APPROVED MINUTES

A regular meeting of the Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board convened at 8:30 AM, April 25, 1994, in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Board members present included Leo Crane, John A.K. Barker and Diana Haynes, as well as Board Chairman, Dale Baird. Also present were Board Executive Director, Dean Sangrey; Education/Enforcement Supervisor, Bill Vetesy; and Board attorney, Steve Scanlin.

Financial Report: The Executive Director presented a report on the Board's current financial status. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Haynes) THAT THE REPORT BE ACCEPTED AS PRESENTED.

Education/Enforcement Supervisor: Mr. Vetesy presented his report regarding the present status of education/enforcement program efforts. A question was raised regarding the need to notify all licensed shooting preserve operators statewide of the requirement for an outfitter license if they provide guided services in the routine conduct of their business. **Administrative note:** The Executive Director will proceed with proper notification to those preserve licensees.

Steve Scanlin, Deputy Attorney General: Mr. Scanlin presented his report on current legal issues pending before the Board. He also reported on ongoing negotiations with Boise attorney John Sutton regarding the appeal of Larry Jarrett's letter of reprimand.

Jimmie Dwayne Blair: The Board reviewed a request from Mr. Blair regarding the delinquent renewal of his 1993-94 outfitter license and subsequent request for his 1994-95 license. After review and discussion, the Board confirmed their earlier decision to allow Mr. Blair to renew his 1993-94 license in accordance with the provisions of Board rule 015., and to renew that license for 1994-95 upon proper application. Further, Mr. Blair is to be instructed to appear before the Board at the June Board meeting to review his current situation regarding his outfitted operations.

Shannon Osborn: The Board reviewed a formal request from Ms. Osborn for a waiver of first aid training requirements based on evidence she is presently enrolled in a nursing program with scheduled completion in December, 1994. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT MS. OSBORN BE DIRECTED TO PROVIDE THE BOARD WITH EVIDENCE OF A COMPLETED COURSE OF FIRST AID INSTRUCTION PRIOR TO ANY GUIDE LICENSING CONSIDERATION.

Gabriel Cassell: The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Cassell, noting he has admitted to a felony conviction. The Board concurred with a recommendation requiring Mr. Cassell's appearance before the Board prior to any possible guide license approval.

Brian Butz: The Board reviewed a request from Mr. Butz for an extension of time to allow for payment of his \$2,700.00 obligation to the Licensing Board. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Haynes) THAT MR. BUTZ BE ADVISED THE BOARD WILL ACCEPT MONTHLY PAYMENTS OF AT LEAST \$225.00 AND THAT HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE RENEWAL FOR 1994-95 WILL NOT BE ISSUED UNTIL AN INITIAL PAYMENT OF AT LEAST THIS AMOUNT HAS BEEN SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD OFFICE. FURTHER, THAT THE ENTIRE BALANCE OF THE RESTITUTION MUST BE PAID IN FULL PRIOR TO ANY SALE OR TRANSFER OF THIS BUSINESS.

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:30 AM and reconvened at 1:15 PM. Board member Tom Kovalicky still absent.

Charter Boat Operators: The Board met with a group of charter boat operators from the Idaho Panhandle that included Gary Brookshire, Pat Prentice, Jim Folk, Cal Butterfield, Rich Lindsey, Dan Jacobson, Levi Hubbard, Jim Meneely, Randy Phillips, Rich Reinwald, and Bob Carbone. These outfitters represent commercial charter operations on Priest Lake, Lake Pend Oreille, and Lake Coeur d'Alene. The group met with the Board to discuss issues of concern about general charter boat operations, and the present conditions on Lake Pend Oreille regarding the licensing moratorium, in particular. Idaho Department of Fish & Game Panhandle Region fisheries biologist Ned Horner also attended the meeting and made a presentation addressing the situation regarding the condition of various fish species in the large lakes and the Departments view of commercial fishing impacts on that resource. Strategies for presentations at the public meeting scheduled for Wednesday evening were also reviewed.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 PM, and reconvened April 26, 1994 at 8:00 AM, with all Board members present except Tom Kovalicky. Also present are the Executive Director and Education/Enforcement Supervisor.

