photography trips. After review and discussion, MSF (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS FOR 1992-93 AND 1993-94. TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT MR. EDWARDS VIOLATE NO LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS. FURTHER THAT MR. EDWARDS BE LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. Crane-nay, Kovalicky-nay, Epley-aye, Baird-nay. MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION, FOR THE ACTIVITIES AND AREAS AS REQUESTED, WITH MR. EDWARDS LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT THE BOARD WILL CONSIDER APPROVAL OF MRS. EDWARDS AS A GUIDE UNDER THIS OUTFITTER'S APPLICATION AND APPROVE SUCH APPLICATION WHEN IT IS RECEIVED. (Addendum #1)

Big Creek Lodge: The Board reviewed the proposed action by the Forest Service to suspend the special use permit for Big Creek Lodge. After review and discussion, the Executive Director is instructed to advise Big Creek Lodge, Howard Manly, DA, that regardless of the action taken by the Forest Service regarding his permit, he must renew his outfitter license on an annual basis, and in a timely manner, in order to maintain a priority interest in the outfitter area. If he is unable to take clients due to the suspension of his special use permit, the requirement for liability insurance will be waived during that period of time.

James McManus, dba Recreation Challenges for the Disadvantaged: The Board reviewed the present status of Mr. McManus' outfitter license and decided to withhold any relicensing action on the license until the April, 1993, meeting.

Tom McCauley: The Board reviewed Mr. McCauley's guide license application for employment as a mountaineering guide for Howard Carroll. The Board directs that the Executive Director contact Mr. Carroll and determine exactly what activities Mr. McCauley would be engaged in. At the present time, the technical committee recommends denial of this application based on an apparent lack of experience. If Mr. McCauley is to be limited only to the activities which Mr. Carroll is currently licensed to conduct, the Executive Director has the authority to proceed with issuance of the guide license.

Gary Brookshire, dba Priest Lake Guide Service: The Board reviewed an amendment request from Mr. Brookshire to include backpacking, mountain bike touring, wagon and sleigh rides, cross country skiing, photography trips, incidental stream fishing, and power boat fishing on Lake Pend Oreille on his license. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. BROOKSHIRE'S OUTFITTER LICENSE BE AMENDED TO INCLUDE BACKPACKING, MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING, WAGON AND SLEIGH RIDES, PHOTOGRAPHY TRIPS, AND INCIDENTAL STREAM FISHING. CROSSCOUNTRY SKIING IS DENIED ON THE BASIS THAT THERE IS NO QUALIFIED GUIDE TO CONDUCT THIS SERVICE AND FISHING ON LAKE PEND OREILLE IS DENIED BASED ON CURRENT RECOMMENDATION OF THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME. (Addendum #2)

Bill Jons - Concerned Citizens for Unit 71: Mr. Jons had scheduled an appointment to meet with the Board to share his groups' concerns about the licensing of a commercial hunting outfitter on the Caribou National Forest in F&G Management Unit 71. Due to inclement weather, he canceled a personal appearance and arranged for a conference call from Attorney Jim Spinner's office in Pocatello. The call was placed at 4:30 P.M., with Bill Jons, Jim Spinner, and Don Gunter participating from Mr. Spinner's office. A general discussion followed in which Mr. Jons shared their views about why they feel it is unnecessary to have someone licensed in that area for outfitted hunting trips. They believe there wasn't enough opportunity for the public to comment on the proposal before the decision was made to issue a license and permit, and they also feel the area should be left open for general public use only. Chairman Baird expressed interest in affording the public an opportunity to comment when the outfitter license is considered for renewal in April, 1993. The Executive Director will keep Mr. Jons apprised of developments during the winter as to when this matter will come before the Board for review.

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✓ **Conrad Fourney:** The Board reviewed an amendment request from Mr. Fourney to add the activity of kayaking to his float boat license. Following review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THIS REQUEST BE APPROVED. (Addendum #3)

Ed Hunt, dba Sundog Outfitters/John Muir and Iris Behr, dba Alcor Farms, Inc.: The board reviewed a proposed sale and transfer of business from Ed Hunt to John Muir and Iris Behr. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS SALE BE APPROVED. (Addendum #4)

The Board meeting adjourned at 5:00 PM and reconvened at 8:30 AM, Wednesday, December 2, 1992. All Board members present as well as the Executive Director and the Enforcement Coordinator.

