**APPROVED MINUTES**

The regular meeting of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board convened at 8:30 AM, June 27, 1994, with all Board members present. Also present were the Executive Director, Dean Sangrey, Board Counsel Steve Scanlin, and Board Education/Enforcement Supervisor, Bill Vetesy.

**April Minutes:** The draft minutes from the April meeting were reviewed. After review and discussion, MSC (Haynes--Barker) THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS CORRECTED.

**Financial Report:** The Board reviewed the current financial reports as presented by the Executive Director. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS REPORT BE APPROVED.

**Administrative Note:** It was suggested the Executive Director prepare some information to share with the industry regarding the structure and purpose of the Board's free fund balance.

**Gary Brookshire:** Mr. Brookshire appeared to discuss his interest in a proposed special use permit from the Forest Service for the conduct of land based recreational activities in the vicinity of his operating area. He was advised that the Board will consider the decision notice issued by the Forest Service and take appropriate action once we have that document in hand.

**Kyle Battisti:** The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Battisti, noting that he has been convicted of an Idaho Fish & Game violation for exceeding the bag limit on migratory game birds (1 goose over the limit). Mr. Battisti appeared before the Board to discuss the matter in person. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS GUIDE LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY WITH THE TERMS OF PROBATION BEING HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, THAT NO AMENDMENTS TO HIS LICENSE WILL BE ALLOWED DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, AND, THAT HE NOT BE LICENSED FOR CHUKAR HUNTING ACTIVITIES. THIS PROBATION WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1995.

The Board adjourned for lunch at 12:00 PM, and reconvened at 1:30 PM with all Board members present.

**Education/Enforcement Supervisor:** Board Education/Enforcement Supervisor Bill Vetesy presented a report to the Board outlining the education and enforcement bureau activities that have kept him busy over the last two months.

**Carter Andrews:** The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Carter Andrews for employment with Randy Hess. Investigation showed that Mr. Andrews had falsified the outfitter's signature on the application form. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Haynes)(Barker-nay, Haynes-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Crane-aye, Baird-aye) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED.

**Walt Browne:** Bill Vetesy advised the Board of the recent resignation of enforcement investigator Walt Browne. The Director was instructed to send Mr. Browne a letter of thanks and appreciation.

**Benedict Colombi:** The Board reviewed a guide license application from Mr. Colombi, noting he was convicted of a Fish and Game violation (purchase of a wrong class of license). Following an interview with Mr. Colombi and review of the information, including a letter from the Fish and Game conservation officer recommending favorable consideration of this application, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE 1994-95 SEASON. TERMS OF PROBATION ARE THAT MR. COLOMBI NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE GRANTED DURING THE PROBATION PERIOD, WHICH EXPIRES ON MARCH 31, 1995.

**Gabriel Cassell:** The Board reviewed a guide license application from Mr. Cassell, noting he had been convicted of felony vehicular homicide in 1991 as a result of an auto accident. He met with the Board and explained he has satisfactorily completed all penalties associated with this incident, including incarceration, payment of fines, and community service. After an interview with Mr. Cassell and a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE LICENSE YEARS 1994-95 AND 1995-96. TERMS OF PROBATION ARE THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE GRANTED TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE PROBATION PERIOD, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1996.

**Mike Richie:** Mr. Richie appeared before the Board to discuss the altered first aid card that he submitted with his guide application in April. He subsequently contacted the Board explaining his urgent need to obtain his license for potential work this spring. Following a telephone conference with Chairman Dale Baird and members Leo Crane, John A.K. Barker and Tom Kovalicky, the decision was made to require payment of a \$300.00 fine and then issue Mr. Richie's license unrestricted. Following receipt of the fine payment on May 26, the guide license was issued on June 1, 1994.

**Mark Bucher:** The Board reviewed an guide application from Mr. Bucher, noting he had been convicted of a Fish and Game violation in 1989 and had neglected to indicate this on his application. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT THIS MATTER BE TABLED UNTIL A FURTHER CHECK CAN BE COMPLETED WITH THE STATE OF WYOMING.

**Steve Scanlin:** Steve Scanlin, Board legal counsel, updated the Board on all pending legal matters, including the affirmative decision in the Ron Sherer case.

**Forest Service Audit:** The Executive Director reviewed with the Board the proposed response to the Forest Service audit of the cooperative law enforcement agreement. After a review and discussion, the Board directed that the report be forwarded to the appropriate Forest Service personnel.