Clarence Binninger/Cheryl Bransford: Dr. Clarence Binninger and Mr. Bruce Wyatt, represented by their attorney Mr. Dennis Davis, appeared before the Board to voice their concerns about the conduct of licensed Idaho outfitter Cheryl Bransford with regard to her interaction with private hunters. This informal discussion before the Board resulted from a complaint filed against Ms. Bransford with the Licensing Board following the 1993 big game hunting season, during which time Dr. Binninger and Mr. Wyatt had an alleged disagreement with Ms. Bransford and members of her staff over specific hunting techniques and baiting practices on the National Forest. Following an investigation by Board staff, it was determined that no violations of state law or Board rules had occurred. Dr. Binninger did not agree with these findings and asked for an opportunity to discuss the matter with the full Board. At the conclusion of this discussion, Chairman Baird directed the matter be taken under advisement for further deliberation.

Board member Tom Kovalicky joined the meeting at 9:00 AM.

Gary Will, Idaho Department of Fish & Game: Mr. Will made a brief presentation to the Board regarding the status of bobcat hunting, trapping, and harvest statistics from around the state. He expressed the Departments concern about removing the bobcat from furbearer designation in the Fish & Game rules, and said he would solicit input from each region regarding their opinion of commercial harvest of these animals and submit a report to the Board.

Election of Board Officers: In accordance with the provisions of Board Rule 072., an election was held to select new Board officers. Votes were cast by an open written ballot. Tabulation of the vote revealed the following results: Dale Baird, Chairman; John A.K. Barker, Vice-Chairman; Leo Crane, Treasurer.

Jim and Jill Koch/Beamers Landing, Inc.: Mr. and Mrs. Koch met with the Board to discuss the recent sale and transfer of the Beamer outfitter businesses to them. The interview dealt with Koch's plans for continuing the operations of the business in Hells Canyon and on the Snake and Clearwater Rivers. At the conclusion of the discussion, the Board welcomed Mr. & Mrs. Koch to Idaho, and encouraged them to contact any one of them or the Board office if they have any future questions or need assistance.

The Board adjourned for lunch at 11:45 PM, and reconvened at 1:25 PM.

Ed Cannady/Sawtooth National Recreation Area (SNRA): Mr. Cannady met with the Board to give a presentation on plans for consolidating summer activities on the SNRA between the three existing outfitters, Randy Baugh, Tom Proctor, and Mike Scott. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE BOARD BE PREPARED TO ACCEPT PROPOSALS FOR POSSIBLE BOUNDARY AND ACTIVITY ADJUSTMENTS RELATING TO SUMMER RECREATION ACTIVITIES FOR THOSE LICENSED OUTFITTERS INVOLVED. ALSO, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR IS INSTRUCTED TO EVALUATE AND APPROVE THE PROPOSED ADJUSTMENTS AS THEY ARE SUBMITTED.

Larry Book/Justin Johns: Mr. Book appeared on behalf of himself and Mr. Johns to discuss a new outfitter licensing proposal for hunting whitetail deer on private property in the northern Idaho Panhandle area. Mr. Book thoroughly reviewed his proposal identifying the separate parcels of private land on which they propose to conduct their hunts. He was advised that when the required research has been completed the Board will again look at his proposal and take appropriate action at that time.

Leadership Education Adventure Project (LEAP): Patti Jo Hutto-Swan and Tracey Sutton appeared before the Board to discuss their proposal for conducting backpacking, mountaineering, cross country skiing and mountain bike touring activities in the Idaho Panhandle area around Sandpoint. They were encouraged to continue this pursuit, and the Board suggested contact should be made with the U.S. Forest Service District Ranger having jurisdiction in any of the areas covered under their proposed operating plan, as well as other agencies who may assist in their proposal.

The Board adjourned for the evening at 4:30 PM, and reconvened on Wednesday, April 27, 1994, at 8:30 AM. All Board members present except John A.K. Barker.

