FEBRUARY 28 - MARCH 2, 1994**

APPROVED MINUTES

The regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board convened at 8:30 AM, February 28, 1994 with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, Board Attorney, Steve Scanlin, and Board Education/Enforcement Supervisor, Bill Vetesy.

Executive Session: Pursuant to Section 67-2345(1)(d), Idaho Code, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION at 8:35 AM TO DISCUSS PERSONNEL MATTERS. Board came out of Executive Session at 8:45 AM with no decisions made.

Financial Report: The Board reviewed the current financial reports as presented by the Executive Director. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Crane) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE FINANCIAL REPORT.

December Minutes: After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THESE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

Scott Minter: The Board reviewed and discussed the draft memorandum from the McCall Ranger District relating to the issuance of a special use permit to Scott Minter for operations on the Payette National Forest. Following this review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker, Epley abstained) THAT MR. MINTER'S IDAHO OUTFITTER LICENSE BE ACTIVATED TO PROVIDE HIM THE LEGAL BASIS FOR ADVERTISING AND BOOKING POTENTIAL CLIENTS AND HE BE INFORMED THAT ISSUANCE OF THIS LICENSE DOES NOT AUTHORIZE HIM TO OPERATE ON NATIONAL FOREST LAND WITHOUT THE BENEFIT OF A SPECIAL USE PERMIT ISSUED BY THAT AGENCY.

Board Attorney: Deputy Attorney General Steve Scanlin reported to the Board relative to ongoing legal matters. Part of this discussion dealt with contracting an independent hearing officer to handle the Epley disciplinary matter. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker, Epley abstained) THAT THE BOARD TAKE NECESSARY STEPS TO CONTRACT WITH MS. JEAN URANGA TO SERVE AS AN INDEPENDENT HEARING OFFICER TO ADDRESS THE COMPLAINT AGAINST MR. EPLEY.

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Education/Enforcement Supervisor: Bill Vetesy presented his report to the Board regarding the current status of issues relating to the Education/Enforcement program. The Board commended Mr. Vetesy for his successful efforts in developing and organizing various strategies relating to the conduct of the enforcement program for the Board, and the significant accomplishments in developing professional relationships with his peers in other state and federal agencies. He was also complimented on his successful completion of his six month probationary period with the Board.

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:30 AM and reconvened at 1:30 PM with the Idaho Senate Resources and Environment Committee at the Statehouse to participate in the confirmation hearing for Licensing Board member Leo Crane. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Board returned to the Licensing Board office to continue with scheduled Board business.

Little Salmon River Petition: The Director presented an update for the Board on the responses and input received relative to the petition being evaluated for proposed float boating activities on the Little Salmon River. Following review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THE BOARD DENY THE PETITION FOR EXTENDING OUTFITTED FLOAT BOATING ACTIVITIES TO THE LITTLE SALMON RIVER. THIS DENIAL IS BASED UPON RECOMMENDATIONS AND COMMENTS RECEIVED FROM THE SOUTHWEST REGION OFFICE, IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME.

Rick Peverly: The Board conducted an interview with Mr. Peverly and his wife Lisa, regarding the proposal to license Mr. Peverly as a designated agent for Birch Creek Outfitters. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT MR. PEVERLY'S DESIGNATED AGENT LICENSE APPLICATION BE APPROVED. (Addendum #1)

Bargamin Creek Outfitting Area: The Director presented a report to the Board on final recommendations for reallocation of the operating area formally licensed to G&L York Outfitters. The proposed redistribution involves allocating the area among the surrounding outfitters, which includes Zeke West, Whitewater Ranch; David Ash, Indian Meadows Outpost and Pack Station; Archie George, Red River Corrals; and LaMont Anderson, Eakin Ridge Outfitters. Following a discussion of the information presented, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE PROPOSED BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENTS BE ACCEPTED AND APPROVED AS PRESENTED. (Addendum: #2, #3, #4 and #5)

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 PM, and reconvened at 8:30 AM, March 1, 1994, with all Board members present.