**Mark Bucher:** MSC (Barker-Haynes) THAT REVIEW OF THIS APPLICATION BE BROUGHT BACK FOR FURTHER CONSIDERATION. Upon further consideration, MSC (Kovalicky--Haynes) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED PROBATIONARY FOR THE LICENSE YEARS 1994-95, AND 1995-96, WITH THE TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS BE GRANTED TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF HIS PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1996.

**MacFarlane Adkins:** The Board reviewed a designated agent application from Mr. Adkins, noting that he was convicted for guiding without a license in 1993. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED.

**Dennis Moedl:** The Board reviewed a guide license application from Dennis Moedl, noting that he was convicted for guiding without a license in 1993. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT THIS LICENSE APPLICATION BE DENIED. **Administrative note:** The enforcement section should be directed to pursue this matter with regards to disciplinary action against the outfitter for employing unlicensed guides.

**Dennis Jafek:** The Board reviewed a guide license application from Dennis Jafek, noting that he admitted submitting an altered first aid card with his original application. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED UNRESTRICTED UPON PAYMENT OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE OF \$300.00.

**Terry Jones:** The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Jones, noting that he admitted submitting an altered first aid card with his application. This problem was verified by the American Red Cross in Salem, Oregon. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED UNRESTRICTED UPON PAYMENT OF A \$300.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FINE.

**William Cardamone:** The Board reviewed a guide license application submitted by Mr. Cardamone, noting that he admitted altering the date on his first aid card. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT THIS LICENSE BE ISSUED UPON THE RECEIPT OF A VALID FIRST AID CARD AND PAYMENT OF A \$300.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FINE.

The Board recessed for the day at 5:30 PM, and reconvened at 8:30 AM, June 28, 1994, with all Board members present.

**Joseph M. Foster:** The Board reviewed a guide license application from Joseph M. Foster to guide for Flying Resort Ranch, noting that he had been convicted for a violation of Idaho Fish & Game laws in 1992. Bill Guth, Designated Agent for Flying Resort Ranch, also appeared with Mr. Foster to explain an oversight that resulted in Mr. Foster's application being submitted incorrectly. After a review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT MR. FOSTER BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY LICENSE FOR THE 1994-95 LICENSE YEAR. TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE ALLOWED TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1995.

**Robert C. McClure:** The Board reviewed a guide application from Robert C. McClure, noting he had been convicted of an Idaho Fish & Game violation in 1993 for using multiple fishing gear. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THE BOARD CONCUR WITH THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DECISION TO ISSUE THIS LICENSE, BUT THAT THE LICENSEE AND THE OUTFITTER INVOLVED (THE EXODUS CORPORATION) BE SENT A LETTER UNDER THE CHAIRMAN'S SIGNATURE INDICATING THE BOARD'S CONCERN WITH THIS TYPE OF ACTIVITY.

**Steve Moran:** The Board reviewed Mr. Moran's guide license application, noting his admission to a conviction for violating Washington Fish & Game regulations in 1993. This incident involved hunting upland game birds without a valid game bird stamp. After review and discussion, MSF (Crane) THAT MR. MORAN BE ISSUED HIS GUIDE LICENSE WITHOUT RESTRICTION. After further consideration, MSC (Haynes--Kovalicky) THAT MR. MORAN BE ISSUED A PROBATIONARY GUIDE LICENSE FOR THE 1994-95 SEASON. TERMS OF PROBATION BEING THAT HE NOT VIOLATE ANY LOCAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAWS, AND THAT NO AMENDMENTS WILL BE ALLOWED TO HIS LICENSE DURING THE TERM OF PROBATION, WHICH WILL EXPIRE ON MARCH 31, 1995.

**James J. Curran:** The Board reviewed a guide license application from Mr. Curran, noting he admitted being convicted for two violations of Idaho Fish & Game laws in 1980 and 1982, but had failed to mention an additional conviction in 1993. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker)(Barker-aye, Haynes-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Crane-nay, Board-aye) THAT THIS APPLICATION BE DENIED. **NOTE:** Subsequent to this decision, the Executive Director was contacted by Mr. Brian Elkins, attorney for Mr. Curran, who advised that Curran's \$82.00 bond was forfeited by the court, but that the judge directed this action would not constitute a conviction on his record. Based on this information, a telephone conference was held between Chairman Baird and Board members John A.K. Barker and Leo Crane. At the conclusion of these discussions, and an affirmative vote by the three members, the Director was instructed to issue a probationary license to Mr. Curran, to include the standard terms of probation that he not violate any local, state, or federal laws, and that no amendments would be allowed to his license during the term of probation, which will expire on March 31, 1995.

