APPROVED MINUTES

Board Meeting - June 28 - July 1, 1993
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened in Boise, Idaho, on Monday, June 28, 1993, at 8:30 AM, with all members present. Also present are Board's Executive Director Dean Sangrey, Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis, and Deputy Attorney General Steve Scanlin.

Financial Report: After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE FINANCIAL REPORT AS OF THE END OF MAY, 1993, BE ACCEPTED.

Review of Guide Licenses Issued: Following a review and discussion of the new guide licenses issued since May 1, 1993, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THESE LICENSES BE APPROVED.

Minutes of April 27-29 Meeting: After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Epley) THAT THESE MINUTES BE APPROVED.

Executive Director: The Board reviewed the actions taken by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board since the last meeting. Following review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THESE ACTIONS BE APPROVED.

Deputy Attorney General Steve Scanlin: Mr. Scanlin reviewed and updated the Board as to pending legal matters.

IDAPA Rule 04.25.01.072.: The Board reviewed a draft rule dealing with election of Board officers. Following review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker)(Crane-nay, Kovalicky-aye, Epley-aye, Barker-aye, Baird-aye) THAT THIS PROPOSAL BE APPROVED BY THE BOARD, WITH THE RULE TO BECOME EFFECTIVE UPON COMPLETION OF THE PROMULGATION PROCESS, AND INCORPORATING THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS: 1) THAT THE TERM OF OFFICE SHALL BE TWO YEARS; 2) ALL BOARD OFFICER SERVICE WILL BE LIMITED TO TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS; AND 3) NO PROXY VOTES WILL BE ALLOWED. **Administrative note:** This rule should be promulgated under the new administrative procedures act.

Enforcement Report: Enforcement Coordinator Al Lewis gave a report regarding the status of current enforcement efforts and cases pending before the Board.

Board adjourned for lunch at 11:40 AM, and reconvened at 1:30 PM.

Bob McManus: The Board reviewed a guide license application for Mr. McManus, noting that he has been convicted for violation of Fish and Game law regarding the purchase of a wrong class license.

After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH THE NORMAL TERMS OF PROBATION THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED FOR THE LICENSE, AND THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Jim Montana: The Board reviewed an application from Jim Montana for a guide license, noting that he had submitted an altered first aid card, and has now voluntarily withdrawn his license request from further consideration. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS GUIDE LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED AND THAT BEFORE THE BOARD CONSIDERS ANY FUTURE APPLICATIONS FOR A GUIDE LICENSE, MR. MONTANA WILL BE REQUIRED TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD FOR A PERSONAL INTERVIEW.

Lawrence Voss: Mr. Scanlin had been instructed to work for a negotiated settlement with Mr. Voss regarding the earlier denial of his designated agent license for supplying false information to the Board. In lieu of a denial or revocation hearing, Mr. Voss agreed to a stipulated settlement that he will be issued a probationary license for the '93-'94 and '94-'95 seasons. After a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS AGREEMENT BE ACCEPTED.

Spencer Van Meter: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Van Meter, noting that he indicated on his application that he was convicted for a Fish and Game violation in Montana in 1992. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED CONTINGENT UPON MR. VAN METER PAYING AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE OF \$300.00.

Matt Purvis: Mr. Purvis met with the Board to discuss his guide license application for employment with Jeff Bitton. Mr. Purvis stated he had been charged with a felony in 1988 and received a withheld judgement following satisfactory completion of a three year probation, which included payment of a fine, court costs, and restitution. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT MR. PURVIS' 1993-94 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH THE STIPULATED TERMS OF PROBATION THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED FOR THIS LICENSE, AND THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS. **Administrative note:** Mr. Purvis is encouraged to take advantage of any instructional courses to further his appreciation of the outdoors and the outfitting industry.

The meeting adjourned at 5:15 PM, and reconvened on Tuesday, June 29, 1993, at 8:30 AM. Board member Ted Epley absent.

Forrest Wimer: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Forrest Wimer for employment with Flying B Ranch. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED BASED ON A PREVIOUS DENIAL OF AN APPLICATION FOR A 1992-93 GUIDE LICENSE, WHICH IS CURRENTLY UNDER APPEAL.