Mainstream Outdoor Adventures/Alan Lamm, Designated Agent: Mr. Lamm recently submitted a letter requesting the Board consider an amendment to his license to include the Hells Canyon to Pittsburg Landing (SN12) section of the Snake River. The files were reviewed by the Executive Director and a letter was sent to Mr. Lamm advising him the circumstances have not changed from earlier considerations of similar requests, namely, that until the Forest Service agrees to issue an additional permit on this section, the Board cannot issue an outfitter license. Following a review and discussion, the Board concurs with the position as stated in the Director's letter to Mr. Lamm on April 13.

Board member Barker joined the meeting at 9:00 AM.

Ray Baier/Four Seasons Outfitting & Guides: Mr. Baier met with the Board to discuss the status of his current amendment request. He acknowledged that numerous concerns have been expressed by the affected outfitters about the extent of his proposed new operating area and activities. He stated he has tried to address each of these issues by having direct contact with the outfitter and discussing their complaints one-on-one. Until these additional issues can be resolved, Mr. Baier asked the Board to consider approving at least a portion of the trailriding proposal for which he has approval from the management agencies. This would allow him to begin operating this spring and he will continue to address the other questions about his amended operations for future consideration and action by the Board.

Tom Ellefson: Mr. Ellefson spoke to the Board about general commercial operations on the large lakes in northern Idaho, and specifically identified his interest in seeing that licensed charter boat fishing tours continue to be authorized and expanded in this area. He feels the current limits on numbers of boats allowed for each operator shouldn't be decreased, and the limit actually puts the charter operator at a disadvantage, especially when they are the busiest.

Idaho Fishing Charters/Jim Spickelmire, Designated Agent: The Board reviewed a request from Mr. Spickelmire to have the probationary status of their licenses removed for the 1994-95 license year based on the fact that Mr. Lawrence Voss, who was cited in 1993 for filing a falsified first aid card, is no longer actively associated with the business. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Haynes) THAT THIS REQUEST BE DENIED.

Ted Epley: Board Prosecutor Nicole McKay reviewed a stipulated settlement proposed with Mr. Epley regarding the charges pending against him for filing false information with the Board. Following a review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Baird)(Crane-aye, Kovalicky-nay, Haynes-nay, Barker-aye, Baird-aye) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THIS SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND PAYMENT OF A \$2,100.00 FINE, WITH NO FURTHER ACTION TO BE TAKEN AGAINST THIS LICENSE IN THIS REGARD.

Frankie Valvo: Mr. Valvo did not appear at the scheduled time for his show cause hearing and it was determined he had not received proper notice of the continuation and relocation of the hearing. Notification was sent by certified mail but not delivered because he had moved to Montana. Based on the foregoing, the Executive Director is instructed to reschedule this hearing for the June meeting.

Travis Tracy: A show cause hearing was held in the matter of Travis Tracy guiding without a license. The time having arrived for the scheduled hearing, 10:00 AM, April 27, the record showed that Mr. Tracy did not appear as ordered. The hearing proceeded, as the record shows that service was accomplished on Mr. Tracy as evidenced by a certified mail receipt dated 3/24/94. At the conclusion of testimony presented, the Findings of Fact established that Mr. Tracy did guide a Board enforcement agent in an area not covered in his employing outfitter's licensed area. The Conclusions of Law are that this constitutes a violation of §36-2113(a)(5)(8) and (14), Idaho Code, and Licensing Board Rules 002.45 and 007.04., as stipulated. Pursuant to these findings and conclusions, MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT MR. TRACY BE DENIED ANY OPPORTUNITY TO RELICENSE AS A GUIDE IN THE STATE OF IDAHO FOR THE 1994-95 AND 1995-96 LICENSE YEARS.

Jack Nancolas: Board Prosecutor McKay reviewed a stipulated settlement agreement reached with Mr. Nancolas regarding his alleged violation of guiding in an area for which he was not licensed. He has agreed to pay a fine of \$200.00. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AND NO FURTHER ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AGAINST MR. NANCOLAS' LICENSE IN THIS MATTER.