**Mark Harbaugh:** The Board reviewed action that was taken on Mr. Harbaugh's guide license application on June 21, 1994. At that time, a telephone conference was held between Chairman Baird, and Board members John A.K. Barker and Leo Crane, to discuss Mr. Harbaugh's application and the details of his 1993 conviction for violation of Idaho Fish & Game laws (possession of upland game birds without a state stamp). As a result of this conference call, and an affirmative vote by the three members, Mr. Harbaugh's license was issued probationary.

**Janice Brown, dba Lucky Dog Retreat:** The Board reviewed correspondence from Ms. Brown indicating that she wishes to relinquish the Lucky Dog Retreat outfitter license at this time. Pursuant to this request, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT THIS LICENSE BE DECLARED RELINQUISHED AND THAT THE OPPORTUNITY FOR RELICENSING NOT BE CONSIDERED AT THIS TIME.

**Larry Jarrett, Lazy J Outfitters:** Mr. John Sutton appeared on behalf of Mr. Jarrett in a rehearing of the disciplinary action taken against the Lazy J Outfitters license. After a discussion with Mr. Sutton and Mr. Scanlin regarding the merits of Mr. Jarrett's arguments, MSC (Kovalicky--Haynes) THAT THE LETTER OF REPRIMAND CURRENTLY OF RECORD IN MR. JARRETT'S FILE AS A RESULT OF THE ORIGINAL HEARING ON THIS MATTER BE AMENDED AND REVISED TO REFLECT AN ADVISORY NOTICE OF CAUTION IN REGARD TO THIS OUTFITTER LICENSE AND THE MANNER IN WHICH HE OPERATES HIS BUSINESS. PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT APPEAL PROCESSES INITIATED EARLIER IN THIS MATTER BE DROPPED BY MR. JARRETT.

**Lake Pend Oreille:** The Board reviewed the moratorium issue on Lake Pend Oreille regarding charter boat fishing activities. Based on results of the public hearing held in Sandpoint on April 27, as well as comments received from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game in a letter dated May 16, 1994, MSC (Haynes--Kovalicky) THAT THE CURRENT MORATORIUM BE MAINTAINED HOLDING THE LEVEL OF LICENSES AT 9, AND FURTHER THAT AT THE APPROPRIATE TIME THE BOARD PROCEED WITH RULE MAKING PROCEDURES TO AMEND RULE 059. TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED LICENSES ON LAKE PEND OREILLE FROM ELEVEN TO NINE.

**Al Bukowsky, Solitude River Trips:** The Board reviewed an amendment request from Mr. Bukowsky regarding his fishing activities on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River. After review and discussion, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WAS INSTRUCTED TO INFORM MR. BUKOWSKY THAT THE ACTIVITY AS DESCRIBED IN HIS AMENDMENT REQUEST IS CURRENTLY PERMISSIBLE UNDER THE DEFINITION OF INCIDENTAL FISHING RELATING TO FLOATBOATING ACTIVITIES, AND THEREFORE DOES NOT REQUIRE AN AMENDMENT TO HIS OUTFITTER LICENSE.

The Board recessed for lunch at 11:50 AM, and reconvened at 1:00 PM.

**Keith Rush:** Board Prosecuting Attorney Nicole McKay presented a proposed stipulated settlement for Board consideration in the matter of Keith Rush allegedly employing an unlicensed guide. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE PROVISIONS AS OUTLINED BY MS. MCKAY AND DIRECTING HER TO PROCEED WITH SETTLEMENT OF THIS MATTER WITH MR. RUSH AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

**Stan Meholchick:** The appointed time having arrived for the show cause hearing for Mr. Meholchick, Ms. McKay appeared before the Board and recommended that the charges against Mr. Meholchick be dismissed based on the fact the complainant and witnesses have dropped their complaint against him and no longer wish to proceed with the matter. Pursuant to this discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker) THAT ALL CHARGES IN THIS MATTER BE DISMISSED.