John Collins: The Board reviewed a 1993-94 guide license application for Mr. Collins, noting he indicated he had been convicted in 1981 for a violation of Fish and Game law for fishing without a license. Following review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED ON A PROBATIONARY BASIS WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Menogyn - YMCA Wilderness Adventures: The Board reviewed a request from Menogyn for exemption from licensing in accordance with § 36-2103, Idaho Code. They are proposing a three week backpacking trip in the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness, and are also coordinating details of the trip with the Moose Creek Ranger District. After reviewing the application and related support documentation, the Executive Director is instructed to advise Menogyn that their operation does fulfill the criteria for exemption under § 36-2103, and therefore, an outfitter's license is not required.

Ron and Susan Sherer: Mr. and Mrs. Sherer appeared before the Board in a show cause re-hearing regarding their respective outfitter and guide licenses. At the conclusion of the hearing, it was the Board's determination the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law remain the same as established at the initial hearing. In addition to this conclusion, the Board finds that mitigating circumstances exist relative to the additional testimony presented by the Sherers at this hearing. Pursuant to these findings, a motion was made by Crane THAT THE PENALTIES ASSESSED BE ADJUSTED AS FOLLOWS: THE \$1000.00 FINE ASSESSED AGAINST RON SHERER'S OUTFITTER LICENSE BE REDUCED TO \$500.00, AND THE \$500.00 FINE ASSESSED AGAINST SUSAN SHERER'S GUIDE LICENSE BE RESCINDED WITH NO FURTHER SANCTIONS PLACED ON HER LICENSE. Motion failed for lack of a second. Following further discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) (Crane-nay, Kovalicky-aye, Barker-aye, Baird-aye) THAT RON SHERER BE FINED A TOTAL OF \$750.00, AND ALL PENALTIES ASSESSED AGAINST THE LICENSE OF SUSAN SHERER BE RESCINDED.

Darl Allred: Mr. Allred appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing regarding his recent conviction for violation of Idaho Fish & Game law. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Findings of Fact

were established that Mr. Allred 1) was convicted for two violations of Fish and Game law, and 2) these convictions constitute a violation of Idaho Outfitter and Guide law and rule as set forth in the complaint. Pursuant to these findings, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT MR. ALLRED BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00 ON EACH OF THE TWO COUNTS, WITH NO FURTHER RESTRICTIONS ON HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE.

The meeting adjourned at 11:52 AM, and reconvened at 1:05 PM.

Jeff Peavey, dba Northwest Voyageurs: Mr. Peavey appeared before the Board in a show cause re-hearing regarding his conviction for employing an unlicensed guide. At the conclusion of the re-hearing, it was the Board's determination the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law remain the same as found at the original hearing. In consideration of the testimony provided by Mr. Peavey, the Board finds there are mitigating circumstances relating to this matter, and as a result, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE FINE ORIGINALLY ASSESSED AT \$750.00 BE REDUCED TO \$300.00, AND THAT THIS FINE MUST BE PAID PRIOR TO THE ISSUANCE OF ANY FUTURE OUTFITTER LICENSE FOR NORTHWEST VOYAGEURS.

Nanette Edmundson-Klingback: The Board reviewed an outfitter license application submitted by Nanette and Todd Edmundson-Klingback for the conduct of trailrides and overnight pack trips in the Garden Valley area. Following a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE AT THE CONCLUSION OF ADDITIONAL REVIEW WITH THE EMMETT RANGER DISTRICT REGARDING COORDINATION OF POSSIBLE CAMPSITE USE AND OTHER ISSUES INVOLVING POTENTIAL CONFLICTS WITH EXISTING OUTFITTERS. (Addendum #1)

North Fork Ranger District, Clearwater National Forest: The Board reviewed the decision rendered by North Fork District Ranger Art Bourassa regarding the petition and resulting EA conducted on commercial floating activities on the North Fork of the Clearwater River. After discussion, the Board directs that the Executive Director correspond with Mr. Borasso and arrange for him to attend the August Board meeting to discuss this matter further.

Jerry Myers, Silver Cloud Expeditions: The Board reviewed an exemption request submitted by Jerry Myers to run 2-person kayaks without a guide in the boat. After a review and discussion, the Executive Director is instructed to advise Silver Cloud Expeditions that their proposed activity is allowed under current rules and no special exemption is necessary.