Robert Allen, dba Greylock Mountain Company: The Board reviewed an amendment request from Mr. Allen to amend his area boundary for the conduct of cross country skiing in the Zumwalt Peak/Bull Trout Point area on the Lowman Ranger District. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Epley) THAT THIS AMENDMENT BE APPROVED. (Addendum #5)

R.O.W., Inc., Peter Grubb, DA: Mr. Grubb has submitted an amendment request to amend his float boat license relating to the Middle Fork of the Salmon River to include backpacking in conjunction with his float boat operations. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS AMENDMENT REQUEST BE APPROVED TO ALLOW BACKPACKING AS AN ADJUNCT TO HIS FLOAT BOATING OPERATION WITH THE PROVISION THAT THIS WILL NOT ALLOW AN INCREASE IN THE TOTAL NUMBER OF CLIENTS HE IS NOW PERMITTED TO TAKE ON THE MIDDLE FORK. (Addendum #6)

Steve Matthews, dba LaTour Peak Adventures: Mr. Matthews has submitted an outfitter license application for the conduct of backcountry alpine skiing and photography trips in the LaTour Peak area south of Coeur d'Alene. The Board reviewed Mr. Matthews application and proposed operating plan and instructed the Executive Director to continue working with Mr. Matthews in finalizing his license application.

✓ **Ray Ralls, DA, Whitten Guide Service, Inc.:** Mr. Ralls appeared before the Board for a denial hearing regarding his 1992-93 designated agent license application. After a review and discussion, it was determined that present records do not show

sufficient documentation of a financial interest in the business by Mr. Ralls, nor a sufficient interest on behalf of the outfitter, Harvey Whitten, in having Mr. Ralls licensed as a designated agent. Mr. Ralls was instructed to provide the Board with documentation of his financial interest in the corporation and to return to the Board with further justification of his need for a designated agent license. At that time, the Board will reconsider its decision on this license.

The Board recessed for lunch at 11:45 AM and reconvened at 1:30 PM.

Galand Haas/Dennis Brandsma: The Board reviewed the proposed sale and transfer of business from Mr. Haas to Mr. Brandsma for the conduct of float boating, fishing and chukar hunting on the SA8 section of the Salmon River and the float boating and fishing business on the CL2 and CL3 sections of the Clearwater River. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Epley) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED, WITH MR. BRANDSMA LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (Addendum #7)

Lazy J Outfitters, Inc., Larry Jarrett, DA/Flying B Ranch, Inc., Mike Popp, DA: The Board reviewed the proposed resolution of the overlap between Lazy J Outfitters and Flying B Ranch. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT REGARDING THIS OVERLAP AND THAT THE LICENSES FOR LAZY J OUTFITTERS AND FLYING B RANCH BE ADJUSTED ACCORDINGLY. (Addendum's #8 & #9)

Sun Valley Wilderness Outfitters, Inc., Glenda Lewy, DA/H & L Outfitters, Inc., Rick Lane & Steven Hanowell: The Board reviewed the proposal by Mr. Lane and Mr. Hanowell to purchase the hunting portion of the Sun Valley Wilderness Outfitters operation. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, INCLUDING FOREST SERVICE SIGN-OFF, AS WELL AS A CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE. (Addendum #10)

Terry Davis/Steve Zettel: The Board met with Terry Davis to discuss the proposed sale of his float boating business on the SA7A, SA7B, and SA8 sections of the Salmon River to Steve Zettel. After review and discussion, it was determined there is not a business to sell in this particular instance because of non-renewal and non-use of Mr. Davis' outfitted operation known as Sawtooth River Expeditions. Further, that the lack of action by Mr. Davis

to renew this license in a timely manner is cause for relinquishment. Therefore, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE RELINQUISHED, AND FURTHER THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR PURSUE CONSIDERATION OF RELICENSING THIS AREA WITH THE BLM IN COTTONWOOD.

Sawtelle Rentals, Inc., dba Sawtelle Sales, Service and Rentals, Chris Chatterton, DA: The Board reviewed an application from Mr. Chatterton for an outfitter license to conduct snowmobile tours on portions of the Targhee National Forest. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE APPROVED FOR THE ACTIVITIES AND AREAS AS OUTLINED IN THE APPLICATION. (Addendum #11)

The Board adjourned at 5:30 PM and reconvened at 8:30 AM, Thursday, December 3, 1992, with all members present.

