APPROVED MINUTES

Board Meeting - August 23 - 25, 1993
Boardroom - Boise, Idaho

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board was convened at 8:30 AM, August 23, 1993, with Chairman Dale Baird and members Leo Crane and Tom Kovalicky present. John A.K. Barker is scheduled to join the meeting tomorrow. Ted Epley is still on a temporary leave of absence. Also present were Executive Director Dean Sangrey, Education/Enforcement Supervisor Bill Vetesy, and Board Attorney Steve Scanlin.

Executive Director: The Executive Director presented a report on special actions he has taken on behalf of the Board since the June meeting regarding the approval and issuance of outfitter licenses. Following a review and discussion of licenses for Jermy Wight, J. Bret Silver, Tom Ide, Craig Wright, Johnson/Downing Partnership, and Que Hansen, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THESE ACTIONS BE APPROVED. (Addendum's 1 thru 6)

Education/Enforcement Report: Bill Vetesy, the Board's newly appointed Education/Enforcement Supervisor, presented his report to the Board. He reported on several cases currently being addressed by his bureau, and also outlined the initial steps he has taken in evaluating the present structure of the Board's enforcement program, and in the development of an educational program for the Board. The Board accepted his report and encouraged him to proceed with his efforts.

The Board adjourned for lunch at 12:00 PM and reconvened at 1:30 PM.

Richard Escott, Idaho Adventures, Inc.: The Board reviewed a request from Mr. Escott for a waiver of the non-use rule in regard to his power boating and fishing activities for the 1993-94 season due to recuperation and rehabilitation from surgery. After review and discussion of his doctor's report, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS WAIVER BE GRANTED.

Martin Baler: The Board reviewed a guide license application from Mr. Baler to guide trailrides, wagonrides, and incidental fishing activities for Moose Creek Ranch, Inc. Mr. Baler's file indicates he was convicted for violations of fish and game laws in 1989 and 1991. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED.

Jake Strohmeier: The Board reviewed an application from Mr. Strohmeier for renewal of his guide license with Chamberlain Basin Outfitters. A review of the file indicates that he was convicted of violating Federal migratory bird regulations in January, 1993. Following a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR HIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Chris Daniels: The Board reviewed a 1993-94 guide license application from Mr. Daniels for employment with Castle Creek Outfitters. A review of the records showed that Mr. Daniels had been convicted of violating fish & game regulations in 1985. He also had answered "no" to this question on his application regarding these types of violations. After a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED.

Chris Perin: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Chris Perin for employment with Gordon Frost. Mr. Perin indicated on his application that he was convicted for a violation of wildlife regulations in Oregon in 1990, and he also submitted a letter of explanation. In reviewing this information, it was noted that Mr. Perin has completed 80 hours of community service as part of his restitution for this violation. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION. (Crane - aye; Kovalicky - aye; Baird - nay.)

Joe Foster: The Board reviewed a guide application submitted by Mr. Foster for employment with Flying Resort Ranches, Inc., noting that he indicated on his application that he had never been convicted of fish and game violations. Further research of the records identified a conviction in 1992 for failing to carry license on his person. After a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED.

Michael Branson: The Board reviewed a guide license application from Mr. Branson for employment with J. Bret Pond. Mr. Branson admitted on his application that he'd been convicted in 1977 of fishing in a section of stream that was closed to fishing in Butte County. After a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

Mike G. Macfarlane: The Board reviewed an application from Mr. Macfarlane for employment with J. Bret Pond, noting on his application he indicated he had no convictions for felonies or fish and wildlife violations. However, further investigation revealed an apparent felony conviction in the state of Utah. The Board directs the enforcement staff to investigate the matter further. If no felony record is confirmed, the Executive Director is instructed to issue this guide license.

Richard F. LaRocco: The Board reviewed a guide license application for Mr. LaRocco to guide for J. Bret Pond. A review of the file indicates he has been convicted of a violation of fish and wildlife law in the state of Utah, and that he submitted a letter of explanation. Staff investigation corroborates the information in Mr. LaRocco's letter. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT MR. LAROCCO'S GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY UPON COMPLETION OF HIS APPLICATION.

Jon Huffaker: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Jon Huffaker for employment with Mile High Outfitters. It was noted that Mr. Huffaker indicated he'd been convicted on two violations of fish and game laws in 1979 and 1984. This issue was first addressed a year ago when the Board reviewed his application for a 1992-93 guide application. After review and discussion, MS (Kovalicky--Baird) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED. After additional discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR THIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Robert Wiley: The Board reviewed a guide license application for Mr. Wiley for employment with Anderson Outfitting. Mr. Wiley indicated on his application he'd been convicted in 1991 for hunting with an unplugged shotgun and was fined \$25.00. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR HIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Terry Saba: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Saba for employment with Wapiti Meadows Ranch. Mr. Saba indicated he was convicted for a violation of fish and game regulations in the fall of 1992, and paid a \$25.00 fine. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR HIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Shawn Keppner: The Board reviewed a guide license application for Mr. Keppner for employment with Mile High Outfitters. Mr. Keppner indicated he'd been convicted of a fish and game violation for shooting a goose without a Federal stamp in a closed area. A check of Idaho F&G records could not confirm this information. The Board directs that this license be issued unrestricted.

Board adjourned for the evening at 5:00 PM, and reconvened on Tuesday, August 24, 1993, at 8:30 AM with Board members Dale Baird, Tom Kovalicky and Leo Crane, present. Also present were the Board's executive director, and attorney.