Eastern Washington University: The Board reviewed a letter from EWU requesting a waiver of the provisions of Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rule 122, relating to non-use of their outfitter license, for the 1993-94 license year. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS WAIVER BE GRANTED.

The Board meeting adjourned at 5:35 PM, and reconvened at 8:30 AM, Wednesday, June 30, 1993, with all Board members present.

Gary Shipley: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Shipley, noting he was convicted for violating Idaho Fish and Game law in 1992 for using a barbed hook while steelhead fishing. Following review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) (Crane-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Barker-nay, Epley-aye, Baird-aye) THAT MR. SHIPLEY'S 1993-94 GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH THE TERMS OF PROBATION THAT NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE APPROVED FOR HIS LICENSE, AND THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAWS DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Edwin Dickson: The Board met with Mr. Dickson to review his designated agent license application for employment with Jim Folk, dba: Diamond Jim Charters. Mr. Dickson's application indicates he was convicted on a felony drug charge in 1986. Since his conviction, he has satisfactorily completed all terms of his court ordered probation and has acquired his Master Coast Guard license. Following a thorough a review and discussion with Mr. Dickson, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1993-94 LICENSE YEAR, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR HIS LICENSE DURING THE PROBATIONARY PERIOD, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994. (Addendum #2)

Ed Leavitt/Bob Bartels, dba: South Fork Outfitters: The Board reviewed a written proposal submitted by Mr. Leavitt and Mr. Bartels regarding their interest in applying for an outfitter license. Their proposal would incorporate an area which is presently licensed to another outfitter. After review and discussion, the Executive Director was instructed to respond to the applicants and advise them that a review of Board records indicates there are no grounds for adjustment of this operating area under the non-use provisions. Current records show that more than zero use has occurred for at least two of the past three years.

Michael Shane Gilbert: Mr. Gilbert appeared in a denial hearing before the Board regarding his application for a 1993-94 guide

license. As a result of testimony provided during the hearing, the following Finding of Fact was established: 1) Mr. Gilbert was convicted for violation of Idaho Fish & Game law in 1990 for possession of unlawfully taken elk. Conclusions of Law: 1) This conviction constitutes a violation of § 36-2113(a)(6), Idaho Code, and Board Rule 002(ss). Pursuant to these findings, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT THE BOARD SUSTAIN ITS DENIAL OF MR. GILBERT'S GUIDE LICENSE. **Administrative note:** This denial is without prejudice, and the Board would consider future guide license applications from Mr. Gilbert, if submitted.

Lynn Tomlinson: Mr. Tomlinson met with the Board to discuss an outfitter license application to conduct various recreational activities in the Dubois, Idaho, area. It was noted during the discussion that Mr. Tomlinson has recently been convicted of a violation of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Act for outfitting without a license. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) THAT MR. TOMLINSON'S LICENSE BE APPROVED FOR TRAILRIDES AND INCIDENTAL FISHING ONLY. FURTHER, THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT MR. TOMLINSON NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1997, OR UNTIL THE \$5,000.00 FINE OWED TO THE LICENSING BOARD THAT WAS ASSESSED AGAINST MR. TOMLINSON BY THE MAGISTRATE COURT, HAS BEEN PAID IN FULL. **Administrative note:** Mr. Tomlinson's license to be issued qualified to guide. (Addendum #3)

The meeting adjourned at 11:45 AM, and reconvened at 1:10 PM.

Waldemar Hirner: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Hirner for employment with Silver Creek Outfitters, noting that staff investigation has determined Mr. Hirner submitted an altered first aid card with his application. Subsequently, he has completed a first aid class and submitted a valid card to the Board office. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Epley) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS. Upon further consideration of the foregoing motion, MSC (Crane--Epley) that the previous action be rescinded, and following further discussion, MSC (Kovalicky-Barker) THAT MR. HIRNER'S GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION UPON PAYMENT OF A \$300.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FINE.

Rich Cook, dba: Cook's Idaho Outfitters: Mr. Cook and his attorney, Mr. Jon Wyman, appeared before the Board in a denial hearing regarding his amendment request for operating area boundary

adjustment with Shepp Ranch. After a review and discussion of the issues, noting that efforts by the Executive Director to assist with a negotiated settlement had been unsuccessful, the denial hearing was terminated. The Board recommended that Mr. Cook, along with Paul Resnick and Ginny Hopfenbeck of Shepp Ranch, make another attempt at a negotiated settlement over the disputed boundary. If this is not possible, the matter will be brought back before the Board as a formal hearing, with all parties present, at a date to be determined.