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Paul Resnick, Shepp Ranch/Rich Cook, Cook's Idaho Outfitters: Mr. Paul Resnick and Mr. Rich Cook appeared before the Board for a rehearing of the issues regarding the operating area boundary adjustment between Shepp Ranch and Cook's Idaho Outfitters. At the conclusion of the hearing, and after considering all testimony presented, the Board finds that no compelling evidence has been presented and there was no error which would cause the Board to consider changing their original determination. Therefore, MSC (Kovalicky--Epley) (Crane-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Epley-aye, Barker-nay, Baird-aye) THAT THE ORIGINAL DECISION OF THE BOARD IS HEREBY SUSTAINED.

Edd Woslum and John Bambacigno: Mr. Woslum and Mr. Bambacigno appeared before the Board in a combined show cause hearing regarding possible disciplinary action against Mr. Woslum's outfitter license and Mr. Bambacigno's guide license. At the conclusion of the testimony, the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law were established: Findings of Fact, 1) Mr. Bambacigno pled guilty to a violation of Idaho Fish and Game law, to wit, transportation of an improperly tagged deer; 2) this action constitutes a violation of § 36-2113(a)(5)(6)(14), Idaho Code, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rule 010; and 3) under the provisions of Rule 012.4, Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules, Mr. Woslum is responsible for the actions of his guide, Mr. Bambacigno, and therefore this constitutes a violation of the provisions of § 36-2113(a)(5)(14), Idaho Code, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rule 012.4. Conclusions of Law are: 1) Mr. Bambacigno is guilty of violating Idaho Fish and Game laws; and 2) Mr. Woslum is guilty of unethical/unprofessional conduct in that he did not properly instruct his guide regarding Idaho Fish and Game rules and regulations. Pursuant to these findings, MF (Barker) THAT MR. BAMBACIGNO BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00, AND A LETTER OF REPRIMAND PLACED IN HIS FILE. FURTHER, THAT EDD WOSLUM BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00 AND NO FURTHER ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST HIS LICENSES. MSF (Crane--Epley) THAT MR. WOSLUM BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$150.00, AND THAT IF MR. BAMBACIGNO IS LICENSED IN 1994-95, HE BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE. (Barker-nay, Epley-aye, Crane-aye, Kovalicky-nay, Baird-nay) MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT MR. WOSLUM BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300.00, AND THAT THE GUIDE'S LICENSE OF MR. BAMBACIGNO BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1994-95 SEASON. (Crane-nay, Kovalicky-aye, Barker-aye, Epley-nay, Baird-aye).

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:50 AM, and reconvened at 1:40 PM, with all Board members present except Ted Epley, who was excused.

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Dave Williams: Mr. Williams appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing regarding alleged violations of outfitter and guide laws. At the conclusion of testimony in this matter, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) Bobcat are not listed on Mr. Williams' license as an authorized species to be hunted; 2) he did actively pursue and take bobcat in relationship to his licensed outfitter activities; and 3) that he did, in fact, have an unprofessional verbal confrontation with Mr. Larry Maxwell, a private citizen. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are: these activities constitute a violation of § 36-2113(a)(5)(8)(14), Idaho Code, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules, rules 002.46 and 007.01. Board member Tom Kovalicky moved that Mr. Williams be fined in the amount of \$500.00 for unethical/unprofessional conduct relating to the episode involving Mr. Maxwell, and that his license be issued probationary for the 1994-95 license year for conducting an activity for which he is not licensed, namely hunting bobcat. Following a discussion of this motion, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THIS MOTION BE TABLED UNTIL A LATER TIME, TO BE RESOLVED BEFORE THE BOARD ADJOURNS.

Frank Nesmith: Idaho Department of Fish & Game Enforcement Bureau Chief Frank Nesmith visited with the Board regarding recent cooperative efforts between our two agencies. He also complimented the Board on the improved working relationship that has evolved with the inception of our new education and enforcement program.

Frankie Valvo: It was noted that the time had arrived for the scheduled show cause hearing for Mr. Valvo. The Director advised that Mr. Valvo had contacted the Board requesting a continuance because he would be out-of-state during this time and would not be available. The Director was instructed to reschedule the hearing during the regular Board meeting in April, and to inform Mr. Valvo he will be expected to appear at that time as there will be no more continuances granted for this hearing.