Kurt Selisch/ Gary Shelton: The Board reviewed a proposal from Mr. Gary Shelton to purchase the float boating, fishing, and incidental chukar hunting business on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River operated by Mr. Kurt Selisch known as Middle Fork Wilderness Outfitters. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY MR. SHELTON. (Addendum #12)

Bighorn Outfitters, Inc., Curt Thompson, DA/George Butcher, dba Bighorn Outfitters, Dave Melton, DA: Mr. Butcher is proposing to buy the Bighorn Outfitters, Inc., outfitter business from Curt Thompson. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED TO INCLUDE THE AREA AND ACTIVITIES AS LISTED ON THE OUTFITTER LICENSE APPLICATION FROM MR. BUTCHER, WITH MR. BUTCHER LICENSED NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, THAT MR. DAVE MELTON BE APPROVED AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR GEORGE BUTCHER, AND THAT MR. MELTON BE LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (Addendum #13)

Jon Bohach: Mr. Bohach is scheduled to appear before the Board today for a show cause hearing. As the time for this hearing has now passed, the Board directs that the hearing be continued until 1:30 PM on this date.

Lookout Recreation, Inc., dba Bitterroot Sled Dog Adventures, Jim Fowler, DA: Mr. Fowler has submitted an application for the conduct of outfitted dog sled rides on the Fernan Ranger District east of Coeur d'Alene. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--

Crane) THAT THIS PROPOSED OPERATION BE APPROVED AS REQUESTED IN THE OUTFITTERS APPLICATION FOR THE ACTIVITY OF DOG SLED RIDES ONLY AND WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT OTHER ACTIVITIES MAY BE REQUESTED AT A LATER DATE, AND FURTHER, THAT MR. FOWLER BE LICENSED AS DESIGNATED AGENT FOR LOOKOUT RECREATION, INC., NOT QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. (Addendum #14)

Board recessed for lunch at 12:00 PM and reconvened at 1:30 PM with all board members present. Also present was the Board attorney.

Jon Bohach: As the time has arrived for the continuance of the show cause hearing for Mr. Bohach, it is noted that Mr. Bohach was served notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, and has failed to appear for same, the Board directs that the hearing proceed as scheduled. Mr. Bohach has been cited to appear for guiding without a license in possession. Findings of Fact are that Mr. Bohach was conducting a guided river trip for outfitter Randy Hess. Mr. Bohach had applied to the Licensing Board for a guide license. Said application was received in the Board office on May 31, 1992, and the license was subsequently issued on June 10, 1992. The alleged guiding incident occurred on June 2, 1992, and a citation was issued. Conclusions of Law are that this action constitutes a violation of Idaho Code Sections 36-2104 and 36-2113(a)(14) and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules and Regulations, Rules 102(a)(d) and 103. Pursuant to said findings, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT MR. BOHACH BE FINED IN LIEU OF REVOCATION OF HIS GUIDE LICENSE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00 WITH THE STIPULATION THAT NO FUTURE GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED UNTIL THIS FINE HAS BEEN PAID IN FULL.

Milt Butler, dba Chilly Ranches: Mr. Butler met with the Board in a show cause hearing regarding alleged violation of Board rules and regulations. As a result of this hearing, the Findings of Facts are 1) Milt Butler did offer and take an agent of the Licensing Board on a guided bear hunt; 2) Said agent was guided by Mr. William Marcroft and Mr. Delvin Hale; 3) That these two gentlemen, or at least Mr. Marcroft, guided the agent outside of the prescribed boundary of Mr. Butler's operating area; 4) That Mr. Hale did not have a valid guide license; 5) Mr. Hale has been convicted in State court of this violation; 6) That Mr. Marcroft utilized his dogs and equipment in this hunt and no signed lease agreement was made between him and Mr. Butler; and 7) That Mr. Butler paid Mr. Marcroft approximately 70% of the booking fee to conduct this hunt for him. Conclusions of Law are that 1) the Board's agent was guided outside of the prescribed hunting boundary