Armacost/Zanelli/Sword Partnership - Alan Odegaard: Mr. Odegaard is proposing to purchase the powerboating outfitter business currently operated by the Armacost/Zanelli/Sword partnership on the SN12 and SN14 sections of the Snake River. Pursuant to a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED WITH THE OUTFITTER'S LICENSE ISSUED TO ALAN ODEGAARD, dba ALAN AND DEBRA ODEGAARD, WITH ALAN LICENSED QUALIFIED TO GUIDE ON SN14 ONLY. (Addendum #4)

Ralph Hlebak: Mr. Hlebak appeared before the Board in a denial hearing regarding his 1993-94 guide license application for employment with Bressler Outfitters. At the conclusion of testimony in the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) Mr. Hlebak did alter his American Red Cross first aid card to indicate a later date of issuance, 2) this card appears to have been valid at the time of submission with his license. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) this act constitutes a violation of § 36-2113(a)(1), Idaho Code, and Board Rule 102. Pursuant to these findings MSC (Kovalicky--Barker)(Crane-nay, Kovalicky-aye, Barker-aye, Baird-aye) THAT THE BOARD RESCIND ITS ORIGINAL DENIAL OF THIS LICENSE AND APPROVE THE ISSUANCE OF MR. HLEBAK'S GUIDE LICENSE, NON-RESTRICTED, UPON PAYMENT OF A \$300.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FINE.

Barker River Trips, Inc.: The Board reviewed an amendment request submitted by Barker River Trips, Inc., for the addition of various hunting activities within the current boundaries of their approved operating area. After review and discussion, it was the Board's decision to hold this amendment until further research is completed with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game.

Ben Franklin/Nancy Feagin/Mary Shrier-Chinn/Brent Leavell/John C. Smith/Charles Briggs/Alex Lowe: The Board reviewed this group of guide license applications for technical mountaineering/rock climbing, noting the various responses received from Technical Advisory Committee members. After review and discussion, MSC

(Kovalicky--Barker) THAT 1) LICENSES BE ISSUED AS REQUESTED FOR BEN FRANKLIN, NANCY FEAGIN, AND ALEX LOWE, AND 2) THE APPLICATIONS FOR MARY SHRIER-CHINN, BRENT LEAVELL, JOHN C. SMITH, AND CHARLES BRIGGS BE DENIED BASED ON RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

Technical Mountaineering/Rock Climbing Licenses: The Board reviewed the general classification of technical mountaineering licenses and evaluated a proposal submitted by Kirk Bachman regarding possible establishment of different classes of mountaineering licenses. Following this discussion, the Executive Director is instructed to set up a meeting date with all members of the Board's Technical Advisory Committee to review possible solutions to this problem. In the interim, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THE BOARD DECLARE A MORATORIUM ON ISSUING "LIMITED" TECHNICAL MOUNTAINEERING/ROCK CLIMBING LICENSES TO ANYONE WHO DOES NOT HAVE COMPLETE AND TOTAL EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING AS DETERMINED BY THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 5:10 PM, and reconvened at 8:14 AM, Thursday, July 1, 1993. All members present except Mr. Epley.

Harry Knox: Mr. Knox met with the Board to review his 1993-94 guide application for employment with Stan Potts. As noted in previous license application reviews for Mr. Knox, he has a felony conviction for violation of federal banking regulations. He has apparently completed all required restitution assignments as imposed by the court, however, he is still on active probation with the Federal District Court regarding this matter. Additionally, Mr. Knox has been before the Board several times in the past to discuss guide licensing opportunities, and has indicated a strong desire to continue his avocation as a bighorn sheep hunting guide. After review and discussion, MSF (Barker--Crane)(Crane-aye, Kovalicky-nay, Barker-nay, Baird-nay) THAT MR. KNOX'S APPLICATION BE APPROVED, PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, NO AMENDMENTS BE APPROVED FOR HIS LICENSE, AND THE TERM OF PROBATION RUN UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HIS FEDERAL COURT PROBATION HAS BEEN SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED. **Administrative note:** Mr. Knox to be advised that the Board feels as long as he is on probation with the Federal court, he should not be licensed as a guide. The Board will consider a future application once that probation is completed.