David "Roy" Carlson: Mr. Carlson appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing regarding allegations that he conducted guided activities in an area for which he was not licensed. Pursuant to testimony provided during the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) Mr. Carlson acted as a guide for the Board's undercover agent during the conduct of an elk hunt on November 1, 2, 5 and 6, 1993; 2) he was employed by licensed outfitter Frankie Valvo at the time these hunts were conducted; and 3) these guided trips occurred in locations not included in Mr. Valvo's assigned operating area. Conclusions of Law are the above actions constitute a violation of § 36-2113(a)(5)(8)(14), Idaho Code, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules, rules

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002.46, 004.04.b, and 007.4. Pursuant to these findings, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT MR. CARLSON'S GUIDE LICENSE BE REVOKED FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE 1993-94 LICENSE YEAR, AND THAT HE NOT BE ISSUED A LICENSE FOR THE 1994-95 LICENSE YEAR.

Travis Tracy: It was noted that the time had arrived for the show cause hearing scheduled for Mr. Tracy. The Director informed the Board that Mr. Tracy had contacted the office by telephone earlier today advising he would be unable to keep his appointment for the show cause hearing because he just got a new job and also doesn't have a drivers license. The Director was instructed to reschedule this hearing during the regular Board meeting in April, and to inform Mr. Tracy that he will be expected to appear at that time as there will be no more continuances granted for this hearing.

The Board adjourned at 5:00 PM, and reconvened at 8:30 AM, March 2, 1994, with all Board members present.

Dave Williams: The matter of the Dave Williams show cause hearing was brought back before the Board for further consideration. Following additional review and discussion MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT MR. WILLIAMS BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500.00 FOR UNETHICAL/UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT RELATING TO THE DISPUTE INVOLVING MR. LARRY MAXWELL, AND THAT HIS OUTFITTER AND GUIDE LICENSES BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1994-95 LICENSE YEAR FOR CONDUCTING THE UNLICENSED ACTIVITY OF HUNTING BOBCAT.

University of Idaho: The Board reviewed information presented by the Director relative to possible non-use of the SA7A and SA7B sections of the Salmon River. As a result of this analysis, and based on notification of non-use received from the University of Idaho, it has been determined that the outfitter license currently held by the University for float boat trips on these sections of the Salmon River should be amended to remove these sections from said license. At the conclusion of this review, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THE UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO'S OUTFITTER LICENSE BE AMENDED TO REMOVE SA7A AND SA7B FROM SAID LICENSE. **Administrative Note:** The Executive Director should begin a review to determine whether or not these sections should be considered for relicensing. (Addendum #6)

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Executive Director: The Board reviewed the following administrative actions taken by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board since the December meeting: **New outfitter licenses approved for Lee Eddins, Bruce Howard, Troy Ginn, and Kathleen Glikzman; sales of businesses approved for Dave Hettinger, and Dave Peterson; and amendments approved for Chris Flanigan, Lonnie Allen, Bob Allen, Rich Cook, The Lodge at Palisades Creek, and Terry Ring.** Following discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THESE ACTIONS BE APPROVED. (Addendum: #7, #8, #9, #10, #11, #12, #13, #14, #15, #16, #17 and #18)

Personal Use Reimbursement Schedules: The Director reported to the Board on negotiations undertaken with the Idaho State Board of Examiners relative to the schedule for reimbursable expenses for Board employees. The Board of Examiners suggested efforts be made to standardize, as much as possible, the reimbursement rates for these types of expenditures for all state agencies. The only agencies affected by this procedure are the Idaho Department of Fish & Game and the Outfitters and Guides Board. An agreement for standardization was reached between the agencies, and the proposed adjustments have been accepted by the Board of Examiners. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky) THAT THESE ADJUSTED RATES BE APPROVED. (Addendum #19)

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:30 AM, and reconvened at 12:45 PM, with all Board members present.

Guide Licenses Issued: The Board reviewed the list of guide licenses issued since the December Board meeting. After review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Barker) THAT THESE LICENSES BE APPROVED.

Tom Willoughby: The Board reviewed an outfitter license application from Tom Willoughby for proposed outfitted activities on private property in the Horseshoe Bend area. Following a thorough review and discussion, MSC (Epley--Kovalicky)(Crane-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Epley-aye, Barker-nay, Baird-aye) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR CONTINUE WITH THE ANALYSIS OF THIS APPLICATION, AND IF ALL CRITERIA ARE SATISFIED, THAT IT BE APPROVED WITH THE EXCEPTION OF BEAR HUNTING WITH HOUNDS.