of Milt Butler, in violation of Idaho Code § 36-2113(a)(8); 2) Mr. Hale did participate in guiding the agent, with the knowledge of Mr. Butler, without having first obtained a guide license, in violation of Idaho Code § 36-2113(a)(9); and 3) a true third party agreement violation does not appear to exist in this case inasmuch as Mr. Butler did receive funds for the trip and did organize and direct the hunt. Pursuant to these findings and conclusions, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT 1) IN THE MATTER OF OUTFITTING OUTSIDE OF HIS ASSIGNED AREA, MR. BUTLER BE FINED \$250.00; 2) IN THE MATTER OF EMPLOYING AN UNLICENSED GUIDE, MR. BUTLER BE FINED \$250.00; AND 3) IN THE MATTER OF THE THIRD PARTY AGREEMENT, THAT THIS CHARGE BE DISMISSED. PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT THESE FINES BE ASSESSED IN LIEU OF REVOCATION OF MR. BUTLER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE, AND THAT THE BEAR HUNTING ACTIVITIES CURRENTLY LICENSED TO MR. BUTLER BE REMOVED FROM HIS LICENSE, AND THAT HE BE REQUIRED TO REIMBURSE THE BOARD FOR ITS EXPENSES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1600.00. THESE FINES AND RESTITUTION ARE TO BE PAID PRIOR TO MR. BUTLER BEING ISSUED ANY FUTURE OUTFITTER OR GUIDE LICENSES. AFTER DISCUSSION, THE MOTION WAS AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT ON THE COUNTS OF GUIDING OUTSIDE OF HIS AREA AND UTILIZING AN UNLICENSED GUIDE, NO FINE BE ASSESSED, BUT THAT MR. BUTLER BE ORDERED TO REIMBURSE THE BOARD FOR EXPENSES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1600.00, THAT THE CHARGE RELATING TO A THIRD PARTY AGREEMENT BE DISMISSED, AND THAT HIS AUTHORIZATION FOR BEAR HUNTING BE REMOVED FROM HIS LICENSE. FURTHER, THAT THE RESTITUTION MUST BE PAID PRIOR TO MR. BUTLER BEING ISSUED ANY FUTURE OUTFITTER OR GUIDE LICENSES. THE AMENDED MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY.

Darell Bentz: Board Member John A.K. Barker reported to the Board regarding Mr. Bentz's recent violation of the Stream Protection Act. After review and discussion of the matter, MSC (Barker--Epley) THAT MR. BENTZ BE REQUESTED TO APPEAR INFORMALLY BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A REVIEW OF THIS MATTER.

Randy Mattson, Innovative Systems: Mr. Mattson, representing Innovative Systems in Caldwell, Idaho, presented information for the Board's review regarding his services which provide a first aid training program that would be available for outfitters and guides. He has requested the Board's review and formal recognition of this program as an acceptable course for licensing requirements. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT MR. MATTSON'S MEDIC FIRST AID TRAINING PROGRAM BE ACCEPTED AS A QUALIFIED FIRST AID COURSE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Tom Lindsey: Mr. Lindsey met with the Board to review his 1992-93 guide license application for employment with a group of various outfitters. The discussion addressed concerns relating to a Fish & Game violation and a felony conviction. Following this review, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THIS GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED.

Gary Towle: Mr. Towle met with the Board in a show cause hearing for allegedly operating without an outfitter license. During the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) Mr. Towle did take clients on a guided horseback trip on July 3, 1992; 2) Mr. Towle's outfitter license had not been renewed for the current license year pending receipt of verification of liability insurance; 3) Mr. Towle's outfitter license renewal application had been filed in a timely manner with an indication that insurance verification would follow; 4) Subsequently, on July 13, 1992, the Board received a copy of his insurance verification which was issued on April 30, 1992. Therefore, Conclusions of Law are that Mr. Towle was, in fact, guiding and outfitting without a valid license in possession, in violation of Idaho Code Section 36-2104, and Board Rules and Regulations, Rules 002(ss), 102(a)(i), and 103. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT BASED ON A LACK OF SHOWING THAT THERE WAS INTENT ON MR. TOWLE'S PART TO VIOLATE THE SPIRIT OF THE LAW, ALL ACTIONS IN THIS MATTER BE DISMISSED.

Harry Knox: Mr. Knox was scheduled for a show cause hearing at this time, but was reported to be ill and could not appear. Board directs that this hearing be rescheduled for a later time.