**Memorandum of Understanding:** The Board reviewed a draft Memorandum of Understanding prepared by the Palisades Ranger District, Targhee National Forest relating to joint enforcement work on outfitters and guides on the South Fork of the Snake River. Pursuant to review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane)(Barker-nay, Haynes-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Crane-aye, Baird-aye) THAT THE EDUCATION/ ENFORCEMENT SUPERVISOR BE INSTRUCTED TO PRESENT THE BOARD'S RECOMMENDED CHANGES TO THE FOREST SERVICE. IF THESE CHANGES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE, THE BOARD WON'T ENTER INTO THE AGREEMENT AT THIS TIME.

Board adjourned for the evening at 5:20 PM, and reconvened at 8:30 AM, June 29, 1994, with all Board members present.

**Jerry Hascall/Dean Steele, Golden Adventures, Inc.:** Mr. Hascall and Mr. Steele appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing regarding their alleged employment of an unlicensed guide. At the conclusion of testimony, the Findings of Fact are that Mr. Steele did provide guiding services to a client utilizing the services of an unlicensed guide. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are that this act constitutes a violation of §36-2113(a)(9), Idaho Code, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules 004.01 and 004.04.b. Pursuant to these findings, MSC (Haynes--Barker) THAT DUE TO THE MITIGATING CIRCUMSTANCES INVOLVED IN THIS CASE, GOLDEN ADVENTURES, INC., WILL HAVE A LETTER OF CAUTION PLACED IN THEIR FILE AND NO FURTHER ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AGAINST THEIR OUTFITTER LICENSE, NOR THE PERSONS INVOLVED IN THE GUIDING ACTIVITIES.

**Brundage Mountain Company:** The Board considered an outfitter license application for snowcat skiing proposed by Brundage Mountain Ski Area. Company President Judd DeBoer and snowcat skiing program coordinator Richard Matthews appeared before the Board to discuss the ramifications of the decision selected by Dave Alexander, Payette National Forest Supervisor. The Board reviewed the decision notice of the Payette National Forest Supervisor, noting his selection of Alternative #5, as modified in his letter. Additionally, the Forest Service has indicated that Brundage Mountain Company is the only acceptable candidate for a special use permit for this activity. After review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Haynes) THAT THIS APPLICATION FOR OUTFITTERED SNOWCAT SKIING IN THE GRANITE MOUNTAIN/SLAB BUTTE AREA NORTH OF BRUNDAGE MOUNTAIN SKI AREA BE APPROVED FOR THE ACTIVITIES AND IN THE AREAS AS DESCRIBED IN THE FOREST SERVICE DECISION NOTICE. APPROPRIATE LICENSES TO BE ISSUED UPON COMPLETION OF NECESSARY ADMINISTRATIVE PAPERWORK.

**John Valvo:** The appointed time having arrived, a show cause hearing was conducted into the matter of the outfitter license issued to John Valvo. Mr. Valvo was not present and the hearing proceeded as scheduled. At the conclusion of testimony presented by Ms. Nicole McKay, Board Prosecutor, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) on the date specified, John Valvo did guide a client in an area for which he was not licensed; and 2) he did hinder the investigation into this matter by failing to provide complete and truthful information to the investigator. Thus, Conclusions of Law are that this does constitute a violation of §36-2113(a)(5)(8)(i), Idaho Code, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules 002.46., 004.03. and 004.04.b. Pursuant to these findings, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT IN REGARDS TO THE CHARGE OF UNETHICAL/UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT, MR. VALVO BE FINED IN THE

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AMOUNT OF \$300.00, AND FOR WILLFULLY OPERATING OUTSIDE OF HIS LICENSED AREA, HE BE FINED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500.00. FURTHER, THESE FINES SHALL BE PAID PRIOR TO THE RENEWAL OF HIS 1994-95 OUTFITTER LICENSE.

**Tom Reinecker:** Tom Reinecker, Wildlife Bureau Chief, Idaho Department of Fish and Game, appeared before the Board to present further information regarding the issue of commercial bobcat hunting and to share the Department's recommendations regarding making bobcat hunting a licensable activity. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Barker)(Barker-aye, Haynes-aye, Kovalicky-aye, Crane-nay, Baird-aye) THAT THE BOARD NOT CONSIDER LICENSING BOBCAT OR LYNX AS AN OUTFITTERED ACTIVITY.