Ray Baier: The Executive Director reported to the Board on an investigation into a suspected violation of Board rules by licensed outfitter Ray Baier for conducting trailride operations outside of his assigned operating area. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT MR. BAIER BE CITED TO APPEAR IN A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AT THE DECEMBER, 1993, BOARD MEETING TO ADDRESS THIS MATTER.

Guide Licenses: The Board reviewed the record of guide licenses issued by the office since the last Board meeting in June. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE ISSUANCE OF THESE LICENSES BE APPROVED.

Bogus Creek Outfitters, Bob LaVelle, DA/Mile High Outfitters, Jerry Jeppson, DA: The Board reviewed the current status of the dispute between Bogus Creek Outfitters and Mile High Outfitters relative to a complaint of mistreatment of animals. The parties tried to negotiate a settlement through the alternative dispute resolution process, but this was not successful. Mr. Jeppson has since indicated an interest in pursuing another avenue to try to resolve the issue. Following review and discussion of this information, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE \$5000.00 FINE ASSESSED AGAINST BOGUS CREEK OUTFITTERS BE RESCINDED.

Alison Nelson, McCall Ranger District: The Board met with Alison Nelson, Resource Assistant for the McCall Ranger District, Payette National Forest, to discuss the current status of the Brundage Mountain Company snow cat skiing expansion proposal. Following this discussion and review with Ms. Nelson, the Board directed that the Forest Supervisor for the Payette National Forest be advised the Board considers this expansion proposal to be a "new opportunity" under the guidelines of the memorandum of understanding (MOU), and that the Board does not intend to take action with regard to issuing an outfitter license for this operation until such time as the Forest Service has completed their NEPA evaluation and a preferred alternative is identified.

Board adjourned for lunch at 12:45 PM, and reconvened at 1:30 PM.

Forrest Wimer: Mr. Wimer came before the Board in a denial hearing regarding his 1993-94 guide license application. At the conclusion of the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) Mr. Wimer was cited for violation of Idaho Fish and Game laws, 2) he was given a withheld judgement, and ordered to pay court costs and restitution, and was also ordered to serve two years probation in relation to the withheld judgement, and 3) Mr. Wimer has satisfactorily completed his probation and subsequently all charges have been dismissed. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: 1) a withheld judgement does constitute a conviction under Idaho Outfitter and Guide law, and 2) conviction for violation of fish and game laws is grounds for denial of an outfitter or guide license. After review and discussion of these findings, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT IN VIEW OF THE FACT THE FISH AND GAME VIOLATION OCCURRED OVER FIVE YEARS AGO, AND THE TERMS OF PROBATION UNDER THE WITHHELD JUDGEMENT HAVE BEEN COMPLETELY SATISFIED, MR. WIMER'S 1993-94 GUIDE LICENSE SHOULD BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR THIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Meeting adjourned at 5:15 PM, and reconvened on Wednesday, August 25, 1993, at 8:30 AM. Board members Baird, Kovalicky and Crane were present, along with Executive Director, Dean Sangrey.

John Rose, Bar 44 Outfitters: The Board reviewed the outfitter license file for Mr. Rose, noting that he has been convicted for two violations of Forest Service regulations. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT MR. ROSE BE CITED TO APPEAR FOR A SHOW CAUSE HEARING AT THE DECEMBER, 1993, BOARD MEETING TO ADDRESS THIS MATTER. Administrative note: Any proposal for a potential business sale prior to the December hearing should be carefully scrutinized, and the Board advised.

Spencer Van Meter: The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Van Meter requesting reconsideration of the penalty assessed against him pertaining to his conviction for violation of Montana Fish and Wildlife regulations. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Baird) THAT IN CONSIDERATION OF MR. VAN METER'S ADDITIONAL LETTER OF EXPLANATION REGARDING THIS SITUATION, THE ORIGINAL FINE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00 BE REDUCED TO \$100.00. (Baird - aye; Crane - aye; Kovalicky - nay).

Financial Report: The Board reviewed the monthly financial reports for June and July. Following this review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THESE REPORTS AS PRESENTED.

Fiscal Year 1995 Budget: Executive Director presented the proposed FY95 budget for Board consideration. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT AND SUPPORT THIS BUDGET RECOMMENDATION, WITH INSTRUCTIONS THAT THE ENHANCEMENT PORTION FOR THE NEW EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM BUDGET BE INCREASED TO THE \$10/\$12,000.00 RANGE.

Kevin Lincoln: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Lincoln for employment with Birch Creek Outfitters, noting he has been convicted for violation of fish and game regulations for shooting waterfowl after hours. Following review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY, WITH TERMS OF PROBATION THAT MR. LINCOLN NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR THIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1994.

Richard B. Walton: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Walton, noting he was convicted for a violation of fish and game law in 1981. After a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED WITHOUT RESTRICTION.

Further, he should be advised that if he has any further questions regarding this matter, to advise the Board accordingly.

Sherry Nygaard/Cindy Burgeson: The Board reviewed a letter of complaint against Sherry Nygaard, dba: Lochsa River Outfitters, submitted by Ms. Cindy Burgeson. The complaint deals with a trailride that Ms. Burgeson booked in July, 1993, which was not completed satisfactorily. The Director has communicated with both Sherry Nygaard and Cindy Burgeson by letter and expects to receive a response to the allegations in the near future. The matter will be pursued further at that time.