Martin Capps: The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Capps regarding licensing meat packing activities in the operating area formerly licensed to Ray Torrey. The Executive Director is instructed to request Mr. Capps to research this proposal with local Forest Service and Fish and Game representatives and come back to the Board with a plan for review.

Philip Bub Smith: Mr. Smith appeared in a denial hearing regarding the renewal of his outfitter license. The Board reviewed with Mr. Smith the wildlife resource concerns provided by the Department of Fish & Game relative to cougar populations in the area, and also the issues identified by the Idaho City Ranger District. These included accessibility of the area by road, close proximity to the Boise area, other outfitters licensed in the area, and the issue of cougar population. After reviewing and discussing this information

with Mr. Smith, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THE DENIAL BE SUSTAINED.

The meeting adjourned at 5:15 PM and reconvened at 8:25 AM, Friday, December 4, 1992, with all Board members present plus the Board attorney, Enforcement Coordinator and Executive Director.

Idaho Wilderness Camps, Inc., Garry Merritt, DA/James Thomas: The Board reviewed a proposed sale and transfer of business between Mr. Merritt and Mr. Thomas. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Epley) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED AS OUTLINED IN THE OUTFITTERS APPLICATION AND THE CONTRACT SUBMITTED FOR BOARD REVIEW, WITH MR. THOMAS TO BE LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. FURTHER, ISSUANCE OF THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE IS CONTINGENT UPON RECEIPT OF PROPER DOCUMENTATION FROM THE NORTH FORK RANGER DISTRICT, SALMON NATIONAL FOREST, OF ACCEPTANCE OF THE SALE BY THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE AND THEIR INTENT TO ISSUE A SPECIAL USE PERMIT. (Crane-aye, Kovalicky-nay, Baird-aye, Epley-aye, Barker-aye) (Addendum #15)

Jeff Peavey and Robert Crump: It is noted for the record that both Mr. Peavey and Mr. Crump were properly served with notice to appear for show cause hearings at this time and date, and that neither one is present. Following testimony presented at the hearing, the Board hereby enters a default judgement in both cases based on the fact that neither Mr. Crump nor Mr. Peavey appeared. Findings of Fact are that, 1) Mr. Crump did guide an outfitted party on May 30, 1992 for Mr. Jeff Peavey, 2) Mr. Crump had not secured an Idaho guide license. Conclusions of Law are these actions constitute a violation of Idaho Code Section 36-2113(a)(9) and Board Rules and Regulations, Rules 102(a)(d), and 105(b) for Mr. Peavey, and of Idaho Code Sections 36-2104 and 36-2113(a)(14) and Board Rules and Regulations, Rules 102(a)(d), and 103 for Mr. Crump. Based on these findings, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT IN LIEU OF REVOCATION OF LICENSE, MR. CRUMP BE FINED \$150.00 AND MR. PEAVEY BE FINED \$750.00. FURTHER, THESE FINES MUST BE PAID NO LATER THAN JANUARY 31, 1993. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE REVOCATION OF THESE LICENSE PRIVILEGES WITH NO FUTURE LICENSE TO BE ISSUED UNTIL FINES ARE PAID.

James (Butch) Renshaw/Herman Kuykendall: Mr. Kuykendall met with the Board relative to his proposal to purchase the outfitting business of James (Butch) Renshaw. Mr. Kuykendall also inquired about the possibility of amending this outfitter license to include bear hunting privileges in an adjacent area not currently licensed. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THE SALE AND

TRANSFER OF BUSINESS BE APPROVED FOR THOSE ACTIVITIES PRESENTLY COVERED BY MR. RENSCHAW'S LICENSE, WITH MR. KUYKENDALL LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. ACTION ON THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT WILL BE DELAYED PENDING COMPLETION OF ADDITIONAL RESEARCH WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND FOREST SERVICE. (Addendum #16)

Bruce Butler: Mr. Butler met with the Board regarding the late renewal of his outfitter license and also reviewed his application for licensing of the sleigh and trailride business he has purchased from R.J. Lewy. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED FOR HIS CURRENT OUTFITTER OPERATION PENDING RECEIPT OF A CURRENT FINANCIAL STATEMENT AND OPERATING PLAN. ADDITIONALLY, PURCHASE OF THE BUSINESS AND AMENDMENT TO HIS LICENSE TO ADD SLEIGH AND TRAILRIDES IS APPROVED WHEN ALL NECESSARY PAPERWORK HAS BEEN SUBMITTED. FURTHER, A CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE TO COVER THESE OPERATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED BEFORE THE LICENSE IS ISSUED. Administrative note: The proposed transaction between Mr. Butler and Mr. Mulligan will not be considered until such time as these licenses are perfected. (Addendum #17)