Board member Epley joined the meeting at 11:30 AM.

Executive Session: MSC (Kovalicky--Crane)(Crane-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Barker-aye, Epley-aye, Baird-aye) THAT IN ACCORDANCE WITH §

67-1234, IDAHO CODE, THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS PERSONNEL MATTERS. The Board went into Executive Session at 11:35 AM, and came out of Executive Session at 11:50 AM with no decisions made.

Ted Epley: Member Ted Epley advised the Board he will be temporarily leaving his position on the Board for a period of time while he works to resolve his problems with the U.S. Forest Service.

Three Rivers Ranch, Inc., Lonnie Allen, DA: Ms. Allen met with the Board to review additional details relating to their request to add addition reaches on the lower section of the South Fork of the Snake River. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT 1) THERE IS A CONCERN THAT POTENTIAL SOCIAL AND RESOURCE IMPACTS REGARDING THIS PROPOSAL HAVE NOT YET BEEN ADEQUATELY ADDRESSED, 2) THE PETITION BE DENIED, AND 3) THREE RIVERS RANCH BE DIRECTED TO DETERMINE AN ALTERNATIVE PROPOSAL THAT IS MORE ACCEPTABLE TO ALL PARTIES INVOLVED. THE BOARD WILL CONTINUE TO ASSIST IN THIS ENDEAVOR.

Logger's Survival/Wilderness Medicine Institute First Aid Courses: The Board reviewed a course curriculum for both Logger's Survival and Wilderness Medicine Institute first aid courses. Following review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THESE TWO COURSES BE ACCEPTED AS ADEQUATE FIRST AID COURSES WHICH MEET THE INTENT OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES ACT.

Meat Packing: The Board discussed the issue of meat packing as a licenseable activity. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane)(Crane-aye, Kovalicky-nay, Barker-aye, Baird-aye) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND BOARD'S ATTORNEY BE INSTRUCTED TO IMPLEMENT A TEMPORARY RULE ADDING THE DEFINITION OF HUNTING TO THE CURRENT OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD RULES, SPECIFYING HUNTING SHALL MEAN THE PURSUIT OF ANY GAME ANIMALS OR BIRDS, AND ALL RELATED ACTIVITIES INCLUDING PACKING OF CAMP EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES, GAME MEAT AND CLIENTS TO AND FROM THE HUNTING AREA. **Administrative note:** Board staff is instructed to begin necessary proceedings to make this a permanent rule with a final draft and recommendations presented to the Board at the August meeting.

Chukar Hunting: The Board reviewed the research completed by the staff concerning chukar hunting activities as related to current outfitter licenses. Following a review and discussion, Board staff is directed to continue researching this issue with the Department of Fish and Game and other resource managers, concentrating on

identifying possible limits that may need to be placed on this activity.

Executive Director: The Board reviewed the actions taken by the Executive Director with regards to new outfitter licenses approved and issued to Salmon Run River Company, Inc., and Carl Zitlau, dba: Granite Creek Ranch, as well as an amendment request for Exodus Corporation to conduct trailrides in the Meadow Creek area north of New Meadows, Idaho. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THESE ACTIONS. (Addendum's #5, #6, and #7)

Draft Operating Plan: The Board reviewed the draft operating plan for application of rules and statutes by the Board's enforcement personnel and staff. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS DRAFT BE ADOPTED AS THE OFFICIAL POSITION OF THE IDAHO OUTFITTERS AND GUIDES LICENSING BOARD.

Snake River Reciprocity: The Board reviewed the current status of the reciprocity issue on the Snake River between Idaho, Oregon, and Washington. After review and discussion, the Executive Director is instructed to initiate a dialogue with the Governor's office on an enforcement strategy relating to the upcoming steelhead season, paying particular attention to the potential for an influx of non-resident outfitters on the Idaho side of the river on the Idaho/Washington section (Oregon/Washington line downstream to Lewiston) of the Snake River.

Complaints: The Board reviewed the pending complaints as presented by the Executive Director. Following a review and discussion, the Board accepts this report and directs that continued investigation be conducted in those areas that are have not been satisfactorily resolved. The three matters recommended for closure are approved, with no further action necessary.