**Roger Brink and Steve Lentz:** Mr. Brink and Mr. Lentz appeared before the Board regarding the sale and transfer of the Randy M. Brink outfitting business on the PS1 and PS2 sections of the Payette River. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Kovalicky) THAT THIS SALE AND TRANSFER BE APPROVED PENDING THE COMPLETION OF NECESSARY PAPERWORK, AND THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BE AUTHORIZED TO FACILITATE THIS SALE AND TRANSFER OF BUSINESS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

The Board recessed for lunch at 12:00 PM, and reconvened at 1:30 PM, with all Board members present.

**Frankie Valvo:** Mr. Valvo appeared before the Board in a show cause hearing regarding numerous alleged violations of Idaho outfitter and guide law. After considering the testimony presented in the hearing, the following Findings of Fact were established: 1) that Frankie Valvo, did, in fact, guide a Board enforcement agent on a hunt in an area for which he was not licensed; 2) that he did conspire with said agent to commit a violation of Idaho Fish & Game Rules; and 3) that Frankie Valvo did instruct and direct his guides to guide said agent for hunting in an area for which he was not licensed. Therefore, the Conclusions of Law are that these acts constitute a violation of §36-2113(a)(5)(8) and (14), Idaho Code, and Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board Rules 002.45., 004.04., 007.01., 007.04, 012.04. and 010. After a review and discussion, MSC (Barker--Crane) THAT THE OUTFITTER LICENSE ISSUED TO FRANKIE VALVO BE, AND THE SAME IS HEREBY, REVOKED.

**Alan Lamm:** Mr. Lamm appeared before the Board to discuss his concerns about not being able to get the Hells Canyon Dam to Pittsburg Landing (SN12) section of the Snake River added to his outfitter license. Mr. Lamm was advised that this would require a petition to go to rules making, and if he is interested in pursuing this, he should provide the Board with a petition as soon as possible. Further, that as soon as the petition is received, the Executive Director is instructed to start research on the matter in order for the Board to be able to act on the petition at the August meeting.

**Rick Barker:** The Board reviewed a report from Rick Barker regarding a seminar conducted to establish criteria for limited activity for rock climbing guides. The seminar was organized by Joe Tonsmeire, Wilderness River Outfitters. After review and discussion, MSC (Crane--Haynes) THAT THE CURRICULUM SUBMITTED BY MR. BARKER CONSISTING OF 6 HOURS OF TRAINING IN THOSE SPECIFIC CATEGORIES, I.E. SINGLE PITCH, TOP ROPE CLIMBING AND RAPPELLING, BE ADOPTED AS THE OFFICIAL BOARD CRITERIA FOR LICENSING GUIDES FOR LIMITED ROCK CLIMBING ACTIVITIES.

**Peter Grubb:** The Board reviewed a letter from Peter Grubb requesting a variance to Board Rule 054.02., relating to the requirement for rafts to carry an extra paddle. He went on to explain that in certain instances involving paddle rafts it potentially can be very dangerous to have this additional encumbrance in the way. After review and discussion, MSC (Haynes--Crane) THAT A VARIANCE BE GRANTED EXEMPTING RIVER ODYSSEYS WEST (ROW) FROM THE REQUIREMENT FOR CARRYING AN EXTRA PADDLE IN HIS PADDLE RAFT BOATS. **Administrative Note:** This topic should be added to the list for future rules amendment consideration.

**George Butcher:** The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. George Butcher, Bighorn Outfitters, regarding a suggestion for an apprentice license for 16 and 17 year olds. In lieu of an apprentice license, the Board directs that the Executive Director prepare an amendment to the trainee rule which will include specified activities for horse operations similar to the special references identified for boating trainees between the ages of 16 and 18.

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**Joyce Jacobson:** The Board reviewed a letter received from Ms. Joyce Jacobson regarding her intent to relinquish her powerboat outfitter license on Cascade Reservoir. After review and discussion, MSC (Kovalicky--Crane) THAT THIS LICENSE BE DECLARED RELINQUISHED, AND THAT THE BOARD PROCEED WITH APPROPRIATE NOTIFICATION TO ADVERTISE POTENTIAL RELICENSING OF THIS OPPORTUNITY.

**Big Horn Camp:** The Board reviewed a letter from Big Horn Camp regarding a proposed backpacking trip along the Idaho/Montana stateline. The Executive Director is instructed to respond to them that the Board feels they do meet the criteria as established in §36-2103, Idaho Code, for exemption from license requirements under these circumstances.



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