Janet Antonini: Ms. Antonini has submitted an application to be licensed as Designated Agent for Twin Peaks Ranch, Inc. After a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED, QUALIFIED TO GUIDE. In regards to the amendment applications submitted by Ms. Antonini, Board authorizes the Executive Director to proceed on those applications as soon as the necessary research has been completed and the shooting preserve license has been obtained. (Addendum #18)

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:55 AM and reconvened at 1:15 PM.

Frank Nesmith, Idaho Department of Fish & Game: Enforcement Bureau Chief Nesmith visited with the Board and observed the proceedings for the remainder of the afternoon.

JAMK, Inc., Jim Criner, DA/Ron Gras, Guide: Mr. Criner appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing relative to the conduct of outfitted activities by JAMK, Inc., without having obtained their 1992-93 outfitter license, and for hiring unlicensed guides. As a result of the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) Mr. Criner did, in fact, conduct outfitted business on the Henry's Fork of the Snake River without having first obtained a valid outfitter license, and 2) guides for Bud Lilly's

Trout Shop did conduct guided fishing trips for the outfitter on the Henry's Fork without having first obtained valid guide licenses. Conclusions of Law are that these acts violate the provisions of Idaho Code Section 36-2113(a)(9) and Board Rules and Regulations, Rule 002(ss). Pursuant to this information, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT BASED ON THE FACT IT APPEARS THERE WAS SOME CONFUSION AND DELAY IN THE BOARD OFFICE REGARDING THE ISSUANCE THE OUTFITTER LICENSE, AND THAT THE MAJORITY OF THE REQUIRED MATERIALS WERE RECEIVED BY THE BOARD IN A TIMELY MANNER, THAT THE CHARGE OF OUTFITTING WITHOUT A LICENSE BE DISMISSED. FURTHER, THAT JAMK, INC., BE FINED \$250.00, IN LIEU OF REVOCATION OF THE OUTFITTER LICENSE, FOR HIRING AN UNLICENSED GUIDE. Administrative Note: Board attorney is instructed to contact Ron Gras to negotiate a stipulated settlement for allegedly guiding without a license.

Chukar Hunting: The Board directs the Executive Director to research Board records to determine those persons who have incidental or minor chukar hunting activities in association with their outfitter license, and to prepare a form letter to be distributed to those licensees to assist the Board in determining what volume of this type hunting activity is taking place. Draft letter to be evaluated with chairman and other Board members.

Guide Licenses: The Board reviewed the guide licenses issued since the last meeting. Pursuant to the review, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THESE LICENSES BE APPROVED AS ISSUED.

Complaints: The Board reviewed complaints received since the last meeting. After review and discussion, the Board approves the actions that have been taken by the Executive Director in relation to these complaints.

Michael C. Johnson: Ted Epley, Epley's Whitewater Adventures, presented a letter to the Board informing them that Mr. Johnson was no longer employed by Epley's Whitewater Adventures, effective September 15, 1992. Mr. Epley stated that he had purchased Mr. Johnson's 1992-93 guide license, as he does for all his employees, and has Johnson's original license in his possession. Epley then asked the Board whether he should turn the license into the Board or retain it for his records. Following discussion among the Board members, and with Board counsel Steve Scanlin, Mr. Epley was directed to surrender the license to the Board office, which he did.

Larry Jarrett/Mike Popp/Forrest Wimer: Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis advised the Board of an ongoing investigation involving Larry Jarrett, Mike Popp, and Forrest Wimer. Following this review, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT MR. JARRETT BE CITED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 5:20 PM.

Emergency Board Meeting

An emergency meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was held on Friday, December 11, 1992, at 1:00 P.M. The meeting was called at this time because a majority of Board members were still in Boise attending the IOGA and America Outdoors conventions. Those in attendance included Chairman Dale Baird, Vice-Chairman Ted Epley, members Leo Crane and John A.K. Barker, Executive Director Dean Sangrey, Board Attorney Steve Scanlin, IOGA Executive Director Grant Simonds, and IOGA Vice-President Jim Thrash.