SD Outfitters, Inc./Ray Hamell, Designated Agent: Mr. Hamell appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing regarding the alleged employment of an unlicensed guide. Prior to the start of the hearing, Mr. Hamell agreed to stipulate to the hiring of an unlicensed guide, acknowledging that this is a violation of outfitter and guide rules. Pursuant to these stipulated facts, MSF (Kovalicky--Haynes)(Crane-nay, Kovalicky-aye, Haynes-nay, Barker-nay, Baird-aye) THAT MR. HAMELL BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200.00 WITH NO FURTHER RESTRICTIONS TO BE PLACED AGAINST HIS LICENSE. MSF (Crane)(Died for lack of a second) THAT MR. HAMELL BE FINED AN AMOUNT OF \$100.00 WITH NO FURTHER SANCTIONS AGAINST HIS LICENSE. MSC (Haynes--Kovalicky)(Crane-nay, Kovalicky-aye, Haynes-aye, Barker-nay, Baird-aye) THAT A LETTER OF CAUTION BE PLACED IN MR. HAMELL'S FILE AND THAT NO OTHER ACTION BE TAKEN AGAINST HIS LICENSE.

Douglas Bruce, Buckskin Outfitters: Pursuant to the provisions of Licensing Board Rule 024., it was noted that Mr. Bruce did not renew his outfitter license for the 1993-94 season. In accordance with these guidelines MSC (Crane--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE DECLARED RELINQUISHED.

Jan Brown, Lucky Dog Retreat: Ms. Brown has requested permission to delay renewal of her outfitter license for the 1994-95 season. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT MS. BROWN BE ADVISED THE BOARD IS NOT ABLE TO POSTPONE RENEWAL OF HER LICENSE, AND IF SHE WANTS TO MAINTAIN A PRIORITY INTEREST, SHE SHOULD RENEW IT AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. **Administrative note:** Ms. Brown should be advised that the Board will waive use requirements as well as the requirement for insurance as long as no client activities take place under her license for the coming year.

Oars-Dories: The Board reviewed a letter received from Curt Chang, Designated Agent for Oars-Dories, in which he addressed the matter of license non-use for mountain bike touring activities. A review of Board records indicates Oars-Dories haven't reported use during the last two seasons for mountain biking, and Mr. Chang has advised they intend to relinquish this activity as of the 1994-95 license year. Pursuant to this information, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT MOUNTAIN BIKE TOURING BE DECLARED RELINQUISHED AND THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WORK WITH THE FOREST SERVICE IN DETERMINING WHETHER THIS ACTIVITY SHOULD BE ADVERTISED FOR RELICENSING.

Vacancies on SA7A, SA7B, and SA8: The Executive Director reported to the Board on the results of discussions with LuVerne Grussing, Cottonwood BLM, regarding recent vacancies created with regard to floatboat licenses and permits on the SA7A, SA7B, and SA8 sections of the Salmon River. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR CONTINUE TO COORDINATE WITH THE BLM TO DEVELOP APPROPRIATE ADVERTISEMENT AND NOTIFICATION OF LICENSING OPPORTUNITIES ON THE VINEGAR CREEK TO HAMMER CREEK (SA7A) AND VINEGAR CREEK TO SPRING BAR (SA7B) SECTIONS OF THE SALMON RIVER. AND FURTHER, THAT NO ADDITIONAL OUTFITTER LICENSING BE CONSIDERED ON THE HAMMER CREEK TO HELLER BAR OR LEWISTON (SA8) SECTION OF THE SALMON RIVER, THEREBY RECOGNIZING THE MORATORIUM CURRENTLY PLACED ON THIS SECTION BY THE BLM, AND AT THE NEXT RULES MAKING OPPORTUNITY, THIS SECTION OF RIVER BE APPROPRIATELY ADJUSTED FOR THE NUMBER OF FLOATBOAT LICENSEES FROM 36 TO 35.