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

CLARENCE BINNINGER, TO DISCUSS HIS CONCERNS ABOUT MS. BRANSFORD'S OPERATIONS.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 5:25 PM, March 2, 1994.

OPERATING AREA FOR DEER, ELK, MOOSE, GOAT, BEAR, COUGAR, PREDATORS,
AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING AND FISHING, TRAILRIDES AND BACKPACKING

Beginning at Blodgett Mountain on the Idaho/Montana stateline and Idaho Department of Fish and Game Management (F&G Mgmt) Unit 17 boundary (Sec. 21, T34N, R16E, BM); then southerly on said stateline and F&G Mgmt Unit boundary to the Granite/Wahoo Creek watershed divide (Sec. 36, T33N, R15E, BM); then westerly on said watershed divide some 7 miles to the approximate center of Sec. 8, T23N, R15E, BM; then on a straight line west some 4 miles to Trail 634 (Sec. 10, T32N, R14E, BM) in the vicinity of Sid Lake on the Bear/Pettibone Creek watershed divide (Pettibone Ridge); then southwesterly down said watershed divide on Trails 634 and 462 to Pettibone Creek and continuing southwesterly downstream on Pettibone Creek to the mouth of Brave Creek (Sec. 25, T32N, R13E, BM); then northerly upstream on Brave Creek to an unnamed branch of Brave Creek and continuing northerly up the unnamed branch to its head and juncture with Trail 435 (SW 1/4 Sec. 12, T32N, R13E, BM); and continuing northerly on Trails 435 and 430 to Freeman Peak (NE 1/4 Sec. 24, T32N, R13E, BM); then northerly to where Trail 427 turns sharply south in the NE 1/4 Sec. 35, T33N, R13E, BM; then northeasterly down the Freeman/Higgins Creek watershed divide to the Freeman/East Fork Moose Creek Confluence (Sec. 18, T33N, R14E, BM); then easterly along the south bank of East Fork Moose Creek to Elbow Creek (Sec. 16, T33N, R14E, BM); then easterly upstream on Elbow Creek to and along the West Fork of Elbow Creek to the Elbow/Pettibone/Wahoo Creek watershed divide (NE 1/4 Sec. 25, T33N, R14E, BM); then northeasterly on a straight line some seven (7) miles to Saddle Mountain (Sec. 23, T33N, R15E, BM); then northerly down the ridge between the forks of Saddle Creek to the forks in the NW 1/4 Sec. 14, T33N, R15E, BM, and continuing northerly downstream on Saddle Creek to East Fork Moose Creek; then northwesterly downstream on East Fork Moose Creek to the Clearwater/NezPerce National Forest boundary (Sec. 21, T34N, R15E, BM); then northeasterly on said national forest boundary to Jeanette Mountain on the Lochsa/Selway watershed divide and F&G Mgmt Unit 12/17 boundary (Sec. 15, T34N, R15E, BM); then easterly on said watershed divide, national forest and F&G Mgmt Unit boundary to Blodgett Mountain, the point of beginning. OPERATING AREA FOR FISHING AND CHUKAR HUNTING

Fishing may be conducted on, and chukar hunting along, the following river segments: POWER BOATING - SA7A, SA7B, SA8, CL2, CL3; FLOAT BOATING - SA7A, SA7B, CL2.

OPERATING AREAS FOR DEER, ELK, GOAT, MOOSE, SHEEP, BEAR, COUGAR, PREDATORS, CHUKAR AND FOREST GROUSE HUNTING, AND FISHING, TRAILRIDES AND BACKPACKING

OPERATING AREA #1: Beginning on the Salmon River at the mouth of Bargamin Creek (Sec. 23, T26N, R10E, BM); then northeasterly upstream on Bargamin Creek to the mouth of Spread Creek; then easterly upstream on Spread Creek to Spread Creek Point (Sec. 30, T27N, R12E, BM); then continuing easterly on the hydrologic divide between Saddle Creek and Goodman Creek to the top of the breaks into Sabe Creek (approximately Sec. 32, T27N, R12E, BM); then southerly along the line of the breaks to Steep Creek; then easterly downstream on Steep Creek to the confluence with Sabe Creek; then southwesterly downstream on Sabe Creek to the Salmon River and the IDF&G Unit 20/20A boundary; then southeasterly upstream on the Salmon River and IDF&G Unit boundary to Arctic Creek; then southwesterly upstream on Arctic Creek to Arctic Point Lookout (Sec. 30, T25N, R12E, BM); then northwesterly along the Salmon River breaks to Rocky Point (Sec. 20, T25N, R11E, BM); then northeasterly down the ridge to the Salmon River at the mouth of Dillinger Creek (Sec. 9, T25N, R11E, BM) and IDF&G Unit 20/20A boundary; then northwesterly downstream on the Salmon River and IDF&G Unit boundary to Bargamin Creek, the point of beginning.