Outfitter Sales/Transfers of Business: The Board reviewed reports from the Executive Director regarding sales and transfers of businesses he has evaluated and approved since the February meeting. These sales included BRET POND TO TIMOTHY THOMAS, DON HABEL TO KEN WELLS, and WALLY AND MYRNA BEAMER TO JIM AND JILL KOCH. New outfitter licenses were approved for MITCH JACOBS, THOMAS WILLOUGHBY, and JIM CLEMENTS. An amendment was also approved for the TUTTLE/THOMPSON outfitter license. Additionally, designated agent licenses were approved and issued for Rick Peverly, Ken Wells, Mitch Jacobs, Jim Koch, Jill Koch, Clifford

Zielke, Bruce Duncan, Troy Rose, and Lyle Thomas. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THESE ACTIONS. (Addendums: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7)

February/March Board Minutes: After review and discussion, MSC (Haynes--Crane) THAT THE MINUTES FOR THE FEBRUARY/MARCH BOARD MEETING BE APPROVED.

Complaints: The Executive Director presented an update on the status of complaints currently being reviewed and investigated by Board staff. He recommended that the current complaint files on Shannon Lindsey, Andre Molsee, Ed Panus, Scott Minter, and SD Outfitters, Inc., be closed. Processing and investigation of other complaints will continue. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THIS ACTION BE APPROVED.

Clarence Binninger/Cheryl Bransford: At the conclusion of additional deliberations in this matter, the Board directs its prosecutor, Ms. Nicole McKay, to proceed with an evaluation of this complaint to ascertain the facts and determine if sufficient cause exists to initiate disciplinary action against Ms. Bransford's license.

Sandy Podsaid: The Board reviewed a letter from the Avery Ranger District pertaining to a temporary boundary adjustment for Mr. Podsaid during the spring bear hunting season. Following review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THE BOARD APPROVE AN ADMINISTRATIVE ADJUSTMENT TO MR. PODSAID'S OPERATING AREA BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION AS PER THE OFFICIAL NOTIFICATION FROM THE FOREST SERVICE. THIS ADJUSTMENT TO HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE IS ONLY TEMPORARY THROUGH AND INCLUDING JUNE 15, 1994.

First Aid Requirements: The Board reviewed a request for waiver of requirements for a valid first aid card prior to the issuance of a guide license for Greg Felton. The Board directs the Executive Director to respond to Mr. David Uberagua, EMT instructor, to advise him the Board has no discretion in requiring a valid first aid card be produced prior to completing a license application. Further, he is to be advised that perhaps Mr. Felton will have completed his course with Mr. Uberagua in time for him to be licensed.

Wilderness Medical Associates: The Board reviewed the first aid course curriculum submitted by Wilderness Medical Associates for possible inclusion on the Board's list of acceptable first aid instructional courses. After review and discussion, and recommendation by the Executive Director, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker)

THAT THIS COURSE BE APPROVED AS AN ACCEPTABLE ALTERNATIVE TO THE AMERICAN RED CROSS STANDARD FIRST AID COURSE FOR LICENSING PURPOSES.

Camp Ida-Haven: The Board reviewed a letter from Camp Ida-Haven requesting a waiver to allow them to conduct floatboating activities on SA7A, for which they are not currently licensed. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT THIS REQUEST BE DENIED.

Brian Simi: The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Simi regarding his efforts to apply for an outfitter permit for trailriding activities on the Cascade Ranger District. In response, the Board directs that the Executive Director advise Mr. Simi the Board doesn't have jurisdiction in this matter and his next level of contact should be with the Forest Supervisor, Boise National Forest.



[Targhee National Forest, West Division, 1963, Map #17][F&G Units 59, 59A & 61]

RESTRICTIONS: Elk and deer hunters limited to a maximum of four (4) rifle elk hunters, four (4) archery elk hunters, four (4) rifle deer hunters, and four (4) archery deer hunters, in each of the F&G Mgmt Units authorized under this license. (59, 59A, and 61). Total elk and deer hunting clients not to exceed 48.

CONDITION: Any private lands in the above area description are not covered by this outfitter license unless signed permission/lease is obtained and filed with the Board.