OPERATING AREA #2: Beginning on the Salmon River at the mouth of Big Mallard Creek/IDF&G Unit 20/20A boundary (Sec. 23, T26N, R10E, BM); then southwesterly downstream on the Salmon River and IDF&G Unit boundary to Gaines Bar and Trail 212 (Gaines Ranch Trail-Sec. 31, T25N, R9E, BM); then northerly on Trail 212 some two (2) miles to the 5200-foot contour level [approximately on the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness (FCRNRW) boundary at the top of the river breaks](Sec. 26, T25N, R8E, BM); then easterly along said contour level and river breaks paralleling the river via the head of Churchill Creek to Big Mallard Creek (Sec. 26, T26N, R9E, BM); then southeasterly downstream on Big Mallard Creek to the Salmon River/IDF&G Unit 20/20A boundary, the point of beginning.

OPERATING AREAS FOR BEAR AND COUGAR HUNTING

OPERATING AREA #3: Beginning on the Salmon River at the mouth of Sabe Creek and IDF&G Unit 20/20A boundary (Sec. 18, T25N, R12E, BM); then southeasterly upstream on the Salmon River/IDF&G Unit boundary to the mouth of Arctic Creek; then southwesterly upstream on Arctic Creek to Arctic Point Lookout (Sec. 30, T25N, R12E, BM);

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then northwesterly along the Salmon River breaks to Rocky Point (Sec. 20, T25N, R11E, BM); then northeasterly down the ridge to the Salmon River at the mouth of Dillinger Creek (Sec. 9, T25N, R11E, BM); then northwesterly downstream on the Salmon River to Bargamin Creek (Sec. 23, T26N, R10E, BM); then northeasterly upstream on Bargamin Creek some 2 miles to the Salmon River breaks; then easterly via Crofoot Point and Bear Point along the Salmon River breaks to Sabe Creek; then down Sabe Creek to the Salmon River, the point of beginning. **RESTRICTION: This operation is limited to 1 boat on any 1 day during the period from April 1 to May 31. [Joint-Use area with Norman H. Guth, Inc.]**

OPERATING AREA #4: Beginning on the Salmon River at the mouth of Dillinger Creek (Sec. 9, T25N, R11E, BM); then southwesterly up the ridge to Rocky Point (Sec. 20, T25N, R11E, BM) on the Salmon River breaks; then northwesterly along the breaks to Hida Point (Sec. 10, T25N, R10E, BM); then northeasterly down the Hida Creek/Salmon River watershed divide to the Salmon River (Sec. 26, T26N, R10E, BM); then southeasterly upstream on the Salmon River to Dillinger Creek, the point of beginning. **[Joint-Use area with Mackay Bar Corporation and Norman H. Guth, Inc.]**

OPERATING AREA #5: Beginning on the Salmon River at the mouth of Five Mile Creek (Sec. 22, T24N, R8E, BM); then northwesterly up the Cove/Jersey Creek watershed divide to Cove Mountain on the FCRNRW boundary (Sec. 18, T24N, R8E, BM); then northeasterly along the FCRNRW boundary and Salmon River breaks to Big Mallard Creek; then down Big Mallard Creek to the confluence with the Salmon River; then upstream on the Salmon River to the mouth of Bargamin Creek; then southwesterly up the Hida Creek/Salmon River watershed divide to Hida Point (Sec. 10, T25N, R10E, BM) on the Salmon River breaks and continuing southwesterly along the breaks via Burnt Knob to Little Sheepeater Point (Sec. 30, T24N, R9E, BM) on the Little Five Mile/Five Mile Creek watershed divide; then northwesterly down said watershed divide to the Salmon River at the mouth of Five Mile Creek, the point of beginning. **[Joint-Use area with Mackay Bar Corporation/Dixie Outfitters, Inc.]**

OPERATING AREA FOR BEAR HUNTING ONLY
